Sward to speak at Three Days In March

Noted Canadian broadcasting executive, Jim Sward, will be the keynote speaker for the Monday session (Mar 14) of this year's Three Days In March (C15). Mr. Sward, regarded as a Canadian broadcasting phenonemon, was recently appointed executive vice-president of Rogers Radio Broadcasting with headquarters in Toronto.

Born in Toronto, the son of a Canadian Armed Forces NCO, Sward travelled extensively through his formative years, attending 21 primary and high schools and finally making Ottawa his home.

Sward first entered the broadcast field at the age of 19 in 1964 as a retail salesman at Ottawa's CKOY. Two years later he was appointed general sales manager for CHSJ Saint John. Station executives weren't aware that Sward was under 21 and when finalizing his appointment at the Appelby Hotel, he was asked for ID and was forced to leave the hotel because of his age.

Moving to Montreal in 1967 Sward was appointed general sales manager for CFOX a position he held until 1970 when he moved downtown to CKGM as general manager of CKGM - at 24, the youngest in his profession to hold such a position having so much responsibility. Three years later he was appointed managing director of the Maisonneuve Broadcasting complex taking charge of CKGM and its sister FM station CHOM.

Mr. Sward's new appointment with the Rogers' chain becomes effective in March.

U.S. syndication for CHUM documentary

The CHUM produced documentary, Evolution Of Rock (The Music That Made The World Turn 'Round) has been picked up for syndication by several leading U.S. radio stations. The special was produced by Warren Cosford with Bob McMillan and Zeke Zdebiak.

Stations that have picked up the special include WRKO Boston, 99X New York City, KFRC San Francisco, WLS Chicago, KLIF Dallas, KHJ Los Angeles and WHBQ Memphis. Enquiries have also been received from several countries including the U.K., South Africa, Australia and New Zealand.

The documentary consists of one four hour introductory chapter plus 20 three

hour segments dealing with each year from the early fifties through to and including 1976. CHUM's Program Director, J. Robert Wood, explained: "It is the most comprehensive audio history of rock music ever produced". There are more than one thousand hit records plus many hundreds of feet of rare tapes including never before broadcast interviews

Wood is particularly proud that the program was signed to RKO and ABC chains in the U.S. He also reports that another program is in the making which will deal with progressive radio.

CHUM's previous documentary "The Story of The Beatles, was aired by more than 400 international stations.

Sobell & Stein producing McCann at Can-Base

It was reported in RPM last week that Polydor recording artist Denise McCann was being produced at Vancouver's Little Mountain Sound. Keith Stein, a Vancouverbased producer/engineer, informs RPM that this information was incorrect. McCann is currently being produced by her husband, Guy Sobell at Can-Base Studios with Stein in charge of engineering.

Stein, a native of Los Angeles has been living in Vancouver for the past five years, three of which he was staff engineer at Can-Base. While Stateside he engineered recording sessions for several name groups including the Incredible Bongo Band. He has also engineered sessions for the Irish Rovers including their K-Tel Kids and Immigrant, Immigrant albums.

Dixon-Propas appointed to handle Ontario Place

The Toronto-based entertainment consultant firm of Dixon-Propas Productions has been appointed to handle forum programming for the Forum of Ontario Place. They will negotiate the acquisition of all entertainment for the 120 day run of the Forum (May 21 through Oct 11).

Neill Dixon and Steve Propas founded their company three years ago, building a steady list of clientele among club owners and performing acts. Collectively they represent more than 12 years in the business both acquiring a sound knowledge of promotion, publicity and public relations dealing with all segments of show business.

Although there is no Canadian quota for Ontario Place, there is a definite preference for the domestic variety of talent. Policy, in the past, has been to break as many Canadian acts as possible. It's expected there will be more Canadian acts booked as headliners and a higher degree of concentration on contemporary talent.

Sales figures to be submitted are net unit sales times suggested list price. Tape sales should be included in album sales.

Each company may submit up to five entries per category. All sales figures are submitted to an independent auditor and are kept strictly confidential.

Budget, premium, promotional and record club sales should not be included on entries. Budget is defined as selling at less than half of the regular full line retail price.

Net sales figures should be for a 14 month period beginning with November 1, 1975 and concluding the last day of 1976.

Canadian artists may be nominated in Categories 14 and 15.

Nominees for Composer of the Year will be the first ten Canadian composers as determined by the best selling single records (Category 2). These ten nominees would be listed on the ballot with the titles of their qualifying compositons. A co-composer would qualify.

