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FEMALE IMPERSONATORS IN ALEX REVUE

Toronto: Honest Ed Mirvish, owner of the Royal Alexandra Theatre, has taken a giant step that perhaps a few years ago may have been a disaster for a legitimate house – but now that we are living in an era of new morality, his gamble of presenting a camp revue by female impersonators could net him a box office smash. Early box office enquiries and press interest would indicate a successful three day showing for FACAD – The Global Village's Satirical Masterpiece. Show dates have been set as Aug 21 at 8:30 PM and a 9:45 curtain for Aug 22 and 23.

Although the art of female impersonation

is not new to Toronto it is the first time a legitimate theatre has staged a performance of this type.

Producer of the show is Robert Swerdlow, with G.G. Mills directing and Lee Brown as co-director.

A press release issued by the Royal Alexandra Theatre indicates "For the Royal Alexandra, Swerdlow, Mills and co-director Lee Brown have expanded the cast to include eight queens (their own word), plus a couple of 'boys'. Only three of them are from the original cast, and for a largely 'straight' audience the treatment will be deliberately broadened."

GRAHAM TOWNSEND CAPTURES SHELBURNE AWARD FOR FOURTH YEAR

Shelburne, Ont: RPM carried the story of the 19th Annual Fiddlers' Contest which took place Aug. 8 and 9 but because of press deadline were unable to publish the name of the Grand Champion.

For the fourth year in a row, Graham Townsend, Banff recording artist, took the top honours. It's expected that this will be the last year Townsend will enter the contest.

Mr. George Taylor, president of Rodeo

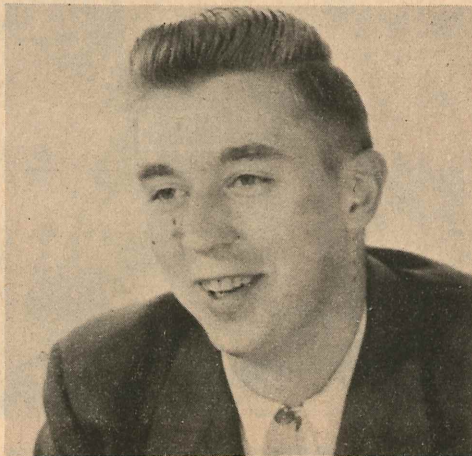
Records, of which Banff is a part, regards the Shelburne Championships as an important part of the folk and old time scene. Much of the sales success of Townsend's album product has come about through his award winning efforts at the Shelburne event. His latest LP release "I Like Don Messer", which has been chalking up good sales is expected to show extra gains in the next few weeks.

PLOTNIKOFF READING LP OF ORIGINALS

Kinnaid, B.C; Serge Plotnikoff, president of Kin-Gar Records & Publications (BMI) is currently readying an album of his own original material to be produced, arranged and performed by himself.

"Songs Of The Land, Life, People", the working title of the proposed new LP contains several of Plotnikoff's compositions that have become local favourites and include: "The Doukhorbor Story", which tells of the struggle of this small religious group who migrated to Canada in 1899 and who have suffered from many outside prejudices and made international news

when they rebelled against society for the right to live as they choose; "The Canada Song", which Plotnikoff received an assist from his wife, tells the story of the growth of Canada including the ethnic contribution; "People Of Our World", a sing-along type of song depicting



true happenings in everyday affairs from newspaper headlines and radio news, and told the way it is.

There are six other Plotnikoff compositions on the LP which is planned for release by the fall of this year.

CHUM BOWS HISTORY OF ROCK & ROLL

Toronto: Radio station CHUM bowed "A CHUM History Of Rock And Roll" – Monday August 18th – to be broadcast four hours each day (7 to 11 PM) for seven consecutive days.

The documentary, which was conceived by Fred Sherrat, Vice President CHUM Ltd., and J. Robert Wood, Program Supervisor CHUM Radio, was launched several months ago.

