CFTO-TV Sets Stage To Debut Colour In Canada

Toronto: The Baton Broadcasting Ltd. (CFTO-TV announces the arrival of colour television cameras which makes CFTO-TV Channel 9 the first Canadian Television station to have colour cameras and to be fully colour equipped. Although colour transmission cannot commence before October 1st of this year (BBG ruling) programs and commercials will be produced in colour almost immediately to insure readiness for the October date. Colour production has been tentatively set at Feb. 1 which will allow advertising clients the opportunity to have their products and packages colour tested, free of charge. Channel 9 will also produce many of the Canadian Programs for the I.T.O. Group of stations until such time as they become colour equipped.

A.F. of M. Favours Open Door Policy for Canadian Musicians

Toronto: Recent border difficulties experienced by Canadian musicians attempting entry to the United States has been partly the blame of the musicians themselves.Gurney Titmarsh, top exec., of the powerful Toronto local (149) advises that if members seeking em-ployment in the United States would follow the simple procedures as set down by the United States Immigration Department clearance would probably come about within two weeks. Intended employers should also be filled in on the proper procedure and complete Form B. contracts. The musicians should themselves make sure the necessary H Form is completed in detail. The last word must come from the Dept. of Labour. Mr. Gilbert Rogers of the A.F. of M. offices in New York City has made himself available to give any assistance necessary should Canadian musicians feel they have been wrongly dealt with.

The reason for the free movement of foreign musicians into Canada came about during the war years when an Order In Council lifted an embargo allowing professional talent into the country, to assist Canada in her role as a very important arsenal of the world. It has not been necessary, up to this time, to contemplate the restoring of this embargo.

It has been reported that traveling groups into Toronto in 1965 earned over a million dollars. 90% of these travelling groups were from the United States.

RPM Launches Ad And Subscriber Campaign for '66

Toronto: RPM launched an all out effort this week to bring in more subscribers and advertisers with a view to increasing the size of the only music weekly in Canada. Editor and Publisher Walt Grealis says, "The Canadian music industry is coming of age, and the importance of a trade publication has proven itself to such an extent that we now have on the planning boards a 16 page weekly. A number of advertisers have pledged their support. An industry as big as our domestic music industry should have a voice.

The new 16 page edition would feature more news and many new features and more of an international flavour. Emphasis would be placed on radio news, and the expanded format would concentrate on developing the production of more good programming recordings, and classical music by



Both advertisers and subscribers would be needed to make the proposed expansion possible."

Before leaving for the US the Big Town Boys completed work on their album which is to be released by Capitol about mid February. Their single release of "Hey Girl Go It Alone" has been sked-ded for release the first week of Febru-ary. /// "Pousse-Cafe" the new Duke Ellington musical opened to good reviews at the O'Keefe in Toronto. Stars include Theodore Bikel, Lilo and Gary Krawford. The show moves on to Detroit as a further step in its progress toward Broadway. /// To overcome difficulties experienced by the new Canada Pension Plan, Mr. G.J. MacKenzie Administrator has advised that all musicians will be regarded as self employed with payment to be made quarterly. Musicians rate is 3.6%. /// George Jones and the Jones Boys, Bill Anderson, Loretta Lynn, The Wilburn Brothers with Bill Morrison and The Canadian Playboys played to a packed house at Treasure Island Gardens in London Jan. 18. The following nite was equally as successful in Kitchener but here it was due partly to the popularity of a local group known as Jimmie Diebolt and the Jay Rockers. /// Isaac Stern, conducting the Toronto Symphony Orchestra, played to sold out houses at Massey Hall Jan. 18-19. /// Dave Brubeck moves into the Palace Des Artes

Feb. 8 after a successful showing at the University of Western Ontario (London). Brubeck's next Canadian appearance will be at the Queen Elizabeth in Vancouver in March. The Clancy Brothers will share the Vancouver bill. /// Ray Price and Jimmy Dickens played to a good houses in Ottawa Jan 21 and Toronto on the 26th. /// Johnny Cash makes his O'Keefe appearance Mar 17. 18, 19. /// The Canadian Association of Broadcasters meeting is set for February 21, 22, 23. /// The Liverpool Set presently appearing at Poppa Joes in Milwaukee are set for appearances at Corning University, Chicago and Boston.

A year ago Canadian programmers were harping for GOOD records. They would only play GOOD records. As 1966 starts, good records are not only passing the acid tests of Canadian programmers but many US record companies find them potent enough for release.

Typically, the NEW cry is for "A CANADIAN SOUND". RPM feels that the new critics are wasting their time because as things stand it is impossible to develop a Canadian sound.

The size of our industry is one major factor and our proximity to the United States is another.

The US record producers have always hungered for new sounds and are capable of moving much faster then our own industry to borrow any new sound from anywhere in the world. It is no secret that they have their eye and ear on Canada.

Using the supposition that a record like "Shakin' All Over", or better still "My Girl Sloopy" were to establish a new sound for Canada, and that the McCoys Bob Dylan Rolling Stones and dozens of other artists jumped on this sound bandwagon, WOILD the credit be graciously bestowed on Canada? Not likely!

wagon, WOULD the credit be graciously bestowed on Canada? Not likely! To establish a new sound would require a dedicated industry and a gigantic promotion campaign to bring this new sound quickly to the attention of the world. The possibility of this kind of a campaign (at this point in our apathy) is highly unlikely. However it gives us something to complain about and certain journalists something to write about.

The present small Canadian industry would have great difficulty grinding out enough records to maintain the image of this sound. The US would in very short time issue twenty or thirty copies of any new sound out of Canada. Canadian programmers have ignored every new sound out of Canada to date. Anything radically new is not easily accepted.

The very essance of being a Canadian sound makes it unlikely to succeed. Self conscious Canada will have difficulty establishing and maintaining a sound of its own.

To many of us, it was here....it's GONE and it's too late to take bows. Already the critics have labelled all Canadian records as copies of the American or British sound. The popular music scene is not based on new sounds just evoling, and it is no secret that a new sound would cost a great deal of money, and

Who would you pay to play and hype this new sound? The word PAYOLA is not a new word to any of us, and that's what it would take. We have not had the advantages of payola to ensure us the success of building stars or a sound. Further-more, the payola bought sound would not be the "Canadian Sound", but would end up being the "Toronto Sound" or the "Winnipeg Sound" or the "Montreal Sound" or the "Kapaskasing Sound" and RPM would be opposed to any centralization of the Canadian industry. The Canadian sound should be the next good record you hear if it has HIT potential.

Stop asking us for a bought Canadian Sound if the price will be payola. Let's just play it if it's good, and if it is as different as the British sound that made it for the Beatles, then the industry can feel that we made it out in the open, and not under tables and in the washrooms of radio stations. Hits are made on turntables by "Hit Spotters" not in record studios.

Meanwhile the real sound of Canada will remain - DON MESSER.


