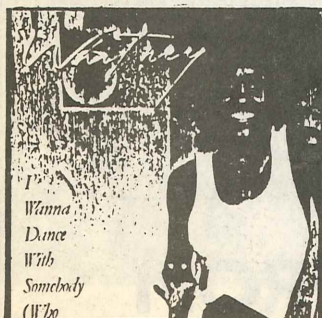

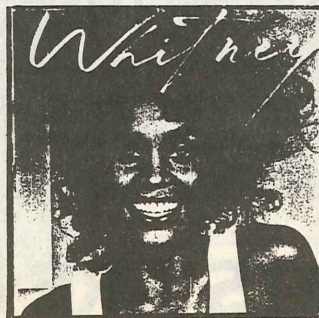

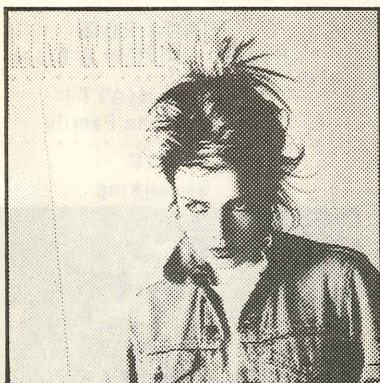

The CASBYs: gloss and glitter and . . . a blooper

The CASBYs crammed almost 2,000 CFNY-FM listeners, industry people, artists and musicians into Toronto's Convention Centre (June 19) for their annual awards. The layout was excellent, the food, superb, and, just like any other awards show, there was and excitement that rolled in and out, as the evening progressed.

David Marsden, the genius behind this "People-type" awards show, got the evening underway, and as he paced back and forth across the stage, he explained the rules and procedures and introduced the emcee for the evening, Shawn Thompson. The latter was perfect in this role as he moved into the first part of the show, a very funny video spoof on some of the big names in the business.

Excited winners were Pursuit Of Happiness, who thought they had won more. They took the Most Promising Group and Best Independent Video categories, plus Best Group. However, the last award was made in error, and an embarrassed Marsden returned to the stage to reveal that an error had been made and that Parachute Club was actually the winner of the Best Group award. This was the third time this RCA/Current band has won this award in seven years.

The lineup of presenters were as exciting as the winners and included Sam and Jayson Sniderman and Bruce Cockburn and Carole Pope, to name a few.

Marsden returned to the stage to present the annual CASBY Excellence Award to a very surprised Stan Klees, one of the pioneers of record production in the early '60s, and one who was instrumental in bringing about the Canadian content ruling. Klees is also known throughout the industry for co-founding the Juno and the Big Country Awards. He also designed the first Juno and Big Country Awards trophies.

To identify Canadian content on singles

and albums, Klees originated the idea of a symbol defining music, artists, production and lyrics, which was the criteria for Cancon as defined by the CRTC. As the result of this he designed the MAPL logo which, today is the universally accepted identification of Cancon and appears on most, if not all, Canadian singles, tapes and albums.

Marsden was quite excited in having scooped the industry with this award to

Klees, the first time this veteran has been recognized for his many contributions to the industry. Interestingly enough, there was Klees accepting this belated honour, when, in fact, he is responsible, more than anyone else, for the hundreds of awards that have been presented to recording artists and industry figures over the span of 23 years.

In all there were 17 CASBY awards presented this year, one almost wasn't ac-

cepted. Jane Sibbery, who was to accept an absent Corey Hart's Best Male Vocalist award, refused to accept. She apparently took offense to a video skit on Hart. However, Carole Pope saved the day, and accepted the award, which added to her stature.

London's UKASE wins Soundstage contest

A panel of local music industry judges selected London's UKASE as the winner of the Ontario Institute of Audio Recording Technology's first Soundstage contest. Their prize included a free run of 1,000 singles provided by Signature Records of London. There were 4 semi-finalists who performed 20-minute sets at a packed C'est La Vie

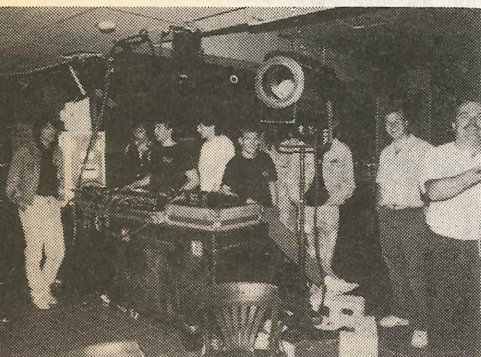
Tavern. Along with UKASE were L.M.O.T.V., JAG and Geneva.

