

Cancon certifications are up 35 percent - CRIA

The end of the year statements on certifications from the Canadian Recording Industry Association reveal that the total number of certifications for 1989 was 314, compared to 295 in 1988. Of particular interest was the number of Canadian content certifications which totalled 65 last year compared to 48 in 1988, an increase of 35 percent.

There were seven double platinum (200,000 units sold) Cancon albums certified this year as opposed to two the previous year, and 17 solo platinum awards compared to 18 in 1988, a drop of one.

In the gold arena, 41 albums were certified, a hefty increase over the previous year's 26. There was no harvesting of gold singles last year, however, there were two singles that managed to gain entry into the gold market in 1988.


Joining the Montreal Branch as promotion representative is Antonello Di Domenico. He joins WEA from BMG where he was a service representative.



Canadian Content Regulations, you're deserving of a lot of recognition from both the broadcast and recording industries. (EC: Happy birthday Nnnnnnevin...!)

A conflict of interest ...! How can anyone be a rock critic for a major daily, host a show on a major rock radio station . . . and be a recording artist? (EC: If you're not good at any of them . . . who cares . . .!)

And the prices go up and up...! When a big bucks movie company wants to move into the recording field... it had better have an open door to the bank. It's not official yet, but rumour has it that a major motion picture company paid \$750 million for a record company. I don't know if Mr. G. went with the purchase, but you can bet he has an ace up his sleeve. (EC: How about the publishing...?)

Now, that's a gold record...! Believe it or not... our industry is fast approaching the day when there will be a gold, platinum, or whatever award, given away 365 times a year. That's an award for every single day of the year. Think about it! Now, that must be a record! (EC: Possibly a gold record...!)

The Future Is Now . . . ! CBS Records took over the whole Ontario Science Centre last week to present its aggressive promotion, The Future Is Now . . . Music For The Nineties On CBS. The video presentation was very effective . . . a nice look into the future. (EC: What prize did you win . . . ?)

Sam The Telephone Man . . . ! You were probably wondering when you would see Sam The Record Man again. Well . . . it's rumoured that Sam will be presenting that cheque for \$5,000 (a sum he's matching with WEA's Stan Kulin, who presented his cheque the day of the commitment!), while he's working the phones on the Variety Club Telethon. Sam, a genius when it comes to getting the most for his money, will get a double value for his money by not only making the donation at his luncheon, but also again before the public . . . on television, live (EC: It's such a good cause and, knowing Sam, I think this MUST be another \$5,000 we're talking about. I heard that Sam is challenging the record retail multimillionaires to match his donation and better it . . .!) I will keep the industry posted.

Which Elvira was first ...? In case you may be wondering about which Elvira was the first, Elvira Capreese first wrote her gossip column in RPM in 1964. That was long before the record that bears her name and about the time that the Mistress of the Dark was still in the cradle, I hope! (EC: To this day, I am the only REAL Elvira . . . all others are imitations!) You should be flattered.

A Canadian studio in Los Angeles? Well, not exactly, but a Canadian has bought into one of the large recording studio complexes in Los Angeles. He recently had a couple of name stars in for sessions and he'll be offering the studio to Canadian acts at fairly reasonable rates. Nothing official yet, but keep tuned. (EC: That's all we need . . !)

Louie's on the move . . . ! After 48 years at Toronto's Royal York Hotel . . . and who could miss him at the door of the Imperial Room, Louie Jannetta is moving on . . . to Toronto's SkyDome. He will be looking after all the private boxes and functions with a staff of 150, a few more than he had at the Imperial Room. It must have been an offer he couldn't refuse . . . because he's writing a book about his 50 years at the RYH. But then, it doesn't cost anything to scratch a working title and besides nothing has happened at the Imperial Room for the last year and it doesn't look as if anything is going to happen over the next two years. Industry leaders comment on entering a new decade

The Canadian music industry enters a new decade with a greater sense of confidence, much of it brought about by the changes that were so hard fought for and which affected welcomed revisions to the Copyright Act, and that's not over yet. There is also the continuing success of the Foundation to Assist Canadian Talent on Records (FACTOR), which, in spite of criticisms, even from this camp, has certainly added to the challenge of "getting a leg up" in the independent field. Working hand in glove with FACTOR is the Canadian Independent Record Production Association (CIRPA), which continues to fight for the rights of the independent producers and small label owners.

