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GEORGE HAMILTON IV RECEIVES BILLBOARD TRENDSETTER AWARD

George Hamilton IV, one of the most active of country personalities, received Billboard's Trendsetter Award at a recent Awards presentation banquet.

The RCA recording star picked up his honours along with an Award for Tennessee Ernie Ford and Sandi Burnett, both accepted on behalf of Ray Canady, Opryland's Marketing Director. Also receiving a Trendsetter Award for the development of Contemporary Country Music format was KOKE Radio.

COLUMBIA ACTIVE WITH CONVENTION & SINGLES

Columbia Canada's top management journeyed to Atlanta recently as part of a major CBS convention held at the Fairmont Colony Square Hotel and hosted by Goddard Lieberson, president of the CBS Group. The Canadian operation was represented by Terry Lynd, Jack Robertson, Bob Gallo, Bert Dunseith, Charlie Camilleri and Julian Rice.

The convention coincided with a particularly strong surge of action for Columbia singles. Charlie Camilleri and Bert Dunseith report that the disco scene is so powerful that singles are being released on the strength of feedback from disco play. "I Just Can't Say Goodbye" by Philly Devotion and "Trusting Heart" by Trammps are just two singles that fit into this category. "Lady Marmalade" by Labelle has netted 25,000 in sales in Quebec and more than 1,000 in sales in Toronto through disco play only. Camilleri also indicated that the disco scene is picking up very well in western Canada, particularly in B.C. and Calgary.

Three Canadian singles gaining solid ground, predominantly in Ontario and Quebec, are Murray McLauchlan's "Do You Dream of Being Somebody", Myles and Lenny's "Can You Give It All To Me" and Bond's "Dancing on a Saturday Night".

On the retail scene, Columbia's special discount series for dealers at prices marked down to \$4.98 and \$5.98 has proved so successful, that the program has been extended to February 15th.

SINGLES, ALBUMS & TOURS CREATE ATTIC PROMOTION

Attic recording unit, Fludd, are now into a well paced ten day tour of the Maritimes. The label is expected to release their new single, "What An Animal", the first part of February, followed by their album, "Great Expectations". The group opened their eastern tour (Jan. 30) in Caraquet, New Brunswick and will see them play dates at St. Francis Xavier and Acadia Universities. They will also play several dates in the Halifax region.

Ron Nigrini joins the album crowd with his first for Attic under his own name. He is currently playing the Nags Head in Toronto where he will be until Feb. 22. Don Heard, guitarist and one of the session men on the Nigrini album, joins the group as a full-time member.

Newest signing to Attic, Ken Tobias, debuts his new material and backup group at Toronto's Chimney, Feb. 10 through the 15th. Off and already showing indications of catching is his first single for Attic, "Lady Luck".

QUALITY DISTRIBUTION FOR GOOD EAR LABEL

Good Ear, a U.K. label will soon bow the Canadian scene with album product by Viola Wills, Carol Crymes, Chris Stainton, Mike Harrison (ex-Spooky Tooth member) and a Canadian duo, Druick & Lorange.

The distribution deal was firmed by Quality's Vice-President and Managing Director, George Struth, Executive Assistant and Director of A&R for Quality, Bob Morten, and Nigel Thomas, President of Good Ear Records.

GINETTE RENO STARS AT RYH'S IMPERIAL ROOM

Toronto and area residents will have an opportunity to "catch a star" at the Royal York's Imperial Room when London recording star, Ginette Reno, the sweetheart of pop programmers, plays the big room from Feb. 10 through the 15th.

Reno is currently on release with a single, "T'es Mon Amour, T'es Ma Maitresse", a coupled performance with Jean-Pierre Ferland.

KUNG FU DANCE BREAKS FOR PYE'S DOUGLAS

With Carl Douglas' single, "Kung Fu Fighting" still a major chart item in Canada (RPM 100), Phonodisc have sprung a strong follow-up, "Dance The Kung Fu", which almost guarantees Douglas continuing chart action.

Initial shipment for the new single was reported to be sixteen thousand — and with only one major radio play. The demand for the record, released one week prior to the U.S., has been equally divided between Montreal and Toronto. Much of the action for the single has come through disco play.

