### Songwriters to Ottawa to push copyright changes

In what Mel Shaw of the Canadian Music Publishers Association hopes will embarrass the federal government into taking action, several prominent and certainly some of the most successful Canadian songwriters recently hand-delivered to Parliament, a copy of Bobby Gimby's single of Canada.

The single was embossed with each Housemembers name, with the following

The latter has been heading up a lobbying force that has inundated members of parliament and cabinet ministers with information that hopefully, will lead to a change in the Copyright Act.

# MCA and WEA vie for Townshend/Who sales

Featured on the Atco label, WEA Music Canada has shipped a special double set album from Who guitarist Peter Townshend. Titled Another Scoop, the release is a follow-up to his past solo album, which was titled Scoop.

Produced by Townshend and "Spike" at Eel Pie Studios in London, the set was put together during 1985 and 1986. Townshend, who did the package for Who fans and record collectors, pulled the material from demo recordings, home recordings, and unreleased "oddities" produced during his career, both in and out of The Who.

Among the tracks included are Pinball Wizard, Happy Jack and Substitute.

Meanwhile, MCA Records Canada is readying another Who compilation album titled Two's Missing. Slated for release in April, this LP is a follow-up to Who's Missing. The latter highlighted material covering the period from 1964 through 1973 featuring a mix of seldom heard and never-before-released cuts.

Featured in the MCA package are The Who's covers of the Rolling Stones compositions Under My Thumb, and The Last Time, originally issued to help pay for the quintet's past legal expenses.

Two's Missing, which also carries trackby-track liner notes by Who bassist John Entwhistle, features cuts going back to the quartet's R&B days with such titles as I'm A Man, and Bald Headed Woman, as well as their rendition of Goin' Down. message: "If this song was composed by (Member of Parliament), he would be eligible to receive a royalty of one cent for every recording sold, the lowest royalty paid in the world. Why?"

Flora MacDonald, Minister of Communications, however, was quite adamant in her defence of the present government's actions. "Since 1984," MacDonald explains, "When this Government was elected to office, we have introduced a discussion paper on copyright.

"We have listened to presentations from groups and organizations, including songwriters, from all across the country. We have listened to the subcommittee's report on copyright. However, what I want to emphasize is that we are taking action, whereas the Liberal party, for 50 years since 1924, did absolutely nothing about revision of the copyright law."

The single was also distributed to all Senators, members of the Press Gallery, and to staff members of the government.

### Major breakthough in CD pricing by PolyGram

PolyGram has announced a "major breakthrough" in Compact Disc pricing (see RPM Mar. 21/87). By approximately the first week of April, all PolyGram companies worldwide will join in presenting a new "special line of Compact Discs from PolyGram's vast, varied pop and classical catalogues."

The initial total of 68 selected titles inaugurating this special priceline, is slated to ship to retail this month. Over the course of the year, more than 100 titles will become available. The initial product thrust will be followed in approximately 60 days by a second cycle of 30 pop and 30 classical titles. The launch of the special line comprises 38 pop and 30 classical CDs.

Ken Graydon, PolyGram Canada's Director of Marketing and Sales, points out that in addition to the "obvious consumer benefits in terms of excellent choice of repertoire, uncompromising quality and sheer dollar value, herewith marking the first time that catalogue CD product (as opposed to new releases) will retail for less than \$20.00... this exciting special price Compact Disc line is offering dealers a legitimate opportunity to generate volume CD sales while retaining full margins."

PolyGram held special dealer presentations at which time the new special price CDs were unveiled to key dealers in Vancouver, Calgary and Toronto. Says Graydon, "The reaction was spectacular, with major promotions coming out-of-the-box," from several dealers.

Both pop and classical titles feature distinctive packaging, identifying them as part of the new line. Pop releases contain their original CD booklets around which are attached removable, eye-catching covers. The front flap of the covers bears a distinctive fold over design which partially displays the booklets inside, and a miniature reproduction of the booklet cover is also contained on the front flap. The inside of the back flap contains a listing of artists in the new series, while the outer side of the flap depicts the



### Gowan's latest maintains "spirit" of last album

For the past few years Larry Gowan has obviously been one of Canada's best kept musical secrets, in spite of the hefty support he has received from CBS. However, with his latest release - that will all change. Gowan now stands to reap the benefits of his chosen career, which began in 1976 with the band Rhinegold.

