

Canadian acts do some border hopping

Has Capitol Records' new Canadian A&R policy shifted their priorities? That's hard to say, but it seems the policy worked out between Capitol Canada president Arnold Gosewich and the Los Angeles office - that any new acts signed to the label in Canada by A&R manager Paul White are, in effect, signed to Capitol internationally is more a formalization of the A&R trend between the parent and Canadian branch over recent years.

A look at Capitol Canada's current Cancon activity reveals quite a bit of meshing of their operations:

Suzanne Stevens, signed to Capitol Canada, has just finished recording enough material for an LP with producer Spencer Prophet in Los Angeles; Deja Vu, a muchtalked-about Canadian rock band signed to Capitol U.S., has just finished recording a new LP at Captain Audio Studios in Toronto and Capitol has just released an L.A. -produced Anne Murray LP - she's signed to Capitol U.S.

On the country side, Capitol on both sides of the border is breaking a debut LP

by Canadian Colleen Peterson, signed to Capitol U.S.; and in October, Capitol Canada is releasing a new LP by Ray Griff, a Canadian signed to Capitol U.S. and now living in Nashville.

Capitol Canada is readying a debut single release for Coyote, the first Canadian group signed since the recent A&R change. Coyote had already produced a few sides with Bob Morten, with support from Thunder Sound and Publisher Chappell Music.

Conspiracy, the last group signed by Capitol before the new policy was announced, has several sides in the can and ready for release.

Capitol is releasing a Rolph Harris LP (tracked at a Toronto Massey Hall concert of his) timed with the start of his CTV show's new season. Harris is signed to EMI in Britain, but has always had a special relationship with Capitol Records here though he is not a Canadian.

Suzanne Stevens has been set for priority promo in Canada and the U.S. with a single or two to be released during the fall with an LP to appear early in the new year.

Harron and Rae launch label with Quality

Quality has inked a distribution deal with Harrea Productions, headed by actor Don Harron and radio and TV producer Jackie Rea. The deal includes representation by Quality Music publishing of JAR and Harrea material, both publishing companies set up earlier this year by Rea.

With the deal, Rea and Harron have also launched the Harrea label which already has listed Charlie Farquarson, Catherine McKinnon, and Patricia Anne McKinnon as artists. The first Harrea release is a single, This World Of Mine by Catherine McKinnon Scheduled for a Christman recent

non. Scheduled for a Christmas season release is an album by Farquarson, a Harron characterization, entitled Doesn't Anybody Here Know It's Christmas? The concept LP will also feature Patricia Anne McKinnon.

Jackie Rea, who has extensive background in broadcast production internationally as well as experience in composing, publishing and performing, has written the new Catherine McKinnon single as well as eight of the cuts on the Harron Christmas IP

Paul Anka LP leads U.A. autumn promo

United Artists has a big Cancon lineup for the fall, headed by Paul Anka's new The Painter LP - now out before Anka's mid-October Canadian tour.

U.A. will also pick up the promo on Vic Franklyn as his non-network TV show debuts in markets across Canada this month. Franklyn will begin tracking another Canadian Talent Library LP soon.

Other new Canadian Talent Library productions on the U.A. fall schedule are LPs by The Laurie Bower Singers and new-

Wonder campaign to highlight fall sales

Motown Records are gearing up for a world-wide push on Stevie Wonder's new record package - a two LP set with a 45 rpm EP single plus a 24-page book on Stevie - which is ready this week after a world-wide premiere on Montreal's CKGM September 28.

The album, Songs In The Key Of Life, was aired on CKGM's Donny Burns afternoon show 48-hours before the LP was mailed to other radio stations.

The Wonder package is listed at \$16.98 retail, and Motown's Ron Newman promises it's going to be a big seller. He reports it has already shipping gold, and by the time the pre-release orders are sorted, he figures, it will be a platinum shipment.

Motown's Wonder campaign will include a wide range of radio, print and in-store advertising.

Keath Barrie, who recently signed with U.A. after the label licenced several of his CTL recordings, is currently on a western promo tour to push his first contract LP with the label.

U.A. is releasing a new single from the Canadian Zephyr album, No Love At All, and they've recently shipped Craig Ruhnke's new set, Hot Spell.

Canadian Jackie Richardson's single, produced by Milan Kymlicka, will be released by U.A. in the U.S.

On the international scene, U.A. is releasing a new Electric Light Orchestra LP, Another World's Record; four ELO LPs have gone gold during the past year.

They're releasing another American Flyer single next week, and Steve Katz is in Toronto to mix the group's next one. They may record their next LP in Toronto.

New Polydor Rush LP is double live set

Polydor and SRO management have announced that Rush's new live double LP All The World's A Stage was shipped in the U.S. (on Mercury) September 29. Release was expected in Canada on or around the same date, and would coincide with the band's cross-Canada tour.

