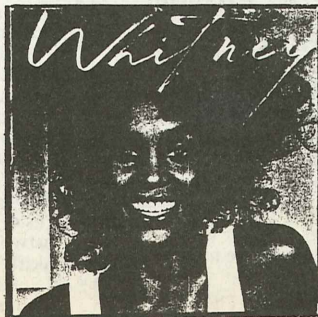

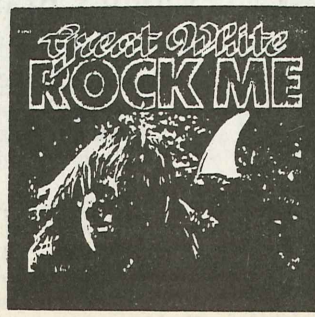

Bryan Adams takes on and wins Toronto

Bryan Adams must shake his head in disbelief when he reads reviews of his show in Toronto, not to mention the rest of Canada. Just about the time he was starting his career in the business, the very mention of Canadian recording artists was cause for "no action" by the Canadian press.

Look what Toronto critics wrote about his triumphant return to Maple Leaf Gardens. The Sun's Liz Braun, under the bold headline of "Can Bryan Adams deliver? You bet. Pour It On!" had this to say, "For the 14,000 adoring fans at his first-ever Gardens show, Adams poured on pure, searing, perfect rock." Under the heading of "Bryan Adams is proof only the strong survive," The Star's Craig MacInnis wrote, "As

he proved last evening, Adams' resilience is more than a convenient persona, worn like so much hard rock armor. It goes to the very heart of his songs, which have become increasingly his own," and the Globe's Chris Dafoe, writing under the banner headline of "State-of-the-art pandemonium," wrote "and this was stadium rock. But state-of-the-art stadium rock and impressive for that."

For once, Toronto critics have said it all. What more can be said, except that when Bryan Adams stepped on stage the message was clear . . . this was Cancon as it has never been heard before . . . and what a messenger.

Virgin launches campaign on Northern Pikes release

Virgin has pulled all stops in a national promotion campaign to bring attention to The Northern Pikes, their Canadian signing from the prairies. The band's LP, *Big Blue Sky*, has been released in vinyl, cassette and CD formats. Their single, titled *Teenland*, is already bulleting up the RPM 100 singles survey (the single was a front-page pick in the June 13 issue of RPM).

The band, who signed to Virgin in January of this year, is made up of bassist Jay Semko, guitarists Merl Bryck and Bryan Potvin, and drummer Don Schmid. Their album was produced by Farser Hill and Rick Hutt at Toronto's Metalworks, McClear Place, Sounds Interchange, Hypnotic Sound, and at Hamilton's Grant Avenue Studios.

Ertegun resigns WEA International

Nesuhi Ertegun, Chairman, co-Chief Executive Officer and founder of WEA International, has resigned. The Chairmanship was passed on to Ramon Lopez, Vice Chairman and co-Chief Executive Officer.

The announcement, made by Warner Communications Executive Vice President Robert Morgado during the opening session of WEA International's annual worldwide managing directors meeting in Venice, took effect July 1st, 1987.

Morgado pointed out however, that "the good news is that Nesuhi is not retiring. He has agreed to a new five-year contract with WCI, to take charge of special projects within the WCI Record Group."

Virgin's Branson moves into budget condoms

Richard Branson, President Virgin Records, has set his sights on the condom market . . . "a new brand of inexpensive condoms," the profits of which he will donate to AIDS care and research.

The new condoms, carrying the impressive handle of Mates, will sell for about 18 cents. It's expected stock will be in place in the U.K. in September.

Branson has established The Virgin Healthcare Foundation, a charitable trust, to coordinate the marketing and distribution of profits for his new venture.

A&M posts for Kulawick, Lacoursiere and Brearton

A&M Canada Eastern Regional Manager Ray Rosenberg has announced the appointment of Geoff Kulawick to the position of Ontario Promotion Manager. He moves from the national promotion and publicity departments after 2 years as Special Projects Coordinator.

