FACTOR support for 42 new projects

The Board of Directors of FACTOR, have announced "offers of funding" for 42 projects through the foundation's Loan, Video, Radio Syndication, Multi-Project Funding, and New Talent Demo Award Programs.

In the Factor Loan Program: Agent, The Jane Bunnett Quintet, Tim Clement, and Neil James all received funding.

Funding for music videos through the Video Program went to: Bundock, Messenjah, Moev, Rave Revues, Shuffle Demons, and Tabula Rasa

Producer Frank Regan will receive support under the Radio Syndication Program for The Ballroom Dancing Show, a 30-minute pilot program celebrating dance music by Canadian composers, and featuring classic ballroom dance material from the U.K. the U.S. and Europe.

In the New Talent Demo Award Program the following artists will have the opportunity to record a demo tape with 25 hours in a "quality recording facility", Richard Challenger, DS5, Glori Gage, 4 Ever Tonite, Nic Holas, Hot Sauce, The Roy Patterson Trio, The Rhythm Slaves, Sheltered Life, Napolean Solo, The Way, and W.E., all from Ontario; B.C.'s Corrine Dawn, Ross Douglas, Geoff Gibbons, Ginnie, Tami Greer, and Perry Smith; Alberta's Mike Comrie and Roy Kozar, Quebec's George Hilal and Linda Morrison; Nova Scotia's Tim Fenwick; and Newfoundland's Edmund Dawe and Esther Squires.

Noted producer Fairbairn joins Penta label

Well known record producer Bruce Fairbairn has joined the Vancouver-based Penta Entertainment, which recently bowed the Penta label.

Fairbairn has been a major name in the music industry since 1978. He has produced such notables as Bon Jovi, Loverboy, Aerosmith and The Dan Reed Network. As Penta's Marlene Palmer points out, "Together, these bands have sold in excess of 25 million records."

Fairbairn's latest project was Penta's debut album, Unadulterated Addiction, by Raymond May, where he was credited as executive producer. He is currently working on Bon Jovi's follow-up to the multi-platinum Slippery When Wet.

In making the announcement of Fairbairn joining Penta, the firm's president Bruce Allen noted, "We've wanted to be involved with Fairbairn for a long time. His production and A&R credibility that he brings to the label are world class, and we're fortunate to have him with us."

Fairbairn joins Penta principals Allen, John Ford, Lou Blair and Sam Feldman. ble for all policy development and for all operational compliance, monitoring and analysis of applications.

As well, a new directorate, reporting to the Secretary General, has been created with Brien Rodger as Director General of Licensing. This unit will continue the present structure of five regional sections.

Also newly created is a Corporate Analysis Directorate, headed up by Bob Tyre. This directorate, reporting to the Secretary General, will be responsible for all marketing, ownership and financial analysis.

The Secretary General will also be responsible for: Strategic Planning, which will include the former Research Analysis unit; Technical Policy Planning and Analysis group headed by Andrew Kolada; and a new group, Secretariat Operations to be managed by Director General Rosemary Chisholm. The latter will be responsible for grouping Decisions, Scheduling, Proceedings, Public Hearings, and Regional Offices.

It has also been reported that the Correspondence and Complaints unit has joined the Information Services with Pontbriand as Director General, now reporting directly to the Chairman.

Pontbriand expects there will be "a period of adjustment, both for licensees in their dealings with the Commission and for CRTC staff, in assuming their new duties."

The implementation of the new organization structure is expected to be completed in August.

Program to help teens presented by Pepsi-Cola

Pepsi-Cola Canada has introduced a summer program billed as Tear Into The Weekend, designed to reverse "seriously subdued teen situations" explains Pepsi Canada's Director of Marketing, Rick Murray.

Throughout the summer, a series of what is described as "larger than life" weekend theme parties are being brought to teens by the soft drink company and participating radio stations in Ontario, and Western and Atlantic regions.

"We chose the weekend focus because everyone loves weekends," continues Murray. "Weekends are fun-loving, carefree, full of action . . . seeing friends, parties, the beach. It's this attitude that Tear Into The Weekend is all about."

Teens can win a Pepsi party by calling or writing to participating radio stations and describing their "seriously subdued situation." The radio stations draw prizes on a daily, weekly and grand prize basis. Weekly prize winners and their friends can attend a free, "fun-filled theme party."

As Murray points out, "The radio station tie-in is vitally important because radio is a key influence for teens."

