THEY PAY THEIR OWN WAY

BOBBY DOW is a young Toronto boy who works every day as a clerk. Greg Hamon is 18 years old and works for a Toronto Department Store. Bruce Morshead, Ken Pernokis, Norm Scherrat, Tom Wilson and Gary Wright all have steady jobs in various fields. All these people have one thing in common. They are all recording artists who have taken their own money to produce records in an effort to be recognized in their own country.

BOBBY DOW'S record was made in Nashville, and released by RCA Victor. Not too much happened for Bobby. The five boys named above are professionally known as Little Caesar and the Consuls, recorded in Toronto's Hallmark Studios, and experienced a good reaction with their first release "If" on Columbia. Greg Hamon has just released his first Canadian cut single on the Bigland 100% Canadian content label. Greg has yet to find out what success he will have.

WHY SHOULD AN ARTIST pay his own way? In a country as small as Canada,

there is really very little reason for a record company to produce records, and with our close proximity to the United States, there is only a small chance of scoring a hit in Canada. Truly, it hasn't happened very often. Undaunted, these Canadian performers are fighting to succeed, and although the odds against them are heavy, there will someday be a breakthrough.

ARE CANADIANS APATHETIC to domestic product? NO. DEFINITELY NOT. Repeatedly, Canadian records that were exposed have met with great success. The biggest problem therefore is exposure. Pierre Lalonde is a good example of a lack of apathy from Canadians. Pierre is heavily exposed, and consistently sells records into the 30 and 40,000s. Don Messer is further proof of high sales of Canadians to Canadians. Bobby Curtola has proven that Canadians are more than anxious to show that we are capable of a little more than "supplying water power to make al-oominium".

BOBBY DOW is presently concentra-



ting on his songwriting, and has had a number of successful tunes placed and the future promises more for Bobby as a songwriter. Little Caesar and the Consuls have been heralded as the top group in Canada and their recent release has caused considerable stir in the industry, since recording on this scale has never been attempted before in Canada.



GREG HAMON is a "boy wonder" at 18, he not only recorded, produced, wrote, but finally went out alone to place the record with a Canadian record company. Greg was in the enviable position of being able to pick his own personal manager, a complete reverse of the normal routine. His own single was just the beginning of Greg Hamon's productions. His intention is to produce further records featuring other Canadian hopefuls, and if his initial attempt is an indication, then you'll see a great deal from a very young lad.....

GOING PLACES. EACH ONE of these artists (and many others) are looking to Canada to say "stay". We can no longer ignore our aggressive youth. Be it a Bobby Curtola, Jack London, Sandy Selsie, Larry Lee or the other "pay their own way" artists. They deserve our vote, and those of us who believe in Canada SHOULD stand up and be counted.

Walt says..

Across Canada Chart Action (ACCA). Our front page feature each week, takes on a new look, and a new policy which the new RPM has made feasible. We now indicate (for those interested) ALL chart action of domestic product from coast to coast each week. If a station chart is absent, the reason will be no listing of Canadian product. Our new score system will indicate points achieved by each record, and their standing that week. Should you doubt our veracity, this is the formula. A number one record earns 30 points (and we'll probably never have to use that, or seldom). 2 to 5, 25 points. 6 to 10, 20 points. 11 to 19, 15 points, 20 to 29, 10 points, 30 and up to 60, 5 points. Each record earns an additional 10 points per chart listing. Ties will be broken by the highest rating of the two records on any single chart. We have been using this formula for the past month and a half and feel that it is entirely fair. The new format also lets you see the action of records regionally at a glance. One additional comment to disc jockeys, program directors, and music directors. **A NUMBER OF HARD WORKING DESERVING CANADIAN ARTISTS AND RECORD PEOPLE ARE LOOKING TO YOU FOR A FAIR BREAK. PLEASE CONSIDER THE REST OF CANADA WHEN MAKING UP YOUR CHART AND RE-ASSESS THE ACCA RECORDS . . . IF NECESSARY FOR THE FIFTH TIME.**

Harold Pounds of Spartan Records sends along the new release of Gary Buck "You're Welcome To The Club". This pop country entry by Canadian Buck could be the door opener for Canadian charts. His earlier releases usually made it south of the border but never in his own country.

"**Mary Poppins**" on the Vista Label (RCA Victor) is getting raves from coast to coast. Julie Andrews, one of the greats in both movie and Broadway musicals is a good reason why this movie soundtrack is a success. Also from Victor very strong chart contenders with Paul Anka's "Ogni Volta" and "Guitar Star" by Duane Eddy. A newcomer to Victor but not to the charts is Johnny Ray with his new release of "A Sometime Love". For jazz lovers check "Body and Soul", A Jazz Autobiography. This is a new series of re-issues of performances from the past and present by a wide variety of artists, including Coleman Hawkins.

