STONE LABEL SUCCESSFUL INDIE

Through the aggressive, Johnny-on-thespot action of Bob Stone, President of Robert J. Stone Of Canada Ltd., his label (Stone) has become one of the most successful in the nation and is considered, in the trade, as being THE major independent.

Stone first entered the business, picking up North American releases for distribution in the UK and Europe. Many Canadians gained international recognition before their own country got wind of them, through the efforts of Bob Stone. He has released well over 100 singles outside Canada and the



Stone label is presently being pressed in 54 countries and is represented by other labels in 13 countries.

Stone's big break came with his acquisition of the Spencer Davis Group for Canada. It was actually through his dogged determination to make The Group a hit in Canada that led to the North American explosion of The Spencer Davis Group. "Gimme Some Lovin" was picked and charted by every pop station in the nation and guaranteed their follow-up, "I'm A Man", the same treatment. By the time The Spencer Davis album hit the market, it was a pre-sold top seller.

The trade was quick to recognize that the Stone label had great potential and could develop into being a sounding board vehicle for their product prior to being released in the all important U.S. market.

Although his powers for acquiring new product have increased tremendously, Stone realizes that his operation is somewhat limited because of the geographic and population problems and has geared his operation to cope with this unfortunate situation. He is still on the lookout for new product but prefers sounds that are unique and, in a manner of speaking, a challenge to the North American market.

Stone has very strong international contacts, and at 23, with 5 years experience, is considered, by European record execs as being potentially the most powerful and in-

fluential contact on the North American scene.

The lines that Stone handles include, Island, Sue, Surprise and Fontana (England), Ariola (Germany), Discobel (Belgium), Sapraphon (Czechoslovakia), Listen & Learn, Chart, Rido (U.S.) and many others. He has created a solid interest for Canadian product in New

GUESS WHO NOT FOR EXPO'67??

THE GUESS WHO, WINNIPEG'S FAMOUS FOUR, HAVE BEEN SNUBBED BY EXPO. WHILE WINNIPEG CITY OFFICIALS AND THE REST OF CANADA RECOGNIZE THE GUESS WHO AS BEING THE GROUP THAT BROUGHT WORLD RECOGNITION TO THE CANADIAN MUSIC INDUSTRY, OFFICIALS OF EXPO'S GARDEN OF STARS, THE SHOWPLACE OF YOUNG CANADIAN TALENT, PREFER TO IGNORE THEIR EXISTENCE.

The Guess Who will be making several appearances throughout Upper Canada, commencing with a giant show at Toronto's Maple Leaf Gardens (May 22). This is apparently the closest the famous foursome will get to the World's Fair, in Montreal, which is being sponsored by Canada. When The Guess Who first broke into the world music scene with their Quality single of "Shakin' All Over", they were acclaimed from coast to coast and received tribute after tribute and were even honoured by their own city of Winnipeg. They have continued to stay on top of the popularity poll, putting out great hit after great hit and are truly representative of the young, clean cut, aggressive Canadian musician.

When this reporter was asked to sit on the selection board for the Garden Of Stars, it was truly a great honour to be placed in a position of suggesting the names of groups from across Canada, to appear at the largest gig in the world. Granted, there were only so many dates to be filled and there were thousands of groups ready to fill these dates. My understanding of the set up was, the Garden Of Stars had been allowed a budget of \$2200, per week which was to be split up between two groups, for a seven day, 2 hour per day engagement. This reporter submitted a list of well known groups from every centre across Canada. This was to be a National effort. Montreal and Toronto were to be classified the same as Winnipeg or Vancouver and so on. Because of the popularity of The Guess Who, they were on top of the list. Their manager, Ray Levin, received a verbal agreement that The Guess Who had been scheduled to appear at The Garden Of Stars from June 4th., to June 10th. Levin explained to this official that the only dates The Guess Who were not available was for the month of September when they were appearing at the Pacific National Exhibition, in Vancouver.







Everything appeared to be set. Oneniters were arranged throughout Upper Canada prior to their Expo appearance. Contracts arrived from Expo showing the dates as Sept. 3 to Sept. 9 rather than the agreed to dates of June 4 to 10. Levin contacted the Garden Of Stars promoter but was told that this was the only week available.

As a member of the selection board, this reporter attended only one meeting, received one cheque, was asked to perform one duty, that of informing a certain Toronto promotion and publicity firm that contracts for certain of their groups appearances at The Garden Of Stars were being returned to them, unsigned, because they were apparently using the publicity, unfairly.

The roster of groups appearing at The Garden Of Stars, lists only 3 groups who are from Western Canada, The King Beezz, and



The Royal Family from Edmonton and The Noctumals, from Vancouver. This is out of a total of 52 groups. The Maritime provinces aren't even recognized. Montreal is represented by 25 groups. This will probably increase to cover the unconfirmed dates. Toronto is represented by 9 groups, 5 being those who were previously advised that their contracts were being returned, unsigned. The remaining groups are from smaller Ontario cities, the U.S., Barbados, Australia and Europe.

