Decrease in vinyl sales alarming - CRIA stats

All vinyl configurations during the month of April showed significant decreases, both over the previous month and the last year. Compact discs, on the other hand, continue to display healthy increases and cassettes are still moving in respectable numbers. Overall however, the value of sold product has increased, given the higher sticker price of CDs.

As well, shipments of vinyl product also continues to decline. The recently released CRIA statistics indicate shipments of 7" and 12" singles have dropped 30 percent and 55 percent respectively since last year. Their net value of sales summarily dropped to \$2.1 million and \$551,000.00 decreases of 28 percent and 49 percent respectively.

Shipments of LPs dropped slightly to 4.6 million units (5 percent), representing sales of \$23.4 million (6 percent). However, cassette

DKD negotiating for Montreal Bowie date

Donald K. Donald Productions of Montreal reports they are negotiating with David Bowie and the Olympic Stadium for an Aug. 30 date. "We have an agreement in principle with both parties," said a spokesperson, "and we expect to conclude the agreement by early July. No tickets will go on sale until sometime in July, and we will give the Montreal rock fans at least 3 days notice prior to the exact on-sale date for this show."

The DKD Ticket Availability & Status Report points out in great detail the stage setting and ticket availabilities for Summer 1987 Concerts. The Paul Simon date (June 25) at the Forum, for instance shows there are "tickets in front of stage only (no rear seating). Approx. 3,000 tickets still available to the public from the south circle and upper blues."

With Bryan Adams (26) at the Forum -guesting Rock & Hyde, "360 degrees proscenium stage set. Great side seats, good corners and rear seats with perfect sightlines

available."

Other dates with similar seat availabilities and stage descriptions are for Nazareth, the Spectrum, (July 8), Peter Gabriel - the Forum, (12 & 13), Bon Jovi, the Forum (16), Corey Hart with special guest Chalk Circle, the Forum (Aug 8), and Pink Floyd, the Forum (Sept. 12, 13 & 14). The latter is already sold out.

shipments increased 13 percent over last year to 9.1 million units, giving their net value of sales a slightly similar increase of 12 percent to \$43.7 million.

Compact discs, on the other hand, showed an increase in shipments of 101 percent to \$1.9 million, boosting net value of sales 108 percent, to \$28.2 million.

Therefore, as noted, the total value of sales increased from \$81.6 million last year to \$98.1 million as of this April, an increase of 20 percent. Whereas total shipments increased only 6 percent, from 16.5 million to 17.4 million.

New single and dates for Hart's '87 tour

The Aquarius label has released a new single by Corey Hart, titled Too Good To Be Enough. Radio is being serviced with the CD single of this track as well as the recently released My Brother's Leaving Today. Dealers will have two formats, a 7" disc with a tour poster sleeve and a single cassette. A video, which was shot in the bayous of Louisiana, premiered on June 16.

The video features Helen Terry and Ruby Turner, who supplied backup vocals on the Too Good track. Says Keith Brown of Aquarius Records, "The new song is like Sunglasses, in that it caught everyone by surprise and made our plans for us. With the tour going out, the timing is too good to resist." The single was produced by Hart and Phil Chapman at S.A.R.M. Studios.

Brown also reports that an additional nine dates have been added to the tour. Kickoff date is in Sudbury (June 26), followed by Sault Ste. Marie (27), Thunder Bay (28), Kitimat, B.C. (July 3), Prince George (4), Victoria (6), Kamloops (8), Kelowna (9), Lethbridge (11), Calgary (12), Vancouver (14), Edmonton (16), Regina (18), Winnipeg (19), Ottawa (22), London (23), Toronto (25), Quebec City (28), Sydney (30), St. John's (Aug 1), Saint John (4), Halifax (5), Moncton (6), and Montreal (8).

It's expected that the support act or acts for the tour dates will be announced next week.

Summer run of Beehive at RHY's Imperial Room

A Canadian production of Beehive, the off-Broadway musical hit tribute to '60s female vocalists will open in the Imperial Room of Toronto's Royal York Hotel, June 29 and run through Sept. 5. The musical will be produced by Toronto Musical Productions, who produced Cats at the Elgin Theatre.

The all-Canadian cast of singer/actresses comprises Jo-Ann Brooks, Sandra Caldwell, Louise Pitre, Renee Rogers, Camilla Scott and Victoria Snow. Liz Tilden and Kim Richardson are the alternates. The latter was a big winner at this year's Black Music Awards, taking honours as Top Female Artist, with her A&M single, Peek-A-Boo, taking the Top Single award.

The Beehive Original Cast Album has been released by Virgin.

