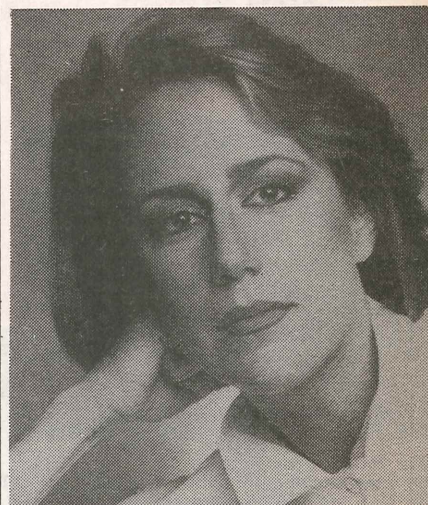

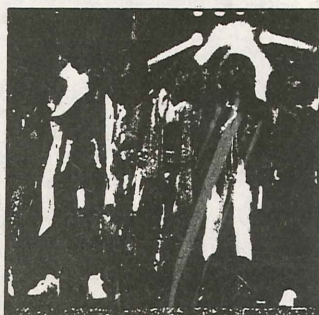

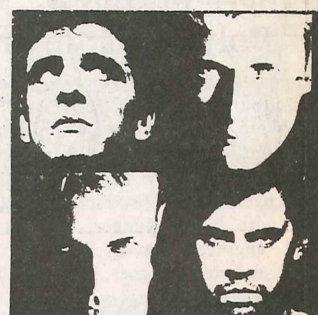

## Tribute to Art Snider scheduled for Toronto

A roast cum tribute dinner for veteran record producer Art Snider will be held at the Teller's Cage in Toronto at 6:30 pm Sunday Feb. 15. Purpose of the "good-natured roast" is to raise funds for special treatments that Snider is going through.

Irving Dobbbs, a Toronto songwriter and longtime friend, is organizing the tribute which is expected to draw a large turnout in view of Snider's contribution to the Canadian music industry over more than 3 decades. During those years he helped launch the careers of several well-known Canadian recording acts including Gordon Lightfoot, The Mercey Brothers and Ottawa's now internationally-famous comedian, Rich Little. Fittingly enough, during Lightfoot's acceptance of this year's Juno Hall of Fame

## U2 LP expected to take retail by storm

Although Island Records is "cautiously optimistic" concerning sales of the new U2 album, MCA's Vice President of Sales, Graham Powers, anticipates initial shipments will exceed double platinum and suggests realistically, they could be double that amount. "It's going to be huge," he adds.

The long-awaited follow-up to The Unforgettable Fire, which is closing in on the triple platinum plateau, is titled The Joshua Tree. Once again, produced by Daniel Lanois and Brian Eno (with 4 tracks re-mixed by Steve Lillywhite), the album was recorded at Dublin's Windmill Lane Studios.

The new album is slated for a worldwide release (Mar. 11), with the single and video to follow a week later. Listening parties have been scheduled for the latter part of this month. Specially designed p.o.p. material will also be made available pre-empting the launch.

## Refugee in studio for PolyGram album

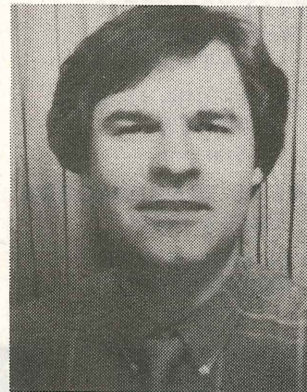

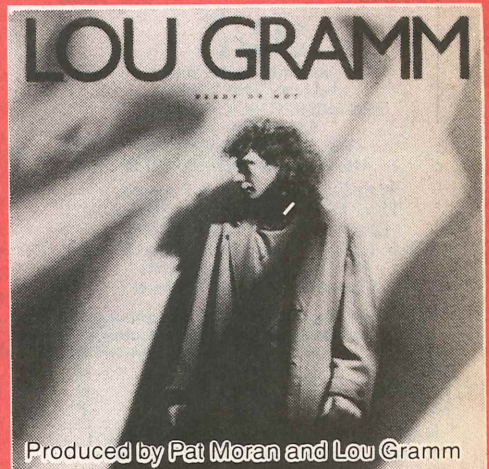

**COVER STORY - by Graeme Boyce****Quebec meets California on "Jenny Sings Lenny"**

Jennifer Warnes' interpretations of, and collaborations with Canadian poet/songwriter Leonard Cohen found on her latest Famous Blue Raincoat album, are proving to be one of this year's fastest moving, and the tandem has put the newly formed Cypress label on the musical map. Her product is distributed in Canada on the Attic label.