The LP was taped over a three-night engagement at Massey Hall in Toronto last spring. It is expected that the LP will be Rush's biggest seller, as it attempts to capture the band's strong live appeal. Their most recent effort, Rush 2112, has been on the RPM chart for 26 weeks.

Le Grand Salon, new Montreal rock club

Another rock club has opened in Montreal, with the promise of presenting international acts once a month to supplement the local offerings. Le Grand Salon is owned by Claude Bouchard and Marc Hamilton, and Paul Levesque has been acquired as talent co-ordinator.

The first out-of-towner performing will be Canned Heat, who will kick off a North American tour at the club. Tickets for such shows will be available at local ticket outlets as well as at the door.

Price for Canned Heat has been set at \$5. Seating capacity of the club is 500 plus. The permanent PA is by Audio Annalysts and the lighting was done by Lumibec.

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Bananas cut debut disc with Amherst

Bananas, a rock 'n' roll showband who spoofs 50s and 60s pop music in clubs around Metro Toronto and Southern Ontario, entered the recording world with a single and an LP, both soon to be released by Amherst Records.

The LP, Come And Get It, features one side of old favourites and a side capturing some of their club-style act with some originals and Spike Jones-style fun.

The single is Mary, Mary, (by Ottawa songwriter Terry Cerice), aimed at the pop market; flipped by Homegrown Country Boy, which they want to work on the country stations.

The discs will be on the Track label in Canada - it's owned by the group and their manager Chuck Beal (who used to be with the Paupers) - and on the Amherst label in the U.S.

Bananas has become best known for its zany bar act, which features a one-set take off on the Dick Clark Show and a one-set flashback to 1957 radio sandwiched alternating with two dance sets. All is broadcast live on video monitors throughout the club.

With costume changes and sound, light and video equipment, the six-member band with two technicians, as lead guitarist Wayne Butterly says, "does have an overhead." They book for about \$3,500 a week, and work all the time.

number of Ontario towns, and plan to work their show into two one-hour concerts - one of nostalgia and one of their own originals mixed with their spoof acts.

Now that they see themselves as becoming more of a recording act, they feel they will have to modify their club act over time to include more of their record-oriented originals.

Montreal fans welcome Toronto's Max Webster

Max Webster recently played a week at Montreal's prestigious Le Moustache. The gig was arranged after the exceptionally positive critical reaction from their performance as opening band for Blackmore's Rainbow this summer. The same critics were in attendance at a Le Moustache press reception with Taurus Records' Tom Berry and about 60 music industry people.

Taurus bought time on progressive giant CHOM-FM, and there was heavy instore display activity which included displays and visits by the band to major stores. Interviews were done with CHOM, CFOX, CKLM, Derek Steede of the Steede Report and Doug Pringle of Media College. And again, critical press coverage of their performances at Le Moustache as genial - Juan Rodriguez said the band was becoming "a household word," while David Freeston concluded his analysis by saying that" Max Webster must be considered as one of the more interesting of Canada's emerging bands."

Berry told RPM that he felt the week in Montreal was a great success. He said "The buzz in Montreal on Max Webster has been excellent, and after last week I feel we definitely have got our foot in the door (of the Quebec market.)"

Broadland closes office, to move in with Quality

Broadland Records has meshed its operations with Quality Records' publishing arm. Quality publishing's Bill Kearns will take over administration of Broadland's record and publishing catalogues, and he'll share responsibilities with Broadland's Dallas Harms and Gary Buck, for the creative side of the record firm's work.

All Broadland business will be handled through Quality's publishing offices at 38 Yorkville Avenue, Toronto.

With the addition of Broadland's Double Play and Grandslam publishing companies to Quality's Broadland, Shediac, Qualrec and other publishing firms, Quality's Yorkville Avenue office will be handling more Canadian music than any publisher in Canada.

Harms and Buck withdrew from many of their administrative responsibilities with Broadland, Kearns told RPM, because they wanted more time to work on their own individual recording and performing acts.

New tour, LP and single from Attic's Ken Tobias

Attic Records has announced that Ken Tobias has embarked on his largest tour yet, beginning September 20 in Thunder Bay and continuing through to October 31. Stops include six days in Winnipeg, three in Calgary, and a week at Vancouver's Old Roller Rink.

Tobias' new LP Siren Spell has just been released, and the cut Oh Lynda is scheduled for release as a single some time in the near future. Negotiations are underway for the American release of the new LP. (Previous product was released by Capitol there.) Tobias' first Attic LP has been released in Germany and Italy.

Tour plans include several local and network TV appearances, including the CTV's Al Hamel Show.

New office opened for Taylor's Jane label

R. Dean Taylor's newly-formed Jane Records has opened offices in the States. The company began a few months ago with a Toronto office, and release is expected shortly of Taylor's own song, Bonnie, through a distribution deal for Jane product with Polydor here. The single will be released simultaneously in the States through an independent distribution system. The U.S. office of Jane is located in Hollywood.

