

NORTHLANDIA BAND JETS TO EUROPEAN TOUR

Willowdale, Ont: August 4th has been set as "launch day" for the fifty-five member strong Northlandia Concert Band to kick off their special concert tour of the British Isles and Europe.

The band was formed in 1966 when a group of 40 young people, who began their band music training at Northmount Junior High School, interested their teacher, Charles Mills, in the idea of a concert band. The group, with members between the ages of 14 and 19 years, became so popular throughout the area they were invited to play on Parliament Hill in 1967 by the Centennial Commission. Each year for the past three they have entered the Kiwanis Festival and come away with top marks in their class.

Much of the success of the band is due the efforts being put forth by their leader Charles Mills and his assistant Dave Elliott, a student at the University of Toronto, who plays trombone and assists with the conducting. Much credit must also go to the support given the band by the Parents' Committee and to Mr. Howard Baker, original chairman of the band, who has led the young organization through concerts, festivals and travels, and of course the loyalty of band members to hours of practice that have turned out a concert band second to none. Part of their campaign to raise funds included the taping of a record session and the subsequent release of an album that is considered a best seller, although restricted to only their own immediate area.

Shortly after their appearance on Parliament Hill a Committee For Europe was formed and now, two years later, the Northlandia Concert Band, along with 16 chaperones, are set to jet across the Atlantic on a dream trip.

First stop will be Amsterdam where they will play a concert followed by a Cologne, Germany date. They'll take in the sights of Koblenz and Heidelberg on the Rhine, playing a concert in Heidelberg famous for its close-

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ness in location for the famed "Student Prince". The next day will be free to explore the Glacier Gardens in Lucerne in the Swiss Alps and then on to a concert in Milan, Italy, A free day on the French Riviera will be followed by a concert in Nice, France and then to Paris and three

days of sightseeing. From Boulogne, the group will travel by Hovercraft to Dover and several concert dates in England's Basildon, Brighton and Colchester and two free days to tour the city of London.

New uniforms are also the order of the day for the group's trip abroad. They'll replace their familiar Hunter's green blazers with blazers of Maple Leaf Tartan to be worn with gold skirts/trousers and gold turtlenecks.

Frank Gould tipped us off on the merits of side 2 of the new disc by the Five Man Electrical Band. Both sides are listed for your consideration. In voting for the record, please do not vote for one side or the other. Simply vote for the record itself and play whichever side you feel is superior.

It has been suggested that we develop more "hard and fast rules". I think a complete review of policy and rules and regulations should be undertaken on the 25th of August when you all get to town.

I plan to go away on vacation until the 6th of August. In my absence, Chuck McCoy will be handling the conference call plus any enquiries relative to the Maple Leaf System and the meeting plunned for August 25th.

Following is a letter received from Nevin Grant, music director at CKOC Hamilton

"Bob: This "NO-PLAY" charge by the record companies is a serious one which could undermine all our efforts. Each group member should take immediate steps to ensure that such a charge could not be laid against his station! In addition to adding the selected songs to our Playlist we are now instructing that EACH of the three songs MUST be aired at least ONCE during each shift.* This takes the element of choice completely away from the Announcers involved and guarantees play! Perhaps other member stations could take similar action. Listing a song alone does not always guarantee consistent play. Sometimes play must be enforced. Keep the faith...

*(the only exception being Restricted Selections not being aired during daytime programming)."

CFOX Montreal recently editorialized on the Maple Leaf System which follows:

"CFOX IS WILLING TO HELP CANADIAN RECORDING ARTISTS EARN THEIR WAY IN A COMPETITIVE MARKET

In yesterday's editorial, we touched on our policy as regards Canadian recording artists. Today, we would like to explain that policy a little further.

CFOX feels that Canada can develop a good strong recording industry just as England has done, despite the fact that the United States and their mammoth recording industry is right next door.

However, we have always objected, and we object now, to those who would have us play any recording just because it's Canadian.

The reason for playing a record on the air has to be because it's something which will appeal to our audience.

We are delighted to give extra promotion to good Canadian records which are popular with our listeners, and we do so.

In fact, at this moment almost twenty percent of the records that we play on CFOX are by Canadian artists, and we have banded together with a number of other Canadian radio stations calling ourselves The Maple Leaf Group to see to it that these records are properly promoted. But, as we said yesterday, we do not believe in insulting our artists by playing Canadian records just because they are Canadian."

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PETER SUNNY & COMPANY INTO GEORGE'S

Toronto: Peter, Sunny & Company, one of Upper Canada's top folk variety trios, will move into George's Spaghetti House for one week commencing Aug 4. This is the first non-jazz group to be booked into this midtown showplace. It's expected that a drummer and flautist will be added for this engagement.

Mirasound Tapes Session Via Telephone Hook-Up



TORONTO'S FOUR ARTS PACTS WITH NEMS

Toronto: Dick Citroen, director of Four Arts Productions Ltd., recently negotiated an agreement with NEMS Enterprises whereby his company will be fully represented in both the UK and Europe by NEMS. Four Arts will now be sole agents for all NEMS activities in Canada.

Besides representing many of the top British recording stars including Donovan, Matt Munro, Sounds Incorporated, Cilla Black, Gerry Marsden, Pentangle, and Deep Purple, NEMS also represents many of the top acts from the U.S.

