

Col. Can gets set for giant push on Epic Artist Ray Hutchinson

Toronto: Columbia Records of Canada are laying down a promotion and publicity campaign never before witnessed in the Canadian music industry. Twenty-four year old Canadian Ray Hutchinson will be the subject of this giant campaign. Regarded as one of Upper Canada's most popular nitory chanters Ray's easy going and very professional manner has acquired for him a very large and fanatical following. It was at one of these nite spots where Bob Martin, Director of Publicity and Promotion for Columbia Records of Canada, became aware of the Hutchinson potential as a recording artist. The best that Columbia had to offer was laid on for Ray. This meant the Columbia recording studios in New York, 31 top rated musicians and Manny Kellem, one of North America's most successful record producers. Ray was flown to New York and the result, "Rose Marie" and his own composition "My Heart Will Never Know", is set for release in Canada next week which is prior to his US release.

Hutchinson's showbiz career started a few years ago with a local group known as The Beaumarcs who attained international fame with their recording of "Clap Your Hands".



The group broke up shortly after and Ray decided to make it on his own as a nite club entertainer. His career has been one of successful appearance after successful appearance.

Governing his own activities, Hutchinson was careful not to over expose himself. But now with his Epic release ready for the North American market the Hutchinson name will probably become synonymous with Canadian television. His TV debut is set for Feb. 12 when he appears on the coast to coast "Juliette" show.

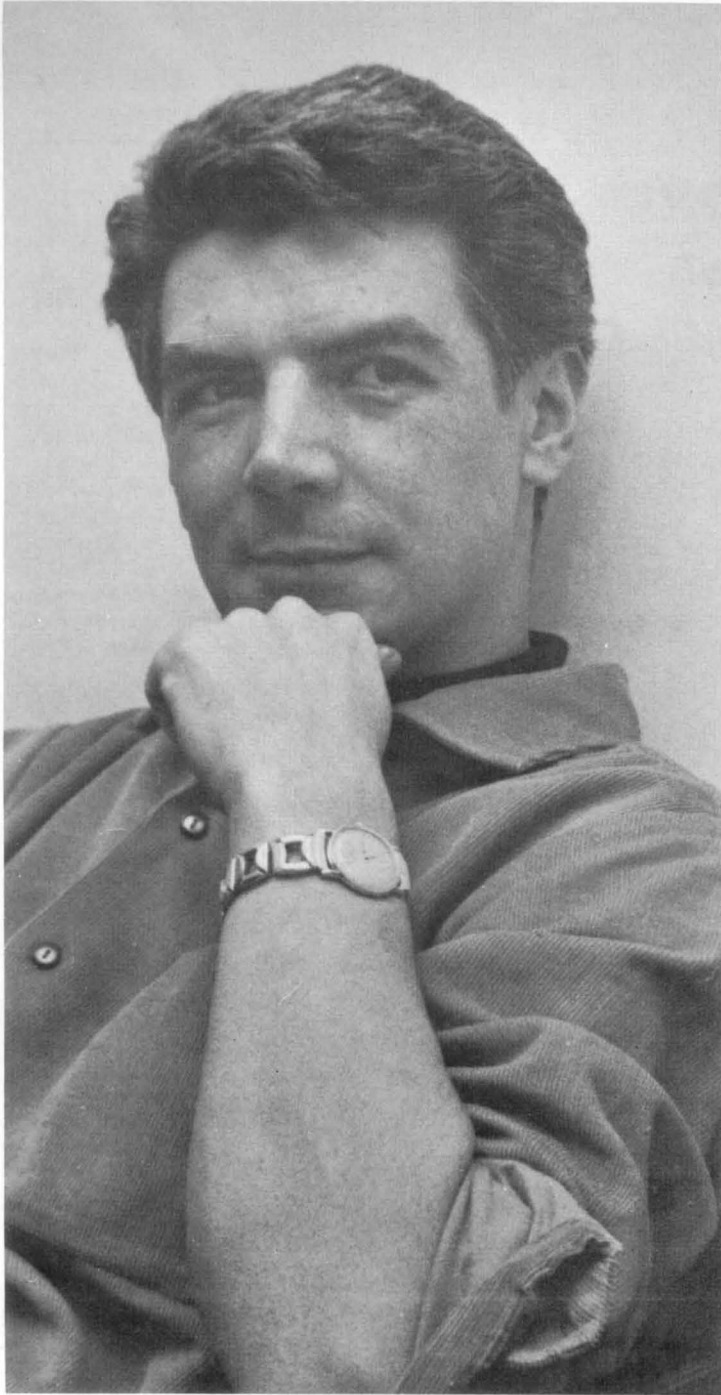

It's been a long time since I've seen my old friend, SAMMY DAVIS JR., but as I watched his debut on his own network television show (NBC-TV) a couple of weeks ago, it was as though I was sitting beside him. Those who have read his book, "Yes I Can"

should understand the tremendous, indescribably joy, Sammy feels as the first Negro performer to have his own network weekly TV show. As somebody who has known him through the years, I realize the true meaning of the words, "a dream come true". I would not want to attempt to express the thoughts that are running through Sammy's mind at this time as I am not foolish enough to believe that I know the inner feelings of a very complicated man. However, "humility" need not be worn on a person's sleeve in order to make known his feelings of gratitude towards a public that is grateful for the opportunity being afforded SAMMY DAVIS JR. Only a handful of people know that Sammy's words of praise and encouragement played an important part in the career of BOBBY DARIN. That story may someday be told, but if and when it is, it will probably be by Bobby as there are some things a man does for which he asks no credit be given.