Cockburn's LAWG show to air on MuchMusic

Bruce Cockburn, who is currently on release with his double album set, Waiting For A Miracle, will be the focus of a MuchMusic Big Ticket special to air June 27. This past March, Cockburn and his band performed at Toronto's Diamond Club for the benefit of the Latin American Working Group, his first club date in 15 years.

Appearing with Cockburn, in his band, are Fergus Marsh, Jon Goldsmith and Michael Sloski. Special guests included: Lillian Allen, Hugh Marsh and Chilean singer Angel Parra. Marsh is set to release his follow-up to The Bear Walks with Shaking The Pumpkin, a record that features both Cockburn and Robert Palmer on vocals.

The performance, to be broadcast in stereo, features songs such as Lovers In A Dangerous Time, Wondering Where The Lions Are, Nicaragua, Joy Will Find A Way, Call It Democracy, Stolen Land, and If I Had A Rocket Launcher, to name just a few.

Baldry tapes at Diamond for possible live LP

Long John Baldry, on release with Ain't That Peculiar, his third single from the Silent Treatment album, recently completed a 5-week swing across Canada. He hopes to release a live recording of his performance at Toronto's Diamond Club, according to Gary Taylor, President of the Vancouver-based Music Line label.

Comfort Sound's 24-track mobile studio was used for the taping and Taylor hopes, after final mixing is completed at the Mushroom facilities in Vancouver, to combine those tracks with studio work, for what he describes as "a really interesting album."

Music Line, distributed in Canada by Capitol, will then release a "first," says Taylor. "If it does come out as a live album, it'll be a first for the Diamond and, of course, it'll be John's first live album."



Yo Ho Ho and a bottle of beer . . . !!

If you thought the "paltry" few millions the record industry chalked up in yearly sales was impressive . . . take a look at the beer business. Last year they squeezed almost \$9-billion out of consumers (EC: Which shows the power of television and radio!!). By the way, I hear from my contact in New York, that a couple of American breweries are on a holding pattern, and won't make any moves into the record business, until they see what happens in Canada . . . Oh well!!

Hold onto your CD hat . . . !!!

At the recent IFPI meeting in Europe, Stan Cornyn, who heads up a Burbank, California record group, stunned his audience when he showed them a "revolutionary" approach to

This new CD is campatable and can be played on any existing CD player . . . and the sound quality is apparently as good as current CDs.

More than rock 'n' roll . . . !!

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

The Cure: looking for their "breakthrough"

With their two previous albums both surpassing gold sales levels in Canada, The Cure undoubtedly are poised to break out of the cult status mold they've achieved over the past decade. Whether new fans will be influenced to purchase a double album, remains to be seen, and this is a concern for the band, says keyboardist Lol Tolhurst.

"The record company felt a bit of trepidation about it," he explains, "because not that many people make double albums -Husker Du and Prince recently - but I mean there's not a tremendous precedent in this part of the '80s for a double album. But once it's heard, I'm sure it will become obvious why it had to be a double album. Everything does work in its own context.

"I think, without being that biased, most people who buy a single album by us, if we'd brought out two single albums in short succession . . . would buy them both. There's got to be some people that'll say 'Well, I just can't afford that . . . so I won't get it.' But I have a funny feeling that it'll be the other way around. They'll say, 'Instead of having an album by them and one by somebody else, I'd rather have their two.' I'm fairly confident in that."

The Cure's new album, titled Kiss Me, Kiss Me, Kiss Me, was recorded in the south of France, which actually allowed the band more time to spend in the studio. Isolated, the nearest town being 15 miles away, and liv-

ing at the estate studio, were the contributing factors that led to the double album, Tolhurst relates. "Plus the fact that we didn't have to go home everyday," he adds.

"If you record in London, or any big city, every day you go home about 4 o'clock, and you lose the continuity of it all. Whereas where we were, if there was somebody around to operate the machinery, then we could say, 'Alright, let's go and do this particular song.' This time we weren't constrained by not having the facilities there all the time."

To a large degree, The Cure have managed to attract their audience without having "hit" singles, and they consistantly sell out their concerts, which Tolhurst hopes will "force the hand" of radio. "Normally," he explains, "bands go through the radio and get their success that way, and then find their audience. With us . . we've already got a loyal, hard core following, plus new people to find out about us."

Tim Pope is again directing their videos, including their first for Why Can't I Be You. However, the video just completed for Catch is different. "That's another departure for us," says Tolhurst, "because it's the first time we've done a video with him that's not humorous. It's more seriously glamorous, and it's the first video we've shot outdoors for a long time." These "departures" and "firsts" keep the band from stagnating, says

Tolhurst . . . and interested.