A major factor in the success of Canadian recording artists, however, is the all important promotion and distribution networks offered by the major labels. without which the independents would go wanting. Hopefully, there will be an even closer relationship between the independent and major labels during this next decade. Also of importance, and not to be overlooked, are the independent promotion people, of whom only a handful exist in this country. When it comes to promotion, the record industry, for the most part, is still black and white and dull. A little colouring from the independent promotion field could

Executive Director Canadian Independent Record Production Association (CIRPA)

There is good news and bad news for the independent sector in the nineties. The growth of technology will present both new challenges and new opportunities, to take just one example, distribution of products through technology may become easier but we still have to be paid for our product no matter what technology is used.

CIRPA sees two prime issues for the nineties - the development of the concept of the music industry as one that deals in rights, and not just products, plus the necessity of being paid for the use of these rights both in Canada and abroad. If both these aims are achieved then the future for the industry is bright. If not, we will have major problems and the industry, as we know it, is very unlikely to survive the decade.

Warner/Chappell Music Canada Ltd.

We at Warner/Chappell Music Canada are looking to 1990 as a year of finalization of the performance society merger and its functioning efficiently on both domestic and international levels; as well as Phase 2 of the Copyright Act being finalized and addressing areas such as home taping, rental rights and retransmission by the end of this year.

Being part of the largest music publishing company in the world is satisfying, especially representing U2, George Michael, Madonna, etc., but the challenge of domestic signings that have impact in foreign markets is Warner/Chappell Canada's goal for this year and many years to come.

In the country music field, this new decade could see the emergence of a true star system. Independent country music labels and artists artists have, for years, struggled to gain recognition. They produce and release a third more product than their pop and rock cousins, but manage only a wisp of attention from the press, radio and retail.

With the industry putting the last nail in the coffin of black vinyl, callously forgetting the millions of turntables and perhaps a few more years of profit, the love affair with the compact disc continues. However, in many cases, the cassette configuration leads the way. Compact disc hardware manufacturers still have a long way to go, boasting only a ten percent penetration of the Canadian market

On the radio front, some observers are predicting that music programming on radio just might get back into the hands of Program and Music Directors. Some programmers are now working closer with record retail stores and listening to record promotion people, which could only make for a stronger, working relationship between the two industries that count so heavily on one another.

Over the next few weeks, RPM will publish comments from leaders of Canada's music and broadcast industries, who will hopefully touch on some of the above topics.

Two matters have consumed the PROCAN staff over recent months, and will continue into 1990. The first is the merger of PROCAN and CAPAC. This merger is unique in that this is not a case of one company acquiring another, but it is a blending of two successful companies into a new society that will represent at home and abroad all Canadian composers, songwriters and music publishers. This spring will see the election for the Board of Directors for SOCAN - Society of Composers, Authors and Music Publishers of Canada.

Hearings for the 1990 tariffs are continuing before the Copyright Board. They include a new cable tariff and the airing of a dispute with private TV broadcasters where they are seeking a substantial reduction in their rates. Also the CTV Network is questioning before the Federal Court the jurisdiction of the Copyright Board in setting a rate through a new tariff for the network.

Backstage prepared for best MIDEM vet

Steve Thomson, President of Backstage Productions International, returns to MIDEM this year with what he describes as "a full range of exciting new product."

New from Ronnie Hawkins is a Greatest Hits package containing over 35 recordings including his vintage rockers as well as his more recent releases from the '80s. This package, available on 2 CDs, 3 albums or 3 cassettes, was just released in Canada on Silver Eagle Records and is currently being touted through a 90-second television commercial. Silver Eagle is also slating the package for a U.S. release later this year.

Hawkins is also enjoying popularity in the print world with a book on his life titled Last Of The Good Old Boys, Released domestically last year, the book has met with critical acclaim and impressive sales, and will be available at MIDEM. Thomson is also taking along a video package of the Hawk which contains vintage footage, concert shots and a special reunion with The Band's Levon Helm, Rick Danko and Garth Hudson.