VICTORIA'S OLD FORGE INTO DISCO ACTIVITY

Victoria's Old Forge, regarded as one of the largest night spots in Canada, has taken the disco plunge. Music co-ordinator, Bill Pick, has announced the unveiling of The Sting boasting a sound booth equipped with a complete professional system. Pick's library consists of singles and albums dating from the 30s to the present.

MACDONALD & DOCKER TO NEW CAPITOL POSTS

Jim Macdonald, Capitol Ontario promotion since July 1974, has been reassigned to the marketing and administration of Clive Davis' new Arista label in Canada.

Macdonald becomes product manager for the label and will oversee distribution and promotion of Arista and affiliated labels, including Rocky Road, Philly Groove, Neighborhood, Philly Soulville, Cotton, and the licensed contemporary jazz label, Freedom.

Mike Docker, up to now Capitol product manager for Vanguard, has been appointed to the position of press information officer.

Docker, who has been with Capitol since September 1973, will be responsible for maintaining a close liaison with representatives of the trade and consumer press. He will also be providing an internal information service for the sales and promotion staff at Capitol.

A&M RE-SERVICES GREENFIELD SINGLE

Released just prior to Christmas, the Greenfield single, "Canada Sky", a Barry Greenfield original has been remixed and re-serviced to radio stations and press people across Canada. The single apparently fell short of what Goldfish president and producer of the record, Terry Jacks had expected, and he explained: "We are convinced of this tune's potential but we weren't very happy with the sound on the initial pressings", adding, "We've re-mixed the whole tune to give it more brightness."

The Greenfield single qualifies as four points Canadian content and was culled from his soon-to-be-released album.

MAPLE STREET & BROWN TO HEADLINE JAMBOREE

George Petralia has set Feb. 16 as the date for his next Oshawa Jamboree to be held at the Canadian Legion Hall.

Maple Street, seen weekly on CTV's "Funny Farm", will-share the billing with A&M's Linda Brown, Harvie Howe, Bev Marie, Gaiety's George Carone, Gladys Smith and Eddie Kernot. The latter was the successful candidate for CBC-TV's "Singing Cowboy".

A new twist to this Jamboree will be a door prize of two tickets to Nashville on the Easter Tour – donated by Aunt Bea's Nashville Tours.

TORONTO'S HARBOUR FRONT SHOWS SIGNS OF THAWING

Toronto's Harbourfront Park, an election present, is beginning to show signs of coming alive. The venture was a bit of a dud last year and it would appear that powers that be are attempting to pump a little life into the park.

Latest communique from the Ministry of State (Madeleine Page - music director), reveals that their After Hour's Jazz Club has reopened. The first weekend (1-2) saw the Rob McConnell Quintet performing at the 235 Queen's Quay West location. The Tony Collacott Quintet is next (8-9) followed by the Ted Moses Quintet (15-16) and The Metro Stompers (22-23).

Being as this is an after hour's club, the first set is 1:30AM going through to 4AM something similar to the old House of Hambourg.

MAIOR ALBUM AND SINGLE RELEASES FOR POLYDOR

The Toronto-based Mercury group Rush have a second album, "Fly By Night", scheduled for release in mid-February. Both Polydor promotion teams in Canada and Mercury in the U.S. will be doing a major push to launch the album. Rush recently taped a segment of the "Boogie" TV show (14) and were also featured in a major article in Beetle magazine. TV dates have included appearances on "Midnight Special", "In Concert" and "Rock Concert"

The first nine albums in a brand new series called Mercury Jazz Master have just been shipped. The series features Dizzy Gillespie, John Coltrane, Charlie Mingus, Clifford Brown, Lester Young, Eric Dolphy and Oscar Peterson. Polydor's Richard Glanville-Brown feels that is is an ideal time to launch the series (to be imported from Holland), due to strong sales increases by jazz labels ECM, Pablo and Verve.

Allan Katz, director of advertising and promotion for Polydor claims that a combination of in-store promotion and radio support, together with the support of the sales and promotion forces has resulted in a fastgrowing success for the Ohio Players' "Fire"

Mark Hodes, national singles promotion for Polydor, tags three Cancon singles just recently released as having the potential to reach high places on the charts. They are, "Johnny Get a Gun" by the Five Man Electrical Band, Alan Gerber's "Tied On" and "Baby, Baby Do I" by Don Goodwin, a tune written especially for him by Paul

Santa could be heard for blocks bellowing "Ho Ho Ho have a Merry Kiss-Mas", and St. Thomas authorities were so bewildered that the limousine was stopped for question-

Kiss played to a near-capacity crowd at the London arena on December 22nd.