Nominees for Female, Male, Group and Country Female, Country Male and Country Group will be based on the top five best selling artists in each category. The definition of sales would be the same as in the sales category except that the figure submitted by each company for each entry would be net unit sales during the 14 month period for all qualifying recorded product: i.e. singles, LP's and tapes. Each company may submit up to five (5) entries in each category. If an artist has product released on more than one label, total sales would qualify.

Nominees for the Best New Vocalist category would also be based upon sales with the following qualifications. The first record by the artist must have been released within the subject year or the prior year. A prior winner or nominee would be excluded from the nominees. A group with a name change along with a significant change in personnel would qualify as a new group.

Nominees for Canadian Producer of the Year will be those associated with the best selling singles and albums of the year.

Canadian albums featuring original album graphics will be voted on by a selected independent panel, their choice to be submitted to an independent auditor. Submit five (5) copies of total record packages to the CARAS office, 245 Davenport Road, Toronto M5R 1K1, Attention: Brian Robertson.

Recording Engineer category will be voted on by a panel of five (5) members of the Canadian Independent Record Producers Association. Results will be submitted to an independent auditor.

Best Jazz Recording and Best Classical Recording will be voted on by a separate selected panel, their choice to be submitted to an independent auditor. Please submit five (5) copies of the record to the CARAS office, 245 Davenport Road, Toronto M5R 1K1, Attention: Brian Robertson.

IMPORTANT INFORMATION

Canadian recordings performed in any language other than English are not eligible for the Juno Awards. French language recordings will be judged under an awards format currently being devised by the AQPD (Quebec Producers' Association) and winners will be recognized on future Juno Award Shows.

It is recommended that independent labels liaise with their distributors in order to ensure that submissions have not been excluded or duplicated.

Except where noted, all awards will be made to Canadians as defined by the CRTC Regulations.

Spirit, U.S. firm pact representation deal

Doug Smith, president of Toronto-based Spirit Records, reports a deal has been firmed between Smith and Paul Smith of Los Angeles-based Music Management International making the U.S. firm partial management and U.S. representative for Spirit group Sara Hamilton & David.

Paul Smith reports Music Management will arrange U.S. record deals and tours for the group and deal with matters such as immigration law. Doug Smith will continue to manage the group in Canada.

Spirit have released a debut single, Help Yourself, from the group. An album is in the works.

Evoy & Good Brothers set for Browne production

New Jersey-based producer Larry Browne, perhaps best known for his writing and production of the Tony Orlando and Dawn hit, Tie A Yellow Ribbon 'Round The Old Oak Tree, has signed a production deal involving Larry Evoy and The Good Brothers.

Neill Dixon of the Dixon-Propas Production firm had apparently contacted Bob Crewe in hopes that he would produce Evoy but because of pressure of other work he passed but recommended his one-time partner Browne. When contacted Browne was looking for a group similiar to the Eagles which brought the Good Brothers into the picture. Dixon set up arrangements for Browne to meet with Attic's Al Mair

and Ed Preston of RCA at MIDEM where a further Canadian meeting was arranged.

The deal calls for four sides for Evoy and an album for the Goods. Browne is expected to write some material for the two acts however, the choice of material will be agreed on by all parties.

Quality releases four Badger albums

Quality Records have shipped three new Badger albums, Yesterday And Today by Paul's People, Steve Bogard's album, titled after his name, and the English group Airborne.

Singles have already been released from each album. Bogard's Touching Each Other has been receiving strong country and MOR play; Airborne's single is titled Give Me The Reason; and Paul's People's is The Morning Song.

The Paul's People and Bogard efforts were produced by Paul Zaza of Toronto's Zaza Sound, who is also Paul of Paul's People.

BMIC announces winners in American Song Fest

BMIC Canada reports seven of their members were awarded prizes in the 1976 American Song Festival. The list is topped by Calgary songwriter Ron Mahonin, who was a semifinalist in the annual competition's Top 40 category.

Other BMIC winners, given honourable mention prizes of 100 dollars each are Ottawa region writers Michael Belanger, Terry Carisse and Bruce Rawlins, S.B. "Whitey" Hains of Toronto, Bill Hillmna of Strathclair, Manitoba, and Tim Daniels, who won awards for two of his songs.

