



Cancon rules apply to music videos

Hull, P.Q. The CRTC has moved quickly to bring music videos into line with legislation on Canadian content.

Effective April 15, television programs airing music videos must adhere to a 30% legislation, similar to AM radio requirements. This would mean that music video shows such as the CBC-TV's Vancouver production of *Good Rockin' Tonite* and CITY-TV's Toronto production of *Toronto Rocks*, hosted by John Majhor, would have to be 30% Cancon.

In the new ruling the CRTC requires that 1) at least two of the audio requirements (a through d) that follow, and three of the requirements (a through f) are met:

- a) instrumentation or lyrics are principally performed by a Canadian;
- b) music is composed by a Canadian;
- c) lyrics are written by a Canadian;

Compact disc price cut announced by CBS

Toronto: CBS Records has reduced the basic cost per unit for their compact disc product from \$17.99 to \$15.59. Don Oates, CBS Vice President, Sales and Marketing, commented on the reduction and CBS's interest in the disc phenomenon.

"Basically, the increased demand in the product has allowed for a reduction in price. It's predictable that once North American production comes on-line, the costs may very well come down further. We were the first people on the street with our product marketed through our CBS/Sony operation."

In the course of marketing the discs through the month of March, CBS will introduce the following marketing/merchandising tools:

- 1) The addition of 40 new titles
- 2) Adoption of the 6" and 12" clear plastic merchandiser
- 3) Availability of an attractive counter-top display unit
- 4) Catalogue brochures for the display units

Oates is confident that the disc products will achieve even greater prominence in the next few years.

"Where you might have said at one time, LP/cassette/8-track, in a few years we'll more than likely be saying LP/cassette/compact disc."

Increase in power for CBC shortwave

Ottawa: The CBC Radio Canada International's shortwave service to the iron curtain countries will get a signal boost as a result of an agreement with the BBC. The much stronger and clearer signal is expected to be beaming into Eastern Europe within two years.

Included in the \$5 million project is the delivery, installation and maintenance of two new transmitters situated in Davenport, England, replacing the 40 year old BBC transmitters now being used.

The agreement for upkeep will run until the year 2008.

- d) performance is in Canada;
- e) video director or production company is Canadian;
- f) video production facilities are located in Canada; and

2) as of January 1, 1986, at least one of the two video requirements (e or f) is met.

It's expected there will be strong opposition to the ruling, particularly from TV stations experiencing success with video countdown-type shows. Those wishing to submit comments on the ruling must do so in writing by April 2, 1984.

The Cancon video business can only gain by the ruling, prompting one observer to note: "The ruling will be a boon to the domestic video production business, and like many of the recording studio people did, they'll go on to become just as complacent and greedy."

Good Rockin' Tonite makes impressive gains

Vancouver: CBC-TV's *Good Rockin' Tonite* reports "an unprecedented 26% share of the 12-17 year old audience." Ron Devion, director of television says, "The amazing thing about *Good Rockin' Tonite* is that they have carved out an audience that didn't exist before."

The audience response has apparently been quite positive, an example being the program that featured Duran Duran and which attracted over 400 letters a day for more than three weeks. "Our viewers give so much of themselves and so much of their time - it's amazing," noted producer Ken Gibson. "We owe our success to them."

Host Terry David Mulligan will continue to show the latest rock videos and interview top performers like Spandau Ballet, The Pretenders, Bryan Adams, Genesis, UB40 and more.

The show can be seen in B.C. on Saturdays at 8:30 p.m. and is repeated on the full network (including Vancouver) on Fridays at 11:30 p.m.

Tembo/CTL campaign launches Patrician single

Toronto: Patrician Ann McKinnon's new single, *Suddenly*, her first release in eight years, has been shipped in a four-colour sleeve with a hefty promotion campaign by Tembo, the release label and the Canadian Talent Library. The single was produced by Micky Erbe at Toronto's Eastern Sound Studios.

The plug side was written by former Steamer member, Gordon Henderson, a well-known B.C. musician/songwriter. The flip, *Cry Like A Rainstorm*, was penned by Eric Kaz.