The bitterness that has been created by this rather questionable manner of selecting musical units for The Garden Of Stars won't create any problems for Expo. This is just another example of government blindness when it comes to the use of public funds. It's only unfortunate that an example can't be made of these errors or short sightedness so that they can be avoided the next time, but who can wait....... a hundred years?

Zealand and Australia where he is currently experiencing success with Mercey Brothers releases "Whistling On The River" and "Uncle Tom".

Stone has just recently tied in with Frank Swain's Caravan Record Sales, who will handle all Stone product for national distribution. Caravan, an equally aggressive young company utilizes the services of Trans World, in Montreal, for Quebec, Wholesale Appliances of Vancouver for Alberta and B.C., and George Spencer of Halifax will handle East Coast sales. Ontario, Manitoba and Saskatchewan will be handled from the head Office in Toronto.

With Robert J. Stone as President and Harold E. Pounds as Vice President and General Manager, the Robert J. Stone Of Canada Ltd., will continue to direct operations from offices in Oshawa and London, Ontario.

Current pop items scoring chart listings for Stone include "I'm A Man" by the Spencer Davis Group, who also have another release just happening titled "Every Little Bit Hurts". Millie Small is moving in from left field with "Wings Of A Dove" and Jimmy Cliff's "Give And Take" is picking up national action. Stevie Winwood's new group, The Traffic will soon see Canadian action, on Stone, with their 4 minute and 10 second,

waxing of "Paper Sun". The Smoke and Elkie Brooks are two other UK properties ready for

the Canadian market.

Stone is becoming prominent in the country field (Canadian & U.S.) as well as the easy listening and classical end of the business and has had much success with his classical line from Czechoslovakia.

Stone has a great deal of interest in domestic product as well, and as the Canadian music industry develops, the Robert J. Stone Of Canada Ltd., will no doubt form an integral part of that development.

THE DICKENS TO BE FEATURED ON CBC-TV NETWORK

Toronto: Canada's unique Dickens are to be featured in their own movie "This Sort Of Life" which will be a part of the CBC-TV Canadian Film Makers series to be televised Wednesday May 31st. at 10:30 PM EDT.

Their Dynovoice disc "Jenny" and "This Sort Of Life" is expected to be released by the end of May. They are currently filling one-nite engagements preperatory to their move into the NYC area and a tour of the U.S.



They weren't picked to play at Expo, you know, even though they are an established recording group and had been recommended to play the big fair. Sorry about that gang but I guess cousins are thicker than water, or blood, or, why argue, you can't fight City Hall.

Listen, The Beaux Geste played Toronto's Night Owl last week and if this is the type of talent they got down there no wonder a famous Canadian producer is off to the Capital. At least I think he's interested in recording an Ottawa group. Have you heard of a Judy band? Anyway, The Beaux Geste are one big groove group and you know what, they're bilingual which makes them all the more interesting.

Kent Chauvin dropped into the offices on his way to Expo. Kent has just graduated



from the University of British Columbia and is hoping to get into the broadcasting business. He used to keep me posted on Vancouver happenings and boy they sure do happen out there. Vancouver gets more of the big names in a month than Toronto does in six.

The Naughty Boys, from Ottawa, waxed a session for Sir John A and came out with a boss sound called "Somebody Told My Girl" and "Tell Me Why". This group is fast becoming one of the most popular around the Capital. Their manager is Don Billows, who is "hip" to the scene and knows the right moves to make. Don also manages the In Sect, that's a group and they've got a disc on the way.

A PASSING FANCY

Now how about that Mitch Ryder. Now that he has a couple of hit records under his belt he's an authority on Canada. He's quoted as saying that Canadian groups shouldn't identify themselves as Canadians. Seems that we're known for our farms not our great rock groups. Mitch Ryder is from Detroit you know, and on a clear day you can see across the Detroit River into that wide open cow town known as Windsor. As a matter of fact, if the wind is right you can spit from Detroit into the great prairie parking lot of CKLW, and you wouldn't hit a Canadian buggy. There's no room. They're all from Detroit.

The Magic Circus were playing at the Night Owl last Monday night and Irving and the gang had filled me in on how great this foursome were, so I decided to catch their act, and in particular, their 45 minute Magic Circus Symphony. They had just finished the Symphony as I walked in the door and all I saw were four happy sweaty guys. Well, I thought my night was ruined but you know what. They enjoy doing this 45 minute bit so much, they decided to go it again. I really think someone important must have popped in like, Canada's top record producer and maybe Canada's newest record producer and I even spotted, I think, the editor of Canada's newest music weekly, "Gone". Well anyway, I was lucky. Let me tell you, I have never seen four guys work so hard and with so much enthusiasm on something so original and so enjoyable as this Magic Circus Symphony. There just isn't the room here to tell you how great this unit is. Just looking around at the audience was enough. Those little Village grannies didn't make a peep. I hope RPM does a picture story on the Magic Circus, soon.