The judges scored each band on presentation, musicality, general feel, audience reaction and a number of other related categories to determine the winner. L.M.O.T.V. received the second prize of a \$100 gift certificate from London's Music Mart. In addition, each semi-finalist received a video tape and audio recording of their performance.

Students from the school provided all of the staffing for the show, including live sound mixing, lighting, audio recording, video taping and camera operation along with management and other aspects of organization.

"The planning and inter-action between the individual crews worked exceptionally well," noted Kevin Armstrong, a member of the event's promotion committee, "particularly since this event was a first for all the students."

He concludes with "I feel that the success of Soundstage has opened a lot of eyes and directed some awareness to the potential held by us, the next generation of industry professionals."

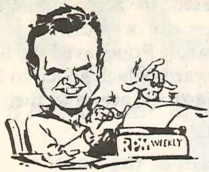
Arena floor surfaces are being converted into a giant cabaret setting where patrons can dance to their favourites from the past.

Dis is about DAT . . . !!

It's a catch 22 situation. Record companies are going to have to make available the DAT configuration, whether they approve or not. If they refuse . . . it will force the consumer, who owns a DAT player, to dub. Strategy is to quickly make available the DAT software and head them off at the pass. I really believe the genuine consumer doesn't want to dub, but prefers to own the product if it has good graphics and literature available along with it. It's all a question of marketing the product and discouraging dubbing. A dub isn't a recording . . . it's a . . . dub!! (EC: *Truer words were never spoken. People buy records . . . they don't make . . . dubs!!*)

A half-million dollar video . . . ??

I hear that a very successful Canadian record producer has tapped the Canadian government for \$500,000 for a video of his next production, of a very large West Coast band. This producer wrote all the material and orchestrated this session for 80 pieces (EC: *A band . . . ??*), and he'll be performing on a 9 foot grand piano, front and centre for this production. (EC: *What's wrong with a 9 foot grand piano . . . ??*)

was "Would Flora MacDonald have given all those millions to the record production industry, if she had known about the artist and the brown M&M's?" This refers to the artists' riders for perks while on tour. The story is legend in our industry and the bottom of the barrel when it comes to childish demands. (EC: *Some artist might not accept the free money for their record if one of the conditions was that their M&M not be pre-sorted by colour.*) On the other hand, I think Flora knew about it and approved the money regardless.

Just checking . . . !!

Well, the second issue of Sam The Record Man's Network is out and the industry is probably checking to see how they feel about dubbing. It's doubtful they would make the same mistake twice. (EC: *Blank tapes are big business, and a high profit item!!*)

If efficiency was gas . . . !!

In the rush and pressure that goes with any awards show . . . the CASBY Awards caused a clerical error that presented one group with three awards instead of two . . . by mistake. I understand the group graciously brought the error to the attention of the CASBY people. The award was engraved properly, but a clerical error occurred in the card inside the envelope. Well . . . the whole thing turned into a tempest. As if this industry doesn't make mistakes. It got nationwide publicity for the CASBYs and in the end, one group got an award they didn't expect, while another group that had already received two, got a chance to graciously admit that people make mistakes. Canadian groups and artists need prime time national exposure. The day we throw this or any other opportunity away, we'll make the ultimate mistake. To understand this, you would have to have been around in the '60s and '70s when we had to fight for national television exposure and that fight led to today's Cancon superstars. You can name them all. Do that right now to indicate that you realize how important all this

is. You make mistakes when you're doing something. You can't make a mistake when you're doing . . . nothing!!

Quote of the week . . . !!

"It allowed us to spend time and not money." The Truth's Mick Lister (recent RPM cover story), talking about recording their new album in the basement studio of Dennis Herring. What a great attitude. Most groups find the ambience of the high-priced professional studios . . . awesome, and like to spend as much time there as possible . . . of course, using someone else's money. That's why albums are costing in the neighbourhood of \$150,000 to \$200,000 (EC: *Did I hear close to \$500,000 for a Canadian group . . . ?*) for one album, and tag on the video cost to that. (EC: *That's AWESOME . . . !!*)

Full colour . . . now and then!!