Tembo is distributed in Canada by RCA.

Pepsi-Cola launches Music Stars contest

Toronto: Pepsi-Cola Canada has announced a new advertising campaign featuring three Canadian bands: Rough Trade, True North recording group headed by Carole Pope, rockabilly-oriented Willie English, nominated for a U-Know Award this year, both based in Toronto, and Quebec's up-and-coming Spa Romance. The latter won CKOI-FM's talent search last year. An extended version of Spa Romance's jingle will be released as their first single, titled *Prends-Moi (Take Me)*. There is no release label at time of writing.

Jack Meier, Director of Marketing for Pepsi-Cola, says the commercials go to air March 19. "We are excited about them . . . these commercials are to advertising what rock videos are to the music industry."

The new campaign is a departure from the traditionally comparative nature of Pepsi-Cola's ad campaigns. The Music Stars contest will be a competition aimed at helping new and talented groups further their careers. "We believe that there is a lot of raw talent in Canada," continues Meier, "and we would like to make our contribution to further music careers."

A panel of judges in the contest cities of Montreal and Toronto will judge the entries. The winning band in each city will be provided with \$2,500 worth of studio time.

CBS Masterworks tribute to Toronto Int'l Fest

Toronto: The Toronto International Festival, a worldclass festival, comprising cultural events, music, dance and opera, will take place from June 1 through the 30th.

In accordance with its perception of this festival as such an internationally-recognized event, CBS Masterworks will firstly be acting as host of the Canadian Opera Company's production of *Death In Venice* (June 26). As well there is the close relationship enjoyed with many of the artists featured in the festival. These will include performances by Placido Domingo (Tosca/Francesca da Rimini), Marilyn Horne (Rinaldo) and the entire Mormon Tabernacle Choir of Salt Lake City. The Canadian Brass and the Toronto Symphony Orchestra under the baton of Andrew Davis are just two of the many ensembles that will represent Canada.

In conjunction with two events which are part of the upcoming festival, CBS Masterworks will be launching the *Win A Day At The Met* contest. Entry forms will be included in specially marked CBS Masterworks records and cassettes. The grand prize will include: two tickets to Tosca, two tickets to Rinaldo, return airfare for two to Toronto on CP Air, two nights accommodation at the King Edward Hotel (June 8-9), and \$200 spending money.

Music featured in the soundtrack comes from such names as Heart, Kickaxe, Ian Hunter, Randy Bishop, the Beach Boys and Danny Spanos. I'm also looking forward to an album from Julio Iglesias with Diana Ross, the Beach Boys and Pointer Sisters. This album will also include *To All The Girls I've Loved Before*, Julio's duet with Willie Nelson, now moving up the charts.

CFNY-FM schedules several spring events

Toronto: CFNY-FM will present several music/record events through March and April, showcasing acts as diverse as their programming format. March has already seen them present the East African Spectacle - Seigneur Tabule Rochereau and L'Orchestra Afrisa with Mbiliabel at the Bathurst Street Theatre, UB40 with special guest Sherry Kean at Massey Hall, Blue Peter at Nags Head North, the L'etranger album preview at Larry's Hideaway and on March 16 presented the 20th Century Rebels at Nag's Head North followed the next evening (17) by Paul Young and The Royal Family at the El Mocambo.

CFNY's own Daddy Cool will host the Albert's Hall showcasing of Coco Taylor and the Blues Machine (19-24) plus the Brian Plummer album preview at the Bamboo Club (20), Echo and The Bunnymen at the Concert Hall (24-25) and the final March date, *Images In Vogue* at Spanky's in Brampton (28).

April will kick off with the station's very popular and highly successful U-Know Awards (2) at the Royal York Hotel and that same evening the station will present the Eurythmics at Massey Hall, followed by Darkroom at Spanky's in Brampton (4) and Weather Report at Roy Thomson Hall (9).