Nimbus-Soundstage ships second direct-to-disc

Umbrella Records, a division of Nimbus in Toronto, has released its second direct-to-disc record, Nexus Ragtime Concert by Nexus. The album was produced by Jack Richardson at Soundstage Studio, and mastered instantaneously at JAMF, the mastering facility next door which is connected to the studio by underground tie-lines

Ilona Pring of Nimbus-Soundstage reports another direct-to-disc effort in the making by violinist Phil Frank, accompanied by piano. It will also be produced by Jack Richardson.

Umbrella Records have distribution arrangements in Canada, the U.S. and Japan, where Nexus are popular. The Canadian distributor is Superior Electronics.

The company's first direct-to-disc effort was by Toronto group Rough Trade, an album titled after their name.



The brilliant British team of Andrew Lloyd Webber and Tim Rice, the same duo who created a contemporary figure out of Jesus Christ, if one might be so bold, with their rock opera, Jesus Christ Superstar, have returned once again with a memorable, but not so famous subject. Eva Peron, the famous wife of the Argentine Dictator, Juan, whored her way into political prominence with the plus of being worshipped as the spiritual leader of Latin America. Webber and Rice have put together, as they did with JCS, an album (2-record set) and MCA, as they did with JCS, have launched a worldwide promotion campaign to bring the album home.

Webber and Rice, attended a lavish New York City MCA preview of the album which included helpful film clips of the life and legend of Eva Peron, a rather unfair upper they have on the average consumer who will have only the words of the critics and hopefully, the music as selected by

radio programmers.

Both Webber and Rice warded off negatives thrown at them and were confident the world was waiting for a "Cinderella story with a realistic twist". Rice, the more outspoken of the two, told RPM: "Evita is a gamble, just like Jesus Christ Superstar was. Andrew and I felt that the life of Eva Peron was a classic worth telling. She is still regarded by many as a saint and, at the time of her death in 1952 she had accomplished as much, even with her handicap, as did some of the great and mysterious women who preceded her".

Perhaps the timing is right. Eva Peron brought a little lace and panty scandal into a Dictatorship. Although many were the victims of her husband, many more were given the sustenance of life which prolonged their existence and added to the spiritual stature of this happy hooker. There has been made a place in history for Eva Peron and Webber and Rice could succeed in immortalising this "first of the liberated broads".

The climb to fame and sainthood however, was not without many pitfalls and sad experiences for Argentine's first lady (who was actually Juan's second). In her efforts to do more for the common folk she naturally ran afoul of the elite and, if cancer hadn't killed her in 1952, Webber and Rice may have had a far more interesting capper to their story.

incidentally, got her to the big city of Buenos Aires and into the world of modelling, broadcasting and the tinsel world of film as an actress of beauty and note.

One character who keeps showing up throughout the opera is identified only as Che, a young Argentine student (C.T. Wilkinson) who provides the more realistic dialogue to bring the pieces together.

One salvation for this set could be the compelling lyrics and infectiously beautiful melody line of Don't Cry For Me Argentina, to be released as a single and which is already scoring nicely in Britain.

"Don't cry for me Argentina The truth is I never left you All through my wild days My mad existence I kept my promise

Don't keep your distance."

... a brilliant performance turned in by Julie Covington.

Unlike the demographics that scored so well for Jesus Christ Superstar, Evita's appeal could be far more reaching and, of course, the record buying public has grown up. Evita could find favour with the 18 to 49 plus group - the adult contemporaries who are now being recognized as "most important" at the record retail level.

Webber and Rice still have an ace up their sleeve - a stage production of Evita, now being considered for the fall and a possible film which some observers have already construed as putting the cart before the horse. But then, they don't have the writing talents of Webber and Rice nor the bankroll behind this massive venture, already beginning to roll.

One criticism could be levelled at the lack of photo coverage of this great lady which were obviously available and could have become an interesting addition to the

How do you market "An opera based on the life story of an unknown?" It's going to be a long haul however, if MCA are successful in having Covington's single added to adult contemporary stations across Canada, the chore could be simplified. As well, the album is highly recommended for FM foreground programming.

MCA Canada's Vice-President, Scott Richards told RPM: "Our entire staff is excited about Evita and our network of promotion people are gearing themselves for a major push on Julie Covington's Don't Cry For Me Argentina, Initial sales reaction has been great.'



Brian Robertson on the Junos

Brian Robertson, executive-secretary of The Academy of Recording Arts & Sciences (CARAS) was recently interviewed by RPM's Stan Klees regarding the progress being made with this year's Juno Awards. The interview follows.

