

Columbia host art bash for Syrinx

Increasing activities at Nimbus 9 Prods.

Nimbus 9, foremost in Canadian independent production, seem determined to maintain that position with stepped up recording activity. The new Cat single "Sunflower" f/s "Take My Life" is ready for release this week. Both sides were penned by group member Mike McQueen who is also responsible for the Toronto Together outing, "We're All In This Together". The single was produced by Jack Richarson and Bob Ezrin at the RCA Mid-America Studios in Chicago.

Noah (formerly Tyme and a Half) had their first album released this week, simultaneously in the United States and Canada. The group from Trenton, Ontario includes Paul Clapper and Marinus Vandertogt who penned all material on the album.

Nimbus' stock in trade, the Guess Who, won again with their "Share the Land" album. In only a few weeks of release RCA has shipped over 350,000 in the U.S. alone, almost assuring it of instant certification in the States. The album is making similar dramatic progress north of the border. The Guess Who appear in Toronto at the O'Keefe Centre on November 8th following their Queen's University gig in Kingston on the 7th. Then, on December 2nd, the group leaves for a ten day European tour which takes them to the U.K., Holland, Belgium and Germany. "American Woman", a million seller, is now appearing in the top ten of charts in such diverse places as Venezuela and Malaysia.

Among other happenings, the Tobi Lark/Toronto Together deck of "We're All In This Together" was released this week in the United States. A highly favourable response is anticipated. One of Nimbus' newer signings, the Enchanted Forest, is skedded for recording in November. The all girl group have been acclaimed throughout the U.S. and having appeared on the Ed Sullivan and Johnny Carson TVers. In the be-

In addition to production for the Nimbus label, Ezrin and Richardson have been busy producing for major U.S. labels. For RCA, the two have been working with new group at the Chicago studios and are presently hard at it with sessions for Warner-Reprise's Alice Cooper. Both single and album sessions are underway.

Workshop established for writer composers

BMI Canada Limited have established Canada's first workshops for professional writers and composers. The workshops are to be held at BMI's Valleybrook Drive location.

With much emphasis being placed on Canadian film and musical productions of late as well as an increased interest by composers and authors in writing for these fields BMI found it advantageous to establish this first for Canada.

The announcement of the above was made by BMI's Nancy Gyokeres. It was also stated that "The aims of the workshops are not only to stimulate professional writers, but also to encourage and develop new creative talent for the contemporary field".

Workshops will be held separately for films and musicals. The first meeting, for musical theatre was held in April and the one dealing with films in September.

Lehman Engel, distinguished U.S. composer and musical director, addressed the April gathering. He will conduct the Musical Theatre Workshop sessions. Richard Kirk vice-president BMI Inc. (California) was the speaker for the September session.

BMI Inc. have held Musical Theatre Workshops in New York, Los Angeles and Nashville, The establishment of the Canadian sessions will eliminate the necessity of Canadian writers travelling to these centres.

Engel returned to Toronto (Oct.9) for the first working session of BMI's Musical Theatre Workshop. A session for Canadian films is expected within the next two months.

CMS picks up distrib

Jury Krytiuk, of Canadian Music Sales, announces the acquisition of the Sugar Hill label for Canadian distribution. The Nashville-based label will initially release singles by Raymond A. Smith and Stann Gunn. The Smith single is "Fifteen Years Ago" a self-penning which Conway Twitty currently has happening. Gunn comes forth with "I'll Be There" a rousing gospel number.

US release for Gene MacLellan single

Following the Canadian invasion of the international marketplace by Little Caesar and the Consuls, the Guess Who, the Poppy Family, Mashmakhan, Lighthouse, Gordon Lightfoot, Edward Bear and others, "Snowbird" composer, Gene MacLellan makes his bid for international recognition with "The Call". Released in Canada some time ago, "The Call" achieved success in most formats. Flip of the U.S. release is MacLennan's own version of "Snowbird". MacLellan records for Capitol, Canada.