Paul White of Capitol informs us that Cliff Richard retains his title for the sixth year as "Britain's Top Male TV Artist" and placed third behind Presley and Orbison in the Top Ten "Male Singers of the World". His newest release "On The Beach" looks like it's headed for chart action. Looks like another big month for Capitol. November sees The Pacemakers, Billy J. Kramer, The Dave Clark Five and The Esquires all appearing in concerts across Canada.

"Pack Up Your Troubles" by the CBC's Carl Tapscott Singers is one of the best of Victor Sing-a-long LPs.

Larry Lee's very recent release "Big Boss Man" (Columbia) heads for the charts with the first listing at CKLB Oshawa. Others starting to show chart action are Shirley Matthews "He Makes Me Feel So Pretty", the CBC Girl-friends with "Once In A Lifetime Boy". Terry Black and Bobby Curtola are still riding high on most of the charts across Canada.

ARE WE GOING TO HAVE A CANADIAN MUSIC INDUSTRY in Canada or are we going to have to resort to pressuring for government assistance? In the past three weeks I have received letters suggesting that pressure has been brought to bear against me to simmer down and stop trying to push Canadian talent. Perhaps my remarks have been somewhat verbose but my policy is still "Canada also". My attitude has been changing slightly in the past three months.

A FEW WEEKS AGO I brought up the matter of the apparent lack of interest by Canadian record companies to produce Canadian singles. "Why should we?" writes one company official. "if it doesn't appear in the American trades, there isn't enough interest in Canada to make it a hit. We can't get it released in the United States usually because it hasn't proved itself in Canada." These remarks require consideration. Perhaps we have two evils at work in Canada, one . . . the FEAR of legislation to regulate air play of Canadian content and two . . . the apathy of those in charge of THE MEDIA capable of dispelling the first evil. Of two evils let's choose the least.

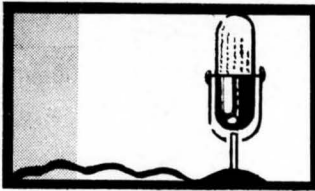

We believe "Music Hop" should be stripped of its script and the show should be, as implied....MUSIC....andHOP....

David Lyman of CKY informs us that their planned jaunt to the north with entertainment for RCAF bases has been cancelled, and hastens to clarify that it wasn't the lack of volunteered talent but rather the unavailability of aircraft. Never underestimate the power of the north. Nice to hear from Chuck Nahumko PD at CJDC Dawson Creek, B.C. Chuck would like to know why he hasn't received some of the Canadian discs mentioned in RPM. Many stations don't Chuck but I think it's a matter of setting up proper distribution for some companies and for others an incomplete mailing list which I hope they will correct.