Thomson explains, "Collectively this unique package offers record companies in all territories an aggressive, turn-key marketing campaign," continuing with, "Together, the components make for a great vehicle to launch a new decade with one of the undisputed legends of rock 'n' roll, Ronnie Hawkins."

Danny Brooks will have his debut at MIDEM with an album titled After The Storm, produced by Canadian producer Ross Munro and arranged by Rik Emmett of Triumph fame. Says Thomson, "Danny's music comes from the street . . . and his integrity shines through on every track." The album was released this month in Canada on the Duke Street label.

Thomson will also be introducing a new Trilogy artist to the international market, singer/songwriter David Hutchins. His debut, On My Own, is slated for release in Canada on Feb. 15. The first single taken from the album titled You've Broken My. Heart is accompanied by a video. The album was produced in Nashville by Gene Rice. Thomson will shortly mount a marketing campaign which he believes will "position David as an artist to look out for in the '90s."

Also priority for Thomson this year is a new album by pop artist Jannetta. The album is scheduled to be produced by Todd Booth of Kim Mitchell fame and Vince Di Giorgio, producer for Eria Fachin and Barbara Doust. Jannetta made good inroads in Canada with her last album, Breathless, now enjoying popularity in Japan where it has been released on the Telchiku label. Thomson expects other Asian releases to follow.

Video is key for Picture Comes To Life

While many acts see videos as nothing more than commercials for their product, Kathryn Manx, who fronts BMG's Picture Comes To Life with songwriting partner Ron Proulx, holds them in much higher esteem. A visual artist by trade, Manx has been instrumental in the production of the group's own video releases.

"We have a strong belief that popular artists work in a variety of modern media and one of those is video, the others being recording and performing live, and each of those things is related," contends Manx. "The first thing we ever released was a video, for No Words/No Speak. It was a real arty extravaganza with a lot of effects and things that had never been tried before." This debut went on to be selected as one of six finalists in the Best International Music Video category at Video Culture '85.

"We felt when videos came along, as part of what we do as artists, it just seemed like the perfect thing for us, so we jumped right in with both feet and made this video," she recalls. "Our second video was for Cross My Heart and we attempted to make it much simpler and just show the band performing...We added some animation afterwards so it definitely got livened up and wasn't quite the simple thing that we had envisioned originally.

"This third time out, we're in a bit of a different situation," says Manx of the group's current video for Do Wot We Want To, the second single drawn from their eponymous debut LP. "We had put our album out and we had started negotiating with BMG for distribution, so we were faced with a lot of different concerns and we thought, 'Now what we really want to do is make a simple video just to show the band performing and not to get into too much of an extravaganza'...It was really a very simple straightforward video.

"I don't blame artists that don't get involved in their own videos, but I really think if artists do get involved in their own videos, it's just another medium of expression for them as artists," she declares. "I guess some artists see themselves strictly as musicians and not as visual artists, or they don't want to be actors, but there's so much you can do with just trying to capture yourself performing live."

As a live performance entity, Manx

insists: "We're not a bar band . . . it's not like we schlep ourselves around the country week after week, but on the other hand, performing is really important to us. We really like it a lot and we enjoy the spontaneity of the give and take between us and the audience...There's a certain simplicity to doing a song live. It's very different from meticulously crafting something in the studio.

"My partner, Ron Proux, and I are a songwriting team and I guess we've always felt it was more a natural thing that we preferred to stay around here and have the time in the studio to write songs and develop ourselves as songwriters," elaborates Manx. "That's more where we see our future being as opposed to being road warriors."

Accordingly, it was not on the basis of their live show, but as a result of the recording and video projects of the band that Picture Comes To Life recently signed to BMG. "We released our album in the early summer [of 1989] on our own label, Cesspool Of Lust," relates Manx, "and we never really intended that to be an end in itself, although it was part of our plan to release an album no matter what happened. We thought, 'Major record labels or no major record labels, we're releasing an album come hell or high water.'

Lew launches unique Blues & Cues nightclub

Gene Lew, well-known Toronto promoter, has opened a new nightclub that combines what he describes as "my dream of providing around-the-clock recreation with my love of music." Lew was the originator of the trendsetting Le Spot snooker hall, and he had to fight City Hall for the right to present 24-hour snooker to the public.