New acts & new action for Love Productions

Love Productions, which has come from literally nowhere to its present position of being a major force in independent production, is envisioning even more ambitious undertakings for the winter months. In the past couple of weeks, Love has completed negotiations with four new acts and is preparing a rush release on one of them, Christmas from Oshawa. The four acts, Christmas, Matt Lucas, Anne Bridgeford and a group called the Ming Dynasty, are skedded for release on Love's label, Daffodil, distributed in Canada by Capitol.

Frank Davies of Love has been in New York in recent days negotiating U.S. rights for Christmas, whose debut album on Daffodil, "Heritage" is skedded for November 15th release. Idea behind the push is to provide simultaneous U.S./Canadian release for the set to take full advantage of the extensive promotional effort Capitol is readying. All material on the set was composed by group member Bob Bryden.

While in New York, Davies also entered into talks with Dee Anthony of Bandana Management for the handling of Christmas. Davies and Anthony have already reached an agreement on the management of Crowbar. Bandana handles such groups as Joe Cocker, King Crimson, Ten Years After and Jethro Tull. North American PR for King Biscuit Boy and Crowbar is being handled by Bob Gibson who performs a similar function for the Guess Who, Traffic and others.

Among the other Love signings, Matt Lucas is set to lay down several sides for an early 1971 release. Lucas had an early-sixties hit with "I'm Moving On".

Anne Bridgeford, also an experienced performer, from Detroit, has a single release projected for January. The Ming Dynasty have already laid down a number of tracks, several of which are being considered for

single release, again in January of 1971.

Said Davies, "We auditioned at least fifty different acts before deciding on the four we have named. There is an amazing amount of talent around at present, but we think we've made the right decisions."

Upcoming from Love is announcement of further world representation of the company's repertoire, specifically in Europe and South East Asia. Also in the works is a second King Biscuit Boy album, "Gooduns", and a follow-up single, both to be released in February in Canada and the United States. According to Davies: "By Christmas of 1971, we intend to have at least three separate acts established on the world market."

National marketing manager, Joe Pariselli, has unveiled a Vanguard "twofer" series in which double albums show a suggested list of \$6.98. The first release under the deal is scheduled for this month with "Chicago Blues" featuring Muddy Waters and James Cotton.

The Vanguard line includes the Bach Guild Series, Everman Classics and the Cardinal Series in addition to Vanguard. Featured are such artists as Ian & Sylvia, Buffy Ste. Marie, Country Joe and the Fish and Joan Baez. Skedded for the near future is a "Best of" series designed to fully exploit the strength of the catalogue.

Columbia negotiates for Carrol Baker recordings

Don Grashey, president of DMG Sound Studios of Thunder Bay, Ontario, reports the finalizing of a production and lease agreement with Columbia Records of Canada. The deal involves all disc product by Carrol Baker.

Miss Baker is currently showing chart action with her initial release, "Mem-Ries of Home": written by George Petralia of Oshawa, Ontario.

The Baker release and subsequent chart action without a national distributor is somewhat unique. Grashev mailed the disc to every important country radio personality across Canada as well as a good representation of jocks at MOR stations. With the disc he included a ballot-type form giving the jocks the opportunity of sounding off against or for the single. Returns were high (approximately 38%) and most indicated the disc had already been charted or placed on playlists. Reports to RPM indicated the single had potential which resulted in a listing on the RPM Country Fifty.

"Ride the MacDonald Cartier Freeway up the charts" will be the slogan used by the label and the group for the coming weeks of engagements.





Anne Murray certifies for US million seller

Capitol recording star, Anne Murray, who has topped the charts of the world with her Gene MacLellan penning of "Snowbird" has certified for U.S. Gold (3).

Presentation of a Gold Record, which represents the sale of 1,000,000 copies, will be made on the Merv Griffin TVer, Nov. 10.

Miss Murray is the first Canadian female vocalist to top the million mark in the U.S. It's expected she will certify for Canadian Gold within the next few weeks.

Ready for release is her followup single, "Sing High, Sing Low", which is expected to become a strong chart item before "Snowbird" moves off the charts.

Miss Murray is represented on the RPM 100 Albums chart with her two album releases, "Honey, Wheat & Laughter" and "This Way Is My Way".