The series of programs will cover the era of rock and roll from 1957 through to the present date – and will cover the activities of Canadian artists in the development of the rock scene – throughout the world. The recording activities of artists like Canada's Paul Anka, The Crewcuts, The Diamonds, The Guess Who, Shirley Matthews, Gordon Lightfoot, Bobby Curtola, Little Caesar, Andy Kim, and The Motherlode will be included in the documentary.

The archives of information from RPM were utilized to assist in some of the historical background for the program – and noted CHUM commentator and presently vice President Creative Development, is credited with the writing. The entire production was done in Canada in the Toronto studios of CHUM.

The 28 hour CHUM History Of Rock And Roll will be made available – free – to other stations – through the CAB Program Exchange, on a first-come-first-served basis.

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Singing and writing since the age of nine, Serge Plotnikoff has gathered together a large collection of pop, folk and country selections which he has made available to other recording artists. He makes appearances throughout the province of British Columbia as well as the prairie provinces and just recently attracted a large and appreciative audience at the Association of Canadians of Russian Descent Jubilee in Saskatchewan where he sang several of his songs at the youth rally.

The Plotnikoff album will be released on the Kin-Gar label but as yet there is no information available as to a national distributor.

BLUENOSE MUSIC INCREASES DISC ACTION

Toronto: Greg Hambleton, president of Bluenose Music, announces the release of over 30 Bluenose compositions on disc over the past three months. This is somewhat of a record for an independent publisher, particularly in Canada, and brings much attention to the fast growing pubbery who have been able to attain a consistent reputation for having good material.

Single releases that have attained national

recognition include the Buckstone Hardware's "Pack It In", Christopher Edward Campaign's "You're My Life" and the just released Eighth Day's "Bring Your Love Back".

Bluenose material has also been released on album and single tracks by Wayne Versage, The Sultan Street Nine, Suzanne, Candy Rock Fountain, Tuesday's Children, The Humble Sponge, Gloria Kaye, and Johnny McGory.

DECCA BOWS NEW LOGO AT SALES CONFLAB

Miami Beach Florida: A new look, a new logo, and a new audio impact were unveiled at the first National Promotion and Sales Convention of Decca Records at The Americana Hotel in Miami Beach July 31st through August 3rd.

Decca's philosophy for the future: "Nothing is permanent except change", was aptly depicted in a series of meetings and seminars, highlighted by audio and visual presentations of new product and approaches to the world of recorded sound. The group of more than 300 who attended (including a delegation from The Compo Company and associates from M.C.A. Records from all over the globe) were given a preview of the year ahead for Decca and its affiliate labels.

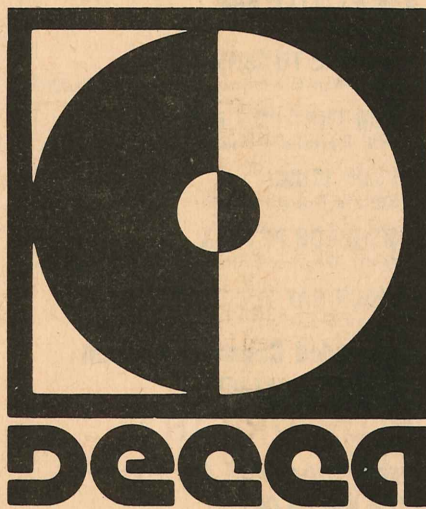
"There's a new excitement at Decca" said Bill Gallagher, Executive Vice President of Decca Records, "With sales already 40% ahead of last year and tape exploding here, as elsewhere, Decca has already taken the first step toward developing a new hit product in moves away from the 'traditional catalogue company' image".

Decca's new logo is the first step in this "New Image". The product upon which it will be displayed includes albums such as "Traces Of Love" by Bert Kaempfert, "And So To Bed" by Herbert Rehbein, Mike Leander's "A Time For Young Love", and Vinnie Bell's "Good Morning Starshine".

Contemporary albums include "An Eye For An Ear" by Canadian singer Terence, which was recorded and produced in Toronto and New York, "The Joys Of Life" by newcomer Karen Beth and Christopher Scott's "moog" in a set tagged "Switched On Bacharach".

