Anne Murray achieves highest Canadian award

#### Red carpet press for Haligonian Murray

While some of the better-known Upper Canadian newspaper columnist and showbiz radio types, make vain attempts to shoot down Canada's high soaring Snowbird, Anne Murray's hometown paper, the Halifax Chronicle Herald, gives front page photo space to this young Canadian phenomenon. With her Capitol recording of "Snowbird" written by another Haligonian, Gene MacLellan and produced in Toronto's Bay Studios by Brian Ahern, certifying for U.S.Gold (R.I.A.A.) Nov. 3 and for Canadian Gold (RPM Gold Leaf) Nov.12, she should be good news for Canada's press. This is the first time a Canadian female vocalist has entered this hallowed and respected area of recognition.

Coming up for Miss Murray is a break-through into another almost closed club for Canadian per-

formers - the Imperial Room of the Royal York Hotel (Nov.30). Capitol will lay on one of their lush affairs for this Canadian beauty, usually reserved for top foreign acts. Just prior to her Toronto opening she is skedded to participate in the Miss Grey Cup festivities as well as perform in concert with Paul Mauriat at the Ottawa National Arts Centre.

Just released and making fast gains up the charts is her new single, "Sing High, Sing Low" which was written by Torontonian Brent Titcomb.Miss Murray sang this number on the Merv Griffin TVer, seen in Ontario out of Buffalo's WBEN-TV (Channel 4). Glen Campbell reportedly presented Miss Murray with her U.S.Gold Disc, but if he did Channel 4 viewers were shortchanged. Said one observer: "Maybe someone said something dirty and they bleeped the whole presentation".

#### Mercey Brothers move back to Edison Hotel

The Edison's Jimmy Clemens knows how to bring out the Nova Scotia shufflers. He doesn't miss a chance to book in Columbia's famous Canadian brother team the Merceys. They returned to the Yonge St. country showplace and after three songs on their opening set, the Edison started to fill up. Even the Columbia people fresh from their smash "free concert" success at Massey Hall with Perth County Conspiracy dropped in to give the Mercey Brothers a little hand support.

Larry, Lloyd and Ray have been tagged a country act - and unfairly. That's not to say they don't appreciate this bag, but they have much more to offer. They can take a current popper or one of their own brand and make it sound as if they cut their eye teeth on rock - maybe they did. Anyway the brand of music and the variety they lay on their audiences is one of the reasons they are perhaps one of the most successful Canadian groups in the business which goes for both booking and records

They recently hit the charts with "Pretty Woman", a foreign copyright and good for that market. But the Canadian country jocks kinda dug the flip - "Old Bill Jones", a Cochrane penning (Berandol-BMI). So popular has this side become it has now taken over as the plug side. The Merceys will perform the "Jones" side on their coming "Tommy Hunter Show" Dec. 4. (CBC-TV) as well as on Cy True's

big Halifax happening, "Country-time" (CBC-TV).

The Mercey Brothers recently went the route of the Canadian Talent Library from which came their first wholly produced Canadian session, with many of the selections written by Canadians. This wasn't their best effort however. Country acts are a completely different breed from their rock 'n rollin' and middle of the roadin' cousins. They don't dig the "clock" scene, and when they have to finish a session within a certain time limit, they tend to tense up which is unnatural for them. They get a little sloppy and nervous and whamo, you might as well forget it. That's why they're referred to as "earthy" people. They like to take their time and gain the confidence of the studio just as they do their audience in a club. They're back into RCA's Toronto studios and an album production by Gary Buck, himself a country performer and one who understands. This session will be made up completely of Canadian compositions.

Between Mercey Brothers' sets there's a solo act who's getting better and better and better. His name is Johnny Haines and he has a way of wailing and pickin' and harpin' that makes the Edison a continuous flow of good entertainment. Anyone interested in a struggling young artist who could be the Canadian discovery of the year?

## Seals & Croft savor taste of Canadiana

When Texans Seals and Crofts returned to Canada and Bernie Fiedler's Riverboat they received good notices and a pleasant look at Canadiana in the raw.


The Globe's Jack Batten tagged the duo as being "more in the business of creating an ambulance of peace and harmony than of merely singing their songs,' - and Quality added to this warm press feeling with a bus jaunt into one of Ontario's happy valleys, Terra Cotta, and a well laid-on spread at the Inn bearing the same name. The party, arranged by Quality's Ontario sales manager, Jack Vermeer and promotion manager Mark Robbins, wasn't the best attended but it was one of the more intimate and interesting bashes of the year - which is really what Seals & Crofts are all about - song intimacy.