Quality out of retail, axes Target Tape stores

Quality Records has closed down its Target Tape stores, and the record manufacturer-distributor is out of the retail business.

"We haven't gone bankrupt or anything like that," Quality's Jack Vermeer told RPM, "We're just shutting down.

"We couldn't see any point in pouring any more money into the venture - from now on we'll leave retailing to the retailers."

Quality acquired the retail tape stores from Stereo Tape Products when that firm went under several years ago.

United Artists gold for E.L.O. and Nightingale

United Artists made two major gold record presentations in September. When Electric Light Orchestra appeared in Montreal and Toronto recently, U.A. president Stan Kulin and national promotion director Al Mathews presented them with three gold records for Eldorado, Face The Music, and Ole ELO, all of which have surpassed sales of 50,000 each in recent months.

Al Mathews also presented singer Maxine Nightingale with a gold record for sales in excess of 75,000 of Right Back Where We Started From when she appeared in Toronto with Mac Davis at the CNE bandstand

This second LP will no doubt strengthen his relationship


new musical and lyrical maturity since his last effort, will probably enlarge his following as well.



Bang, Bang You're Alive shot live for TV

Last week Bang Bang, You're Alive, a syndicated TV variety show produced in Ottawa by Bushnell's Carleton Productions and Gary Dunford's Skywriter Productions, premiered in five major Canadian markets.

The 11-show series, featuring stars like The Bay City Rollers, Tanya Tucker, Maria

Muldaur, Ian Tyson and John Sebastian, was taped before live audiences in 13 days in the studios of CJOH Ottawa (a CTV affiliate) for total production costs of less than \$30,000 per half-hour show.

Director Jorn Winther, a Canadian who has made his mark in the U.S. by producing or directing shows like The Sonny and Cher Show, In Concert, and the upcoming David Frost Nixon interviews, told RPM that he took up the challenge of the low-budget show when he heard the CTV network had turned the series down, because he liked the proposal and he wanted to prove the network wrong.

Winther teamed with Gary Dunford,

Attic raises LP suggested retail price October 1

Attic Records has announced that effective October 1, suggested retail price of Attic LPs will be increased from \$7.29 to \$7.98. Suggested retail price of tapes does not change. All orders received by London Records, Attic distributor, before October 1 will be shipped at the earlier price, regardless of actual shipping date.

Toronto Sun Columnist and media writer who created Celebrity Cooks, has been a regular guest on the Bob McLean show and has written for Bob Newhart and Gloria Gaynor, and show-host Kevin Gillis to put the show together.

Gillis, from Chesterfield, Ontario, sings the familiar theme to CBC radio's This Country In The Morning and has been a regular on the radio network's Inside From The Outside.

There are no syndication deals in the U.S. for the show yet, though Carleton's Bryn Mathews reported that the Westinghouse chain there is interested. The show is geared to the U.S. TV's family-hour market, and, with only 13 shows in the series, is expected to be used as a "second season" replacement series or a summer series by stations there.

Canadian stations airing the show are: CBET Windsor, CJOH Ottawa, CFAC Calgary, CITV Edmonton, and CHCH Hamilton

Much publicity was generated for the show when they signed The Bay City Rollers for a spot while the group was in Toronto. Not only is it a grabber for the entire series, but Winther won an exclusive North American TV production deal with the group as a result.

Les Humphries Singers will be on Attic label

Negotiations between Attic's Al Mair and Kurt Richter of the European recording firm Teldec have resulted in the first Canadian release of the Les Humphries Singers. The group has scored 20 gold records in Europe. Their first release in Canada will be a currently-unnamed song by Canadian Greg Adams, who has also written songs for Roger Whittaker.

The group is led by Les Humphries from England and the other twelve members are from all over the world. The group most recently had their own TV series on Granada in England.

Copper Penny to Agency; Charity Brown inks too

David Bluestein and Tim Cottini have announced that through a pact with the Dick Wendling Management firm, The Agency will act as exclusive booking agent for Charity Brown and Copper Penny.

Charity Brown is currently showing strong sales action on her new A&M album, Stay With Me. Copper Penny release on the Capitol label.

Rufus show band breaks tradition and records

Several months ago a Toronto show group called, for no practical reason, Rufus, played a club in an American city, they were approached by excited members of Gladys Knight and the Pips, who were playing the same city that week. It was an embarrassing situation for Rufus, because they had been mistaken by the superstars for the American Rufus featuring Chaka Khan. After that, and similar incidents, Rufus from Toronto became The Great Rufus Road Machine.

