## There's more to country than stereotyping

As rock became softer and radio moved to the left, country music gained a foothold in a market that is now giving proper recognition to this much maligned music form. Says Garry Newman, Vice President Sales, WEA Music of Canada. "Country music is now all encompassing in appeal because of the new country acts and their ability to crossover into the A/C market." WEA has always had an interest in country music, albeit somewhat reserved, with acts like Hank Williams Jr. Gary Morris, and more, plus several they've lost to other labels. However, it wasn't until the "explosion" of Randy Travis and Dwight Yoakam that country regained its respective position with the company. Travis has gone platinum with his Storms Of Life album, and Yoakam is now platinum with his Guitars, Cadillacs Etc. release. These have been followed up by Always & Forever, the latest from Travis and Hillbilly Deluxe by Yoakam.

"Both these new albums are rapidly approaching gold already," says WEA's Bill Johnston. He also points out that one of their big country crossover success stories of this year has been the Trio album, by Dolly Parton, Linda Ronstadt and Emmylou Harris, which is now well over platinum. WEA has also moved into Cancon country and again, the story is one of success with k.d.lang and Blue Rodeo. Lang had a bit of a slow start with her initial single, Rose Garden, due in part to the lack of Cancon. Her follow-up single, Tune Into My Wave, which qualifies as 3 parts Cancon (MAL), is now moving up the charts. Both singles were taken from her Angel With A Lariat album. Blue Rodeo, who have been opening for Lang on her re-

## June 21 through 23 set for C.C.B.A. Convention

Kitchener will be the host city for the Central Canada Broadcasters' Association (CCBA) Convention, to be held at the Valhalla Inn, from June 21 through 23. Using the theme "Pulling at full strength", the 3-day meet will offer a variety of seminars plus the CCBA Awards, an Oktoberfest-Bavarian reception and a golf tournament, plus a Companion's Program.

Convention Chairman Ross Kentner will officially open the proceedings, along with the Mayors of Kitchener and Waterloo, and other guests. Tuesday's session will open with Future of Sales, followed by seminars on Promotions, Sex-Role Stereotyping, and the CCBA Annual Meeting. The Oktoberfest reception and dinner will bring the convention to a close.

cent tour, are charting with their single, Outskirts Of Love, which was taken from their highly successful album, Outskirts.

MCA's Vice President Sales, Graham Powers, says "Country has definitely caused a great deal of excitement with both programmers and record buyers. The crossover potential of some of these releases is quite obvious, which is why we are experiencing the most remarkable sales in country in our history." Powers cites Steve Earle's latest album, Exit O, which has caused a lot of heads to turn at both retail and A/C radio.

On the Canadian side, acceptance of domestic acts has shown an improvement. "I think the industry is definitely moving forward," says Brian Ferriman, President of the aggressive Savannah independent. "There are a lot of indicators, and it was great news about what Warner Bros had done with Randy Travis, Dwight Yoakam and k.d. lang. This will bring more attention to country in general."

Ferriman continues, "From an association (CCMA) standpoint, I think it's important that this year's awards show is going to CTV. I know that last year when Global televised the awards show, the week after, Terry Carisse, who won Male Vocalist, had the best week for record sales in his career."

Ferriman, who attended this year's MIDEM, is now reaping the benefit of the contacts he made. He has just signed a deal with Britain's Silver Dollar Records for the release of product by Gary Fjellgaard, Matt Minglewood, and Canada's CCMA Duo and Female Vocalist of the Year, Anita Perras and Tim Taylor. Terry Sumsion's Our Lovin Place and Midnight Invitation, released on Silver Dollar in April of last year, has remained on the Top 50 chart since being released. Ferriman has also signed deals with 7 European countries for the release of his entire catalogue.

## CBS release unique Gowan interview disc

Having now moved up the charts past the likes of Paul Simon, Trio and Simply Red; Great Dirty World, Larry Gowan's latest Columbia album, has moved into a very high traffic area, and is showing no indication of slowing down. "Yes," agrees CBS Manager of Pop Product, Art Graham, "the rate of sale is ahead. For example, if you measured the exact same amount of time from the day of release of Strange Animal, and the day of release of Great Dirty World, we have outsold it."