Much has changed since those days, but not his abounding energy and enthusiasm. Those attributes still permeate throughout his songs - his award winning videos and his always eagerly awaited live shows.

Gowan artfully suggests he's not apprehensive about breaking this record outside his home territory. "This is what I consider my best piece of work . . . just as Strange Animal was . . . and just as my first album was," he relates.

"The most important thing for me has always been to come up with something that's original. Something that is not derivative of any particular style, other than to just be good music."

Again, David Tickle produced the Gowan album, recorded entirely in Los Angeles' Producer's Studio last year. Players that appear include Peter Robinson (Phil Collins), Tony Levin (Peter Gabriel), and Rob Brill (Berlin), among others. For the first time, Gowan affirms, background vocalists were also used.

Not only is Yes lead singer Jon Anderson featured (on the hit single Moonlight Desires), but also the San Fernando Valley Men's Choir, conducted by Bob Ezrin. The latter can be found on Living In The Golden Age. There were also two female backing vocalists.

"Someone once said that every time you make an album, it's a reaction to the previous one," Gowan continues. "That's really smart, because it's absolutely true. I think the reaction that this album is to Strange Animal is that the parts of Strange Animal that I

perceive to be the strongest, I've tried to carry through and elaborate on."

Gowan points out that Tickle has helped him become more focussed these days, with respect to his songwriting. "I'm a little more sure of what I want to sound like now, and it makes me more sure of my writing and that works lyrically as well.

"In the past, I think I've been not so much vague as elusive, not really pinpointing what I'm trying to say with a song. On this record I've tried to lyrically 'nail it' each time," he adds.

While recording the album, Gowan interrupted the sessions to complete several shows last summer, and those breaks assisted his objectivity of the recorded work.

"If you make a record in one shot," he explains, "very often, you'll only be comparing it to itself. Every once in a while you've got to poke your head up from the foxhole and take a look around."

That look around afforded him the chance to observe what Peter Gabriel was achieving with his So album, not only did it "challenge" him, it helped "quite a bit," he

"We didn't have our heads in the sand, completely buried in this record. For instance, on Strange Animal, we were making it in England and what was popular? Frankie Goes To Hollywood, the Thompson Twins, and Tears For Fears... and that influenced a lot of the recording.

"Sometimes you would just be going to the studio and you would hear something on the radio, and you would say 'why haven't we tried to be as interesting?' I think it's good to challenge yourself.

"In fact," he concludes, "the Gabriel record last year, challenged a lot of people. I think it challenged a lot of the formulas that rock falls into, and that's probably the thing I dislike most in music.

"Everytime it gets a little bit formulated, it really gets stifled. So . . . it's great to see records like that come along."



### Final approval expected for FACTOR/CTL fund

Following months of scrutiny and deliberation, the final approvals for the various FAC-TOR/CTL programs, financed primarily by the Department of Communications, are expected to be announced shortly.

Progams include the FACTOR Loans, New Talent Demo Awards, Multi-Project Funding, International Tour Support Funds. Radio Syndication Programs and Video

Most eagerly anticipated are monies being channelled through the FACTOR/CTL organization in the FACTOR Loan and Multi-Project categories.

### Bowie plays Diamond announces tour and LP

At a press conference held Mar. 17, and quickly dubbed "a press concert", David Bowie, in between playing 2 songs from his forthcoming album, announced that he would indeed be embarking on a world tour this year. He was unable to specify dates however, which will be supplied by Capitol shortly.

However, CPI president Michael Cohl did offer a full Canadian tour was presently being arranged, in light of the fact that Bowie's 1983 Serious Moonlight tour was their "most successful complete Canadian tour."

Playing with Bowie at the press concert was longtime collaborator Carlos Alomar, as well as Peter Frampton, who will accompany Bowie when the support tour for his new album, Never Let Me Down, commences. The Bowie performances and chat with the press was televised "live" by MuchMusic.

Bowie's album will be preceded by the single, Day In Day Out, one of the numbers Bowie and his band performed at the Toronto date.

Also included on the album is a cover of Iggy Pop's Bang Bang. "Some people do Chuck Berry," commented Bowie. "I cover Iggy Pop."

The FACTOR Loan program was established to assist Canadian record labels and producers in upgrading the quality of their recording projects, with a ceiling of \$60,000 for each.