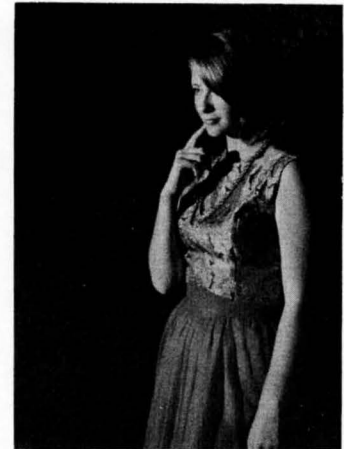

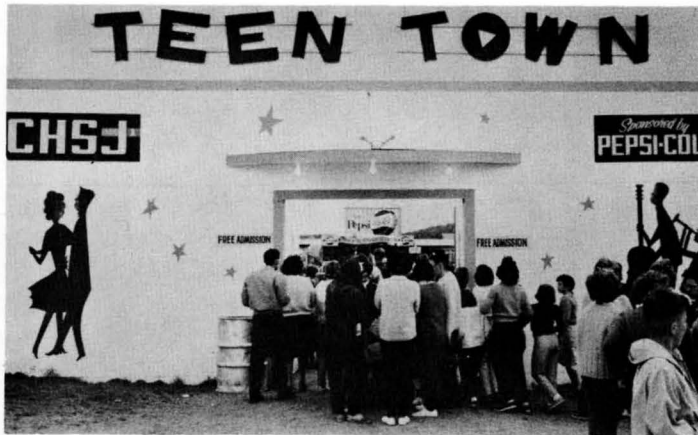

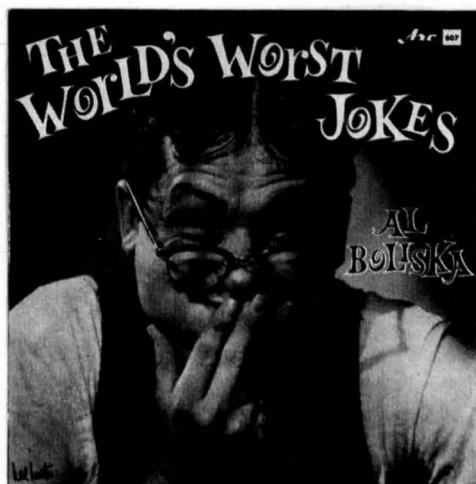

One of the big ones for western New York and South Central Ontario debuts Oct. 3 when Joey Reynolds of WKBW takes to the TV screens with his teen show. Opening show looks good with The Beach Boys, Kathy Lynn, Tracey Dey and Neil Darrow. The following week Connie Francis appears. Reynolds is still one of the top DJs in the US, and the KB radio show covers 17 states and two nations. Canadians hear Joey throughout 6 provinces giving Reynolds approximately the same coverage on both sides of the border.



Reynolds has earned the respect of the industry because of his great versatility. As well as being a natural ad lib comedian, Reynolds has also had a hit record, and has been producing records as well as being part owner of a recording studio in Buffalo. Since Canada is just a stones throw away from the friendly giant, Joe spends a great deal of time in Canada, not only performing, but relaxing in a lakeside home near Oshawa. This is Reynolds as his friends know him. He's a rare radio personality who is SHOWBIZ all the way, and that's the way teenage America and Canada want him.

Al is married, and five years ago after a thorough background as a musician, joined Leeds Music in Canada.

Interested in every aspect of music, Al has written a two movement suite for full orchestra and as well pop music in the current vein.

Al is part of the nucleus of Canada's growing music industry.

George Wilson of CKFH has just received the Columbia sound track of "My Fair Lady" and considers the complete album a must for programming. Our feelings are the same. Another LP George finds most enjoyable is the new RCA Victor release of "Mary Poppins".

Art Collins of CFRB recommends the new Steve Lawrence "Everybody Knows" (Coral) especially the cuts "Blue-ette" and "Girl From Ipanema". A real eye-opener Art feels is "Accent On Youth" by the Harry Simeone Choral and suggests three of the best cuts "Thank You", "Dum Dee Dum" and "Brass Buttons". The new Command (Sparton) LP "Al Di La" with the Ray Charles Singers is a big item at CFRB. The favourite cut is "'Til The End Of Time". The Bob Goulet LP "Without You" on Columbia is receiving much airplay and Art feels one of the best cuts is "Autumn Leaves" sung in French. Single-wise, Art is particularly fond of a beautiful ballad by Elvis Presley "Ask Me" on Victor and another Victor single "September Song" by Al Hirt with chorus. Another delightful entry is the Village Stompers "O! Marie" on Epic. Of special interest to Baroque lovers is the light and delightful "Complete Flute Sonata of Mozart" with Jean-Pierre Rampal on the Epic label.

David Amer just getting over a back injury had time to recommend a few of CHFI's preferred programming. Dave feels very strongly about the Arc release of Pat Riccio "Stranger On The Shore". This is a Toronto based Jazz group. Dave also recommends very highly the new Steve Lawrence release "Everybody Knows". On the classics end Dave suggests Beethoven's "Choral Fantasy" (Fantasy for piano, chorus and orchestra) on Columbia.

We might suggest you give a listen to two new ABC-Paramount singles "I've Grown Accustomed To Her Face" by Sid Feller and his Ork and another show tune by Tommy Sands "Something More". If you want some real easy listening you might try "I Only Have Eyes For You" a new Victor LP release by Hugo and Luigi. And don't forget "From Sea To Sea" by the Courriers also on Victor. This folk group is fast becoming the most talked about Canadian group yet recorded.

My Fair Lady is a well known show around the Columbia shop. Andy Williams sings songs from it. Sammy Kaye plays dancing music from it. Rex Harrison and Julie Andrews with the original cast recording. Percy Faith does it and Andre Previn gets caught up in its popularity. Next, the movie sound track.

Many GMP Stations reported playing the new Canadian recording by Greg Hamon. This strong folk-oriented single looks like a flagship for the 18 year old singer, producer, writer. An American good music type record company is presently dickering for Greg's master or services. Hard to tell which at this writing. This could be the next Robert Goulet story.

As many GMP stations push closer to "middle of the road", the contemporary stations have also started to quiet their sound. Particularly during adult parts of the day.