As Gowan's album approaches the platinum mark, the label has produced and released a 7" double-disc interview package, differing from the Strange Animal disc, which contained the full album. With the Toronto-based entertainer currently touring to sold-out houses, the package will lessen his

actual interview burden and give the label foreground in the secondary and tertiary markets.

"It also gives us a good vehicle to send out internationally, especially for the European countries," Graham continues, "where they can get a bit of insight into what Larry's all about and what his records are all about." Great Dirty World is expected to be released simultaneously across Europe in late summer.

"The Europeans are very excited about the record," he continues. "They want to hold it so they can develop a plan and make it a proper release and launch. It's looking very good. The buzz on this particular record is the best I've felt from any of our Canadian acts ever."

The first leg of Gowan's tour winds down at the end of May, to be followed by a concentration of Eastern dates, which include Fredericton (June 12), Halifax (13), St. John's (16), Corner Brook (18), Sydney (20), Moncton (21), Rimouski (23), Sept Isles (25), Chicoutimi (26), and Victoriaville (27).

## A decade of growth for Joint Communications

Today, Joint Communications is by far Canada's leading media consultancy firm, but when originally launched exactly a decade ago, its founders Dave Charles and John Parikhhal could not have conceived the degree of success they currently enjoy.

Over the years their client list has grown to include companies across North America (and most recently Australia); from individual radio stations, such as their first: Oshawa's CKAR; to chains of stations, as well as internationally affiliated corporations that can be serviced from the Atlanta offices.

For the broadcast community, Joint's service now extends beyond traditional consulting and incorporates research (or "mapping" as Charles refers to it) into the final picture. No longer is the consultant a program director caught "between gigs" but

is, in fact, a professional, helping to keep their stations' various formats in focus.

Essential, and playing a large part in their success, is being thought of as "team players" when visiting radio stations, suggest Charles and Parikhhal. A far cry from the days when the "consultant" would stay in a nearby hotel sending threatening letters and demanding staff resignations.

"We try to become part of the station's family," begins Charles, "and work on a team basis with our clients.

"So this spectre of a consultant coming

in, spying on the radio station and hiding out in hotel rooms is something we do not want to perpetuate, nor have we felt very good about it ourselves. We want to interact with all the key players and let people gain from our experience."

While also advising, Charles considers "teaching" to be equally as rewarding. "We show them better ways in which they can perform and how they can develop their writing and reporting skills and how they can focus their on-air talent." In conjunction, Joint has in operation a "talent bank", which is available as a free service for clients and competitors alike.

"We try to very simply respond to all the talents who come to us," he informs, "and let them know where they stand in terms of their own abilities and help them find their way in the industry. This is paying back some of the things we've gotten out of the business."

Where Joint Communications have achieved their greatest, and most graphic, results is in turning radio stations around in their respective marketplaces, by conducting extensive research studies and positioning correctly their format.

"Once the mapping has been done," Charles explains, "and we have a good view of where the station should be focussed, we then work at helping them position the format. We even help design, or redesign in some cases, the format. Then the servicing begins.

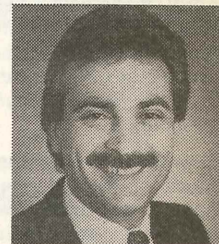
"We're in touch with our clients every week, we help them steer and keep the station's various formats focussed. We're there to serve them and their needs," he adds.

Because Charles and Parikhhal have modelled their company after the Burkhardt-Abrams theory of consultancy, market research presently accounts for (in dollar volume) approximately 40 percent of their business. Lately however, there have been very strong opinions voiced opposing research

and its domination of our industry.

For instance, Roger Waters (Pink Floyd) recently stated: "The whole issue of the increasing takeover of broadcasting by market research-based programming is a subject of great concern. It's effect is to dramatically change the face of radio for the worse . . ."

When FM radio began its rapid acceleration in the late 1970s to where it stands today, it was evident to both Charles and Parikhhal that it was no longer valid to simply "count noses"; that with the technological sophistication of the broadcast industry the

need to service it in a more accurate and reflective manner was obvious.

"Lack of information is ignorance," Charles states. "When you don't take time to do research and truly find out about what's going on, not just how you feel or what you think but truly what's going on, then ignorance is going to be a liability in developing any part of this business."