Horus, the trio have had the lyrical content checked out by a reputable law firm, claimed to be "fully acquainted with the War Measures Act." This law firm has apparently found the contents to be "perfectly clear of any violations whatsoever."

Described as "totally pro-Canada and along the same lines that the government has been advocating," the final verse reads:

"A thing like this could bring a country down but, in our case it's got us right off the ground and, it's led us to the place where we all have to see That we're all one country and

the same family."

The production, perhaps, leaves something to be desired, but the song, obviously Canadian Cajun (Acadian) or Holland Marsh (swamp) is catchy and has much potential. The lyrics aren't that politically offensive but there is an element of chance that could create a police action.

Eye of Horus have only one other alternative and that's to door knock in the U.S. If released in a foreign country and "officially banned" for airplay in Canada, the disc could become one of the hottest "true underground" releases on the market — if it gets on the market.



I do the Rock Show here and after taking a count of the Current Top 100 in Billboard and Cashbox, I find we have about 60 of the records. Some are a month or so old and others a week. We may get some of these and others we'll never see.

I think Canadian Record Distributors should get on the Stick and realize that we sell their records, and make the hits at Canadian Radio Stations.

I must add that not all labels give us poor service, some have been EXTRA-GOOD to us, HOWEVER, there are many offenders.

All I ask is something to keep my listeners from tuning to USA stations to hear the current TOP 40.

Thank you for taking time to read this letter and I hope you can find a space to publish it or at least inform the record companies that something has to be done.

SING OUT EDMONTON!!!!

As a concerned Canadian announcer working in Western Canada; may I ask where is your Western Canadian content? The kind of development here in Edmonton recently has to effect the Canadian Recording Industry shortly.

Let me be the first to tell you of two names you will be hearing a lot of within the next year. The first is a group called UMBRA currently learning about entertainment and entertaining the hard way (the only way), in front of a live audience. This group has the dancers and drinkers standing to listen, laugh, and applaud during their sets, it's more than music it's ENTERTAINMENT!

The other name to watch for is Mick Burr; a young man who moved to Edmonton to write and compose. His belief that he has to work at writing has his material improving rapidly. Everytime I hear Mick's new material (which is at least once a month) I'm more and more impressed.

In Edmonton alone the number of groups and single entertainers with potential is overwelming; may I suggest on that basis a Western Canadian rep for RPM: ITS HAPPENING HERE TOO!

A few guidelines for the new songwriters

All songwriters, especially new writers should be on guard against song sharks. Or the practice of extracting money from songwriters, for little or poor service. Including charging excessive prices for writing music of low quality, to a writer's poem, plus a low grade demo of the completed song. The sad part of this is that many songwriters have sent these demos to publishers, and recording companies with the obvious results.

In recent years many new ideas and gimmicks have been used in regard to this kind of business. Out of interest and curiosity, I have been collecting, mostly by inquiry, many of the current services offered to songwriters. Among the offers which I have received, after submitting a song or song poem, include one to broadcast my song on a special weekly radio program. This, of course, after I have paid the usual collaboration fee. The only value of this service, is that someone may hear your song, and want to use it. The chance of this happening could be very remote, since

the songs would be broadcast on a local station in the United States.

Another offer which I received, was for a guaranteed income of at least twenty percent of the collaboration fee, over a period of two years or more. If my song poem was selected as suitable to be used. Which is another way of saying that you get a twenty percent discount on the collaboration fee, even if your song is never heard of again.

In one offer, the point was made, there would be no charge to me, for the recording and pressing of my song, if it was selected. But each time I sent in music to go with my poem which they had selected, I was told it was unsuitable, and that I would have to collaborate with one of their composers, at the usual fee.

In another case, at a fairly reasonable cost, I could have had my own master tape of my song, pressed on an LP along with nine other new songs. An idea which

But with each song or song poem submitted, two dollars had to be sent as well, to defray costs of handling and mailing. There is one thing certain about this kind of offer, your song or song poem may be returned, but your two dollars will not.