They kept Rufus in their name because they were still the same band. The rest of the name arose from the fact they spend an estimated 40 weeks out of every 52, touring. As a show-and-dance band, they travel from city to city in the U.S. and Canada playing mainly suburban clubs and lounges. They play familiar material, emphasize visual presentation with comic patter, dance

routines and costume changes. They are one of several groups managed by Pizazz Presents, operated by Craig Nicholson and speciallizing in show bands.

The Great Rufus Road Machine is one of a few such groups who are breaking the mould by recording. Their new Rubber Bullet release (produced by Greg Hambleton, handled by Axe and manufactured by Quality), Funny How Love Can Be, is their second. Previously What Does It Matter garnered airplay nationally on MOR charts.

Currently they are at the beginning of a three month circuit from Toronto to Maritime clubs and back again. They're touring in the East for the fifth time.

Will the real Roxy Roller survive? by Boyd Tattrie

Through a strange series of events, three versions of the song Roxy Roller have been released in the U.S. Sung by Sweeney Todd, it was number one in Canada a few months ago, on London, with Nick Gilder singing lead. A Sweeney Todd LP was also released in Canada with Gilder, and it is still in the RPM top 20 LPs after 38 weeks.

Gilder and Todd guitarist Jim McCullough wrote Roxy Roller and together left the group to sign with the American Chrysalis label when the opportunity was offered. Chrysalis also got the international rights to the Roxy Roller master, and released the song in its original form with Gilder on lead vocals in the U.S.

Sweeney Todd, meanwhile, found a new guitarist and a singer named Clark Terry. Shaer made a deal with London U.S., and delivered a new Roxy Roller to them for American distribution. Objections were raised supposedly because the instrumental tracks on the new London version were actually the ones from the original, which Chrysalis now had the rights to. London eventually withdrew their version to avoid complications but many copies remained in stores. London now has released a third Sweeney Todd version with another new lead singer, Bryan Adams.

Presently there are two versions of the song officially on the American market: the very first record, billed as Nick Gilder, and the newest Sweeney Todd version. The confusion is extensive. The September 4 edition of Record World carried fullpage ads for both songs. Both Roxies were Record World's Pick Of The Week, Septem-

Nick Gilder was on a Canadian promotion tour recently, sponsored by Capitol, which handles Chrysalis product here. Another single - She's A Star - has been released for Canadian distribution only while Roxy Roller has its run in the U.S. Although Gilder is still composing with guitarist McCullough, Star is written by Philip Rambow.

Gilder explained that "it was just a song I heard which I instantly loved and wanted to record." It is one of the songs Gilder is using on his new LP; which should be out sometime in January, if all goes well. Some tracks were produced by George Martin and others by Martin's partner Peter Sullivan. "Martin's an amazing person, really," Gilder told RPM. "I'm glad he found the time to do the tracks that he did, he was in between projects at the time.

Gilder admitted that having a different single in the U.S. and Canada at the same time would probably add to the present problems but he told RPM: "We didn't really have an alternative. We had to release Roxy in the U.S. because it had already been a hit in Canada, and we couldn't release Roxy in Canada again. We had to have something out up here, though, so we released Star."

Gilder says he hopes his solo music will keep the audience he had with Sweeney Todd, and expand it. Working with McCullough, he considers his stuff structured,



sophisticated commercial rock. When the time comes to go on the road, Gilder intends to give audiences the same sounds and arrangements they will hear on the record. He feels that Sweeney Todd Folder, which he and McCullough also wrote while with the band, is an example of the things to

And what of Sweeney Todd? They are now fronted by Bryan Guy Adams, who's been with them only three weeks and is only 16. They played their first major Toronto gig recently (they're from Vancouver) at a free concert at Nathan Phillips Square. London promotion man Dave Elliot estimates about 1,500 in attendance. Sweeney Todd, headlining over two other

acts, performed a mixture of earlier Gilder/ McCullough material and several of their own more recent songs. They closed with Roxy Roller, which drew strong audience reaction. No one seemed to notice anything different, and it seemed doubtful that anyone even knew that this was not the singer on the record they heard. Toward the end, the band had to ask the crowd to move back because of the people getting squashed in front as posters were tossed into the crowd. Dozens of hands were reaching for Adams and the new guitarist, who were playing to those in front.

Considering all the recent complications, both Gilder and Sweeney Todd seem to be doing well on their own so far.



Italian jazz-rockers record in Toronto

For the past month an Italian jazz-rock band, Perigeo, has been grinding out their first North American-produced LP at RCA Studios in Toronto. Ian Gunther and Willie Morrison, who hit big with their Three Hats Production's cover of the instrumental Theme From S.W.A.T. earlier this year, are producing.

Perigeo pioneered a new wave of popular jazz-based music in Italy; but when they sat



down to do their fifth LP with RCA-Italy, they realized their relationship with their producer there had gone stale. They wanted to record in North America.

RCA gave them a choice between a U.S. arrangement and Gunther and Morrison in Toronto; they chose Toronto.