Stars On 45 among MCA Video releases

Toronto: One of the more popular of April releases from MCA Home Videos will be Stars On 45. MCA has created a live stage revue, featuring the Stars On 45 cast, which covers the past 30 years of pop music history. The popularity of the Stars On releases was the specially picked "sound alike" singers, duplicating the same vocal harmonies and ranges of the originals. The video features The '50s Medley (Little Richard, Chuck Berry and Elvis), The '60s Medley (Aquarius, The Beat Goes On and The Beatles) plus more recent hits including *You Are So Beautiful*, *Staying Alive*, *Macho Man*, *You Don't Bring Me Flowers*, *My Sharona* and *Hit Me With Your Best Shot*.

Other Home Videos set for the April release are D.C. Cab, *Heat And Dust* and *La Traviata*. The latter stars Placido Domingo in his cinematic debut and was directed by Franco Zeffirelli. This is the first time a work as famous as this has been mounted specifically for the screen.

Sony Grammy sweep in new video category

New York: The recent Grammy Awards contained an interesting first, in that all five nominations in the newly-established Best Video, Short Form category, were all Sony Video 45s.

In 1982, Sony pioneered the concept of the short form music video cassette for home consumption when the firm introduced the Sony Video 45, an 18-20 minute video cassette with three to five songs. Sony boasts that with the introduction of the Video 45, they were the first software company to make a major commitment to music video.

The video Grammy nominees were A Flock Of Seagulls: *Wishing (If I Had A Photograph Of You)*, Nightmares and I Ran; Bill Wyman: *SiSi, Je Suis Un Rock Star*, Come Back Suzanne and A New Fashion; Todd Rundgren: *Hideaway*, Time Heals and Can We Still Be Friends; Duran Duran: *Hungry Like The Wolf* and *Girls On Film*; and Rod Stewart: *Do Ya Think I'm Sexy*, *Young Turks* and *Passion*.

The winning video was Duran Duran.

Van Halen firmed for seven Canadian dates

Los Angeles: Van Halen will kick off the Canadian leg of their most extensive tour yet, when they open in Toronto (April 17).

Ottawa has been firmed for the following evening (18), followed by Montreal (19), Winnipeg (25), Calgary (27), Edmonton (28), and Vancouver (May 1).

The band's entourage includes over 120 tons of equipment. The tour will give an extra boost to their current record, 1984, which has gone double platinum in Canada after only one month in the marketplace.

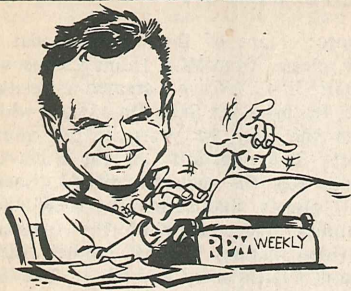

SAYS**There's a battle brewing!!!**

One of the advantages of being an observer of an industry for 20 years is the ability to spot history repeating itself. The CRTC and the broadcast industry are gearing for another fight. This time it's the TV programmers who will be taking on the Commission. The new CRTC ruling that calls for 30% Cancon programming for video programs will likely be challenged. Whoever came up with the 30% figure need only look at RPM's 50 singles chart, to realize how unfair this percentage is when it comes to Video Countdown-type shows. I don't think the programmers are opposed to Cancon regulations in regards to videos but a more realistic figure would be 10% to begin with, on a sliding scale, working toward the 30%. Most Cancon videos are certainly in the "highly professional" class, but there are not enough at this time to satisfy a staggering 30%, just as there weren't enough Cancon recordings, back in 1970 to justify a 30% regulation - a more reasonable

figure of 15%, which I suggested, might have smoothed the waters and perhaps we might have a much more stable domestic recording industry today. Before the war starts, and unfortunately the broadcasters know of no other approach, perhaps a friendly talk with some of the broadcasters, now involved with video programming would solve a problem that can only get worse.

Genie Awards hit low point!!

Would anyone disagree if I said that the Genie Awards was one of the worst TV shows I've ever seen? Well . . . maybe not the worst. (EC: What could be worse?)

Locked in the washroom???

What gung-ho record company president locked himself in his private executive loo last week? He hollered and banged on the wall, but no one would let him out. They all claimed they didn't hear him, but most were taking bets on how long it would take him to get out. Now, how's that for an open door policy?