Kulawick's position will be filled by Rob Lacoursiere, whose previous experience with A&M includes merchandising, A&R, as well as a position in the marketing department of the Paris office of A&M.

Gerry Lacoursiere, President of A&M Canada, has announced the appointment of Susan Brearton as Administrator of A&R and Publishing.

CD sales up 65 percent over last year

CRIA industry statistics for the month of May, 1987, show a phenomenal 65 percent upward climb for sales of CDs over the same period last year, which works out to a 67 percent increase in sales. The Year To Date figures show an increase of 94 percent, up to 2,257,000 over last year's 1,161,000, registering Year To Date sales of \$33,310,00 over last year's \$16,604,000.

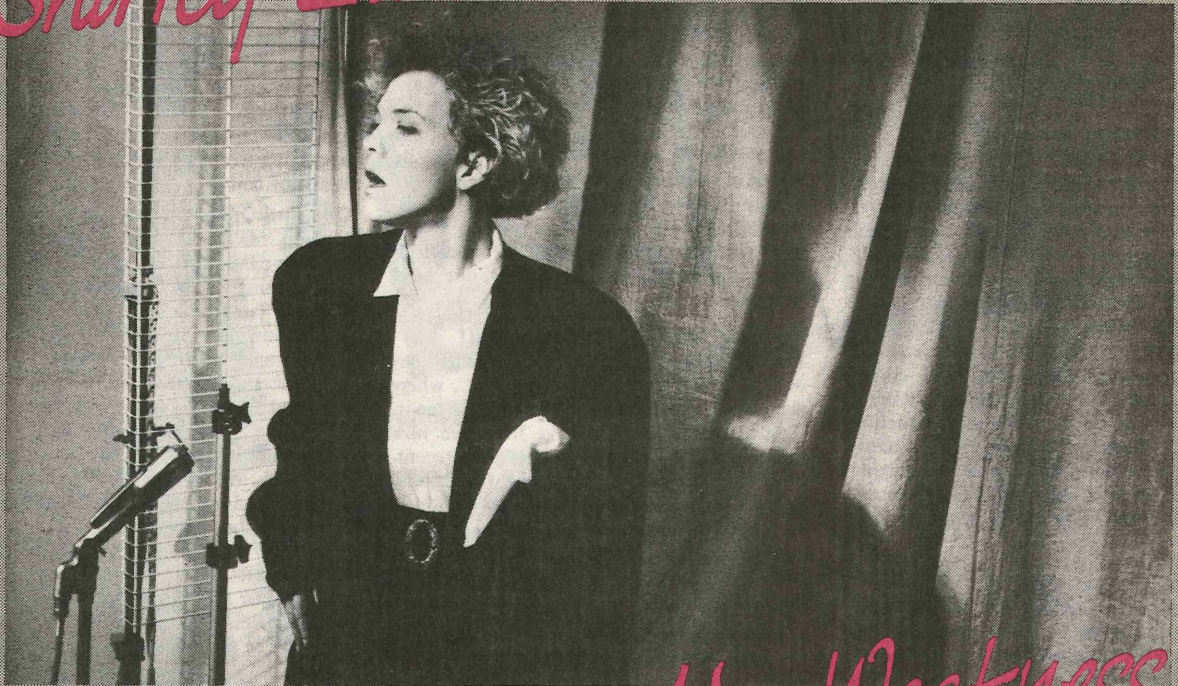
The much maligned LP (vinyl) indicated staying power, up 31 percent (1,082,750) over the same period last year (825,000). However, this worked out to a 1 percent decrease in sales for the Year To Date, down to \$29,257,250 from last year's \$29,692,100.

The 7" single took a bit of a pounding, down 34 percent (390,000), from last year's 594,000, registering a Year To Date loss of 29 percent.

The 12" single showed an increase of 8 percent for the month of May (\$6,000) over last year's \$5,200, a Year To Date increase of 47 percent. However, this worked out to a loss of 42 percent for the Year To Date (\$729,000) over last year's 1,260,000.

Cassette sales for May of this year showed an increase of 26 percent (2,314,250), over last year's 1,837,500, registering a 14 percent increase in Year To Date sales (\$55,942,750), over last year's \$49,172,900.