Looking at costs recently, one of the pillars of this industry made the following observation, which makes sense. "Four colour process posters, ads, and sleeves used to be something special in the promotion of product. Now, that it is being used so much, the special nature of this kind of promotion is no longer effective and certainly it's very costly." So it costs a lot to be the same as everyone else. There's nothing special about four colour process anymore.

A personnel or personality clash??

What station, which recently became No. 1 in their listening area is beset with internal problems? And they couldn't come at a worse time. The problem just might be at the top where "egos" have been bruised . . . or . . . at the worse, not been looked after. There could be a squeezing out of a very competent programmer . . . and the station will be the worse off for it.

Oh! . . . for a corporate sponsor!!

With all the big money being dumped into this industry by corporate sponsors, someone asked me why RPM isn't sponsored by someone each week. Of course it couldn't be a brewery, distillery, winery or cigarette company, but why not a product that enhances the behaviour of young people who buy records? Big problem would be to find someone to negotiate one of these deals, one who wouldn't send you a legal bill for 50 or 60 thousand dollars for their effort. (EC: *You might find 50 or 60 volunteers who would work for nothing!!*) How about a condom manufacturer?

While Island Records' employees and friends alike gather this week in England to celebrate the 25th anniversary of the label's formation, for their artists, who haven't yet achieved even one tenth of U2's current sales this year, it will undoubtedly be just like any other. That is unless the band is the C.S. Angels moving from the Mercury label to Island, and apparently, according to lead singer Steven Fellows, just in the nick of time.

While discussing his previous unhappy relationship with Mercury, Fellows says, it had quite a negative impact on their music. "The trouble with groups," he begins, "is that they're very gullible and idealistic. If somebody tells them a 'good' thing, you go along with it, thinking 'Oh, this person is interested. They have our interests at heart.' You think they're going to help.

"I mean . . . you want to believe people, but the way that it worked out with our previous company, they had these peculiar ideas. It wasn't a question that they liked the group for what we were, but they had this idea of what they could turn us into. Gradually, it dawned on us, over a period of years, that we were getting more and more away from what the group was about. The records were getting less and less of what we wanted them to be.

"There's a great myth about the autonomy of groups that you do this thing and everything else fits around you. That's not really the case because you work with people and particularly with Island, they have an honest and open approach. And if a group loses sight of the fact that record companies exist to sell records, then you're being a bit naive though."

The C.S. Angels are consistent enough to release and follow-up good record after good record, however they have never really amounted to much. Fellows suggests

however, that's not the reason they write and record their music. He is quite content as long as he is allowed to simply make records.

"What I mean is I'm quite happy," he clarifies, "as long as they keep giving us the money to make the records that we want to make. Success is a curious thing anyway, as I understand it. For a start, it means money, which I'd like to make a few 'bobs', because I'm really quite fed up with being poor. But then on another level, it means validation. It means that people can relate to what you're doing."

He realizes however, this is a paradox. In order to sell records, 'hit' singles are necessary, as well as involving what he calls "some perception of a personality" and a vast amount of machinery, "promotion," he says. But, he adds, writing a "hit" is not out of the question.

"It's just that I get so tired of 'product' and 'hype' and 'markets' and 'units', words like that . . . I'm just not interested. When I put on a record I want to hear some music that gets to me somehow. Don't get me wrong," he implores, "I like singles, but basically the charts are really like a hamburger shop; there is very little that isn't processed."

Their deal with Island actually came about through Robert Palmer, who received an Executive Producer credit on Chasing Shadows, their Island debut. But the album was self-produced and the reason for the credit, says Fellows, they didn't want to say "Thanks to Robert Palmer" on the jacket because "that sounds a lot like name dropping" and their association began before Palmer had his success with Riptide last year.

At the band's insistence then, Island hasn't publicized that fact. As Fellows explains, "They know we'd find it distasteful if they did. But to try and deny his involvement

is a lie, yet to overstress it is a lie too.

"I suppose it's to our disadvantage," he continues, that we don't have a manifesto and a strict series of phrases people can trot out everytime they want to tell other people about us. That is to our detriment really. But I see it's our strong point also that we don't have to constantly change our minds, trying to redefine this 'thing'. It's fascinating." Fellows concludes, "Chasing Shadows."

New ownership leads to new operations at BASS

BASS (Best Available Seating Service), has announced new ownership which has led to the installation of what is described as "an improved computerized ticketing system," and the expansion of its existing outlet network.