Originally intended for, what Warnes describes as an "audiophile subscription audience," the label is tapping into a demographic no longer visiting the local record store because product released today lacks "continuity," which is why people compile their own tapes, the Californian singer relates.

"It's pretty much a complaint of Roscoe's and mine, that records are uneven, and we don't like them. Even when we make tapes, it takes so long, and the reason people put together tapes is because the records themselves aren't units of their own," Warnes suggests.

Co-produced by longtime associate and bassist Roscoe Beck, the album is a collection of Cohen's penning, both old and new, jumping across various musical styles from the jazzy title track to the country-pop crossover single Ain't No Cure For Love.

"We felt that Leonard's music needed colour, much colour," answers Warnes, who scored several hits in the '70s while on the Arista label, and who has more recently sang "survival mechanisms" for Joe Cocker and Randy Newman on their movie scores for An Officer And A Gentleman and Ragtime, respectively.

"We wanted to startle those people who stopped listening to Leonard (Cohen)," she continues. "Maybe they stopped listening, but those songs are still useful today in a social sense. So, if you give them a little aural adjustment, they might just listen to the words again."

Beyond then the justice she believes she has done to Cohen's work and the need for an album with continuity, Famous Blue Raincoat was not recorded with the intention of including "five singles either.

"It was a labour of love," says Warnes. "With donated services. A project done for the sake of art. If I told you the figures on that record you would faint!"

Although most radio stations in Canada are playing Ain't No Cure For Love (currently charting on RPM's singles, albums country

and A/C charts), while in the studio, radio formats weren't a consideration, except when it came time to record that particular track.

"It was just a beautiful freedom and joy to make a record without commercial concerns. It wasn't until the 9th cut, which was Ain't No Cure For Love, that we looked at each other and said 'maybe we should have something for radio.'

"Because we hadn't been paying attention to the time lengths, the amount of drums and hooks and all those things you are supposed to pay attention to. So," she explains,

Winter blahs nothing . . . I love this time of year. The first single is Lynn Anderson's hit, Rose Garden, but there really is something here for every taste. k.d. does straight country ballads, rockabilly tunes and even a polka or two for good measure. Expect very high visibility from the media, as well as a national tour beginning in March.

WEA Canada recently struck a deal with Toronto-based (ex-Westerners) The Pursuit Of Happiness to distribute their current indie hit, I'm An Adult Now. After terrific success from college and alternative radio we feel this record has what it takes to make it commercially as well. Their video has been in rotation at MuchMusic since November, so a lot of you may be familiar with this tune without really knowing who they are. The re-mastered 7" is available now and the 12" will follow

"there was a feeble attempt to shape Ain't No Cure for the radio."

When asked whether Cohen was in total agreement with her project, Warnes replies: "Well, he was in total agreement that we should all make some money at last, and he's in total agreement that he'd get all the publishing and that was great.

"But," Warnes concludes, "he argued with me about a few of the arrangements. He didn't think Coming Back To You would work, in the concept stage, and then I left a verse out of Joan Of Arc, which he thought was a terrible crime. Things like that. Generally however, his nature and his relationship with me is that of a gentle loving man and he was very, very supportive."