They describe their music as jazz, with the rhythms and electric instruments of rock; so most young fans accept it as a new form of rock music.

To popularize the basic jazz structure of their music they had to break the traditional solo cycle of jazz performances by varying the solo parts to present two or three instruments playing counterpoint - very much the same as the old-style Dixieland jams.

In popular music today the theme melody has to be more prominent than it often is in jazz; it can't be rushed through to get to the "solo" sections as traditional-style jazz musicians often do.

"Melodies are very important to us," bassist Giovanni Tommaso stressed, "because they are originals, not standards."

Gunther and Morrison are adding strings to the 16 tracks of jazz-rock, something the group has never used before, but, Morrison told RPM, they're not tailoring the LP to the tastes of North American radio.

"We produced the music not with radio but the music in mind, which is supposed to be the theory behind all of this; but it's the first time we had a chance to put the theory into practice."

Morrison said that he and Gunther were attracted to this job also because, for the first time, they had the chance "to work with an international-level budget."

The LP, yet untitled, will be released internationally in the late fall. At the same time, Perigeo's fourth LP, Genealogia, will be released in Canada.

Each of the five members of Perigeo composes music for the group, and each play a number of traditional or electronic instruments; they all are traditionally trained.

The Italian Vice Consul in Trenton, New Jersey is a fan of Perigeo, and he's arranged for them a few New Jersey benefit concerts for victims of the recent Italian earthquakes. They've toured all over Europe, and plan to tour North America next year.

Lick 'N' Stick wins followers

In the later part of Toronto's Golden Age of rock, you could find a young guitarist named Paul Vigna churning out the blues and R&B around Yorkville, jamming with the Myna Birds and Neil Young and such names at the Devil's Den and the Purple Onion. Later, you could find him with bassist Rick Law and drummer Robbie Hancock in the house band for a little hole in the wall off Young Street called the Bermuda Tavern. When the trio wasn't providing appropriate background for the topless dancers, they'd play their own brand of blues and R&B and rock 'n' roll, and on weekends they'd shell out a few extra bucks for a sax player. Those were the mandatory dues-paying days. Today, Paul Vigna and Lick 'N' Stick aren't superstars, but, with a loyal Ontario following and a successful single or two behind them, they are more comfortable.

While grinding away at the Bermuda,

they came in contact with Malcolm Glassford who convinced them it was about time they got themselves good management. That got them out of the Bermuda, where they'd been for more than a year, and into some of the other clubs around downtown Toronto.

By about 1973, they'd played almost every club in Toronto.

That was the year that Neil Dixon did them a favour and got them a date at the El Mocambo backing Bo Diddley. It caused some noise among the club patrons, rock fans, Diddley fans and critics, and Diddley himself was impressed enough to ask them to do the same for him on two more separate return engagements.

After this came a number of prestigious gigs: scoring for three Young People's Theatre plays by Carol Bolt (they played on stage as part of the play in one); they play-

James Leroy moves to Boarding House

Major Hoople is out of the Boarding House - they're just The Boarding House now - and James Leroy is in.

Leroy, formerly of a group called Denim and signed to GRT, has now joined with The Boarding House as, he feels, a catalyst to create a new sound and performance for the Axe recording group.

"We've been wanting to get together for a long time," Boarding House guitaristsinger Richard Howell told RPM, "and then we just did it."

The group spent five weeks this summer rehearsing new material, and now they're breaking in an entirely new sound on a mostly-college concert tour of the east. But their eyes are on the recording studio.

Leroy, who has taken a sort of leadership role with the group, told RPM that they've been talking with a few different producers, and they expect to be in the studio before the new year. They don't want to record without a deal that includes a U.S. release.

They're excited about their new sound and their new image and some of that excitement has rubbed off on reviewers in the smaller cities where the band has been playing. They want to establish themselves with bigger houses in concerts outside of the big cities to pave the way for a hopedfor national concert tour, and to build the geographically-wider appeal needed to break records nationally.


"With good records," Leroy projected, "you can work the big cities through radio."

For their concert work, the group has invested almost \$50,000 in new equipment, and hired a three-man road and technical crew - Woody Pound and Wafer, who used to work for Wednesday. The five band members, manager Dan Monbourquette, and the three-man crew each own a piece of the group.

The good name of Major Hoople's Boarding House is helpful, they say, for promotion; but Boarding House can't be associated with their sound or image. Almost all of the material the band is now performing was written by Leroy with the new band in mind, and modified through their performance.

ed with Diddley again on CTV's Canada A.M., they performed twice on CITY-TV's Guerrilla program; and (perhaps not so prestigious in the eyes of some) they did the soundtrack for a soft-core porn film made in Toronto called Diary Of A Sinner. Through that film, they were heard all over North America.