Meanwhile back at the Riverboat, these soft spoken messengers of peace, but not really rebels, pulled good houses, much to the delight of Fiedler who booked the pair in for ten days, this time.

The last trip into Toronto, Seals & Croft had just released their first Bell album. After a look-see at their Riverboat show, RPM noted: "They sing about 'Today', they sing about 'Earth'. They dig cows, and the Baha'i religion, to which they are recent converts. They are so unlike, in physical makeup, and almost disturbingly unharmonious, vocally and instrumentally (who or what can harmonize with an amplified mandolin?) but their clash makes for a beautiful sound." That was back in July - and there has been a change, in their stage delivery and certainly on their second album release. From the stage angle, and Batten also sensed it when he wrote: "Seals and Crofts radiate an absolutely pleasurable, convincing and occasionally touching sense of union, subtlety and togetherness."

All that can be really added to the above is the fact that their new album is also "togetherness" although four cuts were produced in New York while the remainder reveals the superb quality of both studios and musicians of San Francisco.

Manager Marcia Blake, a Californian, accompanied Seals & Crofts on their return trip to Canada.

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## George Hamilton IV goes U.K. country

George Hamilton IV, who tops the popularity poll for American country singers in Canada, has brought his pickin' and singin' to old blighty - and they apparently dig it. Says Murray Kash of London, England: "This is the very first time the BBC has ever done a country music show on television and if it goes well there are plans for many more".

Guests on the series, to run 9 weeks, includes: Slim Whitman, John D. Loudermilk and Murray Kash.

Hamilton has just returned to the States and a date in Statesboro, Georgia. He informs us that the theme for the new British TVer is Gordon Lightfoot's "Early Morning Rain", which he no doubt had a hand in arranging. RCA and

London have released Hamilton's now famous "Canadian Pacific", written by Calgary's Ray Griff, to tie-in with the television series. The album was released prior to the show and is now enjoying good sales action. The series got underway Nov. 13 - a Friday.

Another Canada-oriented album is skedded for Hamilton with the title song already written by Ray Griff. This time the session will be cut in Canada - at RCA's Toronto studios, with Canadian musicians. Allselections to be written by Canadians. George tags this one as "sort of a Canadian Pacific Vol 11". The new set will be more country-oriented and less folk-country.

A shot on the CBC-TVer, "The Tommy Hunter Show" is being skedded for Hamilton during his recording session. This show is now seen in several markets in the U.S.

#### Music Factory gaining on local scene

In the three months since the reformation of Music Factory by Wayne Thompson and William Tenn, the booking agency has become an important part of the Toronto and Ontario scene. Joe Thomas, who had much to do with the coordination of Mainline's recent tour of Australia, has joined Factory as an agent. He joins John Hearne, Doug Greer and Craig Nicholson.

"Block Booking" of colleges and universities has now become big business within the Factory complex. Bill Huard, formerly of Aura productions, has been given the responsibility of this new venture. Huard has booked some of the big ones throughout Canada including: the Guess Who, Chicago, Three Dog Night and Sly and The Family Stone. He also played an important part in last year's Strawberry Festival which was held at Mosport.

#### Expansion underway Canadian Bear Ltd.

Canadian Bear Ltd.(Edward Bear) have recently moved to a larger office complex at 40 Prince Arthur Ave. Toronto.

Included in their operation are Eeyor Music (Publishers); Ace Art (graphics) and Muscle Music. The latter is a new company formed to handle commercials for radio and TV using rock music.

Future plans for this aggressive trio of businessmen is to expand the company's involvment with total media productions including movies and writing. Music Factory's loft is also experiencing much action. Grant Spence and his staff have a full roster of dates for Lighthouse and Mudflat. The latter, who feature Grant Fullerton and Pinky Dauvin, formerly of Lighthouse and the Stitch 'N Tyme are becoming top potential. Lighthouse have just returned from a month of dates in Western Canada with the Royal Winnipeg Ballet.