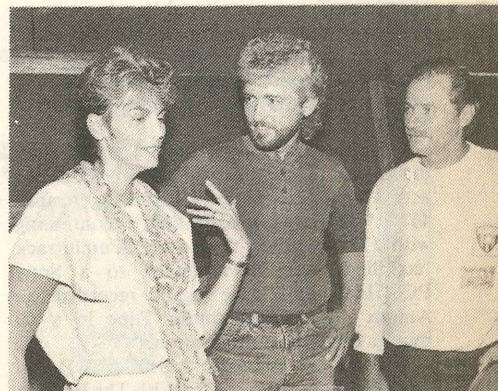
Vancouver Ticket Centre purchased BASS in March of this year, with a "significant investment being made by Toronto based VenGrowth Capitol Funds," as well as several smaller investors including High Tech Ventures, a public company traded on the Vancouver Stock Exchange.

According to the firm's president, Tom Worrall, a change in the central site computer and outlet printing equipment, coupled with a conversion to the innovative TicketMaster software, "will improve both telephone and over-the-counter service dramatically."

Worrall continues with "TicketMaster has proven to be the finest ticketing system in the world and in our opinion is best able to service the Toronto area market. This is a major, international city and it deserves the most advance ticketing system we can acquire."

Worrall also points out that as part of an "improved service philosophy," Tele-tix, the new telephone ticket sales operation will now give all seat locations over the phone, a service not previously offered. As well, tickets will be mailed to buyers within 24 hours of their call, up to 10 days before an event. Tickets purchased within the 10 day period may be picked up at any BASS TicketMaster outlet.

Sunrise Records stores have been added as outlets, giving the BASS/TicketMaster system a total of 42 locations. They are adding further outlets on a chain basis, aiming for a total of 65 to 100 outlets.

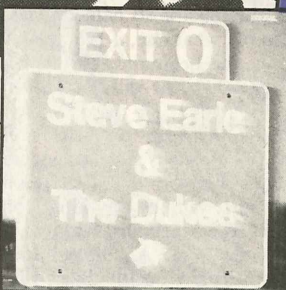

In 1955 Elvis Presley purchased his first luxury item; a pink Cadillac. Fittingly, Toronto's new rock 'n' roll nostalgia club, *The Pink Cadillac*, is so named. The club is dominated by, what else, a 1961 pink Caddy. That's only the beginning of the trip back through time that this split-level club has to offer.

Looking around, the staff are easily spotted in bobby-socks and suspenders. Atop an elevated platform, DJ's do lip-sync routines, while spinning anything from *Buddy Holly* to *BTO*, including *Motown* and the *British invasion* era. A whole lotta shakin goes on, downstairs on the dance floor. The 500-plus capacity club will host concert nights featuring oldies bands from Canada and the U.S. including the likes of the *Ugly Ducklings* and *Del Shannon*.

The concept of retrospective dance clubs isn't new, but there presently seems to be a growing demand for them, especially since the phenomenal success of Toronto clubs like *Studebaker's* and *DeSoto's*.

Co-partners Syd Marcowitz (bar owner extraordinaire) and Robbie Lane (early days rocker and *Studebaker's* consultant) make no bones about their high expectations of the "P.C.". Lane is expansion-minded: "This is only the first in a line of many to roll off the assembly line," he says.

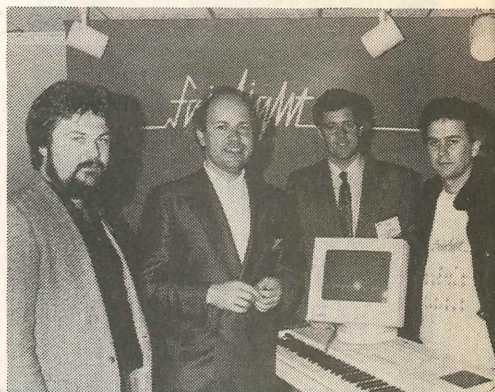

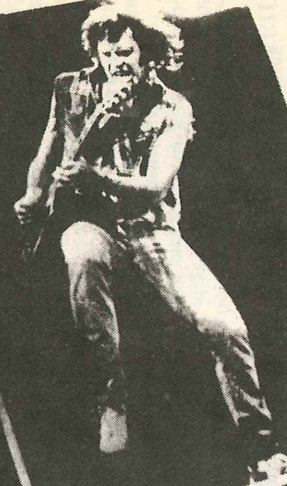
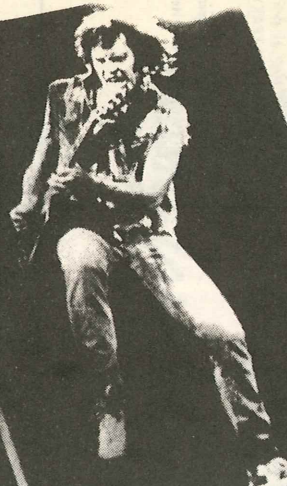