Their signing with CBS came as a result of a demo record for CAPAC, that in turn had resulted from appearances on the Canadian Rockworks radio show that Ian Thomas ran while he was a CBC staff producer. Rounds to the record company A&R departments were done twice before John Williams gave them the nod (and Bob Gallo) in one of his first signings for CBS.

Each of Lick 'N' Stick's single releases has spread their name a little further. Under My Thumb put them on the charts nationally, and now Mary Ann, another Vigna original, is well established on the RPM singles chart.

The success of Mary Ann has convinced CBS that an album would be a worthwhile investment and an after-Christmas release is expected. Currently they are working on moving into the concert circuit as an opening band.

The band dwells in that often frustrating strata between being broke and making it

as a national attraction, but they are fairly content with the progress that they are making. "We're not after a lot of money or superstar status," Vigna told RPM, "Just so long as people still come out to see us."

Stringband seeks financial aid: sells subscriptions

Stringband has embarked on a unique method of record production. Three years ago they formed their own label and have since released two LPs financed by themselves and friends. Each of National Melodies and Canadian Sunset have sold about 7,000 copies since their release, through personal requests to the label and limited Toronto retail distribution.

The band is seeking the estimated \$10,000 required to finance their third LP by mailing out letters to fans and handing them out at performances. The letter outlines Stringband's philosophy and objectives and offers an invitation to sing at the recording sessions plus a mention of the donor's name, in return for monetary assistance. \$5. or more entitles the donor to a copy of the album when it is finished, and copies are given for each additional \$5 as requested. "You could say we are selling subscriptions," they say in the letter.

Angel Application Forms, as they are called, are available by writing Stringband at 44 Sussex Avenue, Toronto. Cheques may be made payable to Marie-Lynn Hammond. Organizers request that any assistance be rendered by mid October, so that the donor's name can be added to the list before the album cover is printed.

Dan Plouffe joins Rogers Radio as CFTR assistant PD

Former Footprint Productions president Dan Plouffe has been appointed assistant to the program director for CFTR Radio in Toronto. In addition to being a founder and first president of Footprint, Plouffe has also been general manager of Morgan Earl Sounds, another Toronto radio production house. Plouffe received U.S. trade recognition in 1974 for his radio productions work, and has been involved in productions which have won more than 20 Cleo

The appointment was announced by Chuck Camroux of Rogers Radio.

Second LP release for Mercury's Moxy

Mercury artists Moxy, who have been breaking in the U.S. through their live appearances there, have released their second LP. A single, Take It Or Leave It, was released earlier.

Polydor releases new Garfield single

Polydor has released a new Garfield single, reports Lori Bruner. The single, entitled Give My Love To Anne, is from the Strange Streets LP, as was Old Time Movies, their first single.

Ovations and encores were reportedly bestowed upon the band when they opened for The Beach Boys in Toronto recently.

Concept now back to being a reality

Tom Wilson's Concept booking agency was almost ruined when most of his staff left the firm last spring to form their own agency.

Now, six months later, Wilson told RPM that he's just about back on track. With four full-time agents working under Wilson, Concept is booking at a pace fast enough to handle, Wilson estimates, 6-8 per cent of Canada's almost \$50 million-a-year live entertainment bookings equal to his pace before last spring.

Concept is handling about two dozen Canadian acts; like April Wine, Blood Sweat and Tears, Ronnie Hawkins, Mighty Pope, Thundermug, and Sylvia Tyson (Wilson says he never has handled such a wide variety of artists).

Wilson claims to be the only major booking agency in the country that does nothing else besides book acts - many others engage acts on behalf of clubs, and many of them are now also involved in personal management since the Musicians Federation gave them the green light for that last spring. An agent who gets up to 20 per cent of the gross from booking an act could conceivably get another 5-10 per cent from the house engaging the act and another possible 10 per cent as the group's agent. One individual or firm could skim off more than one-third of the money a club or promoter pays to engage performers.

Wilson guesses that Toronto is, on a per capita basis, the biggest live-music market in North America. Concept does about one-third of its business in Toronto.

Wilson aims to build Concept by booking tours for Canadian acts - his tour of Crowbar in 1971 was the first major Canadian tour ever by a Canadian band.

The demand for live music is growing faster in every major Canadian city than the ability of local agencies to handle it. This, Wilson notes, is centralizing the business in Toronto more than ever before.

The biggest competitor for any Canadian booking agency comes from the big U.S. agencies who, by all international and A.F. of M. rulings, have a free hand here as if they were operating in their own country.

Wilson wants the Musicians Federation or possibly the government to do something to stop the heavy flow of Canadian entertainment dollars into U.S. booking agencies when there are Canadian agencies to do the job just as well. He estimates that more than 90 per cent of the U.S. acts booked at the major fairs and grandstand shows this summer were booked directly through U.S. firms.