Pepsi has introduced a unique 2:40 minute anthem that is now playing on participating radio stations to kick-off the weekends. The song also doubles as a commercial and there are 30 and 60 second thematic and promotional spots as well. The radio spots were produced by J. Walter Thompson (Toronto), and are part of the multi-million dollar Tear Into The Weekend advertising campaign.

To support the program, JWT produced five new television commercials. There will also be outdoor advertisements in bus shelters in selected markets.

The television commercials are based on a "spoof" of a newscast. "We wanted them (the commercials) to be incredibly fast-paced, almost frenetic to get teens' attention," Murray explains.

The Tear Into The Weekend campaign runs from July to September.

The wild and wonderful world of Compact Discs

(A report from Jed Leland, Jr. of the Los Angeles-based Levinson Associates.)

The compact disc has become more than a new-fangled money tree to the record industry in the year or two (or three) since it began leading the music-happy consumer away from the good old reliable vinyl LP, much as the audio cassette ultimately did in the indomitable eight-track.

The shiny 5-inch CD has become a sales and promotion tool, as well. And, it may be the newest item to develop a collector's following, in the tradition of stamps, comic books and baseball cards.

Where record companies once sent radio stations and music reviewers new releases in the 45 single format as a matter of habit, there's an increasing shift to servicing on non-commercial compact disc.

The labels are packing one cut onto the 5-inch, sometimes two, if the release will be going out in both 7-inch and 12-inch dance formats, although the CD can take an hour or more of music.

This assures the best possible listening by contemporary technological standards. More and more radio stations, meanwhile, are buying CD equipment that allows them to make a higher quality transfer for broadcast than possible with a 45 (or from an LP cut).

That's not all that's going on.

The labels have started packing promotional CDs into trade magazines, to make sure their latest offerings reach broadcasters and retailers. It's an ad with ears. (MCA

Records did it most recently for Elton John's newest single release, as an example).

The next revolutionary wave in the world of CD, the smaller 3-inch model that can offer about 20 minutes of music, is already making inroads.

Dunhill Compact Classics may have started it all last December, when the Los Angeles (Northridge)-based company introduced a collector's CD-3 featuring the late Harry Chapin.

The commercial CD was gold, featured two rare Chapin performances and also scored as the industry's first CD picture disc. A portrait of the artist was included on the CD, along with informational copy, as part of Dunhill's participation in a Congressional Gold Medal salute to Chapin at Carnegie Hall in New York City.

Another promotion-oriented independent, country music label, Hub Records of Studio City, California, borrowed from the Dunhill book by recently mailing to broadcasters and country-rooted media, a CD-3 that "presents" Sarah, part of a broad-based promotional campaign behind this new artist. The non-commercial CD, also a picture disc, incorporated Sarah's current single, Chains, along with three previous chart singles.

Sony took the possibilities of the CD in another direction a month or so ago, offering a trio of CD-3's to purchasers of a new compact disc player geared to play either 5-inch or 3-inch discs. These discs each had four cuts by as many artists, from the Warner Bros, Geffen, Elektra, Asylum, Virgin and Atlantic labels.

Dunhill meanwhile, was continuing its trend-setting ways with a David Bowie picture disc. This time the CD was for sale, but only in a limited edition of 10,000 copies. The bins went clean in a matter of weeks, as collectors snapped up copies, now reportedly selling for as much as \$200 apiece.

"Apart from the superior quality it brings to music, the marketing, merchandising and promotional potentiality of the compact disc is limitless," says Dunhill president Marshall Blonstein. "It's bound only by imagination and the spirit of innovation that's always been a part of the music industry. We've always believed in the concept of using the product to sell the product ... "

He continues, "The phenomenon of collecting is one great example. We sensed

we were on to something when we tried it with Chapin, and we proved it with Bowie. People are after these CDs for the pictures, the collectible aspect, as well as for the music," and, with a trace of good humour, he notes, "I'm surprised we haven't heard already from the Danbury Mint"

Hub's president, H.L Vogt, observes, "The size of a CD gives it growing praticality as we move more and more into the age of the apartment dweller, where storage space will be at a great premium. And, size also makes the CD work as a promotional item. I wouldn't be surprised if one day soon we find gift CDs of the 5-inch and 3-inch variety packaged as premiums inside cereal boxes and cartons of soda pop."