George Olliver releases single and LP on Slott

George Olliver one of the top Cancon recording artists of the '60s, and who was once billed as "Canada's blue-eyed prince of soul" is back. He returns with the release of a new single and video titled *Dream Girl*, taken from his soon-to-be-released album.

Olliver was an integral part of Mandala, and in 1967 the Ottawa Citizen labelled him as "the high priest of teenage soul." It's also interesting to note that the Mandala helped establish the original Club Blue Note, a

Toronto after-hours R&B nightclub. Olliver also helped re-establish the new Club Blue Note on Pears Avenue in Toronto.

After his long association with the Mandala, Olliver became associated with Natural Gas, a group he helped take up the charts in the U.S. during the early '70s.

Promotionally Yours . . . Martin/Kierans, a Toronto PR firm, is handling Olliver and his new recording venture. They arranged the following question and answer segment.

From 1965 to 1968, you and the Mandala were very popular in Canadian music, and your ventures into the U.S. music scene were also immensely successful. It must have been an exciting time for you, as a young musician from Toronto.

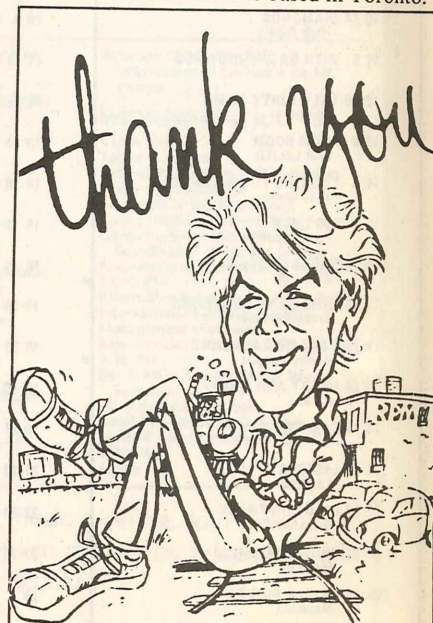
Yes, it was. But fame is fleeting, to coin a cliché. That success was good for me, careerwise, because it made me want to work even harder, to improve in every way possible as a performer. I knew that the success of the Mandala and, later, of Natural Gas was not going to last forever. It's understandable. It's part of the evolution of the industry. But I also knew that it could give me an opportunity to move forward as a solo artist. The appetite of the public is insatiable, so one must continually strive to keep the intensity going in creative process . . . to push oneself to the limit.

But what would make a young white boy from Toronto sing a sort of music that was, especially at the time, linked mostly to black

performers? I mean . . . soul was not what one would call 'mainstream' in Canada in the '60s.

True . . . as a kid, I grew up with the sounds of Elvis Presley and Jerry Lee Lewis, rock 'n' roll. But then I discovered the music of James Brown and Wilson Pickett, an off-shoot of rock 'n' roll that seemed to have more meaning for me. It was deeper. It had a certain pain to it. That was R&B, or soul music. It appealed to me as a writer. Ever since that time I have been a great advocate of that style of music.

The Olliver album was self-produced at Round Sound in Toronto, with Olliver writing most of the material. He wrote the plug side of the new single, and co-wrote the flip, *Please Don't Call*, with B.J. Cook, a Toronto songwriter, who has gained much respect and importance in the Canadian entertainment business. The Slott label is based in Toronto.

Talk about a rock, ball-bustin edge, this Texas trio moves right into the fray of things with their debut for the label. Should be interesting to watch their progress. Key are the title track and Don't Rock Me The Wrong Way. Produced by Richard Mullen.

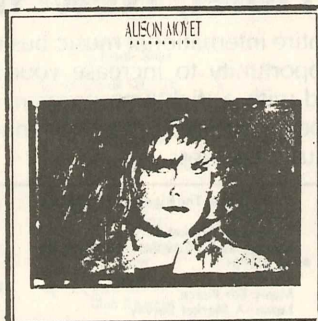


JENNIFER RUSH

Various producers, including Harold Faltermeyer.