JOHN ALLAN RETURNS TO THE GOOD BROTHERS

Champion fiddle player, John Allan, has chucked his visions of being a farmer/auctioneer and taken his bow and returned to the fold of The Good Brothers. Allan had been working his parents' 220 acre spread near London when he decided to return to the music business. He had worked the first part of 1974 with the Goods but prior to this association had chalked up good experience with Country Rebel's Willie P. Bennett's Band and with Rural Retreat.

His first major date with the Goods will be at the El Mocambo.

BEAU DOMMAGE RECEIVES ACCLAIM FROM OUEBEC PRESS

Capitol Records' Montreal office has reported an enthusiastic acceptance by local fans of the newly-signed Quebec group, Beau Dommage.

The band's album "Beau Dommage", after a December release, is well on its way to achieving Canadian gold. It was recorded at Tempo studios in Montreal.

Two hundred press representatives attended a reception to meet the group just prior to the album's release. Following the meeting, the Montreal Journal said "Beau Dommage is 'the' Quebec group", and the Weekly Gala Des Artisres stated that they were "a group who have only just begun to astound us.'

Beau Dommage have been receiving strong chart action on their single "Le Picbois (The Woodpecker), and are also showing heavy airplay off their album on FM stations. Group members are Pierre Bertrand, Michel Rivard, Robert Leger, Marie-Michele Desrosiers and Real Desrosiers.

BAKER & PALMER TEAM FOR GAIETY

Gaiety's top selling artists, Carroll Baker and Jerry Palmer have teamed together for what is shaping up to be a heavy schedule of jamborees, clubs and fairs that will take them into the fall. Bookings are being arranged by Maureen Enright of Thunder Bay's Music & Artists Agency.

Baker has just completed a successful U.S. tour where she shared billing with Faron Young and David Houston. She will be playing a two week engagement at Regina's Town Pump (10-22) and will fly into Thunder Bay (23) for a country concert at the Exhibition Coliseum. This will be her debut as a duo with Jerry Palmer, who recently returned to the Gaiety fold and is seeing impressive action with his new single, "Ooo Mama", a self penning. Palmer was first discovered by Gaiety's Don Grashey in the early sixties when Palmer was sixteen.

The Grashey/Palmer team worked the Canadian western provinces where Palmer was established as one of the most successful rock artists in the business. He was also given top exposure on all rock-oriented shows produced by the CBC and CTV Networks. His popularity spilled over into the U.S. where he was eventually featured on the Dick Clark Bandstand and worked the U.S. west coast successfully for several years.

The sales picture for both Palmer and Baker (the latter a strong country item, "I'd Go Through It All Again", written by Conway Twitty), and is now showing some gains with pop programmers.

Grashey is also arranging for more U.S. appearances of Baker and Palmer as a package and is interested in one nighter tie-ins with radio stations looking for this type of entertainment for their area. recently decided to put the Turtles back together, with new recordings for the group in the works.

GRT has released a double album set titled "Happy Together Again" with good initial reaction. Several contest giveaways were organized on local stations and "Happy Together" and "Elenore" are again receiving the heavy airplay that was once experienced.

Volman and Raylan spent two years performing with Frank Zappa and also recorded two albums as Flo & Eddie before bringing the Turtles back together.

BOND MAKING STRONG NATIONAL CHART GAINS

Bond, Columbia's new signing, took to the airwaves of many markets across Canada with their initial single, "Dancing On A Saturday

Night". The single was produced by Bob Gallo at Toronto's Manta Sound.

Although the same song had been released earlier by a U.S. group, with not too much success, the Bond single has shown early indications of catching, not only with contemporary rock programmers but with the discos. The single was tried on the CBS international and U.S. crowd during their recent Atlanta Convention and apparently met with good response. CKLW, the gateway to the south, has added the deck to their playlist.