Were there any difficulties with the Juno nominations this year and have there been any changes in the proceedings as far as nominations are concerned?

The two obvious changes were the addition of two extra categories. One was classical and the other was jazz.

Why was the folk category taken out and then put back in?

At a meeting of the CARAS directors, regional representatives and the advisory

board last December, there was a general consensus that the folk category was a very grey area, inasmuch as it was difficult to control in terms of determining who was eligible for that category. There was some comment made that it was outdated in terms of identifying who was a "folkie" and who was a country singer and who was male or female vocalist of the year. In order to try to clear it up, it was decided at that time to withdraw it from the list of awards. Following that, there was quite a lot of comment both in the media and through telephone calls we got here against that action. We convened a meeting of the directors of CARAS, analyzed the comments and calls and, basically, they reversed their

decision and decided to keep it in, with the proviso that the directors would have the option of determining themselves who was eligible for that category, which they did this year.

Would you agree with the statement that it's easy to put in new categories, but it's going to be extremely hard to withdraw any categories from here on in?

I think so. I don't know whether it was the fact that the folk category was so close to the roots of Canada that caused people to go so emotional about it; I tend to think that was one of the reasons. A lot of people said the folk category was unique to Canada and that type of music dominated others more than anything.

Were there any general problems with nominations this year? Were there a lot of audits or any confusion?

No. We made a decision this year that we would have all the best selling categories audited as a matter of course, primarily because those four categories - best selling Canadian single and album and best selling international single and album, are based solely on sales. The winners are determined on sales only, and there is no voting.

When will the voting ballots go out and what is the deadline?

Voting ballots go out Feb 18 and the deadline will be March 7.

How do you feel about this year's awards as they stand now?

We're enthusiastic. There's an awful lot of interest in them both at the ticket level at the Royal York and in the show, not only from the industry but also from the people who are participating - the artists and the potential nominees. We've noticed that in particular this year. The enthusiasm seems to be reflected in a lot of the so-called "names" that are attending or appearing on the show, either as guests for the evening or as presenters.

Host for this year's Juno telecast is Winnipeg-born David Steinberg, now enjoying a successful U.S. TV series. Talent lineup for the show will include Carroll Baker, the T.H.P Orchestra, Patsy Gallant, Andre Gagnon, Keath Barrie, Ian Tyson and special guests, the Four Lads.

Mel Shaw discusses CARAS

Following is an RPM interview with Mel Shaw, president of the Canadian Academy of Recording Arts & Sciences (CARAS). He was asked about the nomination procedure for this year's Juno Awards and the general reaction among CARAS members toward the event.

How do you feel about the nominations procedure this year and have there been any changes?

The nominations are going along very well. I feel that although it wasn't a blockbuster year for the industry, there are a lot of good categories - the new group for instance. We've added a jazz category and classical category. We have a panel for that. We've had a good response, even beyond what we expected in the number of records. We'll have five nominees in each category. I feel it gives a wider recognition there. I'm very happy with how the response has been in each category.

How is membership as far as voting is concerned?

We seem to have hit an industry median. the same as NARAS has. I've talked with Jake Cooper, the president of the American academy (NARAS). They're a little over 4,000 and, comparing the markets sizewize, we seem to be fine.

Approximately what figure are we at now? In between six and seven hundred.

What would you expect to hit as the ultimate industry figure?

Already I think this is a pretty solid re-

presentation. But there are some new members and a few people didn't rejoin perhaps they're inactive now. I would like to look for 1,000 as a real optimum figure. They seem to want to join after we closed off. We seem to have a great big rush of people who want to join, just for the mere fact that they want a break on the Juno tickets and better seating. A lot of people wanted to join, but it was too late. The forms had gone out. The expenses of mailing out information, newsletters, compiling everything, takes up time and money. CARAS members were offered savings on Juno tickets up until February 15. After that, seats were made available to the industry at \$40 per seat. So, a couple could save \$30 by joining CARAS, or double the membership fee. I feel the Junos have turned into such a high interest point with people phoning and artists getting involved and coming in from all over, that those who were a little lackadaisical will find, especially this year, that they may lose out.

How do you feel about the early break on the emcee and the performers and the inaccuracies that appeared in some of the dailies and in some of the international trades?