Hey, I'm almost caught with my photos down. Any of you fan club presidents got any drag with your group or some of you Moms and Pops (I know you read Canada) who would like to see your hairy wonders in RPM, have them send me a good reproducible photo.

Did you know that The Tremeloes were English? Well, I didn't until I found out their hit record "Here Comes My Baby" was written by Cat Stevens. The reason you got to hear their disc was because of the efforts of Columbia's Bob Martin, who heard a sample copy that came from CBS (England) and decided to get it released. They have another single on the way. You didn't think everything was released here did you? It's people like Martin and Paul White of Capitol and George

"Double Yellow Line" by the Music Machine looks like a hit on its way. Write down the name of Janis Jan's single, "Society's Child" NOW looks like it could be a hit. Are you old enough to remember Jimmy Clanton? If you are you might be interested in Jimmy's new record "C'mon Jim".

The Hollies have a new HIT called "Pay You Back With Interest". Wilson Pickett will climb the charts with "Soul Dance Number 3". Do you know that Boris Karloff has a single out? "Come My Laurie With Me" features Boris in a lighter vein and without the monster garb. Should get some programming from the standpoint of interest.

WHY....are disc jockeys and music directors playing NEW records before they get on the listings? Is Canada emerging as a hit making country? Are U.S. record companies looking at Canada as a nation to be reckoned with? Slowly the HIT business in Canada is advancing itself, and a FEW people have figured out WHY. 





The Hollywood Bowl was flooded by 18,000 freezing teenagers who came to see The Supremes' show. The Supremes sang every one of their past hits as well as their new one, "The Happening". They returned four times after shouts of "more, more". Supporting acts included The Buffalo Springfield, who after finishing their set, were quickly rushed to the airport for a flight to San Francisco for another concert. Johnny Rivers excited the crowd with "Memphis" and "Baby I Need Your Loving". The Seeds were the most colourful. They were presented with flowers by fans which they later threw to the crowd. Other acts, under the stars, included The Fifth Dimension and Brenda Holloway, who came up with fine performances.

A new singing group jumped into national prominence with their first recording, "I Had Too Much To Dream". The Electric Prunes, a California-based quintet, uses eight separate amplifiers to create a sound uniquely their own.



The group's lead singer and harmonica player is James Lowe, 22. Born in California, he moved to Hawaii with his family in 1962, where he joined a bluegrass group. A year later he returned to Los Angeles.

MODBEATS ALBUM GRABS ONT. ACTION

Toronto: Caravan Records reports that they have passed the 3000 sales mark for the Red Leaf album release of "Mod Is" by the British Modbeats. This is somewhat phenominal being as the album has only been on the market 21 days and achieved this sales figure without the support of the Toronto market. Their single "Somebody Help Me" has picked up much action across the nation and is listed as No. 3 on the Canadian Hits chart and No. 33 on the RPM 100.

ANDY STEWART WAXES TRIBUTE TO CANADA

Toronto: Winding up his successful coast to coast tour of Canada with the White Heather show, Capitol recording artist, Andy Stewart found that his composition "Two Lands", a tribute to Canada, had been well received at every performance. In view of this finding and the fact that his audiences represented a



good cross section of Canadian life, it was decided to wax "Two Lands", which will probably be referred to as "Andy Stewart's Centennial Project". The lyrics are somewhat overpowering and some critics are of the opinion it could be another "Scottish Soldier".

BEE GEES SET FOR CHART ACTION

NYC: In April of this year, Atlantic-Atco Records President Ahmet Ertegun and Robert Stingwood of NEMS concluded an agreement for Atco Records to distribute Bee Gees recordings in the U.S. First release of the Bee Gees, "New York Mining Disaster-1941" has been given the nod by U.S. trades and is currently being picked and charted by radio stations across the nation.

The Bee Gees became an important part of the Australian teen scene when their average age was just ten years. They starred in their own weekly 30 minute TV series, out of Brisbane. This was in 1960. However, they had three years of experience behind them, having entered the musical field as a

When the Bee Gees returned to Britain, they found that their fame had preceded them. Robert Stigwood, joint managing director of NEMS signed the Bee Gees to a five year management contract and the same day they

signed with NEMS they became a foursome. Colin Petersen, an Australian living in Britain had met the Bee Gees on their return to England and within a couple of weeks had agreed to become their drummer. The Gibb brothers, Maurice, Robin and Barry and Colin Petersen, The Bee Gees, will be heading for New York City shortly to promote their first North American release "New York Mining Disaster-1941", which is already topping the charts in the UK, and will probably make a tour of Canada and the U.S. Their disc is distributed in Canada by Quality Records.