Tobias - "Catalyst between

two worlds"

By now, the Canadian music industry is well aware of the talents of Ken Tobias. There has never been a lack of interest in this twelve-year veteran of the music business and it seems redundant at this point to launch into an account of his history and accomplishments. The following review from the June 1974 Penthouse is an example of the critical acclaim he has received. "Ken Tobias is another singersongwriter at the interface of Dylan and the Beatles, but with an edge - especially as a performer - on most of his competitors". The review was in regard to the Tobias album, "The Magic's In The Music".

In the following interview, Tobias reveals his thoughts as he reflects on the activity that surrounds him.

How do you feel being signed to a relatively small label like Attic after having been on the roster of larger conglomerate companies such as Polydor and MGM?

It's a lot better. Even though the people who own and control Attic are pros and have been in the business a long time, I get personal attention. They're just starting and have got a lot to lose and so have I, but we've also got a lot to gain. We're all professionals, and we relate to each other in that way. I don't feel as if I'm seventeenth or eighteenth in line for promotion. I feel like I'm up there in the top five. I think it's great and I'm enjoying it very much.

How were you signed to Attic?

Al (Mair) has always followed my career and Gordon (Lightfoot) apparently liked my music, and felt I had something for me and told Al. When I was in England doing my last album, Gordon was doing a show at the Royal Albert Hall and came up to the session afterward. He sat down and listened to about six songs intently and told me he really liked my music. I feel that maybe that had something to contribute to the Attic signing. I think he helped me, in the sense of having put in a good word for me to Al.

You've recorded in England, the U.S. and Canada, does any one place stand out above the others?

When I recorded in L.A., I worked at MGM studios, a beautiful place, very space age, but I found it was cold. I felt that I couldn't go behind the console with a cup of coffee, there were too many rules, but it was my first album and I enjoyed that. Then I went to England, and it was the thrill of going, combined with the thrill of working with the heavy musicians that were with me there that made it a standout. The producers were fantastic, and it wasn't a matter of worrying where you put your sandwich down, though I'm not for making a mess of the board, but you shouldn't have to worry about those things. What's important is to get things happening in a good atmosphere. That's why I shy away from really new studios, even though they're equipped. RCA (Toronto) is an older studio, you can feel it in the walls, there's some dues paid there. I think that may be because I spent only a short period of time at RCA, England is still a standby Kate Elliott

During the years that you've spent in the music industry, you've come close to really making it internationally several times, but never quite got there. Do you get discouraged, and what keeps you going?

More than anything, my driving force is psychic energy. Music is my vehicle. I tend to be objective and stand back and look at myself and what's going on, just to see that it's only a part of myself travelling on my path towards some destiny. I'm travelling at a certain pace now, and I think that there's no way I could give up. You won't have success unless you're ready for it and I don't think probably I was ready for it. But always this music thing has been a healer for me. I've always got something back from it and it allowed me to put something back into it.

Would you describe the influences that your music has had, and talk about where it is now?

When I first started I was listening to people like Vera Lynn, and instead of going an octave lower, I used to sing her notes. I was a kid and had the voice then and it helped me. My voice didn't change. Then my influence became pop music. At that point I picked up a guitar and started to write songs. It seems that as soon as you picked up an acoustic guitar, you were suddenly a folk singer, which isn't wrong, folk music has helped me through this life. It's been my bread and butter for many years, but secretly, inside, I wanted to do other things. I had arrangement ideas and could hear other things happening. But When folk music came along, I formed a folk band and played guitar and little banjo. That's what was in, the Kingston Trio and so on, but on the side, I became a drummer. I was playing rock music with a group called the Badd Cedes and was wearing leather jackets and Beatle boots at the same time as I was doing folk music on "Singalong Jubilee". There I was with a pompadour while the rest of the guys had brush cuts. Now, along the way, I've developed a little bit of the blues influence, although I'm not a blues singer, and I'm doing some rock and roll. Mostly my lyrics are all funky.

Do you have an ultimate goal for your music?

I'd eventually like to learn to play the piano and want to get a synthesizer but not to get into electronics for the sake of electronics. I like black music very much - the reality of it, and folk and classical music - something I'm starting to listen to more. I also like country music and rock and roll. Musically, I don't see any goal. I've always tried to just grow and fall into a certain direction.

What moved you to write "Lady Luck"?