"By understanding what people are doing and why, which is in part theoretical and part research, and from the practical experience of a decade in the field, we've built up a very nice business," adds Parikhhal, who addresses the question of over-research in the broadcast industry, which he calls an "intriguing" one.

"A lot of the focus these days," he answers, "has been on the fact that research, like an x-ray of your chest, tells you what the immediate problem at hand is but it doesn't tell you what the future holds.

"A lot of radio stations did 'research' and decided things are changing; that advertisers want to pay more money for people who are over 25 and because everyone used the same research techniques and responded to the same demands of advertisers, they all ran the same way.

"All of a sudden, almost overnight," he continues, "and because of a very powerful concentration of ownership in Canada, you had Canadian radio become very conservative and not break a lot of new music. So they blamed research for it. But research isn't to blame. You can't blame the tool that identifies the problem," he maintains.

"You can, in this country, blame (station) managers who are understandably frightened that they're not going to meet the budgets that head office is putting on them unless they go this way; the majority of people in the radio business are business people first and foremost, and you have that concentration of ownership.

"You're now less likely to get the little operator who loves music and who wants to make their radio station a breaking ground for new music. The more it has become a

## Radio asked to support Missing Children's Day

The Government of Canada has proclaimed May 25th as Missing Children's Day, "a day set aside to remember Canada's missing children, and to serve as a reminder that crimes against children can be prevented."

To place a greater emphasis on the missing children problem, Trilogy Records has released a single, titled Please Take Me Home, taken from George Bears' album, Chase Your Dreams.

"The song very well describes the situation and reality of child abduction," says Gary Rosenfeldt, President of the Edmonton-based Victims of Violence, himself a parent of an abducted and murdered child. "and for this reason we are asking that radio programmers play the record on May 25th and in the weeks following Missing Children's Day."

Rosenfeldt continues with "As parents of abducted and sometimes murdered children, we sincerely believe that with the cooperation and assistance of concerned citizens throughout Canada, we will see a reduction in these crimes against children," concluding with "Many of our personal tragedies could have possibly been prevented had we had better knowledge of the problem.

**COVER STORY - by Graeme Boyce****The "Mats" restore credibility of Minneapolis**

As far as uncompromising artistic endeavours are concerned, The Replacements are flourishing while managing to antagonize their record company - and the band's recently released album, *Pleased To Meet Me*, is quite a raunchy piece of rock 'n' roll.

Produced by Jim Dickinson, their follow-up to *Tim*, the critically-acclaimed album, has already aroused many sleeping critics, and has the band excited as well, as opposed to their last effort, which bassist Tommy Stinson says lacked in "so many" areas.

"The production just wasn't strong at all," he elaborates. "I mean . . . you listen to it and there's so much that could have been done, and should have been done. It just sounds really, really weak compared to the new record . . . and," Stinson adds, "we actually had more to say on this record than with (ex-Ramone Tommy) Erdelyi."

Trying to "define" the band's sound is somewhat of a sore point with Stinson, even though they are lumped into the REM-meets-Ramones or Sex Pistols-meet-Aerosmith categories. "It's just no fun if people can classify you and we don't like playing any certain way. We have more fun playing things we can't play . . . things that we've never played before rather than an album full of the same old shit," he clarifies.

Regardless of the label's efforts to "make" lead vocalist Paul Westerberg "sing" or to write a "hit" song, Stinson is confident this album will do very well. "They wanted us to do that," he explains, "because our managers had told them we had 4 possible hits on our record."

"One of them was *Learning How To Fail*, but we didn't put it on the record. We did it on a moments notice and the words were mumbly, but that was the song. They wanted us to go and put words on it and 'sing' it. Well . . . we wouldn't do it because

that was the song as it was.

"They wanted *Can't Hardly Wait*," Stinson continues, "as the first single, and we said 'No'. We wanted *The Ledge*. *Can't Hardly Wait*, with the horns, is us, but it's not us in the true sense. It's us trying something different that they liked, but they're really trying to take it further."

"We didn't want people coming to the show, wanting to hear this song, then when we'd come up and rack up a story, they'd get disappointed."

Previous releases from the band include *Sorry Ma*, *Forgot To Take The Trash Out*, *The Replacements Stink*, *Hootenanny*, *Let It Be*, and *Tim* (their debut for Sire). Yet, it was the latter that brought them the praise and accolades, which allowed the recording of

bunch of accountants in a board room simply looking at a balance sheet and asking: 'How can we improve this?'"