Mike Reed is back!!!

Well, not quite. Remember good old Mike Reed, that amiable promo person who left the business a few years ago? He's back and managing Apples, located on Gerrard Street East in Toronto's east end. He has a pretty fair menu plus brunch and a good spot to hold record company showcasings. The place is licensed for 130 people. Owners, Allan and Herb Appleby use the premises to raise month for Toronto's Children's Hospital, taping sports and music groups to be used on an in-house video screen.

Video singles list acclaimed!!

In what practically amounts to hysteria, the addition of the music video clips to the RPM 50 singles chart, brought about a stampede of accolades which just proves that

these promotional vehicles are one of the best things that has happened to the record business. As one critic noted, "I guess you don't have a hit these days without a video" (EC: Pass that on to the CRTC!!) Canadian acts may find it a bit expensive to get into the mainstream and compete. (EC: And tell that to the CRTC!!!)

Promise of performance???

A guy walks into a store and orders pea soup, potato salad and a corned beef sandwich. "Are you from the CRTC?" asked the proprietor. "Yes . . . how did you know?" asked the CRTC rep. The answer . . . "This is a hardware store!"

Olivia Newton-John burnt out???

I find it hard to believe that a knowledgeable radio consultant would claim that Olivia Newton-John "is burnt out". Well, she might be burnt out at some of the stations he represents, but how can you ignore 600,000 album sales of her Greatest Hits Vol. 2, which enjoyed 64 weeks on the RPM 100 - and watch her new single, Livin' In Desperate Times. I'll bet many of the stations, using our prophet's consulting services, will be charting this single.

The albums highlight colourful packaging which includes a four colour original photo of each act. The back of the album jacket also carries the group history. There are about ten original recordings included in each album.

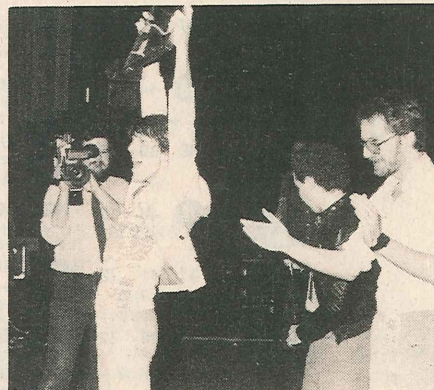

'63 Monroe, a four piece group, comprises Scott Bentley (a.k.a. Scott Bentley, vocals), Jeff 'Rooster' Rooth (drums), Marky Burnaway (guitars) and Pete Dekker (electric bass).

Moss Music Group adjusts label prices

Toronto: The Moss Music Group (Canada) has announced a reduction in price of the Vox Cum Laude and MMG Digital recordings to the suggested list price of \$9.98 to coincide with corresponding analog lines.

Ira Moss, President of the Moss Music Group (New York), explains "We believe that the great masterpieces of classical music, performed by world-renowned artists, and recorded with state-of-the-art criteria and equipment, should be made available not only to those who can afford high-priced recordings, but especially to those who cannot."

Solo and chamber music will include such artists as Renata Scotto, Pinchas Zukerman, Julius Baker, and conductor/pianist Andrew Davis.

Digital/Analog CD info introduced by PolyGram

Montreal: Responding to criticism from several areas of the music industry, PolyGram has initiated a system which will identify the recording history on their compact discs. The system will preclude the confusion emanating from the use of phrases such as "digital mastering" or "digitally mastered".

The system is simply a three letter code, being a series of variations employing the letters 'D' and 'A'. The letters will identify the type of tape used during session recording, mixing and/or editing, and mastering (transcription).

On the rear cover of the CD box, there will be a small frame with the three letters. By way of example, DDD would indicate the use of digital tape recorders during session recording and mixing/editing as well as mastering. AAD would denote the use of analog tape tape recorders during session recording and mixing/editing with a digital tape recorder being used for the final mastering.

PolyGram's CD coordination in Baarn, Netherlands, is encouraging all record companies to adopt the code, concurrent with PolyGram including the code on all new pop and classical releases.