A little bit of frustration. I'm a believer that you shouldn't expect any rewards for anything, but at a particularly down moment, I was thinking, 'I'm struggling, trying to do it, trying to be good at it, trying to be kind to people, but where's my luck?'


You seem to be more absorbed than many artists when you perform, and you also tend to sing with your eyes closed. Are you really in another world?

In the past when I've played bars and clubs, the lighting wasn't very good and consequently all you can see is a lot of people staring at you, It's very difficult to concentrate when people are staring at you, especially when you're doing something soft or something more intimate. So ! used to close my eyes a little bit and in a space around about six inches from my face I created a world. I can still see what's going on inside and still maintain my touch with reality. It's difficult sometimes in a bar when you're singing something sensitive that means so much to you, and somebody who's drunk, or some ass who's not aware, will do something to shock you right out of it. But you've got to keep it together at that point, even though sometimes you feel you should say something.

Have you changed, do you think, or have your audiences?

I think I've changed quite a bit. Audiences are audiences. They come in to listen to music or to drink, depending on where you are. I've always felt that you should not go on stage and try to turn the people on. It's wrong, you've got to turn yourself on and then it turns them on. You've got to be the catalyst between the two worlds. If they're there to drink, I shouldn't expect too much more than that. But there have been times when I sing certain songs and I feel suddenly like Daniel in the lion's den. It was noisy, and suddenly everyone's mellow, because they've just become aware of this voice singing. I know that if you're in a fur factory, you shouldn't expect silk.

Ken Tobias smiles and adds, "But then again, if you're a magician, you should try".





The Good Brothers, Canada's "Newgrass" bluegrass band is maintaining its record as one of the busiest groups in the country. they are compiled to sell records. Not too long ago, RPM's whole chart system was revamped "to make it more accurate". It is now embarrassing to report that the RPM charts are TOO accurate. They have fallen behind the U.S. charts by three weeks to a month and look like they are designed to hinder record sales. Some enterprising executives or sales people are going to analyse the results of that beautiful but costly accuracy and demand that the system be changed. The real question is . . . was there any good reason for the change in the first place.

Saw a poster that came in the mail to RPM. All it read was, "The Kerry Waghorn Studios, Box 5144, 349 West Georgia Street, Vancouver." Very subtle these westerners. They didn't even enclose their recording rates. Congratulations on the new studio.

Some of the record company greats feel the industry is recession-proof, but are worried that the retailers will push the panic button. Right now the dealer who wants to take advantage of the money laying around from unattended concerts can keep his stock good and bright and pull in the consumers. It's a time to publicize, merchandise and profitize. It's luxuries that are suffering. Records are a necessity!!!

SPIRIT OF CHRISTMAS Lies To Live By Daffodil 10047-W

A five piece group from Oshawa, Ontario with an incredible and collective sense of perception. They are bound together



musically by lyrical magic that should be read first before the music and the vocal interpretation can be appreciated — a smart move to include a libretto. Bob Bryden displays an exceptional talent with words, and, when mixed with just enough of his own music, an almost sensuous musical painting evolves — all tied together with a built-in vocal property (Preston Wynn), to complete the concept. Engineer Lee De Carlo (Manta Sound) emerges almost as a sixth member of the group (a tuned-in sixth sense, if you will) performing the necessary board chores that completes a perfect marriage of upfront vocals and background.

With almost every album that bears the production credit of Gene Martynec, this young genius proves that vocal quality



"does not, necessarily, a good album make". The Materick voice is abrasive, but his power to communicate and interpret, with sincerity, his own-material, is the most enjoyable part of this album. Although there is great concentration on professionals as studio people i.e. Bruce Cockburn, Murray McLauch-lan, David Essig etc., which undoubtedly adds to the production, it's that gravelly voice, buffered by just the right ingredient of lushness that makes for free flow of total entertainment - almost, if you'll pardon the corniness, a hail storm, softened by a gentle rain, and both in concert, Again, Lee De Carlo, does his slide and pot act and brings this immense sound into a common denominator of sensitive quality. Materick is a "today" folksinger, with a flair for hardline poetry. Contains his current hit single, "Linda Put The Coffee On".