In lieu of controls, Wilson sees that Canadian agents have to make deals with their U.S. counterparts, hoping that favours are returned. He says it was because he spent so much time in the U.S. last year that his staff situation developed; but he claims those contacts made there are starting to pay off.

"I neither want to beat the U.S. machine or join it," says Wilson.

Working with Wilson are: Dean Cross, who takes care of concerts and touring; Dianne Green, high schools; Frank Pollard and John Kondis, lounges.

Fludd was at a disadvantage by being a last minute replacement for Widowmaker, who, apparently, had some working permit problems and who many fans had hoped to see. Fludd overcame that, however, as well as some poor sound mixing, with a mixture of new and now-familiar material.

CTV's 15th anniversary passes with new season

October 1 marks the 15th anniversary of CTV, Canada's only private TV network.

In 1961, 8 private stations began broadcasting common programs to 70 per cent of the potential English-language TV markets; now 15 CTV affiliates reach 93 per cent of those potential viewers. The network has been owned by its affiliate stations since 1966.

The CTV net began with just 10 hours a week of programming. Now, 15 years later there are 66 hours, 20 minutes of network shows available to the affiliates.

In its 16th season, CTV is airing more Canadian variety and music than ever before, with new shows The David Steinberg Show, Alan Hamel's daily talk show, Julie Amato's variety show and Alex Trebek's Stars On Ice joining CTV's Bobby Vinton Show, Pig And Whistle, Funny Farm and Ronnie Prophet's Grand Old Country. The latter two shows were nominated for this year's RPM Big Country Award in the catagory of Top Canadian Country TV Show.

The LP includes two of their hits of the last year (the title song and Light At The End of The Hall) in addition to their current hit, and there may be more airplay hit cuts to come from it.

There is at least one good Barry Brown composition in addition to the two hits he wrote. (Light At The End Of The Hall which he scored to words by his lead-singing sister Lawanda and If You Keep Throwing Dirt): Richard, the sensitive song of a father learning to love his retarded child.

For the family-hour Family fans, there are two spirituals, Stand By Me Jesus and Touch Of God: and for the believers

there's a cover of Mac Davis' I Believe In Music.

Everything on the LP is suited to fit the soft-sound needs of today's country formats; a lot of that is due to Jack Feeney's easy listening productions with engineer Haywood Parrott at RCA's Toronto studios.

New U.S. country star has no deal in Canada

Tom Bresh has had two top-10 country songs in the U.S. but hasn't experienced a release in Canada.

Bresh, in Toronto to appear on the Tommy Hunter and Bob McLean Shows with a Vancouver date set for the Tommy Banks Show, has watched his two hits, Homemade Love, and now, Sad Country Love Songs, climb to the top of the U.S. charts while his label, Asa Farr's Farr Records, has no distribution deal in Canada.

Asa Farr, a cotton-construction-pork millionaire, started his Los Angeles-based record firm last year, and so far has only one artist: Bresh.

Farr Records was recently voted new label of the year by a U.S. trade and Bresh was voted new male vocalist of the year by another trade magazine. Farr is distributed by independents in the U.S.

The Tommy Hunter Show appearance is the first featured-guest TV work Bresh has done, but he's been the subject of talk about a Toronto TV pilot for a series to be sold for next season. He's a country-pop singer; both of his single hits have been successful crossovers.



The Programmers

CBC radio season seeks lower-brow audiences

They say there's going to be a lot of changes concerning CBC radio's popular-music policy when their national AM network opens its 41st season during the first week of November.

In line with recommendations of the recently-released CBC Radio Study Group's report on arts and music programming, there will be a programming shift in favour of popular music - how much of a shift and how successful it is in building CBC-radio evening and daytime audiences will be more clear when the shows are actually on the air.

The part of the shift most important to the popular-music industry is the move of four returning weekday-evening music shows - Great Canadian Gold Rush, Touch The Earth, Jazz Radio-Canada, and Country Road - from the 10:00 p.m. spot to 8:30 p.m. and the addition of a new top-40 record program, 90 Minutes With A Bullet, to run on Wednesday 8:30 - 10, featuring a computer-correlated national record chart.

All the 8:30 p.m. weekday shows will run for 90 minutes following the peak CBC-radio weekday audience spots - built on CBC's national news and the popular As It Happens current affairs programme.

CBC radio-magazine shows will be beefing up their music presentations this year, but The Entertainers, the Sunday afternoon variety show, will be replaced by Special

CFTR free summer rock concerts a success

Sunday Sept 12 CFTR presented its last free outdoor rock concert at Toronto's City Hall square. Since the beginning of August, the station has staged 25 pop and rock groups in the square, in 8 concerts, including Charity Brown, Jackson Hawke, Deja Vu, Wednesday, A Foot In Coldwater, Sweeney Todd and others.