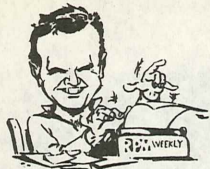

CDs remain a big item

On page 2 of this edition is a piece that trumpets the fact that CDs are up 65 percent over last year. As well, the production figures are up and generally, the industry agrees that it won't be long before CDs and cassettes will practically make black vinyl obsolete. Funny that a stock reporter on television was quoted as saying the demand for CDs had lessened. It can now be said that as more and more CD players are sold, and as the price comes down, CDs will rule the roost. Record companies report no decline in sales, production or demand. While in Toronto, Bryan Adams was presented with an award recognizing 50,000 CDs of *Into The Fire*. (EC: *Obviously we have to come to an expert to get the true picture!*)

About that . . . party!!!

The Bryan Adams concert was GREAT, but then came the party . . . and it was overbooked. There were a couple of nice, but insensitive Molson people on the door with a list that looked like it came from the bottom of a bird cage. They didn't know who was supposed to be there, because they couldn't find them on the list. There were so many guests of guests of guests (EC: *Probably friends of friends of Molson*) that I think, some very important people were ushered upstairs . . .

Long run predicted for Beehive - Imperial Room

The Imperial Room of Toronto's Royal York Hotel was the setting for a dynamic look-back at the '60s as seen through the Canadian production of Beehive. The opening night crowd (June 29) represented the "beautiful people" of Toronto's entertainment elite, a list treasured by Gino Empry. From the audience reaction, and the critics, Beehive should quite easily make its commitment of a Sept. 5th closing.

The all-girl, all Canadian cast comprises Camilla Scott, Jo-Ann Brooks, Victoria Snow, Sandra Caldwell, Louise Pitre, and Renee Rogers, all of whom were exceptional in their casting of the big names from the '60s. These included Lesley Gore, Brenda Lee, Connie Francis, the Shirelles, Shangil-Las, Janis Ian, Tina Turner, Dusty Springfield, Lulu, and Janis Joplin, and more.

One of the highlights of the evening was Louise Pitre, fitting herself into the character of Janis Joplin for a frantic look back at this late, great from the Woodstock era. As well, Sandra Caldwell is no slouch when it comes to movin' and groovin' . . . and with such a large frame, displaying a powerful vocal punch with River Deep Mountain High, one of the many numbers she performed.

There were almost 40 songs in this production, somewhat unbelievable considering the varying roles the girls had to take. This is a powerful message from the '60s, an era where the females, black and white, established themselves as a force that still exists today.

Chalk Circle - a foursome with a fabulous future

Granted, for Chalk Circle, gone are the days of slogging it out on Toronto's Queen Street circuit. However, the reality that exists now is only their progression to the next "stage"; whether an opening slot on a major headliner's tour or, better yet, an international deal. In any event, come September, they fully expect to be touring Canada's campuses in support of their new album, *Mending Wall*.

This band is the epitome of the new wave of Canadian musicians about to take the world by storm. Along with the likes of Blue Rodeo and The Northern Pikes, who are talking to their own generation in their own language, they stand steadfast in the face of our dinosaurs pretending to be young again.

As the rest of Canada's musicians grow older and more distant from the issues of the day, they leave a void only to be filled by youthful vigor and a genuine excitement in the making of their music. While most "international" artists complain about being overproduced, the technology of the day has opened up the doors for many bands to sound "just as good" as any other.

Chris Tait, Chalk Circle's lead singer, suggests that even given a bigger budget, he isn't sure their album would have sounded any differently. "I just don't think you can really buy creativity," he says. Nonetheless, he admits they are more than willing to take the advice of both the record company and their producer, Chris Wardman, while recording. Yet, as he adds, "Either the song has it in its stripped down form or it doesn't."

Following the release last year of their debut, *The Great Lake*, the band embarked on a gruelling tour across Canada, which took them into every small town their managers could think of, and having survived that, they set about to write some new songs. Not too many of them however, survived to

make it onto their new album, Tait explains.