Special items included "Judy Garland's Greatest Hits", Lionel Hampton's "Steppin'

Out Vol. 1", "The Birth Of Soul" by various artists and a sequel to Decca's hit LP of "W. C. Fields" titled "The Marx Brothers - Original Voice Tracks From Their Greatest Movies".



Compo's Sales Manager (Apex Records Division) Lee Armstrong was applauded for his efforts in securing the material for Decca's upcoming "David Clayton Thomas" album which is skedded for a September release.

Highlight of the convention was the presentation of some of the label's major talents during closeout banquets in the ballroom of the hotel. Friday evening (1) performers included country artists Jack Greene, Jeanie Seeley, Bill Anderson and Jan Howard among others.

The Saturday show (2) was devoted to a program of pop and contemporary music with staged excitement by the Irish Rovers, Leapy Lee, The Peppermint Rainbow, Jimmy Damon, McKendree Spring and newcomers, Karen Wyman, and Peter Cofield, a young poet-composer-singer, who's first Coral album will soon be released.

POLYDOR HOLDS FIRST NATIONAL MEET

Montreal: The week of July 21st proved to be a historic and memorable one. Man set foot on the moon – while Polydor Records held its first major National Sales Convention at the plush Mont Gabriel Lodge in Quebec's Laurentians. The theme "Sound 21" was appropriately illustrated by the use of a global picture printed on plastic and illuminated by a lighting fixture which hung sphere-like from the ceiling. It was in this atmosphere that plans were laid to continue the progress Polydor Records had made in its first year.

Frank Henry, National Sales Manager, launched the Convention by welcoming the staff and introducing Mr. Fred Exon, Managing Director, who officially opened the proceedings. He extended a welcome to Polydor's management, sales and promotion staff from across the country.

Out of country executives who attended the Convention included Jerry Schoenbaum, President of Polydor Inc. in the U.S. and his General Marketing Director, Jim Frey; Mr. D. Bliersbach, Executive Commercial Director of Deutsche Grammophon, Hamburg, and Mr. W. Triepke who is in charge of the Hamburg Management for Canada.

Following the introduction, Guy Bertrand, General Marketing Manager gave a brief summary of the past year-and-a-half of Polydor's

Sales Operations.

Gilles Marchand, Classical Marketing Manager and his assistant, Vas Pollakis, highlighted their classical presentation with the release of "Classical Gassers" on Music Guild. Included on the set are themes from "Elvira Madigan", "Interlude", "Rosemary's Baby" and "2001 Space Odyssey". They introduced six new multiple albums – to be released this fall – to be sold at low prices (for a limited time only) and will come under Deutsche Grammophon's Annual Subscription Series. New product from Heliodor, Music Royale, Privilege, the regular DGG, Archive and Westminster were also introduced.

Winfried Birkenfeld, Label Chief for European labels gave a very interesting and informative presentation on Polydor Hamburg; Polydor London; Ariola from Munich; and Island Records. Among the new releases introduced from Germany was Stereo Musicale which consists of five records and includes Roberto Delgado, John Scott Orchestra, Tommy Reilly, Peter Thomas, and James Last "In Concert". One of the new sounds coming from Germany is an album by Nick Barbarossa tagged "Sounds Ltd.". From Polydor England comes a new group name of Taste and the new supergroup, Blind Faith. From Island Records, two new groups, Spooky Tooth and Free. A release from Ariola, Munich

is Jo Ment's "Happy Sound". The first in this series is called "Tops For Dancing".

David Garneau, Label Chief for the U.S., introduced from ABC, the Otis Redding musicians, The Upsetters; "Truck Stop" LP by Jerry Smith; a new album by Ford Theatre; and a new B.B. King called "Live And Well". His presentation also included new product from the underground Probe label, Impulse and Riverside. Polydor New York introduced their latest and very hot All Night News Boys LP which was produced by Jimi Hendrix.

Rudi Assaly, head of Polydor's Tape Division, presented Polydor's world of music – on tape. He emphasized the growing popularity and usefulness of the cassette and introduced the new stereo Polydor Kiddy cassettes which he described as entertaining as well as educational.