Lee Aaron - many male fans desire her while many of the feminists obviously despise her although there are also female watchers who do find her an inspiration.

Lee Aaron doesn't take her new title, Metal Queen, too lightly. In fact, that's

the title of her new Attic album. She, and her four-piece band are currently on tour in support of the album, boosted by the release of Shake It Up as the first single from the package.

Although this is her first album for Attic, Aaron had previously released The Lee Aaron Project on the Freedom label, a couple of years ago. Attic plans to re-issue her first album sometime this year, featuring a new cover design.

Aaron's unit comprises guitarist/vocalist George Bernhardt, who also helped on her first album; guitarist/vocalist John Albani, formerly of Wabbit; drummer Attila Demjen; and bassist/vocalist Jack Meli.

One of the first breaks for the young singer was in 1979 when, at the age of 17, she was discovered by Bob Connolly, who became the manager of the group she was involved with at the time. It was Connolly who elevated Aaron to the position of being the focal point of the group rather than just a female singer of an all-male group.

Being attractive and having a perfect body created somewhat of a problem for Aaron who was the subject of a rather revealing photo story in Oui, a skin magazine.

"Here I was, playing with a band for three years and no one cared," she explained. "Before I did Oui, nobody cared, and then it seemed everybody wanted to interview me. I can't say it didn't work, because now that I have my second album released, I'm being recognized."

Would she do it again? "Emphatically NO!", shot back the torchy singer. "It worked for the time. I don't want to be known as the girl who takes off her clothes. It's okay to use sensuality, but to do it twice is naughty."

"In the beginning, my audience definitely consisted of more males. They expected a wiggle and jiggle show. Now they know what to expect. But it's actually flattering to have girls coming backstage and telling me that I'm an inspiration to them."

While many U.K. bands have found their biggest market in North America, Aaron is in the ironic position of having her largest following in England. She appeared at the 1983 Reading Festival in England, having just played London's legendary Marquee Club and although she was backed by a U.K. group that had only 12 hours to learn her material, she drew rave reviews.

"I'd never played in front of so many people. For a split second I thought I was going to drop dead, but when I heard the

crowd cheering and saw 50,000 outstretched arms, an incredible rush came over me that made we want to just go for it."

Aaron pointed out that in England which has a large record-buying market, the industry survives on the exposure received through trade papers and magazines, while in Canada it is basically because of radio play. The Aaron album sold much better in Europe due to rave reviews. She also pointed out however, "There's a large metal following over there and when you're not available you create a demand." She does see the return of metal rock with commercial appeal, and points up that her new album is heavier than the first, but still displaying commercial viability.

The Lee Aaron group will be playing several Ontario dates including Guelph (March 26), Stratford (27-28), London (29), Hamilton (30), Toronto (31), Sudbury (April 1-5), Thunder Bay (6-7) and west to Regina (9-14), Saskatoon (16-18), Calgary (19-21), Edmonton (23-28), Brandon (April 31st through May 1st), Winnipeg (2-3), plus a Vancouver date currently being negotiated.

PAYOLAS

Stars - Brampton, Ontario - March 6/84

Demonstrating the stage savvy and pacing which has brought them to the brink of international stardom, the Payola\$ delivered a solid show at Stars in Brampton on Tuesday night.

Vocalist Paul Hyde resembles not so much a rock and roll singer as a front man and storyteller, one minute crooning over his microphone, the next, regaling his audience with some tale from a melancholy past. His partner-in-crime is guitarist Bob Rock, previously involved in the engineering/production side of the business; he is a spirited on-stage foil to Hyde's jaded MC.

The band's repertoire at this point in their career is quite diverse: a stylized pop/rock mix shot through with passionately sung calypso and hard-edged reggae. Two particular highlights were Soldier, with its martial rhythm and terse lyrical imagery, and Eyes Of A Stranger, a great piece which allowed drummer Chris Taylor to let loose.