Andy Goldmark and Bruce Roberts and Gus Dudgeon. Nice to have the top guns of production, but it's Rush's vocal quality that comes through, particularly her duet of Flames Of Paradise with Elton John. Should follow the success of Power Of Love, a single that has become part of the history of rock. Also key are Down To You, Love Of A Stranger, and Call My Name.

ROY ORBISON
In Dreams - The Greatest Hits
Virgin - VDL-90604-W

- Pop
A double album set that should be hot as a pistol, which means it should be front-racked for the best possible customer action. Orbison is in good form with these re-recorded treasures from the past. Only The Lonely, It's Over, Crying, Blue Bayou, and Fallin, to name just a few. Should be a must for radio station libraries as well. T. Bone Burnett, and David Lynch co-produced the title track with Orbison.



ALISON MOYET
Reindancing - Columbia - FC-40653-H
Jimmy Iovine is the production genius behind this package of entertainment from English songstress. There seems to be more meaty substance here than with her last release. The vocal charm appears to have become more pronounced. There should be immediate action on Is This Love, the first single, which she co-wrote with a J. Guio. But there are better tracks, much better: Without You,

Ordinary Girl, Blow Wind Blow, and what should be the next single, Weak In The Presence Of Beauty. Customers will buy on the strength of her last release, so should be front-racked, and radio will be very important here.



ERROLL STARR
Temple Of Love - A&M - SP-9130-W
This could be the one to break Starr, voted this year as Top Male Vocalist in the Black Music Awards. First single, For The Love Of Money, is a perfect promotion vehicle for this package that has various producers including himself. These are Mark Berry, David Bendeth and David Tyson. Exceptional vocal quality of Starr is buffered nicely with a highly polished instrumental team. These include Tyson, on keyboards and synthesizer on Angel, and the same on Holding Out For You. Another plus on the latter is the sax work by Earl Seymour. Both these tracks are key, along with the Bendith/Starr production of Temple Of Love. The original version of this track appears on the Temple Of Love album.

RAY STEVENS
Crackin' Up - MCA - MCA-42020-J
Great cover, depicting the clown of country/pop music, and he has it in the grooves as well. Current single, Would Jesus Wear A Rolex, got a big laugh and early chart action, but, and Stevens must be used to this by now, he has dropped off the chart. But watch for Cool Down Willard, The Ballad Of Cactus Pete

And Lefty, and Gourmet Restaurant, all key from this self-produced album. He might not have a bunch of hit singles out of this set, but he'll sell a lot of albums.



JOHNNY CASH
Is Coming To Town
Mercury - 832 031-4-Q
This is Cash's label debut for Mercury, and it could bring him back into prominence once more. Contains Sixteen Tons, Letters From Home, Heavy Metal (Don't Mean Rock And Roll To Me), and The Ballad Of Barbara, all key. Produced by Jack Clement, who has a lot of background vocal help for Cash with The Carter Sisters (Helen, Anita and June), Carlene Carter, Waylon Jennings, and Cindy Cash-Stuart. Good stuff for that traditional country radio station.

RONNIE PROPHET & GLORY-ANNE CARRIERE
Book Shop - BSR-33-747-N
Lucky In Love is the current single taken from this Tony Migliore production, and it's beginning to look good for this talented pair. There's a lot of vocal confidence here - each complementing the other. There's even more creative when it comes to instrumental backing, which includes the use of a cello, sax and mandolin. Great stuff and watch for the crossover possibilities. Background vocals supplied by Colleen Peterson, Debbie McCall and producer Migliore. Also key are You And I Are Stereo and Old News. Canon.

Pitney finishes local dates to boost Attic album

Legendary singer-songwriter Gene Pitney recently completed some select Canadian dates in support of his debut Attic album, his first LP in several years, appropriately entitled Trans-Canada Highway.

The title track, co-written by Pitney, was taken as the first single and caused a mild flurry with programmers across the country. Much of the album was produced by Dave MacKay. Gerry Bron and Roger Cook are credited with producing a couple of tracks.

Pitney, who is best remembered for such crossover classics as The Man Who Shot Liberty Vallance, Only Love Can Break A Heart, It Hurts To Be In Love, and A Man Without Pity, among others, recently completed an entire week at the Imperial Room of Toronto's Royal York Hotel. He followed up this engagement with dates in Hamilton, Kingston, North Bay, Sudbury and Thunder Bay. U.S. dates are also in the works.