"Yes," he agrees, "the album differed a lot from the demos. Actually, after we did the demos, we wrote the other half of the album. We recorded the demos and went 'Wow! This is it!' But I guess we mustn't have been satisfied because we went on a writing binge after that, and at the last minute a lot of those songs made it on the album.

"It's a weird feeling when you know you're going to be recording in 3 months," Tait continues. "It's like 'Oh, I guess we can't write any more songs. We'll just have to concentrate on these.' This *Mourning* was written a month before we went into the studio."

Signing to the independent Duke Street label last year prior to the release of their first "hit" single, *April Fool*, all bandmembers agree their relationship with the label is one of mutual understanding and respect; helping them with arrangements and instrumentation in their songs, a level of maturity displayed in very few bands today.

"They have complete trust in what we

were doing," relates keyboardist Tad Winklarz. "They have quite a bit of faith in their artists. When they sign someone, they give hints about this, that and the other, based on their expertise but it really doesn't go past that."

Idealistically, Tait hopes their new album is not so much a departure from the songs found on its predecessor, but an improvement, given more time in the studio. "I think it's a better album and a better indication of what we're about, as far as the band, and as far as the music is concerned," he states.

"If major companies are a bit more heavy handed when it comes to picking songs and expressing their interest in what direction they want the album to take," he continues, "then I don't know if we're spoiled because the relationship with Duke Street is just 'Go and make us an album'. I imagine our headspace would have been the same, regardless of who we were signed to at the time."

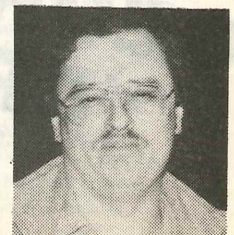

RADIO TO RECORDS - by Warren Cosford (CHUM-FM)

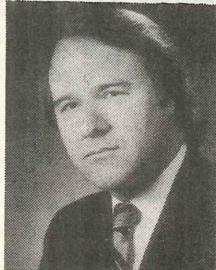
Soft and poppie music bland and safe radio . . ?

Lately it seems there has been a lot of editorial about how soft and poppie music has become, and how bland and safe radio has tended to be.

Of course, it's not the first time. Those of us who remember 1955, were likely listening to Patti Page, Perry Como, Bing Crosby, Frank Sinatra, Rosemary Clooney, and The Four Lads. It was MUSIC MADE BY ADULTS FOR ADULTS, and it was usually about love. Chuck Berry, Fats Domino, Hank Ballard and a few (mostly black) performers were making another kind of music with lyrics about love in a more risqué and energetic manner. However, it wasn't until Elvis sang Heartbreak Hotel that most of us found out about ROCK AND ROLL.

Elvis almost single-handedly created MUSIC BY KIDS FOR KIDS.

Chuck Berry, Jerry Lee Lewis, Little Richard, The Everly Brothers, Buddy Holly & The Crickets and two extremely under-appreciated performers Jack Scott and Hank Ballard, led the way for a lot of kids who were one hit wonders and/or crossed over from R&B and Country.

The adults looked at these incredible successes and said 'Hey, there's a lot of money to be made with this Rock and Roll' . . . and so they created Fabian, Frankie Avalon and singers whose first name was most likely Bobby.

Meanwhile, Chuck went to jail, Buddy was killed in a plane crash, Richard found God, and a few of the other original rockers such as Elvis and Jack Scott were drafted into the army. The Payola investigations cleaned the rest up.

In 1960, the No. 1 song of the year was Theme from A Summer Place by Percy Faith.

Since then these cycles have seemed to continue . . . from The Beatles to The Monkees . . . The Monkees to The Jefferson

Airplane . . . The Jefferson Airplane to The Bee Gees . . . The Bee Gees to The Sex Pistols, and the Sex Pistols to Madonna. Back and forth from MUSIC BY KIDS FOR KIDS, to MUSIC BY ADULTS FOR KIDS.

But don't hold your breath waiting for another cycle of Music for Kids by Kids because for the first time in thirty years, most of radio is programming to adult listeners. Because the advertisers want them.