Tenn reports much of the success of his business is due the activity on the record scene. Says Tenn: "I've never felt stronger about the potential of Toronto talent. There's not an act in our front line-up without an excellent recording contract happening. Toronto groups have the confidence they often lacked before, and as well, there's a strong Canadian spirit in the industry. It feels good".

#### Royal 'Peg Ballet & Lighthouse in Van.

With SRO appearances in Ottawa and Toronto and a television special upcoming, the Royal Winnipeg Ballet and Lighthouse moved out to the west coast for two days of sold out performances at the Queen Elizabeth Theatre in Vancouver. The show was promoted by CKLG. The station also presented Lighthouse at the University's of British Columbia and Victoria. According to Don Hamilton, vicepresident and general manager of the station, the Queen Elizabeth affair was sold out two days before the first performance. Promotion was restricted to CKLG and posters around town.

### Columbia's Perth County in concert

The Canadian record industry is going through a massive change. The change isn't, just more productions - it's an obvious development of a sound that is uniquely Canadian. Torontonians had an opportunity to sit in on this sound when Columbia Records sheckled out several hundred bucks and threw a free concert at Massey Hall (Nov. 16). There was no big splash of advertising, no tie-in with the conventional methods of promotion just a gentle word-spreading resulting in more than 1500 of an audience to witness Perth County Conspiracy and their "Ontario-ofono-kee" stylizing of "back to the land" offerings.

The Conspiracy has been born of these rebel times but, as Hamlet-trained Cedric Smith puts it: "There is no conspiracy—only conspirators." Smith and his co-conspirator, Richard Keelan, are the Conspiracy—that doesn't exist. If this sounds confusing—wait. There are about 30 more bodies that figure in this Conspiracy—that doesn't exist, and if you are of the hard-nosed establishment, don't be confused, forget the Perth County Conspiracy



and curl yourself around something familiar — like a "Pops Concert".

The Perth County's stage setting resembled something out of "Minnie-Ha-Ha", with a beautiful

black and shiny grand piano that looked as out of place as a whale in a minnow pond. There were a couple of brightly coloured and

## GRT presents a Montreal spectacular

GRT of Canada, a company which has become synonomous with spectacular press parties, celebrated its ascension into Canadian talent in Montreal this week (16) with what may well have been their most successful bash yet.

More than 200 of Montreal's leading press, radio-TV VIP's turned up for the event, which was organized by GRT's Quebec branch manager, Jim Corbett.

By all accounts, it was a memorable evening, made even more so by the live appearances of Everyday People, Cane and Abel, and Ronnie Hawkins with his new band, the Fedville University Collegiate Klan.

GRT president, Ross Reynolds and his able assistant, marketing manager Ed LaBuick, flew in from the Toronto head office, along with promotion gal, Jutta Ney, and Harry Hrabinsky.

The party kicked off with a welcoming speech by Ed LaBuick, who introduced the first performers of the evening, Everyday People. This six-piece group (comprising lead guitar and vocalist, Bruce Wheaton; keyboards and singer, Pamela Marsh; bass guitarist Carson Richards; drummer Alan Muggeridge; organ and pianist David J. Hare; and guitarist Christopher C. Paputts) produced a set which exceeded all expectations.

A featured song was "You Make Me Wonder", the act's first single which is already catching airplay across the land, and was featured in the Gavin report this week.

Altogether a fine, fine group—smoother harmonies, strong instrumentation, and forceful inperson appeal. GRT has a real winner with Everyday People.

Then came Ronnie Hawkins, making his first Montreal appearance in many years. His new group, which hails from Edmonton, was well received but, predictably, many people tried to compare it with Crowbar, which had been the Hawkins' backup group until April this year.

The group's featured singer, B.J., went down well. This long, lanky girl has a lot going for her, particularly within the realm of the concert stage. She has an enviable ability of whipping up excitement with sensual body movements and

all-round showmanship.

Cane and Abel, an eight-man Montreal soul group, rounded out the evening with a rowdy, ramrod set of standard R&B material. Their first single, a funky re-working of the Mamas and Papas' "California Dreamin", is already picking up strong play in Montreal.


At the end of the evening, one speculated on the wealth of Canadian talent which GRT has secured in such a short time. Undoubtedly leading the way in the tape scene, GRT is well on the way to becoming the country's first truly established taperecord operation, eminently able to discover and market Canadian talent without the dubious assistance of their parent companies.

Many Canadian record companies could take a lesson from GRT.