Between shows, Pitney revealed he had been working on the album for almost a year and stressed it was not produced for the Canadian market, despite the title. It's expected the album will be released in the U.S. and other countries shortly.

"Trans-Canada was just one of the songs offered me by the producer," explains Pitney. "But the album itself had nothing to do with Canada."

Pitney says that if and when the LP is released in other countries, it may not even

have the same title, and it's quite possible the first single may not be the same. Interestingly enough, Trans-Canada Highway represents his first album of new material since 1975. "My last album, which was on Epic, was shelved," he continues. "That was in 1980. Just as we finished the album a new regime was brought into the company."

He pointed out that any acts that were not selling over 250,000 at the time, were put on hold. He apparently has been trying to get the recording back ever since.

"But I think this album has a better selection in relation to the Epic album," says Pitney. "With Epic, I was working with a producer who wanted to change me. I think you should stick with what you do best."

Pitney, who is also known for writing such hits as He's A Rebel (Crystals), Hello Mary Lou (Ricky Nelson), Rubber Ball (Bobby Vee), and more, is credited with co-writing only one track on the album. Apparently touring was the barrier.

"Nobody could wait for me to write the songs," he explains. "When I'm on the road, all I think about is where I'm going, and what I'm going to be doing."

Pitney is cutting his tour activity down to 6 months out of the year to work on investing in other projects.

How does he feel about the current pop and rock scene? "I love some of the things coming out now," he answers, "I think the '70s were a washout though, with the disco

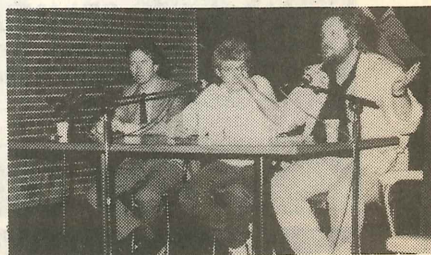
influence. Artists like U2, Phil Collins, and Sting are very creative and have good direction." He concludes with "I think the music will keep going in circles about every 10 years."

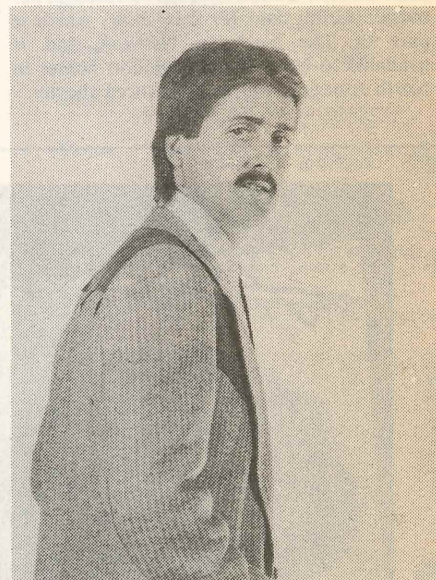

Ottawa's CHRO moves away from country

Earlier this month Ottawa country station CHRO switched to an Adult Contemporary format, in an effort to reach a younger demographic "more representative of the Upper Ottawa Valley's population" and to "attract advertisers stigmatized against buying country," informs new Program Director Charlie Watts.

Although the station had been broadcasting country music successfully since 1981 ("elevating the station from near bankruptcy to a solid financial position," says Watts), the move was made in the wake of recent research studies which indicated CHRO was not "fully meeting the needs of Upper Ottawa Valley residents."

According to Watts, the most recently published radio listening statistics indicate that, in terms of hours tuned, of all listeners over the age of seven, 56 percent were over the age of fifty. Renfrew County data shows the median age of the population is 30.3 years. Therefore, he reasons, the majority of CHRO's listeners are "at least" twenty years of age older than the median age of the community.

The station adopted the format "Hot Hits, Familiar Favourites", a sound that has proven most popular in other radio formats among the broadcast possible range of age groups (see RPM, June 20, 1987). To introduce the "new" sound, CHRO broadcast a non-stop "music marathon" from May 29 at 4 pm through to June 1st at 5:30 am, when morning personality Jon Blair officially launched the "new" CHRO.

"During the first two weeks of the new sound," Watts advised, "we're running a supporting promotion called 'Sample The Sound' offering the listeners hourly prizes and the opportunity to win a Sanyo Radio, Cassette and CD player."