"Unfortunately, 80 pecent of the bands are pretty dense, and if they find one formula they'll stick to it . . . like a dog holding onto a bone. With us, and I know it sounds selfish, we really want to keep entertaining ourselves. We're not straight ahead rock or pop people, and that's why we do changing styles all the time."

When asked whether he thought Kiss Me was indeed The Cure's Physical Graffiti, Tolhurst replies, "Yes, very much so. Actually, I've been listening to that album quite a lot recently. Obviously," he concludes, "you do a double album and the first question everyone asks is 'What's your favourite double album of all time?' Well, that's the one, that I thought to myself, was the one for me."

The band are about to set out on a North American tour, which includes Toronto, Montreal and Ottawa.

June is CD Month on Thunder Bay's 94FM

94FM has scored another first. For the month of June, all the station's music spotlights will be presented on compact disc.

"94FM has been building a compact disc library for over a year and we now feel we've built enough of a collection to make all our spotlight features CD," says Mike Thurnell, the station's programming assistant.

Spotlights are 20-minute music features on an artist or album and are heard 4 times daily.



Artist Relations - the link between label and artist

Roger Desjardins, Artist Relations Manager for WEA Music of Canada, is perhaps

the best known in his field, certainly one of the most admired. He began his career record the business at the age of 17 in his native Montreal, where he had the opportunity to hone his talents in the promotion field. After an association with Capitol, he joined WEA, where he moved to head

office and took on the "awesome" job of Artist Relations Manager, covering all of Canada and looking after upwards of 150 acts each year. He celebrates his 14th year with WEA in July of next year.

The affable Desjardins is not only involved in looking after the acts from a touring standpoint but is quite often the influencing factor that brings foreign acts to Canada for publicity and promotion tours.

As a company, we feel the artist is very important," says Desjardins, "and I've always felt that without them, where would we be." He continues with, "I don't know if I have a special way of speaking with them, but I seem to get along quite well with them, and quite often I'm able to get them to go that extra mile we need to market a piece of product."

Dealing with as many acts in a year as he

does, Desjardins does experience some frustration. "Sure, there are times when things get a little tight... there's a lot of egos to deal with," he admits. "I think I would have been perfect for the Diplomatic Corps, because I can turn the other cheek so easily. But it's a therapy for me."

One of his jobs is smoothing the way for the artist to do interviews and autograph sessions. When it comes to British artists, he finds this sometimes creates problems. "The British artists have a fear of the written press," says Desjardins. "They don't like talking to them because they're afraid of being misquoted... which is what they find in England where the press isn't too kind to recording artists. I have to explain that this is a different country, and the press are music people first and critics second.

"There have been a couple of times, particularly when I'm dealing with an aging rock star, when I've asked the interviewer to stay away from a delicate area and, for the most part, they do . . . but we can't control the pen, and that's what these artists are afraid of "

What exactly does the artist relations job entail? "I make sure that the company is well represented," explains Desjardins. To make sure that we're not just a maitrix number or a piece of plastic. We're a company that cares about our artists. It's my job to ease them into doing publicity and promotion campaigns . . . which includes in-stores. I try to make it a fun thing for both sides as opposed to putting on boxing gloves."

There's been less and less antagonism of

late, because as Desjardins suggests, "The new artists are more intelligent and they have a better understanding of what the record business is all about.

"In my situation I have to know about every area of the company, because I'm trapped with them for ex-number of hours, and when they want to know about something, I've got to be able to give them sensible answers.

Desjardins isn't into what he describes as supplying services in "the grey area...drugs, booze and ladies of the night. That's a myth, but I'd be lying if I said I hadn't been approached. My answer: "That's not what I'm here for. I'm a professional at what I do, and I don't think I'd like to degrade myself to that point of having to supply this type of service." There are enough people around who can look after what they need, but I don't believe a record company should be involved in that type of thing."

If anything, Desjardins, who displays somewhat of a Father Confessor character, has been able to communicate with some of the acts who have problems, and talk to them as a "friend" rather as a record company rep. "Some of these people have problems, and they find they can trust me, and we just talk . . . about very personal things, and if I can influence them away from a particular hang-up I will, and I think I have on a couple of occasions."

Six months into 1987, and it looks like this could be one of the best years for WEA, and for their touring acts, which puts Desjardins front and centre. "This will be a big year for us in country," he boasts, "and they are terrific people to deal with," continuing with "We've always been known as a rock 'n' roll company, but ever since Stan Kulin has been with us, he has more or less pushed us and guided us into country . . . and now we're really into it . . . and I'm glad we are."

COCA caps annual event with awards show

The Canadian Organization of Campus Activities (COCA), an association of college and university programmers and entertainment buyers, recently held their annual meetings and showcases in Toronto (June 6 - 10). The 4-day event culminated with a banquet honouring those winners in a variety of categories.