THE VIBRATORS

Larry's Hideaway - Toronto - Feb. 22/84

Returning to Toronto at a time when there is very little left of the original "punk spirit" of 76/77, the Vibrators show that you can go home again. It is seven years since this seminal force in British music last appeared in Toronto. The intervening years have seen drummer Eddie work with the Inmates and PiL, and guitarist Knox record several singles in pursuit of a solo career. Making their appearance quite late in the evening, the band wasted no time, instigating a wave of activity in the packed hall. Of specific interest was the current single, MX America, taking advantage of the prevalent anti-nuclear sentiment in both Europe and the U.K. This music still incites a sort of manic urgency frequently lost in the latter waves of music emanating from Great Britain. March will see the release of the Alaska 127 album, with the band touring the U.K. in support.

Ottawa: Gord Atkinson, popular CFMO-FM on-air personality, is celebrating his 30 years on the Ottawa scene with retrospective editions of his Showbill program. Selected editions will be aired March 31st, April 1st, and April 8, Saturday mornings at 11:00 and Sunday evenings at 6:00.

Atkinson began his Ottawa radio career in 1954 as entertainment editor of CFMO's sister station CFRA. For four years, prior to his move to Ottawa, he was entertainment editor at CHUM Toronto. In 1967, Atkinson was appointed manager of CFMO-FM and brought to the post an extensive knowledge of broadcasting that began in his hometown of Toronto in 1948.

The flashback programs to be aired will feature Atkinson in conversation with several recording/TV/movie stars including Ottawa born headliners Rich Little and Paul Anka, both who made their respective radio debuts with Atkinson while they were highschool students.

Atkinson's first radio program with weekly features on the late Bing Crosby, established a long lasting association and friendship between the two and prompted Atkinson to write, narrate and produce The Crosby Years. This 12 hour musical anthology earned him the prestigious Armstrong Award

from Columbia University in 1975.

Atkinson is also recipient of many other awards including The Howard Caine Memorial Award presented by the Canadian Association of Broadcasters, two Certificates of Merit from the International Radio Festival of New York for his programs about Judy Garland and Paul Anka as well as having his special series on songwriters become a part of the Song Writers Hall of Fame exhibits in New York City. Perhaps one of his greatest accomplishments was the arranging of the Frank Sinatra/Rich Little fund raising concert for the Ottawa Civic Hospital in Ottawa in 1982.

CFMO has tied in a promotion to mark this milestone for Atkinson during March and April. In conjunction with Air Canada and Voyageur Travel, the station will be awarding trips to three of Atkinson's showbiz beats. Hollywood, San Francisco and London.

Randy Raine-Reusch readies major tour

Vancouver: Randy Raine-Reusch will be touring Ontario and the Maritimes performing a series of contemporary, experimental music concerts through the assistance of the Touring Office of the Canada Council.

The Vancouver-based composer-performer is highly regarded as an instrumentalist with his music being described as "expressive, flowing through many layers of emotion and visual imagery".

Raine-Reusch has been showcased at folk festivals, in over 400 school shows as well as at a computer conference. Jack Anderson of the New York Times wrote: "The sounds were good to listen to just as sounds... sensitive..."

Country music nod to Murray/Sneezy Waters

Los Angeles: Capitol recording star, Anne Murray, adds another major nomination to her long list of credits with the naming of her single, A Little Good News, as a hopeful for Single of the Year for the 19th Annual Academy of Country Music Awards.

Ottawa's Sneezy Waters also gets the nod for Hank Williams: The Show He Never Gave, a movie nominated as Best Country Motion Picture of the Year. Waters has gained widespread recognition for his portrayal of the country legend, which he has made into a concert and club act.

Alabama readies major North American tour

Nashville: Alabama's Roll On, their fifth album for RCA, has become one of the fastest sellers in the group's four year association with the label. Canadian sales are now nudging platinum (100,000) which falls in line with their previous platinum successes, Mountain Music, Feels So Good and The Closer You Get. Roll On has already made impressive gains up the RPM 100, an indication of its general popularity, while the single, Roll On (Eighteen Wheeler) is enjoying action on both the RPM Country 50 and Contemporary Adult chart.