They may be new to the business, but what they might lack in experience is more than compensated by throbbing enthusiasm and energy. GRT's entry into Canadian talent is bound to have internation repercussions, and be of invaluable assistance to radio stations come January 18.

## Ohio's Lee Rand makes western showing

Lee Rand, who recently returned to western Canada after a successful go-round of promotion throughout upper Canada, has shown an increase in his booking power, particularly in the province of Alberta. During his Toronto stay,



his manager Bob Jefferies, opened several doors for the young singer.It's expected these contacts will guarantee Rand several dates in Ontario and Quebec in the

coming months. One of his most important contacts was with the CBC-TV's "Luncheon Date" crew. Rand made the Elwood Glover show, seen from coast to coast in Canada.

First date on his return to Alberta was the Club 41 in Cold Lake. So successful was the engagement that he has been booked back for February. Jefferies is now finalizing dates in Calgary and other areas throughout the province.

Rand has played many of the big

rooms in the west including: Winnipeg's Town N' Country, Jasper Park Lodge, Saskatoon's Bessborough, The Macdonald in Edmonton and others. He has also played clubs throughout the U.S.He had two shots on the Jackie Gleason TVer and just recently played Rodney Dangerfield's New York club.

Jefferies is currently negotiating a recording contract for his young singer. They have enough material in the can for an album, all cut at Edmonton's Damon Sound Studios.

#### Humperdinck sets and breaks own records

The first week of a skedded two week engagement at Toronto's O'Keefe for Parrot recording artist Engelbert Humperdinck, saw him chalk up a record \$144,303 at the box office.He broke this record when on his last night (Oct. 31), O'Keefe officials reported a gross box office that was in excess of \$145,000.

Not since the 1967 engagement of "Hello Dolly" starring Carol Channing has the O'Keefe registered such impressive returns. This show took in \$143,258 for one week.

Although security was fairly strict with regard to Humperdinck's movements, the London promotion effort handled by Ontario sales and promotion manager Ken McFarland and promotion rep Glen Russell, did manage to get the British chanter exceptional press and television coverage which added greatly to Humperdinck's box office success.





#### Haas into thirtieth year with Sunwapta

Edmonton's King of the squeeze-box, Gaby Haas, first hit the airways at the age of 18(1940)when he joined King Ganam for CFRN's 3 hour presentation of "Barndance" He became so popular with Edmonton and Northern Alberta listeners he was asked to take over the show in 1947, continuing threw until the show's demise in 1958. Regulars on the show included: the Rodgers Brothers, Joyce Smith, Stu Philips, Omar Blondahl, Dixie Dean and many others.

Haas bowed his "Chuckwagon" show on CFRN's television outlet in 1955 and now, fifteen years later with the show re-titled "Country Music", Haas can proudly point to what must almost be a record breaking association of 30 years with the Sunwapta Broadcasting Co.

Regulars on the Haas show in-

clude: Frank Rodgers, Joe Kozak, Rich Chernesky, Peppi Haas, and Hank Rodgers. Some of Canada's top country artists have appeared on the CFRN TVer over the years



including: Dick Damron, Jimmy Arthur Ordge, Jack Hennig Hank Smith, Gary Buck, Bob Smith, Bev Munro, Shirley Rodgers, Duane Davis, Tommy Hunter as well as a host of foreign country acts.

## Crescent 1220...first rock coffee house

Says Montreal Gazette's Dave Bist: "The need for a place like the Crescent 1220 was painfully obvious."The new club, actually it's the old Champ's Show Bar at Ste. Catherine and Dorchester, is Montreal's first rock coffee house. It's open from 8 PM to 6 AM the following morning.Live groups take the stand until 2 AM. The stage is then open for jamming until 6 AM. Owner Mike Gilligan would appear to be making a play for the freeformers (there's admission at the door).Up until this new club, the young crowd (not old enough for licenced premises) were left to catch entertainment as best they could, local dances or a jukebox joint. What Gilligan offers is top local talent and all the throbbing ear piercing necessaries for an accepted rock group, snacks (hamburgers, pizza's coffee etc.) and it's right downtown.

Bist, in writing in his "Sounds Like Montreal" column for the Gazette noted: "Crescent 1220 hopefully will find a very big need in this city, and maybe in the future - if things go well - could become a showcase for big names from the U.S."





large blankets, propped up on what looked like teepee poles. Scatter rugs were placed on the floor in front of the mikes. A candle flickered its message and a flashing red light topped the set.

