



Major labels phase out CD blister pack

Citing environmental concerns, major Canadian record companies have announced they will eliminate the compact disc "blister pack" by April 1st.

Brian Robertson, President of the Canadian Recording Industry Association (CRIA), says concerns about the waste caused by the 6" X 12" plastic package came from within the music industry itself. He claims concerns had been raised at industry meetings over the past two years that "the plastic shell was both a challenge for the record buyer to open and was an immediately disposable item that served no further useful purpose than to clutter up garbage sites for years to come." The labels will eliminate both the plastic and cardboard longboxes.

Environment Minister Lucien Bouchard called the move "a laudable decision that will encourage others in the business community to look for ways in their production processes

to reduce waste."

The decision to eliminate the longboxes, however, has left retailers scrambling to adapt. The blister pack was initially introduced in 1985 as "a merchandising aid at the retail level," says Robertson. Retailers could continue to use their 12" X 12" display racks for compact discs. Now, says Bruce Van Allen, Executive Vice President, Sales for A&A Records & Tapes, "we either have to change all the fixtures in our stores," to accommodate the 5½" X 5" CD jewel box "or go out and get our own longbox." A&A has opted for the latter course, but even this "is a major expense on our behalf," says Van Allen.

Stewart Duncan, manager of Sam The Record Man's Yonge Street (Toronto) store, says they too, are opting to keep the longbox. "It's going to be labour-intensive, and initially it'll be a huge expense." But he

says there is a bright side. "We'll be able to build in a security system," similar to the one now in place for cassettes. The store's longboxes will not be disposable, but will be removed from the CDs at point of sale.

While both Van Allen and Duncan say the goal of reducing waste is laudable, they express puzzlement at the record companies' move. Van Allen points out that some U.S. labels have just decided not to dump the longbox, while Duncan says "most blister packs are now cardboard. The plastic has not been as much of a problem as it was."

CBC Radio Variety releases Elemental CD

CBC Radio's Variety Department has shipped its first recordings project CD, entitled Elemental, the work of Halifax singer/songwriter Laura Smith.

The album, which was produced in Halifax by CBC's Glenn Meisner, features the top session musicians from Atlantic Canada.

The second release features two bands, Montreal's Bliminals and The Nyetz from Vancouver. The Bliminals session was produced by Roma Baran who has worked with Laurie Anderson. The Nyetz recording was produced live-to-DAT in CBC's Vancouver studio by Tod Elvidge.

The Variety recordings will be programmed frequently on CBC's regional and network programs, but are available for airplay by any national or international broadcaster. For information regarding these recordings contact Andre LaRiviere at Variety Recordings, CBC Montreal.

Coming up are CDs from Kate and Anna McGarrigle, a new sound from slide-guitarist Ellen McIlwaine, a session with Toronto singer/songwriter Eugene Smith, and a tenth anniversary celebration, featuring fifteen R&B chestnuts by Canada's premier R&B band, The Lincolns.

A wait and see situation with new CRTC proposals

FM should no longer have lower Canadian music requirements than AM stations is the message the CRTC is sending out to broadcasters. In a recent review of FM policy, made available February 16, by the CRTC, several changes were proposed. Included were:

Increasing Canadian music requirements to 30 percent per day for all popular music-based stations, and to 20 percent per day for easy listening stations.

- Exempting Canadian hit records from the 50 percent limit of hit records that FM stations can play.

- Eliminating the distinction between hard rock and soft rock classifications.

CRTC Chairman Keith Spicer pointed out that the objectives of the proposed changes were "to strengthen and fine-tune our creative resources in order to maintain and develop the diversity, comprehensiveness and high standards of FM radio." He went on to explain, "We want to arrive at a new FM policy that offers listeners a wide variety of choices, while favouring Canadian artists and paying due regard to the realities faced by broadcasters."