We received a belated Christmas greeting from DUKE ELLINGTON. Instead of sending out cards, the Duke sent out programs to his "A Concert Of Sacred Music" which took place in New York and San Francisco.

Heard from LOU CHRISTIE who arrived in New York this week to start working with CHARLIE CALLELO on his next single session and an LP, which no doubt will be entitled "Lightnin' Strikes".

SHAWN ELLIOTT called me after returning from South America and told me he would be recording a new single and also a new LP.

Waiting to break big on the charts are "When Liking Turns To Loving" by RONNIE DOVE and "Working My Way Back To You" by that little known group THE FOUR SEASONS.

The FRANKIE VALLI record "(You're Gonna) Hurt Yourself" is an out and out smash in New York and is breaking fast in other areas.

RAMSEY LEWIS' "Hard Day's Night" should follow in the footsteps of his other giant hits.



COLUMBIA: An English record called "Ordinary Guy" by Chip Fisher gets its North American airing in Canada first. The Columbia people have rushed this release across the country with the hopes that Canada could be a sounding board for this smash hit. Also from Columbia comes a new Broadway release "The Syndicate" by John Barry from the new musical "Pas-

sion Flower Hotel". Canadians Bobby Kris and the Winnipeg based Shondels are making good strides up the charts across Canada.

SPARTON: "Mac Wiseman Sings - At The Toronto Horseshoe Club" is the newest in country releases from the Sparton people. Mac calls this LP his "Salute to Canada" and used some of Canada's top country musicians on the session including Ron McMunn, Lloyd Grant, Don O'Neil, Joe Brown and the late Ward Allen. This was the last recording session in which Ward participated. National chart action is the order for the newest by Ray Charles "Crying Time".

Graham Hart moves from CKBW Radio Atlantic to CJCH Halifax. David Horne joins Fred Trainor at CKBW to share the teen spots.

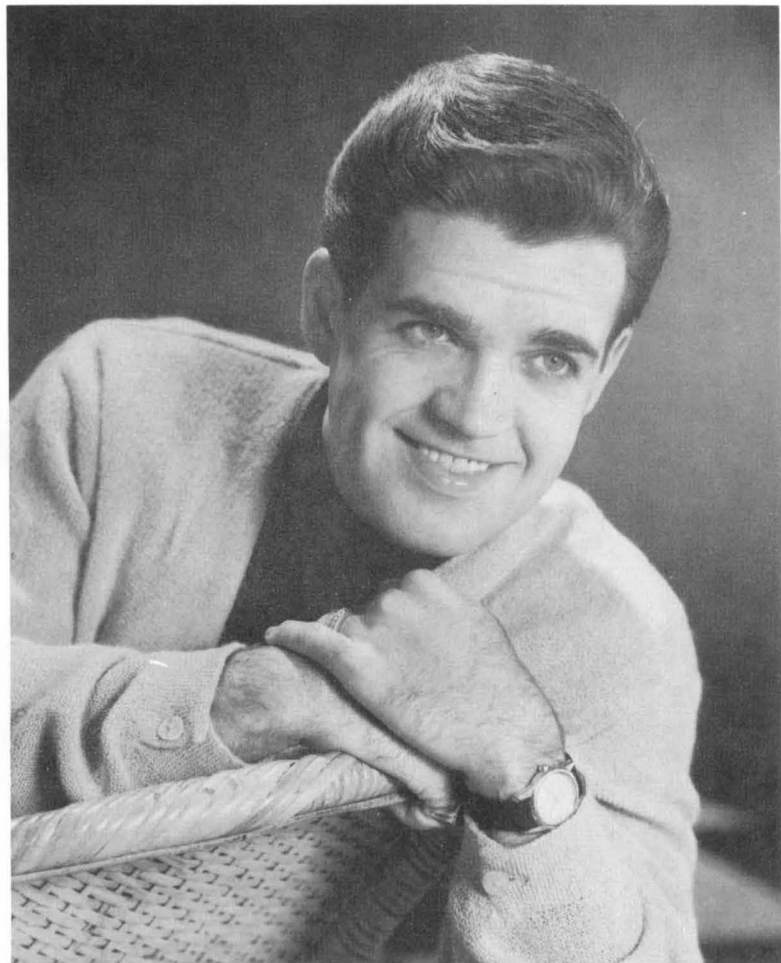