A concert tour of some 40 states, including Canada, is now underway and which has already scored them two sold-out dates in Knoxville, Tennessee as well as three sell-outs in Greenville, South Carolina. However, now that the album has made an impressive entry onto the RPM 100, Laurie Anderson is "the forerunner of a new electronic awakening," says a music critic. She is definitely new and her music falls into the electronic quirks category and that is perhaps why the interest is showing, and of course, her rabid video following. Sharky's Day is a key track as is Excellent Birds. She co-wrote the latter with Peter Gabriel and the rest, she wrote herself. Anderson is scheduled for a Massey Hall (Toronto) date, April 23.



LUNA TWIST
Look Out - Ready - LR-041-W

Belgium may be late getting into the new music field, but Luna Twist could make up for lost time. This quartet is already setting a domestic record for sales of two of their singles, African Time and the title track. The latter has been taken as a single. The sound is '60s influenced, described by keyboardist/songwriter Dirk Blanchart, as "a gentle form of terrorism." Blanchart also doubles on guitar. The other members are lead vocalist Alan Tant, bassist Filip Moort-

gat and drummer Dirk Van Gansbeke. Also key are Questions and Oh, Oh, Oh.



WEATHER REPORT
Domino Theory - Columbia FC 39147-H

Produced by the group's keyboardist Zawinul, drummer Omar Hakim and sax man Wayne Shorter, Weather Report's 13th album since signing with Columbia 12 years ago, takes a definite direction into what jazz enthusiasts now refer to as the "progressive/jazz idiom, although jazz purists would probably not be too open to acceptance of this brand of jazz. One of the highlights of this package is Carl Anderson's vocal magic on Can It Be Done, which, again, introduces another dimension to Weather Report's aim to cover all the bases of today's music scene. Also key are Zawinul's penning of the title track and Blue Sound - Note 3.



CHRIS REA
Water Sign - RCA/Magnet - MAGL-5048-N

It's obvious from the vocal confidence and lyric interpretation there's a great deal of music history in Chris Rea's background, dating back to 1970 when he hit the boards with his Beautiful Losers group, featuring Deep Purple vocalist David Coverdale on lead. This Britisher from Middlesbrough even managed a Grammy nomination in 1978 for his Fool (If You Think It's Over) single. Rea puts all that experience into this package which he co-produced with Dave Richards. I Can Hear Your Heartbeat has been taken as a single and should attract the attention of CHR and contemporary adult programmers. Also key are Out Of The Darkness and Midnight Blue.



MARCEL CELLIER & GHEORGHE ZAMFIR
Flute de pan et orgue - RCA KKK1-0535-N

RCA scores a big one with this debut from pan flutist Zamfir, no stranger to the pop

charts and organist Marcel Cellier. The duo have actually been together since 1970 when they came up with the idea of combining the organ with the pan flute. Their music was, in its original form, played by village musicians in the Transylvania region of Rumania. These "doinas" have been cultured somewhat, but only from the overpowering presence of the organ, to present an exceptional package of entertainment. The tracks might need a little editing for programmers. The material is primarily traditional with arrangements by Zamfir and Cellier. A key track however, is Doina de jale (Doina d'adieux), written by Zamfir and arranged by Cellier. Also key are Doina Oitului and Joc din oas.

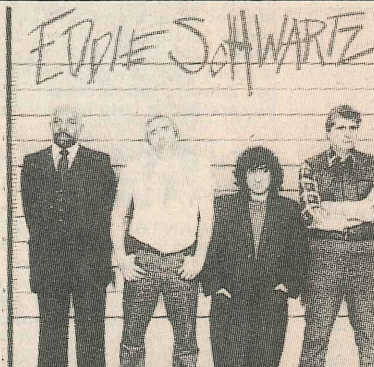

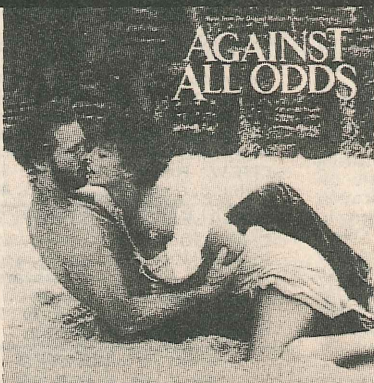