CARL DOUGLAS Kung Fu Fighting Pye NSPL 18450-L

Made for discos and if anyone comes close to creating a new dance craze, it will be Carl Douglas. Out of nowhere, he jumped the pond with his first explosive hit, "Kung Fu

Fighting", and before this one had shown any signs of cooling, Phonodisc rushed out a follow-up, "Dance The Kung Fu", both contained on this set. There are no writer credits or selection times. The latter could create a problem for programmers, but the real value, of course, is with the discos, where play is now heavy and will obviously lead to strong retail sales — without radio play. A disco-treasure is the very lengthy instrumental, "Blue Eyed Soul", which could have some hidden meaning.

THE TRIMBLE TONES

Take 30 Soundaround 7425

This album, the third for the Saskatchewan "old tyme" group, has scored exceptionally well in the province, but is hampered by the lack of a national distributor. There's cornball, shuffling polkas and waltzes mixed in with a couple of nostalgic sixties bits that could prove to be a cash register smash. Remember, a lot of people laughed at the Mom & Dads and the only thing missing on this set is the piano. The group has that Saturday night prairie sound about them that could garner much interest if promoted properly. Producer and owner of Soundaround label, Bill Brown, blanketed the province with effective television advertising and it paid off for him. He is now open for other means of distribution throughout Canada. You can contact Brown in Regina at (306) 523-6694. Incidentally, the album was produced at Regina's Calart Studios and qualifies as having Canadian content.

OSCAR PETERSON TRIO WITH CLARK TERRY Mercury Jazz Master 6336 342-Q

Recorded in Holland in 1964, this is one of the first releases on Mercury's Jazz Master series and should be given a listen by pop programmers looking for a vehicle to stir their listeners. Peterson, even in 1964 was contemporary for that era and there hasn't been much change — as far as jazz is concerned. What's most important, for jazz buffs, is the availability of this series. Clark Terry is heard on trumpet and flugelhorn, with Ray Brown, bass; Ed Thigpen, drums and, of course, Peterson on piano.

TV & RECORD ACTION FOR RCA COUNTRY ACTS

Barry Haugen, national country promo for RCA, reports a full schedule of TV appearances for artists on his roster, Jim Ed Brown and Karen Wheeler recently taped the Ian Tyson Show and Gary Buck, whose single "What"II I Do" is beginning to pick up airplay in the U.S., is scheduled to do the Tyson show within the next few days. RCA-distributed Arpeggio artist Lynn Jones recently appeared on the Tommy Hunter Show and future Tommy Hunter dates are scheduled for Roy Payne (14) and Wilf Carter (8).

Record action for RCA's country artists is also high with Leroy Anderson just finishing recording sessions at RCA's studios. Anderson's new single should be out within the month. Bob Ruzicka's album, titled "Dude", is ready for February release; band tracks were cut in Edmonton and final mixing was done at the Toronto studios. Plans are underway for Al Cherny to record his new album in the spring, it is tentatively titled "Back 40" and will feature top 40 fiddle hits. "Back 40" is being readied in conjunction with Tee Vee Records.

It is safe and accurate to say that programming a radio station is unlike any other occupation or profession. It cannot be compared with doctor, lawyer, merchant,

carpenter, mechanic or even thief, because a qualified program director must be capable and objective at the same time. He has to know and understand the job that must be done, but he also has to eliminate any personal feelings from his many decisions and judgements. Additionally, he must be bright enough to explain his actions to his manager so he will also fully understand the product he has on the air. And there's the rub. There's the individuality and difficulty of the programming profession. It is very often next to impossible to explain to a nonprogramming person (like management or sales) the specific values that must be considered and employed to properly program a radio station. The reason is simple, and one that I have stated many times. Radio

can only be heard, and each person can only hear for himself. So each person has his own subjective idea of what a station sounds, or should sound like. Unlike other businesses that affect two or more senses, radio affects only the sense of hearing, and that makes it both unique and personal. It also makes it necessary for the program director to be sure his ideas, methods and sounds are accurately understood by his superiors.

A common statement throughout the industry is, "Everyone's a program director" and it's true. Everyone hears a sound that he likes, and he figures that everyone else should like the same thing. Wrong! In this competitive age only the fool programs for his own tastes, but if he happens to be the owner or the manager, there often is not much the program director can do about it. Just the other day I discussed this problem with some sound, capable radio people, and they admitted that an enormous amount of their time was spent trying to keep the owner's personal taste and judgements out of the sound of their station. Obviously, if one has to spend many hours convincing management that programming should be aimed solely at the target audience, he will hardly have enough time left to do a proper job. It's awfully hard to tell an owner to stop meddling with his own product but one way or another the idea must be gotten across to him. If he wants a good product then his personal tastes must not be allowed to be the determining factors.