This, he says, harkens the analogy that 'guns don't kill - people do.'

"We need to have that dynamic environment," Parikhhal asserts. "If we don't then you are going to get people saying that radio is over-researched. You are going to have people blaming the tool, rather than taking a look at what the tool does. Therefore, when research is done in an unimaginative and narrow-minded way, it will always give you the same answer."

Parikhhal also suggests that due to the symbiotic nature which exists between radio and the recording industry, "When we do move to an overly-researched, overly-safe type of radio, the recording industry withers and they become increasingly a branch plant for America.

"And after the recording industry in this country had done such an incredible job in bringing Canadian talent to the fore . . . at just this time you hear from a lot of radio stations the new Bryan Adams is too hard! What's this? It's all a bunch of people playing Lionel Richie because their U.S. research company tells them this is 'safe' music to play."

Since Joint Communications' inception, and rise in prominence, Charles relates Canadian artists have always had their support. "Sometimes we end up being a surrogate manager," he quips. "We have given a lot of free time to Canadian artists, to help them evaluate their music and to say what is good or bad about their particular work. The fact is that these opportunities given by a company like ours to the artists is very valuable and if more people were to do that kind of thing, there would be more people to benefit."

Both agree what is needed for the betterment of our industry is dialogue. "There has to be some high level dialogue," advises Charles, "and I think that's one of the areas of growth for our industry and if it doesn't get to that," he warns, "then we'll still be

pondering the same issues in the next 10 years."

With their position in the industry, and able to draw on their U.S. and Australian experiences, Parikhhal feels the historical solution to "throw money" at the problem will not suffice. "They think that by throwing money at it," he contends, "that's going to solve it. They should, at a very senior level, all be sitting down and saying 'Look, we're all in this together. What can we do about it?'"

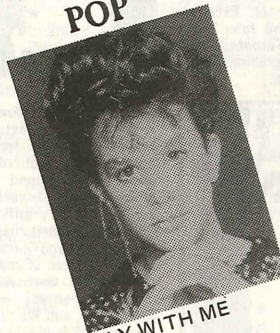
"We're the guys in the middle and we've

done a great deal in this country to keep the dialogue open, to try and keep people aware of what's going on. Yet," Parikhhal concludes, "we don't get paid for it and we don't want to get paid for it. It's just part of our contribution to the country."

Admittedly, research is certainly not infallible but in the same breath cannot be saddled with the errors of its misuse and more importantly when understood and used creatively is merely another means to achieve effectively, and efficiently, a profit.

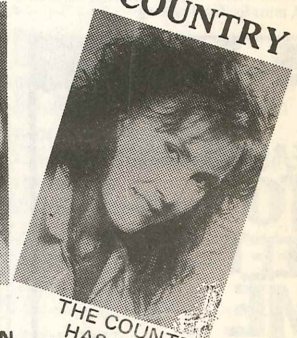

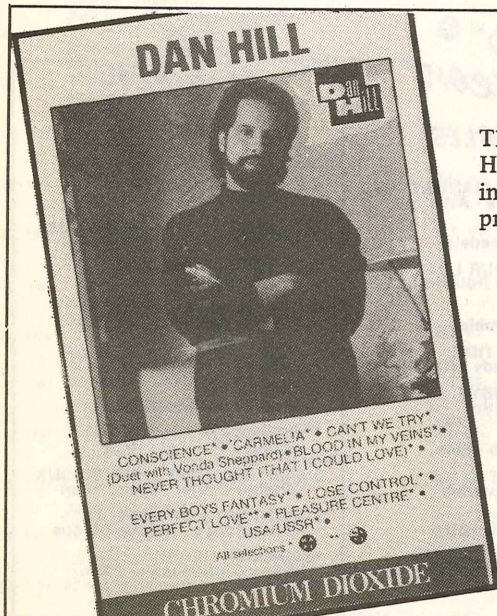

 The timing couldn't be better as Murray literally "packs 'em in" on her most extensive tour of Canada, sponsored by Ford. The producer was Jack White, the writers, exceptional and as diverse in their writing as Murray is in her interpretation of such key tracks as Are You Still In Love With Me, penned by Mark Spiro, K.C. Porter and producer White, the title track, written by White, Spiro and Tony Marty, and an incredible job on Perfect Strangers, a duet with Maritimer Doug Mallory. This song was written by Jonas Fjeld, Astor Anderson, Johnny Saroussen and Spiro. There's more of a light-hearted trip here for Murray, as she wanders slightly to the left of country, which leaves her wide open for the A/C crowd. Canadian programmers are moving slowly on this one because of the lack of Cancon, but Murray's an international star, and these same programmers could end up with egg on their faces. A must for front-racking.