What the broadcasters will be facing is an increase in Cancon to 30 percent. Marty Forbes, Program Director at CKFM Toronto regards the new proposals as a "Supply and demand" situation. He goes on to explain, "An increase is not good if it forces stations to play records that are 20 to 25 years old in order to meet their Cancon requirements." The impetus would definitely be on the recording industry to meet the new demand for quality Canadian releases.

Also of interest to the Canadian recording industry is the proposal exempting Canadian hit records from the 50 percent hit ratio. There has been some argument that Canadian records have been dropped by stations when they attain hit status so that more foreign hits can be played.

Duff Roman, Vice President, Industry Affairs CHUM Ltd., who has heard of this practice, is of the opinion that exempting Canadian hits would give the records more flexibility and would be favourable to both FM and Canadian artists.

There has also been concern over the removal of the distinction between hard rock and soft rock formats. Removing the regulation of these as two distinct formats may allow stations to operate solely on the basis of competitive forces and could result in competitors being reduced to across the board imitators. Says Roman, "In its purest form it may be ideal but it is something that needs to be looked at really carefully."

The CRTC invites comments on its proposed changes to the FM policy up until May 11, 1990. A public hearing is scheduled for June 26, 1990 in the National Capitol Region.

CBS reduces prices on compact disc product

Don Oates, Senior Vice President Sales and Marketing for CBS Music Products, has announced (Feb. 21/90) reductions in the wholesale price of compact discs, a move described as one that could "save the consumer as much as \$2.00 on the retail of CBS compact discs."

As Oates points out, "This is the second wholesale price decrease on CBS compact discs in the past six months." Apparently a contributing factor to the price reduction was the lowering of production costs associated with the elimination of the "wasteful" plastic blister package and the cardboard longbox, which should become effective at the retail level by early April.

Oates goes on to point out that "In reducing the pricing on compact discs, CBS has taken the lead in making this new technology more affordable to more Canadian households."

Current Records

In your February 17 column, Walt Says, you take a couple of gratuitous shots at the CBC. I'd like to set the record straight.

First, The Junos. The CBC has never asked for foreign acts on the Junos; in fact, we endorse an all-Canadian lineup. Our role is to support the decisions that the CARAS industry talent committee make. And for the record, not a penny of public money goes into the pocket of any foreign artist who appears on the show.

We've always invested in Canadian artists and we believe the Canadian public want to watch, as they did with k.d. lang's Buffalo Cafe, Anne Murray's Family Christmas and Anne Murray's Greatest Hits, Volume II.

This brings me to the second issue: what you refer to as "the old CBC crutch". You state that "the CBC is still fighting the same battle that never did develop a star system for televison." Walt, I'll let the record stand for itself. In the past five years, the CBC Television Network has given prime time

exposure to Anne Murray, Ian & Sylvia, Bryan Adams, Luba, Jane Siberry, Frank Mills, Leonard Cohen, Murray McLauchlan, Tommy Hunter, k.d. lang, David-Foster, Rita MacNeil, Colin James, Corey Hart, The Irish Rovers, The Razorbacks and Rush, among others. Our two music video series, Good Rockin' Tonite and Video Hits, continue every week to support and promote our artists. And Video Hits Presents, a brand new series which we decided to air twice for maximum exposure (once in Video Hits and again in its own time slot, Saturday late night), dedicates a full half hour to such talented Canadians as Blue Rodeo, George Fox, Cowboy Junkies, The Pursuit Of Happiness Andrew Cash, The Jeff Healey Band, Sarah McLachlan and the Tragically

We were there for Tears Are Not Enough in '86 and we've been there for the Junos for 15 years. Walt, this isn't fooling with the star system; it's helping to build it.

Censorship is dangerous! We recently witnessed a classic case of censorship and banning of record/video product . . . and there's more on the way. The subject matter may be racist and "despicable" in some minds, but one record company official told me "one person's language may be another's vocabulary" . . . and before we make a big to do about it . . . think of the snoops at the dailies, thirsting to publicize the banning of a video or record . . . and the resulting curiosity. Those who didn't even know the record or music video existed, might go out and buy it. I like Sam Sniderman's approach. He stocks it, out of sight, and doesn't make any noise about it. (EC: In quantities of one, probably . . . !)