Now, it's Blues & Cues for Lew, who is the President of the Canadian Professional Snooker Association. The new club, located at 3477 Kennedy Road in Scarborough, is built in 20,000 square feet of space and features 33 English and American style tables, which gives his customers the choice between snooker and pool. The club also features a range of private rooms with both types of table, licensed service and gourmet food. The Snooker Club features membership privileges.

While Lew handles the Cues side of the club, Derek Andrews looks after the Blues side. A longtime blues promoter, Andrews has tucked a lot of club experience under his belt including Egerton's/The Edge, Albert's Hall and the Horseshoe. He also produces the Toronto Harbourfront Soul 'N' Blues Festival, which accesses him to some of the big names in blues.

Firmed for January are Junior Wells and the Junior Wells Band (18-20), Stony Plain's Morgan Davis (22-25), Stony Plain's Paul James (26-27) and, Gordie Johnson and Big Sugar (29-31).

In February the club will mount performances by Molly Johnson and Big Sugar (1-3), and Stony Plain's John Hammond (8-10).

"We accomplished that, but then we felt that the next logical step was to hook up with a Canadian label for distribution just to be able to get to a larger public," she comments, "and we did approach people and made sure people had heard our album, so eventually it just came to pass that BMG were interested enough to take our video and our album to an international marketing meeting...It was actually the UK people and the international department of BMG that said, "Wow, this band is too talented to ignore and we'd really like to keep in touch with them." So it came about after that that we got signed in Canada."

Manx reports that, after signing, Picture Comes To Life was "in a bit of a curious position at first because we had released our first single on our own, and that was Cross Your Heart, and we'd gotten a fair bit of airplay here in Toronto...we'd also had some play across Canada, so when BMG stepped into the fray around the middle of September, they released our album and played catch-up with the rest of the radio stations in Canada...Now everything's evened out, it will be a blitz right across Canada."

Picture Comes To Life is another clear example of how record companies have come to reward the determination and conviction bands display by releasing albums and videos independently while simultaneously reducing the financial risk that must be taken with an act's initial release. The hard work has paid off for this band who took the time and energy to do it the way so many young Canadian groups recently have.

Reed mounts third annual Holly's Prayer concert

This past Christmas was a bit more joyful for hundreds of children in the Mississauga (Toronto) area thanks to recording artist Rob Reed. Reed presented his third annual Holly's Prayer Christmas concert at the Meadowvale Theatre for two shows (Dec. 16 & 17). Donations of toys carrying a \$15 value or greater were accepted as admittance.

The Holly's Prayer idea evolved from a tragedy that occurred more than six years ago. As Reed explains, the story was about a little girl who was abandoned beneath a transport truck. After the media picked up on the story and within 48 hours of finding the child, approximately \$86,000 was raised from the public to cover the child's medical expenses. The little girl was later adopted by a caring family.

A single by Reed, appropriately entitled Holly's Prayer, was released on The T.O.T.S. Christmas label. The song was written by Reed and Al Leger. "This Holly is about what would have happened if that child had not been abandoned," says Reed. "If she had stayed with the parents who didn't want her or who couldn't afford to have her, whatever the reason was. Our story is about what would have happened if she had been kept in that family living in that situation."

In view of Reed's efforts more than 1,000 toys were presented to the Mississauga News Christmas Bureau Fund for distribution to the needy children in the area.

Reed is currently on release with his Jennie single Tiger Eyes.

Oldies format working at CHUM AM - Davies

When Ross Davies, Operations Manager and Program Director for both Toronto's CHUM AM & FM, dropped the bombshell last September that the AM operation was going with an All Oldies format (RPM - Sept. 16/89), there was considerable concern within the record industry. Most had hoped the station would go back to its original rock format and battle head to head with CFTR. The industry was looking for more exciting radio, radio that would help sell records. Davies persisted however, and now, almost six months later, he is still convinced he made the right move.

"We're very, very excited," he admits. It was obviously a calculated gamble when he made the switch, only two and a half weeks prior to the start of the fall BBM survey. "We honestly didn't really expect to get any kind of reflection in the fall book," he continues, "but, in fact, we did. If we were to compare the fall ratings to the last ratings taken with the old soft-rock format which was the summer ratings . . . we did very well, a circulation increase of 120,000 listeners. I think it was very much a word of mouth happening."