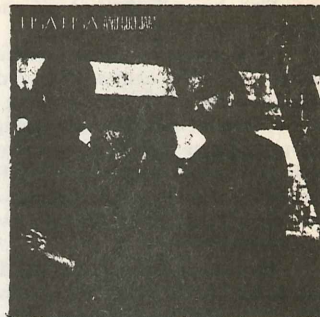
**DAN HILL** - Pop/Rock

Front racking a must, because programming will be heavy on this priority package.

No one track stands out individually, but taken collectively, this is an impressive package.

 One of the finest and freshest sounding albums releases this year. Has tremendous potential to sell through on originality alone. Produced by Dennis Herring at Dustbowl and The Music Grinder in Los Angeles. Title track has been releases as first single.



**CHRIS ISAAK** - Rock/Pop  
 Self-Titled - Warner Bros - 92-55361-P  
 A distinctive and texturally compelling album, produced by Erik Jacobsen, which features a cover of the Yardbirds' classic Heart Full Of Soul. Isaak's second for the label and his (almost country) vocal style is really quite unique, and very difficult to categorize, therefore stands a great chance of selling through in the underground circuits. However, with the current success of many eclectic artists, this album could very well and easily cross over into CHR formats, with key tracks such as Fade Away, and Waiting For The Rain To Fall appearing. A gem with clean, crisp guitar work.

Nice version of Friday On My Mind. Also key are Take A Little Time, and Thunder Rising. Moore was assisted in production by Pete Smith, Peter Collins and James Barton.

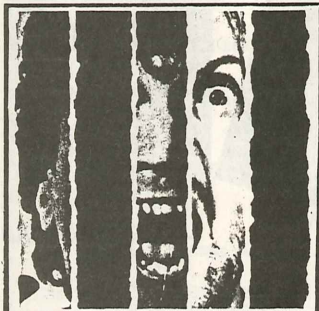
**ACE FREHLEY** - HM/Rock

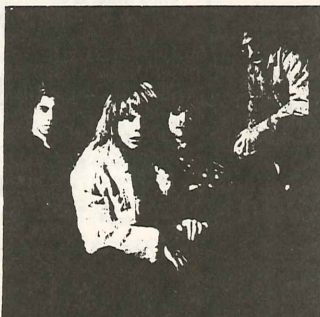
**THE REPLACEMENTS** - Rock

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# And the Nominees are .....

**Q: How are the nominees chosen?**

A: Nominations are based on chart action in RPM over the previous year. The ballots are mailed to all RPM subscribers. This gives us a very good mix of voters, making it impossible for blocks and pockets to control the voting. The winners will be known only when the envelopes are opened onstage, at the actual awards banquet.

**Q: Will the awards feature performances by country artists?**

A: No, the dinner will be followed by the awards ceremony, at which time, the presenters will open the envelopes and announce the winners.

**Q: How many categories are there?**

A: Exactly one dozen (12). The Big Country Awards are a very coveted award. They aren't given out in large numbers. They carry a great deal of prestige and are part of a very posh event. We purposely limit the attendance so as to keep it on a high plain.

**Q: Will there be meetings and conferences tied into this event in the future?**

A: No, we believe there is a great deal of that available presently, and there's no further need for additional conferences.

**Q: Isn't \$100 per person a little too expensive for a banquet?**

A: Actually, it isn't. That price is all-inclusive. Once you pay the \$100, you have paid it all. There are no other charges: for parking, coat check, drinks, or dinner wine. Everything is included. The evening will be a very dignified affair in a very elegant setting - something designed to bring prestige to the Canadian country music industry. This is an event for the industry. Once a year we get together for a very special industry evening to honour our own.