Here's a little CD tidbit. Did you know that it was MCA, away back in 1972, with Minnesota Mining, that introduced the first compact disc. (EC: I wonder how many other "firsts" the Americans gave away . . . ?)

And . . . about the Junos . . . ! I'm wondering if we might see George Fox performing on the Junos this year. I understand there's one . . . maybe two spots open. Besides being from the West (all the other performers are from the Toronto area, with the exception of the foreign acts), Fox is the first Canadian country male vocalist nominated for Male Vocalist of the Year since 1975. Here's another one: New Brunswick artist Roch Voisine, a dynamic young singer, who is breaking out in Europe, has, unfortunately, been overlooked. In fact. add Voisine and Fox to the current Cancon lineup and the show would be a barnburner. Anyway, I'm laying odds that Alannah Myles will blow away the Scot and perhaps the myth that foreign acts "will make Canadian acts look better." (EC: What proud Canadian said that . . . ?)

He smiles...he even winks!Yes, Corey Hart is about to bounce back into the forefront of the record business once more.

Capitol gave me a sneak preview of Hart's next single and video, A Little Love, the first released from his new Bang album. The expression, "triumphant return" is a tag meant, in this case, for Corey Hart. His video reveals a Corey Hart that should have been a few years ago... aggressive and personable. One scribe suggests that with this new album, Hart "has indeed found himself." (EC: How about a Juno slot...?)

Billy Joel... an honest superstar! What a pleasure it was to watch Billy Joel at work during his recent Toronto press reception. He was superb... not like some of the jerks who call a press conference and then can't get out of there fast enough. This was one of the best press bashes I've been to in some time. Joel was open and very honest, even about his pending legal action. (EC: Some recording stars are just nice people!)

But nobody told the artist...! I was privy to a little argument the other day between a record company official and an artist, regarding the release of a package. The artist was upset about the release . . and the record company executive was upset because the artist and manager weren't fully clued in on the original arrangment. So, when the three of them had a chance to sit down and talk, the problem turned out not to be a problem. (EC: Isn't that always the way!)

A little elevator music ... please! Not too long ago, a well-known Canadian country artist had just boarded an elevator on the ground floor of a large building when he spotted a super-Cancon-producer coming into the building. He held the elevator door open, but the super-Cancon-producer declined, saying "I never use elevators" (he has a fear of heights), and as the elevator door closed, our country artist was overheard to say, 'If he doesn't use elevators, how does he ever hear his music ...?" (EC: Nice guy!)

Janz tests artistic convictions on new album

Recently, Paul Janz had the rare pleasure of seeing Every Little Tear, the lead single from his new album, Renegade Romantic, become the nation's most added record of the week at CHR, A/C and AOR. Understandbly, Janz has nothing but praise for the effective work done by A&M to surround his release with an aura of anticipation. "Out of the box, in Canada there is a really strong awareness that I have a new record out," he affirms. "You just can't miss it."

The fact that Janz worked extensively with the company's U.S. division can only have been of great assistance in developing this awareness within the industry. "My deal is through A&M in Canada," he explains, "but this record is done as if it were an American release...I didn't go through the A&R in Toronto at all, except through Gerry Lacoursiere, he heard everything, but it was all done through Los Angeles.

"They, in fact, had the release scheduled for last year," says Janz, "so it wasn't something where A&M in Canada had to beat them over the head and say, 'You Gotta release this!' As soon as Steve Rabalsky, who is Senior Vice President of A&R down there, got involved, there was no question...He had some very constructive things to say about where my writing was going.

"I really wanted to center very much on what I thought were the biggest strengths on the last record," Janz recalls, "and the songs that did the best were the songs that I had written myself and not co-written with anybody out of Los Angeles. So I ended up writing everything, lyrics and music, on this record myself and I think that allowed me to focus a little better.