According to the report, this new agree-

ment will involve NEMS as concert and television reps for all artists represented by Four Arts. Initially, acts from Canada involved in the deal are singers Doug Crosley and American Ronnie Hawkins. The latter makes his home in Toronto. Interest is apparently running high on Motherlode and the Guess Who.

UK acts effected by this agreement include the Kinks, who kick off their concert and college dates in October; Vera Lynn; The Robert Farnon Orchestra and David Whitfield.

KERR TO MANAGE ALLAN BRUCE

Montreal: Warner Bros - Seven Arts' recording artist Allan Bruce, currently seeing national action on his LP "My World Of Song" has signed a management deal with Gib Kerr, manager of Rich Little.

Kerr, who is headquartered in Granada Hills, California, is also president of his own record company, Kerr Records, on which Little is presently chalking up good sales on his album release, "Rich Little's Broadway". The Kerr label is distributed in Canada by RCA.

Bruce has also concluded a deal for subpublishing of his compositions with Music, Music, Music of New York City.

Recent appearances on the Arthur Godfrey radio show and the Johnny Carson TVer has resulted in much speculation by U.S. industry execs over the potential of Bruce. He has also made several appearances on Canadian television and is skedded for guest shots on CTV's "Diamond Lil" and "Cafe Conc".

CHAM CONTROLS OWN

Hamilton: What should be of particular interest to the trade is the news that radio station CHAM is now controlling their music systems internally. Record companies should re-adjust their mailing lists and alert their promotion departments.

John Murphy, newly appointed program director notes "Record company representatives are welcome and are encouraged to visit both librarian Linda Hargin or myself at CHAM on a phone call's notice".

CHAM's music format is similiar to that of her sister station CHFI (easy listening).



Crocodile and another Canadian unit, Giant Bear Chicken Show have been assigned to K&K's newly formed Super K Records with both groups debuting singles and albums simultaneously.

King George III also advises that K&K and himself are in the process of negotiating a movie pact for Crocodile.

COSBY SETS VANCOUVER RECORD

Vancouver; Newly appointed West Coast Warner Bros Seven Arts' promotion man, Bruce Bissell, can now sit in with the masters after his superb promotion of the Bill Cosby show and Cosby LP product.

The Coliseum date (July 12) drew the larg-



est crowd (14,100) for a single performer in the history of the showplace.

Martin Onrot, of Martin Onrot Associates tied everything together nicely and together with Bissell made the date one of the best from a promotional angle ever seen in the city.

Bissell took advantage of the obvious record sales potential of Cosby and set up effective displays throughout the city which was instrumental in moving much of Cosby's LP release "The Best Of Bill Cosby".

Super Recording Groups Could Run Into Difficulties

Many rock groups have begun to use the idea of having their friends join them in recording sessions and live performances to add excitement and interest to their music. Examples of this include the Beatles, Rolling Stones, Jefferson Airplane, and a new group, Delaney and Bonnie & Friends.

Delaney and Bonnie & Friends is a group of eight musicians, singers and friends whose



performances of their own brand of traditionally rooted American music has gained them overwhelming acclaim in an astonishingly short time. Their friends include organist Bobby Whitlock, drummer Jim Keltner, and guitarist Leon Russell, all three of whom show up for the majority of dates booked.

The development of everchanging rock groups is an interesting phenomenon which presents problems as well as advantages. The advantages of having Keith Richard, Eric Clapton, and George Harrison playing on your record as Billy Preston did recently, are obvious, the sound is great. The same is true with Jeff Beck group member Nicky Hopkins helping the Jefferson Airplane record their new album and several of Jimi Hendrix's old friends are stopping by to help him record. The problems arise from the business end of the industry. An artist is signed to a particular label, he cannot record for other labels without his own label's permission. As yet, no one has cracked down on musicians for stepping across contractual borders, but I'd suggest you enjoy the music that is being created from this recombination since I'm sure that as soon as it starts to become financially successful the record companies will put a stop to it.

Noel Redding has definitely split from the Jimi Hendrix Experience. He will pursue a career with his newly formed group, Fat Mattress. Noel's group will be handled by Chas Chandler, an ex-Animal group member and a former manager of Jimi Hendrix. Apparently Noel decided to leave Jimi when he was not consulted about the expansion of the trio into a "creative commune". Jimi's plans for the new experience include writers, dancers and artists as well as musicians.

Supposedly a jazz festival, the Newport Jazz Festival was really a gigantic rock and roll show this year. And the attendance was about three times as great as any other year the festival has been held....The Isley Brothers back in the studio in New York City this week recording a new album....The Kinks have added a brass section for all future live appearances in England, so they will get the same sound live that they get in their recording....The Who

are planning to write the soundtrack for the film to be made about "Tommy", although none of them will star in it....Mick Jagger will be off to Australia soon to star in "Ned Kelly".

Have you heard the new single by The Plastic Ono Band? Rumour has it that John Lennon, Yoko Ono, Tommy Smothers, Petula Clark and Timothy Leary all got together in John and Yoko's hotel room during their last bed-in for peace in Canada to record "Give Peace A Chance". This chant-like song is guaranteed to be the next thing to be heard at an anti-war rally.

Following the path cleared by The Guess Who, another Canadian group, Motherlode, looks like it is going to have a million selling single in the U.S. with a song they wrote themselves called "When I Die".....Chuck Trois, formerly a member of the 1910 Fruitgum Company and The Soul Survivors, has formed his own group called The National Bank. With Chuck in the group are several musicians who used to be members of Mitch Ryder's band.