The applications are usually reviewed by an evaluation committee who consider three criteria: musical quality, sales potential, and radio airplay potential. Recommendations are then turned over to the Board of Directors, who make the final decision

However, record companies with national distribution may apply directly to the Board for approval of funds; if their artist has released at least one "successful" album previously. FACTOR defines "successful" as having sold enough records and/or received enough airplay to recoup the cost of produc-

The Multi-Project funding program was established to enhance the development of the Canadian recording industry through support for Canadian-owned active labels, conducting business on a national level. The applications are approved semi-annually up to \$100,000, to a maximum of \$200,000 per

The eligibility criteria insists that applicants should have at least a two year track record, as well as having produced and released three albums, including one in the year prior to the application. In addition, companies must be able to show that they have the financial and people resources to promote funded projects.

The number of artists per company funded by FACTOR/CTL should be limited to six per year, of which three must be new acquisitions.

### Ex-tape pirate now legal can't make ends meet

Last year, Lawrie Del Grande was making and selling taped music for a variety of retail outlets. These outlets were willing to pay a good price for his unlicensed product. However, today - as the first fully-licensed taped music distributor in Canada - Del Grande actually regrets his decision "to play by the rules," he says.

"I'm in a position where I'm battling 99.9 percent of the world doing it at a piracy level," he contends. "I signed their contract and paid to become a licensed person . . . and what has it done for me? Nothing."

Although the problem of piracy, of unpaid royalties, will soon be addressed with anticipated changes in the copyright laws, until that time, Del Grande simply won't be able to sell his service.

"Actually," he explains, "I can't sell tapes. It's got to be strictly on a leasing basis. So, that's one drawback because most of the bootleggers out there are selling tapes. It's pretty tough to compete with that when you've got to ask the guy to return the tape."

Complicating the issue, as well, he adds.

are the U.S. companies that are able to sell their product in Canada, and who claim to pay their royalties stateside.

"I'm the guy doing it the right way, never mind arguing with those clowns from another country. Let's worry about me. I'm the guy who paid a thousand bucks. I'm the guy who tries to help the situation, but what am I getting in return?" he asks.

Because the piracy problem is reportedly costing the record industry \$60 million each year, Del Grande is surprised none of the musicians are upset. "If musicians were made aware that there is somebody out there trying to cover their buns, I might then start getting some musicians behind me.

"Obviously the pirates are causing the majority of the \$60 million loss because I'm sure not getting any . . . not even a significant part. I've got next to no business," he concludes. "When at one point I was pumping out 500 tapes a month . . . to next to nothing because I'm playing it the straight way. Where's the justice to this whole thing?"

music is not surprising, considering that drummer Steve Bray collaborated with Madonna on Like A Virgin, True Blue, and the not-too-shabby single, Into The Groove. Not a bad kitchen in which to develop your musical "chops". Give it a listen; Breakfast Club serves up a menu for even the most jaded palates.

Another exciting solo career on the horizon is that of Jody Watley, founding and ex-member of Shalamar. Her self-titled solo debut features nine songs (six of which Jody co-wrote) and a host of producers including Andre Cymone, Bernard Edwards, Pat Leonard, and even George Michael, who trades lead vocals on the gang-busting track, Learn To Say No. The album contains no ballads, opting for more up-tempo cuts such as the first single release, Looking For A New Love, because as Jody says, "I love to dance." Released in the U.S. a few weeks prior to Canada, the record has made very impressive in-roads at CHR, and all indications are that radio in this country will follow suit, with several major stations adding last

Of course, tours are always a big part of the business, and this winter was no exception. The nightmare did indeed return to Eastern Canada, as Alice Cooper played to sold-out houses a few weeks ago. Approaching gold status in Canada, Alice's debut MCA album, Constrictor, should reach that plateau following Western dates at the end of march and beginning of April.

Steve Earle brought his guitar Town to our towns in March to packed venues and wildly enthusiastic audiences. Western dates will be announced shortly. This album is also very close to gold in Canada (which would mark his first precious metal album in the world), and while the support from country radio initially started the ball rolling, increasing acceptance from CHR and AOR is pushing Guitar Town over the top. As Earle would say, "Not bad for a hung-over hillbilly."

All in all, the spring is shaping up to be an excellent season for MCA, not to mention the excitement generated by our distributed labels and the success they are currently enjoying with their roster of artists.