Clive Corcoran, station promotion director, says that the most successful shows - Charity Brown and Wednesday - drew about 2,500 people, according to police estimates. Average attendance was about 1,500. The series was planned far in advance, with negotiations for use of the square, having begun last September.

This was the first summer the station has arranged the concert series, and Corcoran told RPM that it was so successful they fully intend to do the same next summer, perhaps with more concerts.

Corcoran figures that the concert series has increased the station's presence and visibility to the Toronto listening audience by 100%.

Occasion, a series of two-hour specials, including some musicals.

90 Minutes With A Bullet will originate from Winnipeg with host, music journalist Jim Millican. Producer Colin Bennett says the show will have a national record chart based on reports from more than 100 Canadian radio stations, local and national sales figures - all fed into a computer which will produce a weekly listing. The show will also feature interviews with artists, music writers and industry reports.

There will also be a popular music, 90-minute weekly show featuring contemporary records from Quebec, Sundays at 10:30 p.m.; and a programme of stage and film music following the 11:00 p.m. news on Saturdays.

Morningside, the new weekday morning magazine show, will be airing live and taped music sessions from CBC studios across Canada. David Amer, Morningside music editor, told RPM that the show has a tight music-budget of only \$700 a week; but they're trying to work a variety of unusual Canadiana into the show.

They've researched into the national archives in Ottawa and found a number of 19th Century and turn-of-the-century popular songs which will be performed by John Arpin and presented "with affection and nostalgia." The show has already booked

CBC computer musical to be aired Oct 24

CBC radio is breaking a new kind of star into the music world - Beula, a Digital PDP 11/10 computer who premieres October 24 1:03 p.m. on CBC's The Entertainers as the computer that rules the world in 1990 in David McLey's The Revelation.

But Beula is more than a star - she is the show. The computer sings, talks and plays much of the music. She sings with the voice of Bev D'Angelo (star of Cliff Jones' radio musicals Hey Marilyn and Hamlet), broken down into numbers a computer can "hear" and reconstruct to be used by the computer to play the lead role.

D'Angelo and Cal and Rory Dodd also star with the Digital PDP. In the radio production Beula is accompanied by McLey on piano and a string section led by Milan Kymlicka.

The story, based on the Biblical account in the Book of Revelation Chapter 13, was commissioned by Entertainers producer Ann Hunter.

McLey scored and created the produc-COMPUTER continued on page 20 David Wilcox and the Teddy Bears, and Bruce Miller for upcoming appearances for 15 minute national-exposure spots.

The problem with the live show is the time of performance. A performer who appears on the early part of the show, which begins taping for Atlantic-region airing at 8:13 a.m., has to be in the studio at 7:00 - earlier local time, if the performance is being fed in from a Western studio. To beat this, Amer will pre-tape some musical sections of the show one day earlier.

The Entertainers is off the air and in its place is the weekly two-hour Special Occasion, which will open November 7 with a salute to CBC's 40th birthday. The text of that show has been written by CRTC chief Harry Boyle, a former CBC producer.

Former - The Entertainers producer Ann Hunter told RPM that the slot will be filled by entertaining specials, not neccesarily only about entertainment. With all CBC radio departments participating in the programming, she explained, the show will be a vehicle to produce shows which no individual department's budget would allow - including a few musicals commissioned to Canadian composers.

Hunter, veteran producer for CBC radio variety and broadcast recordings - the part of the corporation that makes records of broadcast and non-broadcast performances, primarily for spot broadcast on local and national CBC programmes - told RPM that the shift to bring CBC's lower-brow music programming into prime-time exposure, as well as to try to increase the production of shows and broadcast recordings of non-highbrow music, began well before the current programming report was completed.

The scheduling change, and her idea to introduce the top-40 show and the national chart was agreed on before the summer.

The CBC FM network will be broadcasting some of the AM network's popular-music programming at alternative times during the week. Touch The Earth will be aired Sundays at 5 p.m.; Jazz Radio-Canada, Saturday at 2:04 p.m.; Great Canadian Gold Rush, Saturday at 11:05 p.m.; Special Occasion, Thursday at 9:04.


The popular Sunday Magazine show moves to the FM network exclusively this year, running weekly for 85 minutes beginning at noon.

In addition to a wealth of classical and light-classical shows, the FM network will air Midnight Jazz every weekday evening; Music To Listen To Jazz By, Sundays at 11:05; and Re-Cycling The Blues, Saturday at 10:05. AG

playlisting the single are CKNW, CJJC, CBUF and the CBC. Across the border in Alberta, CJCA AM and FM have aired the single which was produced by John Driscoll and released on his Skyline label distributed by Quality.

The Attic crowd have a great fan at CKOB. The station's General Manager, Martin Burns, while on a trip to Ireland this year, happened on a copy of Combine Harvester by the Wurtzels. Back home, he played it a few times on the air and the station was flooded with calls as to where it could be purchased. 