George Fox leaps over all hurdles with debut album

From plowing his fields and picking the rocks during the day, to playing in the local bars at night; from his fateful trip to Sweden, to his decision not to buy a mighty John Deere, but opt instead for studio time, newcomer George Fox has made incredible strides in the past few years, as he now has a record deal with WEA and is presently touring with Randy Travis throughout the Western provinces.

As Fox says, "I blew past my dreams quite a while ago," and that was apparently before his first single was released or, in fact, his debut self-titled album. Actually, a little over a month ago, Fox and his songwriting partner, Jerry Martin, weren't even sure if they'd be playing at the Calgary Stampede, let alone opening for the main musical attraction himself, Randy Travis. Obviously though, there must be some merit to the music of George Fox.

"What we tried to do with the album," explains the Albertan rancher, "was to come up with something that did sound unique, because when you listen to country radio, at times there are some things that sound structured or fitting in with trends, and we tried to

Toronto's Q107 wraps Homegrown Contest '88

Heather Dietrich, Promotions for Toronto's Q107, reports "another great year for Q107's Homegrown Contest, and this year's contest marked the 10th Anniversary for Homegrown at Q107."

There were more than 1500 tape entries from local acts, with nine winners chosen for inclusion on the Homegrown LP, to be released mid-July on the MCA label.

The top three placing bands took home major prizes. First prize winner, Mark James Fortin, won a CD single to be released on MCA, recorded at Metalworks, promoted nationally by the Music Brokers, \$10,000 worth of Peavey stage and sound equipment from Steve's Music, and \$2,000 cash; Runner-up Brooke Palmer received 50 hours of studio time at Certain Circles Studios plus \$1,000 cash; and Alter Ego, took the third place prize, 25 hours of studio time at Certain Circles and \$1,000 cash. get away from that. We tried to do something different and I think that's the way it turned out. Yet nobody's saying that we're trying to sound like Randy (Travis) or that we're ripping off Dwight Yoakam, and the feedback from the programmers is that it's a fresh sound."

Singing in front of crowds far in excess of 10,000 these days has taken an adjustment, Fox admits, ('1t's like we've jumped out of a UFO,'' he adds), but the dates have indeed gone well, so far, and the fans have been very appreciative of the two musician's similar styles.

Inspired originally by Elvis Presley's Heartbreak Hotel, Fox recalls that his career went from high school friends garages; singing Chuck Berry, Buddy Holly and, of course, Elvis Presley, progressing into country music quickly, simply due to economic necessity. The demand in Cochrane, Alberta for rock bands isn't too great. Thus he was soon introduced to the music of Hank Williams, Johnny Cash and Johnnie Horton. "But it wasn't until that trip to Sweden that I really got into it," Fox continues.

To make a long story short: the availability of country music while visiting Sweden was his only link to home. He was isolated, he couldn't speak the language and yet he could sing along with Willie Nelson. So, for the year he was there, on an exchange program, he discovered what country music was all about.

"When I got back to Canada," he

Indie sector heralds new marketing firm

An aspect of the music industry that isn't being overlooked today by the independent sector is the increasing involvement of corporate sponsors, who continue to spend thousands (sometimes millions) on their various regional, national or international marketing campaigns. Now, Lana McKenzie hopes to formally cement relations between the two communities, once eons apart.

McKenzie's company, Live Wire Promotions, offers to be that "missing link" between advertisers and their respective corporate clients and those bands willing to buffer their bank accounts by either appearing in commercials or tying-in specifically to campaign strategies and sponsorship packages.

"I find that more and more corporations are investing in the music industry because they're realizing that a quarter of the world's population is under twenty-five", states McKenzie, formerly with both the Music Brokers and Jacob Gold's office. "These people do have massive buying power and the agencies find they can market their products through music."

The major corporation's effective use of current "superstars" has had a filtering effect on the independent bands and, in fact, these acts are now willing to accept contracts with sponsors prior to signing recording deals, which apparently has made no adverse impressions on A&R directors either. From soft drinks to cosmetics, from clothing to entertainment itself, all these products rely on the disposable income of the younger generaelaborates, "that's about the time George Strait, Ricky Skaggs and John Conlee were coming out and that's when I started to get real serious and I hooked up with my guitar player, who played a big part on this record. It's taken five or six years of pretty hard work.

"I mean . . . it's easy to get the initial ideas, like there's one song on the album called RBJ and I remember I got the first two lines when I was out loading hay racks one day, but it took me a year before I actually had the thing finished. People say 'Yeah, I could've written that,' but I invite anybody to sit down and try it because it does take quite an effort."