Too simple and obvious an observation? Not at all. In my opinion, many radio stations are still being programmed by the impulsive whims of owners and managers, and the result is poor and non competitive product.

What can be done about it? First, get all your facts and figures absolutely straight. Know exactly what you are talking about, and document your ideas with sound information acquired from as many sources as you can find. Check the ideas and programming techniques of other successful stations, and see if what they are doing corresponds with your techniques and plans. Be sure to look at other stations that are similar in approach and size to your own, then make all the logical comparisons you can possibly make. Write those comparisons down, and then step back and take a good look at them. Are they logical? Do they make any sense? Are they strong enough to acquire the kind of audience you are going after? If you are in a highly competitive situation, are your sounds and ideas on a competitive level with the other stations? These and many other questions must be logically answered, and they must be answered in a manner that will be accepted and understood by management.

Again, the reasoning is fairly obvious. Radio is such an intangible that to get the same understanding across to others it is absolutely necessary to reduce it to something that is close to being tangible. You've got to get some of the other senses involved, and then there is the possibility of reaching some common ground and removing the subjectivity. For many years I have used charts, graphs, lists and visual comparisons for virtually all of the format ingredients, and I have found that people can come closer to an understanding if they can see what they think they are hearing. Again, too basic? No, I don't think so, for in most cases these visual systems are not being employed. Your ideas may not be absolutely perfect, but if you lay them out so you and everyone else can see them, at least you have more to offer than hours of semantic verbiage. And the chances of being understood are considerably greater than they were before. Next week we'll go into the music and playlists.

A musical based on the life of Marilyn Monroe has been scheduled for broadcast on "The Entertainers" (16) on CBC-AM radio. The show was written by Toronto composer Cliff Jones whose first and only other commission for CBC Radio was the highly successful "Hamlet". Jones has written about 40 tunes in all for "Hey Marilyn!", which has virtually no dialogue. The musical biography will run for approximately two hours and will be broadcast on CBC-FM (15) as well as AM, Beverly D'Angelo has undertaken the lead role of Monroe in the musical. She is originally from Columbus, Ohio, and recently turned down an offer to do a six-month tour with Grand Funk so that she could remain on the Toronto scene. Other cast members include Cal and Rory Dodd and Peter Law, all from the original cast of Hamlet. Rudy Webb (formerly of the Toronto cast of Godspell) is also included along with Barbara Law, David George (A&M recording artist) and Cathy Young (GRT recording artist). Jeanette

AIR PIRACY CHARGES LAID IN CKLG STRIKE

Violence erupted at strikebound CKLG Vancouver. Apparently, without the full knowledge of all its members, six strikers took control of both the AM and FM stations and broadcast an endless cartridge announcing the strike and playing "Part Of The Union" by The Strawbs. This incident happened Saturday (1) and when management arrived, they were forcibly prevented from entering the premises by a gathering of an estimated seventy-five picketers - six of who apparently worked at the station. Members of management were reportedly assaulted and the Chief Engineer was physically removed from the building by union members who apparently sealed the control rooms and offices with a liquid steel, or similar sealing substance. They then left the building.

Non-union members set up shop at the transmitter site and programming returned almost to normal with the exception of commercial content which was resumed when management regained entry to the station through a court injunction. This took almost twenty-four hours to secure and caused yet another incident on the picket line. Programming however, returned to normal at noon Sunday (2).

Charges of assault have reportedly been laid against members of the union as well as charges under the Broadcasting Act (Section 20) regarding air piracy, against one man.

The present situation at the station has fourteen strikers picketing the station and forty-three staff members performing their usual duties. There is only one on-air personality who has struck the AM outlet while most are off on the FM side. They are either on strike or, because of other union affiliations or because they are Americans, cannot cross the picket line.

There is apparently a move underway by some to exert economic pressures on the station by influencing sponsors to withdraw their support which, apparently, hasn't met with success.


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