Guy Bertrand, Sales Manager for the Quebec branch, gave a talk about the future productions of French Canadian artists and vividly outlined the potential of Canadian recordings. He also gave a brief rundown on future releases from Polydor France.

New releases of Canadian product was presented by Mr. Exon and Polydor's Executive Producer, Bob Hahn. This included productions by George Walker; Looking Glass; Major Hoople's Boarding House; Life; Trilogy; and Michael Vincent.

The week concluded with a guided tour of ▶

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Polydor's new and modern plant for the production of musicassettes. Indications are – this facet of the business will play a significant part in the future of Polydor Records Canada.

Throughout the week, members of the staff hosted individual presentations garbed in different costumes which added a touch of internationalism to the event. Miss Lori Bruner, National Sales Promotion Director was dressed as a Canadian Indian maid with Guy Bertrand dressed in an old French Canadian farmer costume which led, naturally, to a Canadian toast. Germany was toasted with the famous Lowenbrau beer by Winfried Birkenfeld who was garbed in a German Alpine outfit. Rudi Assaly, bedecked in a colourful Lebanese costume, toasted the country of Lebanon while a belly dancer enter-

tained; David Garneau, with the use of psychedelic music, toasted the U.S., and Vas Pollakis who chose the Grecian national drink, ouzo, treated the staff with his choice of Bouzouki music and a toast to Greece.

The Grand Finale was the Thursday evening dinner which ended the Convention. Major Hoople's Boarding House, who have just signed to the label, were the guest artists for the evening.

Results to date: 117 CTL albums, 156 CTL-participating stations. 37 newest CTL albums released for sale to the public on

RCA Victor, London, Capitol, Harmony and Camden labels. The BBC in its second year programming CTL music throughout the U.K., helping make Canadian performers better known abroad.

As the Canadian Talent Library begins its eighth year, its founders salute the enlightened broadcasters who co-operate to make possible this "Made-In-Canada" success.

Montreal: Jacques Druelle, manager, classical division London Records, reports an excellent sales return for their classical catalogue for the quarter ending in July.