Everyone is so anxious to get any information whatsoever, we were a victim of scanty news and rumour. As soon as any little thing is confirmed they like to pick up on it. I think that shows the amount of interest in the Junos that's been building all these

Do you think it will affect the ratings, being shown on a Wednesday instead of a Monday? It's hard to determine. I don't think so. That didn't seem to be a concern to the CBC or the Academy to assume that the ratings would be less. I don't think when you have such a big national event, it matters what day it's on. It's going to be a really big show. We've had some comment about the Four Lads. I checked on them. about the Four Lads, I checked on them. They had 17 records hit the charts in a row, back from 1955-59 and had been on the charts for about 269 straight weeks. That was ten years before the Juno Awards were started by RPM, I think that it's a nice thing that they're on the show. When this is brought to the attention of some of the skeptical people who were wondering why, I think it's a nice way to honour somebody who did so well in the past, especially in light of the fact that it's the 100th anniversary of recorded sound.


(Ed: An interesting footnote to this interview is the fact that Stan Klees, the interviewer, put the Four Lads on radio for the first time in the late 40s. The radio station was CHUM. The Four Lads were still at school in Toronto, It was before they recorded and it was their first live performance on radio.)



CIRPA's second symposium

by J. J. Linden

The Canadian Independent Record Producers Association held its second symposium at Toronto's Park Plaza Hotel February 10-14. Attendance was heavy among its members, who include publishers, managers, booking agents and promoters as well as producers from throughout

CIRPA was formed about six years ago on a basically informal basis by a number of independent producers in order to protect themselves and mutually further their cause. Among the founding members were Mel Shaw, journalist Ritchie Yorke, Greg Hambleton, and RPM's Stan Klees.

The first symposium was held in 1974 over a two-week period.

LEGAL TACTICS

Proceedings got under way in earnest on Friday morning with a workshop on contracts featuring lawyers Jerry Edelstein from New York and Bernie Solomon from Toronto. Edelstein teaches music business law and has represented many musicians including Bette Midler and Neil Sedaka. Solomon represents many of Canada's recording artists.

The workshop began with a demonstration of the artist's representative in contract discussions with the lawyer from a typical record company. References were made to the facets of the relationship between the two, such as percentage of sales royalties, artist commitments as to amount of material to be recorded, duration of contract and options for renewal, company commitments by the company as to promotion payments, tour support and the size and nature of advance.

FINANCES

The finance workshop was conducted by Vancouver accountant Grahame Waymark of Waymark & Reid, who specialize in ballet, theatre and rock music. Among his clients are Bachman Turner Overdrive.

Keynotes of the finance workshop were discussion of ways and means of dealing with U.S. withholding taxes, means for an artist or independent producer to get financing, different ways of easing the tax situation and the advantages and drawbacks of moving to the U.S.

Above all else, Waymark stresses the importance for any artist or producer of getting sound financial advice before making any deals. He feels careful consideration should be given to whether to incorporate, and for which aspects - - he advises artists are often best off to incorporate for publishing only - - and to which rights organization to belong to, as each of the Canadian and U.S. groups have different advantages which apply to musicians in different situations



distributed by London Records. The three
mentioned that since London carries fewer
Canadian and U.S. acts than many of the other major distributors, it is an ideal company for dealing with independents, as it pany for dealing with independents, as it doesn't compete with them and also has time to promote efforts by the independ-

All three stressed the need of the smaller independent to remain in as much control as possible. They all insist on having publishing, although they renegotiate with an act that has a top seller. Axe saves money in having president Hambleton do the producing, and Taurus is a division of successful management company SRO.

The independents have the disadvantage of being unable to mount an expensive promo campaign, having nothing to write it off against. They must do a stronger, more personal job of promotion and be in constant touch with radio, distributor and plants in order to insure smooth action on their product. This personal promo style often reaps success with product that majors wouldn't record, such as Hagood Hardy's The Homecoming.

Yamaha consolidates national operation

With the opening of Yamaha Canada's new national headquarters in Toronto (Scarborough), plans are now underway to move all main offices to the national base.

These include their audio, musical instrument and sporting goods divisions. As the need arises, additional warehouse facilities will be acquired to accommodate the company's expected rapid growth.

The musical instrument division, perhaps the most important from the music trade standpoint, is headed by National Sales Manager, John Kennedy. His division is divided into two groups - one being the small musical instrument division, managed by Tim Craig and the keyboard division with Dave Mitchell as manager. The latter recently came into prominence with the unveiling of their organ-synthesizer (GX-1) described as the equivalent of nine 37-key polyphonic synthesizers blended into one unit. Stevie Wonder contributed to the international acclaim of the GX-1 which was featured on his Motown album, Songs In The Key Of Life. The album shipped Platinum in Canada and has been enjoying heavy sales to date.