Davies literally brims over with enthusiasm as he talks about the excitement at the station and the promotions that created even greater listener reaction. "We just did a two hour Elvis Presley special celebrating his birthday," he enthuses. "and we got so many calls we had to run it again that same day. The response was incredible and I don't think AM stations have received this type of reaction for a long, long time.

"There's a tremendous amount of excitement," he continues, "and the feedback has been so positive that we're just waiting for the next survey period, which we're in right now, to hopefully show more significant increases that the sales guys can go out and really tell a story to the advertisers, because we know it's working."

It wasn't a nailed-down, tailored to CHUM AM All Oldies format that Davies

brought in. Changes had to be made on a day-to-day basis. "Oh yes," Davies stresses, "we modified and adjusted as we rolled. We had to weed out some of the more obscure stuff... massaging is probably the best way to describe what we did with our music. We've had to add more gold into the run as well, but it has to be the right type...so we're doing that constantly, plus getting the jocks settled in as to what their roles should be. Some of them were a little apprehensive in the beginning."

The main concern of Davies, of course, was the plight of the radio station. CHUM AM's ratings had plunged in a few short years and he was faced with a do or die situation. He knew he would be ridiculed by the record industry over his move. "Sure...I was concerned about the criticism we might get from the record industry," Davies admits, "But I was also concerned with saving a radio station. I expected to get a lot of calls, but they weren't as nasty as I thought they would be. The record industry

might not like our format necessarily, but I think they've been pretty understanding of the reality of the situation.

"The key was to save the radio station. I

don't want to give you the gruesome details," he continues, "but we were in trouble . . . it wasn't looking very good and, frankly, it still isn't. We have some really big corners to turn around here . . . but we're all feeling very good about what's happening now. We know we're going to do it, but it was a situation where we couldn't wait much longer to make a change."

Davies also points out that "The side effect of our change is that if we can become a good radio station and get people listening to radio on the AM band . . . I think that will have a spillover effect for the industry. It keeps people interested in radio. I can't expect them to listen to us all the time, but at least they're listening to radio." He goes on to suggest, "I would imagine we are contributing some value to the record companies insofar as their library and gold product is concerned."

Davies firmly believes that broadcasters "have to keep listeners interested in the AM band . . . it's very important," he continues, "Besides, we're having fun . . . it's like the good old days in radio, the fun and excitement of contests, things that aren't done on FM. I call it The Great Escape." He concludes with, "If you want to lose your troubles and worries and just get away for awhile . . . tune in CHUM AM, because we are having a lot of fun."

A feather in the cap of the Barndance was the induction, this past year, into the new Canadian Country Hall of Fame in Kitchener of 25 country artists. Of these, seven have performed on the CKNX Barndance: Earl Heywood, The Mercey Brothers, Al Cherny, Maurice Bolyer, Tommy Hunter, Myrna Lorrie and Wilf Carter.

The original CKNX Barndance was founded in 1937 by W.T. ("Doc") Cruickshank, as a country music program on AM 920. The show featured live bands and local talent and was so popular it went on the road in early 1938. For the next 25 years (1938 to 1963), the Saturday Night CKNX Barndance followed a hectic performance circuit around Southwestern Ontario.

It wasn't long before the Barndance was known as the largest travelling show of its kind in Canada, featuring such regulars as Ward Allen, Tommy Hunter, Earl and Martha Heywood, Al Cherny, "Lucky" Ambeault, "Slim" Boucher, Red Burns, Ernie King, Maurice Boyer, The Mercey Brothers, Jack Kingston, Clark Johnson, "Cactus" Mac, Howard Sisters and Don Robertson and The Ranch Boys.

Guesting on the series of shows were the biggest names in country from that era, including Ray Price, Bill Monroe and the Blue Grass Boys, Wilma Lee and Stoney Cooper and the Clinch Mountain Clan, "Slim" Whitman, Myrna Lorrie, Gordon Lightfoot, Wilf Carter and Mac Wiseman. The Barndance was looked upon as the "Grand Ole Opry" of Canada.

When the Barndance wound down in 1963, several artists who had performed in the show during the '60s and '70s staged a series of Barndance Reunions for the next few years. However, it was in the early '80s when CKNX AM revived the show, bringing it back into mass popularity once again.