When the audience became restless. a cat with a beard and boots came out and wrinkled off a few unfamiliar but pretty classical ripples on the piano. He was interrupted by another bewhiskered Quaker-cum-Mennonite-looking chap - which brought a cheer from the natives. This was, of course, all adding to the atmosphere and suspense of those who had never experienced the Conspiracy - that doesn't exist. Anyway, the cat on the piano tickled away for a bit until most of the downstairs seats were full. The houselights dimmed, the candle became excited and on came a wild and beautiful assortment of brightly clothed people of all ages numbering, perhaps, 30. They took positions front, centre and everywhere, which made one brace himself for a Joe Cocker ouslaught. But these were gentle people as the audience was soon to discover. Keeland and Smith were next and a bass player name of Michael Butler, who was just out of sight, to use an old establishment term. The piano again played an important part in getting Keelan, Smith, Butler and their thirty or so commune buddies all together and bustin' out with that old "people" music — so easy to transfer to an audience.

Keeland and Smith, the latter

often revealing much eloquence, went through a routine, perhaps strange but enjoyable. They were doing their own thing — and communicating beautifully. Both Keeland and Smith have an easy vocal delivery enhanced by an incredible relationship with their acoustic guitars. Keeland introduced his three-stringed dulcimer, and produced a solo bit that had every ear of the audience tuned in.

Somehow, Massey Hall and its bourgeois hoity-toityness softened and blended with the almost pageant-like goings-on of the Perth County happening.

One glance at the beaming Fred Wilmot, who looked more like a gentleman farmer than head of Columbia's giant Canadian operation, was proof enough that he had wiped away any doubts he may have had on the potential of the Perth County Conspiracy.

Their producer, Johnny Williams, who is Director of A&R for Columbia, was also over his sweat and although he expressed confidence in having waxed Canada's big entry into the world market, the Massey Hall experience was good for him.

One of the big boosters, manipulators, or anyway you want to tag him, of the Perth County Conspiracy, is Columbia's publicity and ad chief, Bill Eaton. He believes, and because of this belief, his network of promotion people, from coast to coast, have caught the fever. Perth County Conspiracy are as native to Dingle Beach, Nova Scotia as they are to Saskatchewan's Buf-

falo Narrows and Dog's Ear Park in British Columbia.

Here's another plus factor for Keeland, Smith and company — Toronto critics dig this Canadian group — a rare happening. Says the Telegram's Peter Goddard: "there are riches in their music that goes far beyond the notes." Bill Dampier of the Star writes: "The music is good. It is simple, melodic and sweet, without being saccharine."

"Perth County Conspiracy Does Not Exist" (Columbia ELS 376) is their initial release, and it's top fare for middle of the road, music of today, and country stations — not to mention the free-formers, sometimes referred to as "underground". One cut, "Keeper Of The Key", may be culled as their first single.

## Partridge item tops on West Coast--TP&C

Raymond Ramsay of Taylor, Pearson & Carson, reports increasing sales activity for the Partridge Family single "I Think I Love You" which topped the CKLG chart, week of Nov.9.This activity has also brought much attention to their album, which Ramsay tags as their big one for Christmas.

The month of October held many disc surprises for Vancouver fun seekers. Spade Neilsen, Birchmount recording star appeared with his group at the Gildford Shopping Centre Mall, for three shows and packed the place. The Original Caste did a noon hour show at U.B.C. as well as taped 2 shows for Mike Neun's CBC-TVer "In The Round". These tapings are skedded for the latter part of November.Ramsay found the Caste exceptionally cooperative in promoting their disc "Ain't That Tellin' You People".

"All For The Love Of Sunshine" by Hank Williams Jr. received a shot in the arm with his headlining a show at the Queen Elizabeth. Sharing the bill were: Sheb Wooley, Diana Trask and Lamar Morris.

The Mike Curb & His Congregation's "Burning Bridges" has been slow to catch on in Vancouver but Ramsay reports Curb's announcement on the drug scene, really whacked home. Says Ramsay, "The reaction, so far, has been positive".

A big sleeper looks like it could be the Laurel & Hardy album release, "Naturally High". Seems the Vancouver buyers dig this high camp set.

## Can. Talent Library draws int'l interest