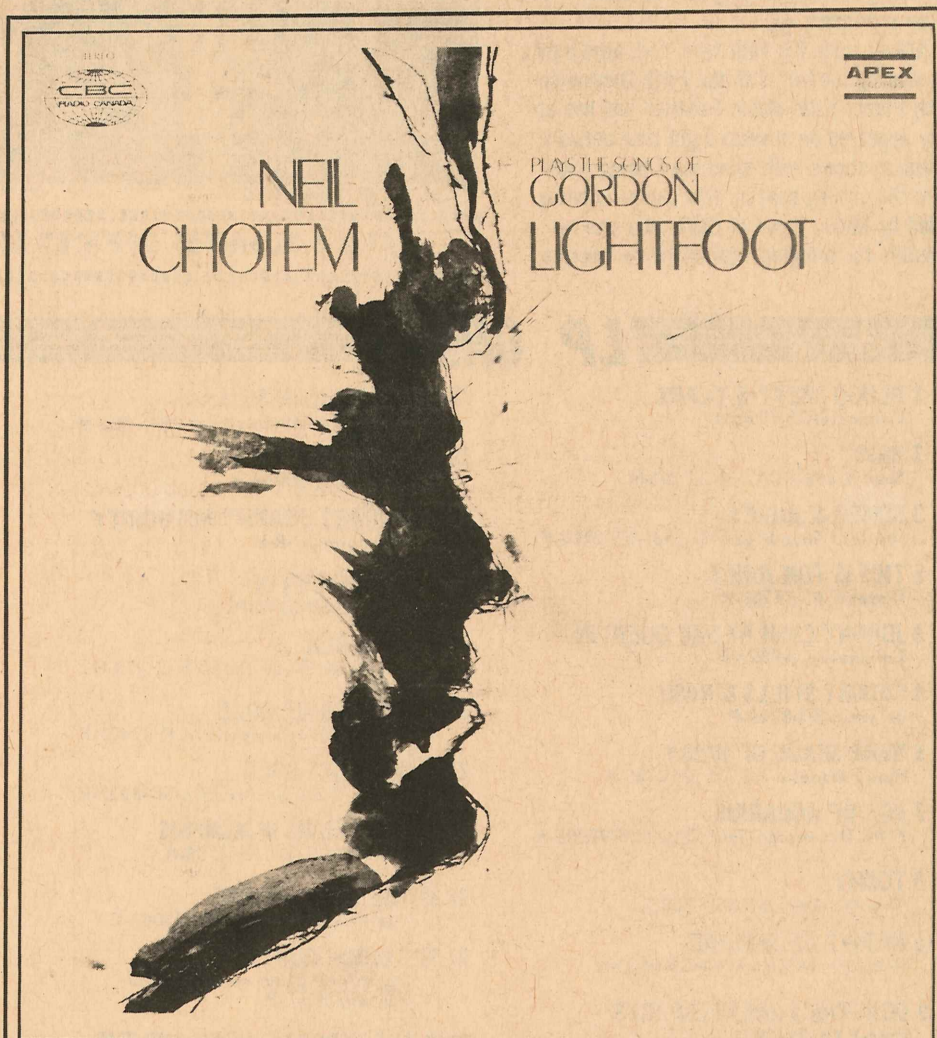

Nash On Sick Call

Ex-Hollies star Graham Nash, now part of America's Crosby, Stills & Nash, was reported seriously ill last week in Los Angeles with a throat infection. Doctors revealed that Graham has a growth on his vocal chords, and has been ordered to stop speaking for two weeks. An operation was considered, but the doctors

decided against it, at least for another few years. Many singers develop these small growths, called polyps, on their vocal chords as a result of strain while singing. It is particularly difficult for Graham because of his high pitched voice.

He is presently resting at his home in Laurel Canyon, California. His illness delayed the live debut of the group at New York's Fillmore East a few weeks ago. Plans are being made however, for the group to appear in Britain, possibly at the Royal Albert Hall in September. Ex-Buffalo Springfield member Neil Young has been added to the group as guitarist, thus making it known as Crosby, Stills, Nash & Young.

Bob Dylan will most probably make his first British concert appearance in three years at the Isle of Wight Pop Festival in August. Dylan apparently agreed to appear, it is now a matter of negotiating a contract, and setting the date. The festival will run for three nights, and already booked are The Who, Moody Blues, Fat Mattress, King Crimson, Pentangle and many other groups. It is hoped that Richie Havens will come from the U.S. with Dylan.

Jehro Tull is set for a month long tour in England this fall, and they will promote the entire thing themselves - the reason, says group leader Ian Anderson, is to give all the artists appearing a chance to play what they want to play, and for as long as they want.

Manfred Mann Chapter Three is going to play their first set of concert dates in Sept. and release an lp to coincide with the tour... ..The William Bell tour was cancelled in England because there is at present another William Bell touring there!.....Robin Gibb hosted a 97 piece orchestra when he conducted them and recorded "To Heaven And Back", his latest composition. The single will be billed as The Robin Gibb Orchestra and Chorus.....Diane Craig has replaced Marianne Faithfull in "Ned Kelly", playing the role of Mick Jagger's (Ned Kelly's) sister.

The first album by Blind Faith has been banned in some parts of America because

the jacket design shows a naked girl to the waist, holding a silver space craft. Some dealers felt this was offensive, so the record company has released an alternate cover, thus giving buyers a choice. The contents of the record however, are the same in both.

Rumor has it that Lulu, having recently left producer Mickie Most, will record for the same label as does her husband.....Speaking of Mickie Most, he will produce Nancy Sinatra this week when she arrives in London to recordJackie Wilson and Eddie Floyd will tour England together this fall.

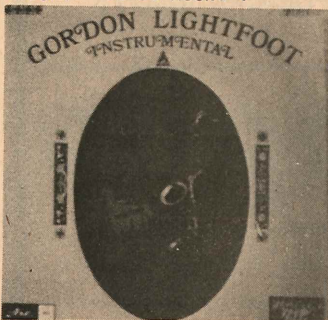