**Q: Is it possible to reserve a table?**

A: Yes - tables of 8, 9 or 10 can be reserved ahead, if you get a group together and arrange that they all pay prior to 4 pm May 22nd, or mail all the payments in the same envelope. We must have all the names in advance.

**Q: Will it be possible to pay at the door?**

A: Definitely not. For an event of this kind, advance planning makes it impossible to arrange any additional meals. You must be confirmed at least 2 days before the banquet. After 4 pm on May 22nd, if you don't have a confirmation number, you can forget the banquet until next year.

The latest Golden Eagle packet contained a single release titled After All This Time by Boone And The Girls. Featured are David Boone and Sheila Deck. The plug side was co-written by Deck, David Vonau and Murray Fiesel. The single qualifies as 4-parts Cancon and was self-produced.

## Shotgun release new single

Just shipped on the Double Barrel label is Shotgun's latest single, We Chose To Play, an original by Brian Twaites, the band's bassist and business manager. The Oshawa-based band have just completed recording their second album, which contains all original material written by the band. They will also be label shopping. The band, which is no stranger to the charts, are currently on tour of the Atlantic Seaboard, which will take them through to June 15.

## CKPE-FM heavy on Cancon

Bill MacNeil, Music Director of Sydney's CKPE-FM, takes his Cancon commitment seriously. His latest chart of 50, lists 11 Cancon singles, beginning with Old Loves Never Die by Peter MacDonald at No. 4), followed by Joan Kennedy's Family Pride at No. 10, Family Brown's I Love You More at No. 14,

Aimie by Double Eagle Band (15), Old Photographs by Terry Carisse (20), Ian Tyson's Navajo Rug (24), Michelle Wright's New Fool At An Old Game (28), Play Me Some Honky Tonk Music by Prairie Oyster (35), Gary Fjellgaard's As Rivers Run Saskatchewan (41), Willie Nelson's version of Neil Young's Heart Of Gold (42), and Terry Cousineau's Will So Long Do? which enters the chart at No. 50. McNeil has been a constant booster of Canadian content and, unlike some of his counterparts, he integrates his Cancon with American singles.

## U.S. release for Tyson LP/single

Ian Tyson's latest Stony Plain album, Cowboyography, the biggest selling album for the label this year, has been released in the U.S. by Sugar Hill Records. The single, Navajo Rug, currently garnering Canadian chart action, will also be released in the U.S. Interestingly, more than 55 percent of the Canadian sales of the LP have come through the BMG (RCA) office in Calgary. Stony Plain will be re-releasing Tyson's 1983 Columbia album, Old Corrals and Sagebrush.

## Heavy touring for Prophet & Glory-Anne

Ronnie Prophet and Glory-Anne are currently touring both the U.S. and Canada, and since the first of the year have played dates in Nashville, Peace River, Slave Lake, Toronto, Memphis, and several dates through the Maritimes. They have just finished playing Niles, Jackson and Kalamazoo in Michigan, as well as Bruce Mines and Russell in Ontario, and will play Nashville's Opryland Hotel May 21, then head north for the RPM Big Country Awards, which will be emceed by Prophet. The latter is currently climbing the charts with his latest RCA single, No Holiday in L.A. as is Glory-Anne with her RCA single, Small Talk.

## Bruce LeBarre covers Leonard Kohls

For the third time over the last few years, Life Is Like The Morning, written by Medicine Hat songwriter, Leonard Kohls, has been covered. The latest release is on the M<sup>2</sup>E label by Bruce LeBarre. The other releases were by Jack McAfee on the Jam label in 1977, and in 1981 by Ken MacLachlan on the Mootrey label. The song is published by Mercey Brothers Music. Kohls, who is well-known in pop, country and Gospel circles, is a schoolteacher in Medicine Hat. His material has also been recorded by Shirley Ann (Is She With You?), Kris Gordon (From My Window With Bars), Billy Stoltz (I Couldn't Sign My Name), Bill Hersh (Our Little Girl), Orval Prophet (Four Little Faces), Sherry Black (The Lights Of Home), Marie McBurney (Nothing Could Be Sweeter), and Joanne &

Robert (Hats Off To 100 Years). He has also had The Maker Cares and The Hands Of God, published in the More Canadian Music songbook.

## Joan Kennedy showcase "leaves 'em spellbound"

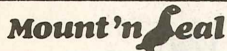