Therefore, when all the songs were written, instead of buying the new John Deere, they went off to Calgary's Smooth Rock studios to begin recording the project, which had to be interrupted during calving season, and soon after, the finished tape was on the desk of Bob Roper at WEA. "But when I first started recording and realistically looking at it," Fox relates, "I thought I was going to be selling this record at the hardware store or the grocery store."

He concludes with, "So I wanted, as well as my own stuff, to have something that people would recognize on the cover, so that when people picked it up, they'd go, 'Oh yeah, I know that song,' that way they might scoop it up and then hear the songs that I wrote," which is simple enough reason for the inclusion of the cover tunes by Hank Snow and Hank Williams, I've Been Everywhere and Lovesick Blues respectively; his favourites and hopefully his new fans favourites as well.

tion, the obviously unwanted demographic at radio.

"I would say that the non-alcoholic beverage companies are using musicians and music to sell their product more than alcohol beverage companies are," McKenzie continues. "I don't have the exact statistics to back that up, but all you have to do is turn on the television. Coca-Cola, Seven Up, Pepsi, they look like non-alcoholic beer commercials of yesteryear, and I see all of them eventually jumping on board.

"And bands are finally clueing in," she concludes. "I think bands are much more business-like than they were five years ago. They're aware of the corporate angle. They are aware that there are a certain number of things they have to do in order to make it. Going out and playing live gigs is no longer the only avenue to take.

"For Canada, with free trade coming, I think the independent scene is going to grow astronomically in the next few years and that has been shown with the number of independent record companies that have recently sprung up. There are a lot of bands out there who are very good, but they're not considered commercially viable by the record companies. If you can prove though that you can make money independently, then you will get signed to a major label, because the bottom line is money. But that just may mean getting corporate funding and then putting out your own record, on your own label." Radio Re:Action





If the album jacket doesn't turn you on, the music inside just might. On the debut album, pro-duced by Mick Glossop (Van Morrison, The Waterboys), lead singer Christy Dignam proves he can belt rockers like Heat Of The Cell and the first Canadian single, Lowing Me Lately, as well as skillfully handling softer material such as Been So Long. Being promoted as "Erie's Hottest Rock Export" since U2, it seems likely that we'll be hearing more from this young band.



RAYMOND MAY · Pop/Rock Unadulterated Addiction Penta - 96-07961-P

Penta 96-07961-P If you stand too close to the speakers you can feel the sweat drip off this one. From fiery rock 'n' roll to heartfelt ballads, the unpretentiousness of May's untrained vocal style and the stripped-down sound mix together in the proper formula for success. Pro-duced by Paul Hyde and May, both the album and Romantic Guy, the first single, are receiving attention from radio and retail. On this consistently strong debut effort, several tracks manage to stand out above the rest: watch for Tiger And The Butterfly, Ride 'Em High and the ballad, True Pretender. Papa has a fresh, appeal-ing vocal charm, further enhanced by an exceptionally well balanced in-strumental backing. Produced by Papa, Daryl Burgess and John Webster at Vancouver's Ocean Sound. Also key are Heart Attack, the flip of the single, and You Fill Me Up, the latter's funky dance rhythms will catch on with the dance club crowd.


Prairie Oyster continues tour schedule

Quality . . . not quantity!

Your comment about "not nearly enough Cancon rotated " on video shows (Walt Says - June 4/88), kind of disturbed me. I am very proud of what some of our artists have done on a worldwide basis, but I do not feel anyone's music should be played on the basis of their country of birth, at least not as the sole reason. It's my personal opinion that a quality, not quantity factor should be in place. In order to help today's record industry, wouldn't it be better to have a fifteen percent quota, and only songs up to a year old qualify for Cancon status? Many of the songs radio stations play to make their thirty percent quota aren't even available for purchase anymore, having been deleted years ago. How about FM stations? Should Canadian hits be classified as hits? I don't think they should be restricted on playing or promoting the new life of the record industry.

I just happen to think we have talent galore in this country, and instead of legislating airplay, we should promote airplay. I fully agree with the original Cancon ruling. It was needed. I think it's time for change. It's like learning to ride a bike with training wheels. Once you learn, you take the training wheels off. I'm not anti-Cancon, I am very pro-Cancon, just wanting to do it properly.