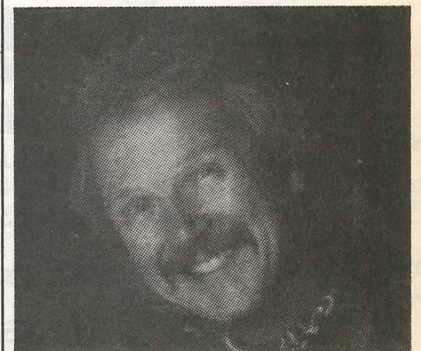

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## Craziness involved in Virgin's Sanity single

Punching home the fact that record people can still have fun in a serious industry, Sanity, the first single from Killing Joke's Brighter Than A Thousand Suns LP, was serviced to Toronto rock stations by Laura Bartlett, neatly tucked into a straight-jacket.

Bartlett, National Promotion & Publicity Manager for Virgin Records Canada, made this special servicing to Toronto's CFNY, Q107, CHUM-FM and CFTR.

The Killing Joke album represents Virgin's first release for the EG label

Bartlett came up with this unique idea for servicing the single, but hastens to point out the straight-jacket promotion has been used in the past by other companies. "In this day and age," explains Bartlett, "the business is still supposed to be fun. It was a servicing thing and I had decided to do something different. It was meant only to

highlight the record . . . and it was fun."

Bartlett believes this type of promotion is quite proper in servicing a record, but felt that promotions involving such ideas as chaining oneself to a radio station, which was apparently used recently in Canada, can have the reverse effect intended.

"If you're just servicing a record, it's alright," she explained. "But if you're looking for an add and go chaining yourself to a station, you're leaving yourself open to the fact that they don't care. You're making it stand out."

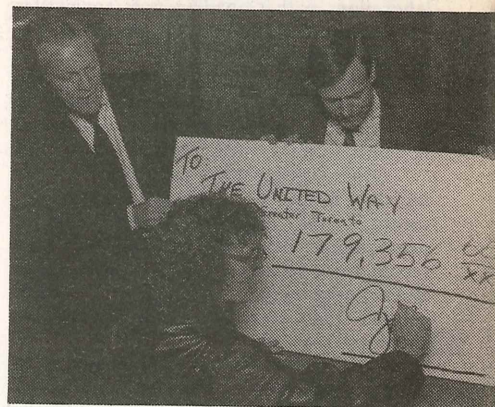

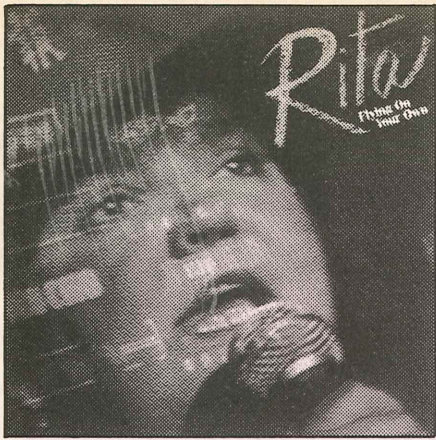

## Heavy country release from MCA

Album releases include product from the Bellamy Brothers (Country Rap), George Strait (Ocean Front Property), Waylon Jennings (Hangin' Tough), The Oak Ridge Boys (Where The Fast Lane Ends), Nanci Griffith (Lone Star State of Mind), Steve Wariner (It's A Crazy World), Moe Bandy (You Haven't Heard The Last Of Me), and Ray Stevens (Greatest Hits). All of the singles, with the exception of Lovett and Earle are now charting. It's expected these two will move into the charts shortly.

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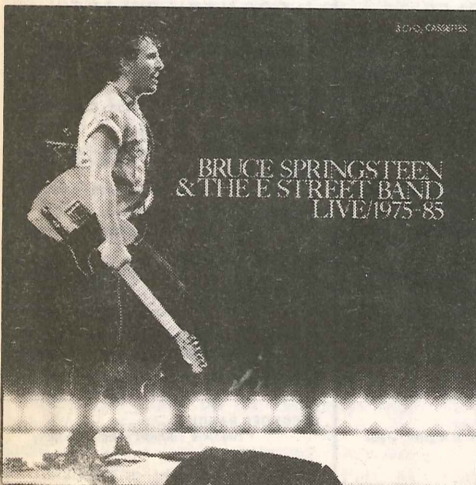
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