Garcia, Grateful Dead sign with Arista

Capitol/EMI of Canada report California group The Greatful Dead have been signed to Arista Records. The label is distributed in Canada by Capitol. In the same package, contracts were firmed with group leader Jerry Garcia and his band and another Dead member, Bob Weir, and his band.

Arista also signed a new group, Hollywood Stars.

Capitol's Kris Kerenyi reports additional new signings on the Capitol label, Additions are Bobby Gosh and Richard Torrance, whose debut album Bareback is slated for a March release.

Charles-Dunne & Owens to promo Prokop

Stan Lepka, national promo co-ordinator of Quality Records, reports that Toronto publicity firm Charles-Dunne & Owens has been retained by Quality to work promotion on Quality's new signee Skip Prokop. Lepka explained that Quality, busy promoting artists Lynx, Sweet Blindness, the Stampeders and Bruce Murray, hired the PR firm in order to give Prokop the representation they feel he deserves as "one of Canada's most celebrated musician-performers."

Lepka is of the opinion the forthcoming Prokop album, Old Photographs, will be a success internationally as well as in Canada.

"Sold Out" notices for Hill's concerts

Bernie Fiedler of Finkelstein-Fiedler, manager of GRT artist Dan, Hill, reports almost all of the artist's Ontario tour dates have been sold out. Sellouts took place in Belleville, Peterboro, Timmins, Sudbury, Thunder Bay, Barrie and Hamilton. Hill also flew into St. John's, Newfoundland to make an appearance on 90 Minutes Live.

Future dates are slated for Winnipeg February 9, Brandon (10), Cornwall (18), and Montreal (19). After that Hill goes to California for appearances there.

Thunder Sound sold to Marsden, Frenette

David Marsden and Fred Frenette of David Marsden Creative Productions have purchased Toronto's Thunder Sound Studios and took over administration January 20. Marsden has been in Thunder's building for two and a half years and has used the studios extensively.

The building, located at 29 Davenport, was formerly owned by Brink's Security and used for their offices and storage of their money. It is built of solid cement and was a natural site for sound studios.

Thunder Sound consists of two studios, a main 24-track studio with a new MCI machine which adapts to 16-track recording, and a new smaller studio with a 3-M 8-track machine and an MCI board and four-track

machine. The second studio was built late in 1975. Thunder underwent major renovations at that time which included a new isolation booth, the 24-track board, and a complete rebuilding of the main studio for better acoustics.

The main studio has a full complement of effects equipment, including phasers, omnipressers, digital delay lines and a new Eventide Harmonizer. Marsden is happy with the facilities: "As far as equipment in both studios is concerned, they're equipped with anything and everything that has to be there to get the sound. In the large studio for example, we can seat up to 40 musicians depending on the type of equipment."

Marsden also announced the addition of

a new engineer, James Kaye, who comes to Thunder from Los Angeles where he most recently worked on Neil Diamond's latest album. Kaye also has two and a half years experience with the Andre Perry Studios in Montreal, and eight years' overall.

Marsden reports David Marsden Creative Productions will continue to function, with Lindsay Gillespie in charge of operations. One of its recent projects has been a 60-minute Bob Seger radio special featuring non-stop music. They will also continue to produce radio commercials.

Marsden is very optimistic about the future of Thunder Sound: "What we want to do is re-energize Thunder and make it one of the top-rated studios in North America, There is a whole new feeling here."



Radio talking books introduced by CING


CING Radio in Burlington, Ontario in co-operation with the Oakville Public library have recently announced their intentions of broadcasting a unique service for the visually handicapped. The service is being called Radio Talking Books and will be carried on the CING stereo 108 FM subcarrier frequency. The signal for Radio Talking Books should in no way interfere with the regular programming of CING, made possible by means of special receivers distributed to the visually handicapped. The resulting programming will be of interest to an estimated 20,000 visually handicapped that could receive the broadcast signal in the Toronto & Hamilton areas, and perhaps as far as Niagara Falls and Buffalo.

Final approval will come from the CRTC by late February or early March with a planned airdate now being set for the late spring of this year.

The broadcast day (19 hours, 7 days per week) will consist entirely of locally produced programming, or pre-recorded packaged shows. Newspapers, magazines, best-selling books, interviews and information of interest will make up the bulk of the schedule. No use whatsoever will be made of CNIB or commercially produced Talking Books. Most programming will be either live or recorded at CING.