The music industry however, is still making music for kids, therefore radio is forced to play a lot of old records. For the record companies, this has created a "boom" for reissues (I recently paid more for a new pressing of an old Joe South record than I did for the new Bon Jovi album), and of course, the record people have accidentally discovered a way to sell old records to Yuppies for too much money . . . it's called CD.

But at some point, everyone has got to see that we are in an era of Music by Adults for Adults . . . and today's adults will buy records. It's a habit. They're buying old records now, and they'll buy new records tomorrow . . . if someone makes some new music for them. It's starting to happen.

The first Music for Adults by Adults record is the first album in many years to reach the No. 1 position on U.S. trades without first having a Top 20 single, and that's Graceland.

In Canada we have another: Jennifer Warnes' Famous Blue Raincoat.

Both of these records have at least one thing in common; a '60s Rock and Roll attitude using '80s technology. They are not "Pop Pap" nor are they nostalgic . . . they are the beginning of a New Cycle.

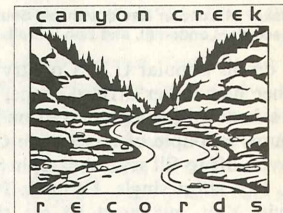

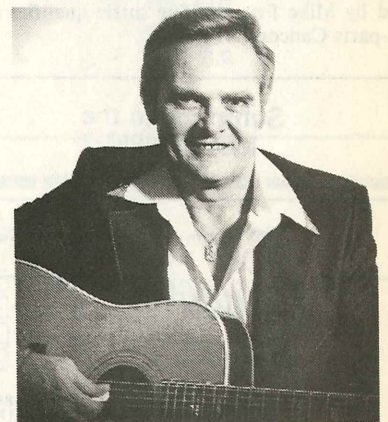

There were 144 concert-music works submitted in four categories by 86 composers in the ninth search for new-music sponsored by PROCAN, which was a record.

John Burge of Vancouver and Francois Rose of Laval, Quebec, were double winners,

Bleiweiss heads up new label division for Moss

Ira Moss, President of the New York-based Moss Music Group, has announced the creation of RB International, a division that will consist of 4 labels, each devoted to a different contemporary popular music form. Rick Bleiweiss, who recently joined the company, will head up the new division as General Manager.

Two of the labels are already established: Lifestyle, a progressive instrumental label, and The Golden Voyage, described as "a blend of natural and environmental sounds." The 2 new labels are RBI, which will concentrate on artists in pop, rock, jazz, dance, rap and other contemporary music genres, and RIC Records, a non-artist-oriented label for what is described as "specific projects."

The first staff appointments for RB International are Marla Roseman, named as Director of Promotion, and Niko Andulich, A&R Director.

Richie Havens, a veteran of the early '60s, who has 14 albums to his credit, is one of the first signed to the RBI label. His debut is titled Simple Things. Drivin has been taken as the first single.

John Leatham, who heads up the Moss Music Group in Canada, is preparing a major launch for the RBI label for mid-July. It's expected that Havens, who just landed a major voice-over contract with Molson, will be in attendance along with top executives from the Moss Music Group.

and each received \$2,000. Both had received cash awards in previous competitions, Burge in 1985 and Rose last year.

Other winners were David Harman, \$1,750 and Omar Daniel, \$1,000, both of Toronto; Ottawa's David Parsons, \$1,750; Guy Pellitier of Montreal, \$1,750; and Peter Mills of Rochester, N.Y., \$1,750.

Prominent Canadian composer Istvan Anhalt chaired a three-person judging panel. He met with composers Anne Lauber of Montreal and Michael Horword of Toronto for two days of judging.

"We were looking for evidence of promise," explained Anhalt, "and in the winning works we found it. Many entrants were not gutsy enough in their writing, but the composers we chose, displayed a confidence that will stand them in good stead in the future."

The judges spotted no specific stylistic trends in the work of the competing composers, and as Anhalt points out, "In Canada, we have a terrific musical diversity. We do not collectively follow this or that trend, but disagree in a very constructive manner," concluding with "The competition showed me that our young composers are still free to choose what they want to be."

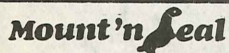