"There were a couple of comments about my last album, Electricity, that it was a little too scattered in terms of musical direction," he informs. "I don't really buy that because if the record had been a huge success it probably would have been lauded as, "What a nicely diverse artist we have here!" but I still wanted to have something a little more recognizable about what I do.

"On the performing side, I tried to depend less on gadgetry and more on really truly good performances," elaborates Janz.

"Bill Drescher, the co-producer on the record, had really good input there because if something sounds good without all the gadgets, you know you've got something with some substance, with some backbone to it. If you need to introduce all kinds of gadgetry and weirdness in order to make something hip, chances are you're dealing with something of somewhat less substance."

In addition to his strong sentiments about studio gimmickry and defining his sound, Janz has clear ideas about the place and purpose of pop music within the grander scheme of arts. "I don't take myself too seriously; I think that's one of the things that a lot of writers and performers do," Janz asserts. "I don't think there's very much art that happens in pop music, [but] I think there's a lot of excellently crafted songs and performances.

"I look at even the first single, Every Little Tear, it's not supposed to be anything profound," he admits. "I think a lot of the stuff you'll find on this record is written more out of my feelings and emotions than actual experience...and sometimes on certain songs it's hard to define experientially what the basis for the song is. There are a few where there is that basis, but with that in mind, I do

think that this record is probably the most personal record that I've ever done.

"I think that if you look at the album as a whole and listen to it, it does say something about me," he suggests. "It says something about how I think about feelings, about relationships and I think, for the first time, what it does is allow the listener to recognize something about me and I'm really happy about that.

"If there is such a thing as objective art, I don't think this is," states Janz in conclusion. "If there's a point at which it becomes art, it might be when it illicits a certain emotional response in the listener...If a guy listens to the thing and he says the whole record sucks, that might be an emotional experience, but that's not what I'm talking about. I'm talking about something that resembles in some way the emotional feeling that I had when I wrote it or performed it. To me, if I can do that, what I'm doing is worthwhile."

Fanshawe unveils new state-of-the-art studio

Steinmetz also points out that the Fanshawe facility is the first Canadian studio built from the ground up using the R.F.Z (Reflection Free Zone) acoustic design.

The studio will be available to the students in Fanshawe's Music Industry Arts program. Sony of Canada will use the facilities for three weeks each summer to train their employees and user clients.

CMRRA and GEMA pact licensing deal

The Canadian Musical Reproduction Rights Agency (CMRRA), Canada's principal licensing agency, has obtained the right to issue mechanical and synchronization licenses in Canada for the catalogues administered by Gesellschaft Fur Musikalische Auffuhrungs-Und Mechanische Vervielfaltigungsrechte (GEMA), CMRRA's German Counterpart.

Previously it was necessary for Canadian record manufacturers and importers to make application to a New York-based organization to obtain mechanical licenses for GEMA's catalogues. The CMRRA representation agreement also includes synchronization rights, which will allow Canadian film makers, television program producers and advertisers to obtain rights directly in Canada from GEMA's extensive catalogues.

The agreement became effective January 1st of this year. GEMA has a reciprocal agreement to represent CMRRA in Germany.





Additional bass, keyboards, violin, drums and percussion fill out the album and give it a varied and at times lush sound. Performed in the Innu language, the songs are strongly melodic and immediately captivating. Kashtin's sound is hard to pigeon-hole, but that shouldn't scare away radio, because the songs, which range from fast, upbeat numbers to ballads, are so catchy that they will surely have strong radio appeal. In particular, songs like Pakuakumit/Pointe-Bleue and E Uassiuian/My Childhood (the first single from the album) have some of the same toe-tapping beat and harmonica riffs as Cajun or Zydeco music. Like those styles, Kashtin, which means "tornado" in Innu, crosses linguistic and cultural barriers and wins you over through the sheer force of music. (cassette reviewed) - JL