CING has laid down general policies for the station which are as follows. The Radio Reading Service will broadcast no commercial messages. Preference will always be given to Canadian material, with each broadcast week containing at least 90% Canadian content. The bulk of the broadcast material is the spoken word, CING feels that with all types of music available on regular AM and FM radio stations there is no reason why CING should compete with them. News broadcasts will have considerable emphasis on local events, in depth news background material, and to news of special interest to the print handicapped.

Broadcast will be principally in English however provision has been made to broadcast one hour of French language material per week, with the idea of producing an Indian language program in the future.



Stock moves to Masters Workshop

David Stock, former senior engineer at Toronto's Eastern Sound, has moved over to Masters Workshop in Rexdale, Ontario. He will manage the 16 track facility.

Stock's credits as a freelance engineer include sessions in the U.K. for Deep Purple, and Doris Troy. As well, he has worked with Mickie Most and engineered the session for Chester which resulted in their hit of Make My Life A Little Bit Brighter.

Stock is currently cutting sides for country artist Rick Diamond.

Other activities at Masters include a single session by Chuck Beal for Bananas; a self-produced single session for Grampa; and demo session by MCA producer John Stewart for Scott Newton.

Jingle business at Masters is also picking up due the efforts of Tom Baroni.

BST head up an all-GRT CBC Superspecial

New GRT signee through ABC Records in the U.S., Blood Sweat & Tears are in Toronto recording a CBC Superspecial. Four more GRT acts will also be on the bill, making the evening an all GRT event.

The other artists are singer-comic Martin Mull, known for such numbers as Dueling Tubas and 2001 Polkas, Rufus, and rockblues artists Bo Diddley and Chuck Berry.

Epic releases Jackson Hawke single in U.S.

Epic Records in the U.S. has released Jackson Hawke's first single Into The Mystic from their album Forever. Last month New York executives of CBS Records International flew to Toronto to see the band perform.

CBS in the U.S. has paid particular attention to Jackson Hawke since the 1976 International Convention in Los Angeles.

The Programmers

Listener-sponsored CJRT does it all over again

Toronto's listener-supported FM station, CJRT, is in the middle of its annual fundraising drive with \$107,000 still needed to cover their current operating budget, according to station manager Cam Finley.

CJRT has an annual operating budget of \$790,000, with \$580,000 coming from

the Ontario government.

"Last year there was tremendous interest in our financial campaign and programming," Finley told RPM, "but this year it seems we're old hat."

To generate new interest in the station, CJRT is sponsoring a media conference February 15 with 100 invited Toronto media personalities to discuss the station's plight and its role in the Toronto broadcast scene.

"CBC listeners are discovering us with new programming changes there," Finley noted. CJRT broadcasts a wide range of classical, jazz and folk-style music with regularly scheduled shows and no commercials.

CJRT has carried out successful personal subscription and corporate sponsorship drives, and they've hired a professional fund raiser with money from a Wintario grant.

They've scheduled a big benefit jazz night at Toronto's St. Lawrence Market for the last weekend in March.

CBC-TV specials wake up discbiz promo

A few record companies have learned to take advantage of the national exposure some of Canada's top stars have enjoyed this season on CBC-TV's Superspecial series.

When the right ingredients are mixed, like a star with a new record or national tour and a prime-time TV hour, the public takes note - and even buy some records, according to those involved with stars like Valdy, Anne Murray and Murray McLauch-

Anne Murray's December Sunday-night showcase was viewed by more than 3 million Canadians - about as many as have ever watched Canadian talent on the TV screen. Capitol Records' people say the publicity campaign they carried out with CBC variety promo around the show has netted healthy sales.

Capitol's Mike Kernahan and CBC placed ads in TV Guide and 17 major newspapers, and circulated thousands of posters and flyers to record outlets across the country to advance the show, which was titled Keeping In Touch - the same as her then-new Capitol LP. Artwork on the posters was taken from the LP jacket design.



increase in demand for LPs by Bruce Cockburn, who was a featured guest on the Boulevard special.

CBC plans to rebroadcast the special sometime later this year and True North and the network have plans for it in the U.S., where McLauchlan's LP is receiving

top critical praise.

True North has co-production rights to the show and stands to realize a share of the income it may generate from U.S. sales. Finkelstein plans to run with the TV tapes in Chicago and Los Angeles now that he's set dates for a tour by McLauchlan and his band in the U.S. in March. He's looking at independent syndicators or the Public Broadcasting System there to show interest in the entire show or selected segments. True North has sent tapes of the show to Island Records, McLauchlan's U.S. distribut-

Each of the Sunday night CBC specials has picked up ratings. The series premiere with the Boulevard special netted about 1 million viewers - - dead against a deciding baseball playoff game.

"We used the special almost like a national gig," Finkelstein said: "We have to give CBC and (producers) Ron Marcasca and Ian Anderson top marks." TV critics rated the show among the best Canadian variety productions.



Country Cleek

Gold and Ottawa barbs

Those great guffaws of southern accented laughter from dressing room A, backstage at Hamilton Place the other night were Conway Twitty's reaction to recent newspaper reviews of his performance at the National Arts Centre in Ottawa. The clippings had just caught up to the Twitty entourage, courtesy of MCA's national promotion manager, Bob Johnston, Twitty's co-star, Cal Smith, was reading the reviews aloud as Conway and his Mrs., daughter Joni Lee and her husband Chris, assorted musicians from the Birds and The Bumpkins, several representitives of MCA Records and your reporter got right off on his efforts. The review that appeared in the Journal, over the signature of Ian Haysom, brought some of the biggest laughs. A quote or two if I may: "His abbreviated act (let's not grace it by calling it a performance) was devoid of humanity at all. Twitty, a celluloid robot, walked on stage in a ridiculous costume and sang some favourites from his repertoire. He didn't speak, didn't say how nice it was to be here, even." At another point in the article the reviewer trained his guns on Conway's stage name. "Although it's difficult to treat a man seriously with a name like Twitty (it's his own fault if we do. His real name is Harold Jenkins) the artist makes sure we do. He doesn't make fun of himself. He's as serious as they make them. Bland, yes. Boring, yes. But silly, no."

I can't help but wonder how the people taking in the Twitty show at the Arts Centre felt when they read that kind of a review in their daily paper the next day. On a couple of occasions, I'm told, the nearly full house demonstrated their feelings for Conway and company with standing ovations. Oh well, that kind of a review is a cross that most of us country folk have learned to bear.

A Hamilton concert for Conway is the closest thing to a homecoming the fabled MCA artist could experience and still be on the road. He began his career at a steel city night club called the Flamingo back in the late fifties. As fate would have it, the stage of the magnificent Hamilton Place

auditorium stands almost on the same ground where once Conway first sang for his supper. Matter of fact, Conway and his wife took time out to visit the Herkimer Street apartment where they lived during that Flamingo engagement that was originally scheduled for two weeks and grew into an eight week gig. Another career milestone occured during that stay at the Flamingo. That's the time, and the place, that Conway wrote It's Only Make Believe.

By the way, Conway's whole family have joined their famous dad on the MCA label with the late February release of son Michael's debut for the label. As is the case with both of his daughters, Joni Lee and Jessica James, Michael will use a stage name as he comes to the MCA fold. Charlie Tango


used to be the name of Conway's aircraft when he was a flyer in the Korean war, and that's the billing from here on in for Michael Twitty. His first MCA release is entitled, He's Not Country.

It must be said that the very positive attitude of the MCA Canada people towards country product generally is a very refreshing change of pace. Both national promo manager, Bob Johnston, and Ontario promo manager, Randy Sharrard, exude excitement when they talk about Conway Twitty in particular, and country product in general. This kind of positive approach is reflected in the attitude and efforts of the label's sales staff, all the way from Jim Morrissey in the Maritimes, through Geoff Gibbons in the Toronto area, right on out to big Jack Skelly, that dyn-o-myte MCA promoter in Winnipeg and the west. Sharrard had just returned from Sudbury, the previous stop for the Twitty/Cal Smith/Joni Lee product. With respect to MCA's attitude towards Conway Twitty, Bob Johnston said it all when he referred to Twitty as "the Elton John of country music". And this kind of effort and attitude was not lost on the artist either. Conway made it quite clear that if he had his way, he'd take the whole MCA Canada crew back home to the U.S. with him where their kind of thinking and action would indeed be unique in country music promotion and merchandising circles.

Two nights later, at Conway's Toronto dates in Massey Hall, the artist was presented with a gold album for Canadian sales on his High Priest album. Meanwhile, the Greatest Hits Volume 2 package is approaching the Canadian gold standard under a full head of steam.
