Yes... something is terribly wrong with the Junos. Thirty percent Cancon for almost

twenty years on radio, hundreds of Homegrown-style contests througout Canada, hundreds of thousands of from dollars FACTOR and government to support production and touring . . . and what do we get at The Junos? Barely fifty percent Cancon.

What on earth are Rod Stewart, Milli Vanilli, Aerosmith, Quincy Jones and Lyle Lovett doing at the Junos?

Imagine for a moment that you were a visitor to Canada from another country and somehow got a ticket to the Junos. What would you think? Would you really get a sense of Canada? I don't think so! I think you would be confused. What do Rod Stewart, Milli Vanilli, Aerosmith, Quincy Jones and Lyle Lovett have to do with Canada?

To me, the Junos should be about the rich cultural musical mosaic that is Canada. It should be about all the things so many of us have worked so hard for almost the past twenty years.

Why isn't it happening? Probably for a lot of reasons, not the least of which is that famous Canadian inferiority complex. We bring Rod and the boys in to assure ourselves that we've done everything possible to improve the ratings. It's kind of the cheap

Wright to perform with Toronto Pops Orchestra

Veteran recording artist Priscilla Wright will be the featured vocalist for a Toronto Pops "Legendary Ladies Of The Big Band Era" concert at Massey Hall (Mar. 31). The concert is one of several upcoming Pops evenings with Canadian Symphonies for Wright, whose career stretches back to her discovery as the singing voice-over for a Bromo Seltzer commercial in the mid-1950s.

Wright's first single, released when she was 13, was titled Man In A Raincoat which became a No. 1 hit in Canada and was a Top 20 on U.S. trade charts.

After a successful career in her teens, Wright studied geophysics at the University of Toronto and worked in the field for three years before marrying and moving to Ottawa. She is married to Conservative MP Geoff Scott.

Wright has continued to perform for many years with jazz bands and for the Armed Forces abroad and, a few years ago, re-entered the recording field. A revamped version of Man In A Raincoat, produced by Harry Hinde, spent 18 weeks on the RPM A/C chart in 1988, peaking at No. 8. She is currently on release with a new single, We Rise Again, now moving up A/C charts and playlists across Canada.

and easy way to get the country to tune in.

But I'll bet it doesn't work. Because year by year, the Junos are becoming "just another awards show" with very little for the rest of Canada to hang onto . . . a kind of Son of Grammys. What's worse is that Canadian performers at the Junos are gradually evolving into "opening acts" for the international stars. What are they doing at our wedding? They're taking the day away from us.

After the show I went to one of the parties. Rod Stewart and Aerosmith were there . . . surrounded by autograph seekers. Because it was an invitation only party, I have to assume that most of the people seeking autographs were from the record industry and media. Alannah Myles, meanwhile, was standing almost unnoticed in the food line. Maybe that's part of the problem. The Junos have become the industry playing to itself. But the industry has seen it all. And the industry is Toronto . . . but the Junos are Canada.

Why not take the Junos on the road. Of course it's a crime that they haven't been in Vancouver or Montreal before this, but why not also take them to Winnipeg, Edmonton, Calgary and Halifax as well. Imagine, for example, the attention our stars would get in Winnipeg? Anne, Gordon, Corey, Bryan,

CJLB's Turner slams CRTC denial of licence

John Turner, General Manager of CJLB, is critical of the CRTC which denied the Thunder Bay organization a country FM operating licence. "Extensive market research conducted in the summer of '89," Turner points out, "clearly indicated area listeners wanted a country radio station."

He goes on to stress, "Even the CRTC, in the denial of CJLB's application, stated, 'A market exists for a country oriented radio station'. CJLB feels it has no choice but to respond to the listeners demands," and is now a full service country music radio station.

Only a few weeks ago, Turner had changed CJLB's format to Classic Gold, which was reportedly, answering "the cry of Thunder Bay listeners for something unique and different." At that time, Turner introduced "The one thousand dollar music guarantee." He boasted, "The new AM 1230 Classic Gold will play nine Classic Gold songs in a row guaranteed, almost every hour of the day, or we'll pay the first caller \$1,000."

However, as Turner explains, the switch to Classic Gold "was directly tied to the belief the CRTC would approve at least one of the two country FM applications."

He goes on to point out, "CJLB's research indicated the Classic Gold format, combined with an FM country station, would be a winning combination," concluding with, "Unfortunately the CRTC's decision made this option impossible . . . and CJLB is pleased to provide the much needed country service to the residents and advertisers of Thunder Bay."

CFRB's Wally Crouter a "Millennium Man"

Wally Crouter will shortly celebrate his 43rd year as Canada's most listened-to morning personality, and to add importance to that event, he has signed a new contract with Toronto's CFRB 1010 which will take him through to the end of this millennium - 1999.

"This doesn't mean I'm a thousand years old," said Crouter, "although some people might think it does."

Gary Slaight, President of Standard Broadcasting's radio division, called the signing "precedent setting" in North American radio, "and underlines the value that Standard Broadcasting places on Wally Crouter's respected profile in Toronto radio."



Here's an interesting quote . . .! A longtime observer of the music industry was overheard to say, "Never in the history of Canada's entertainment industry have the lives and careers of so many been controlled by such a small group of greedy, self-serving egoists, who fancy themselves as disciples of good." (EC: Who does he have in mind?)

Junos . . . a battlefield! The comments regarding this year's Junos are both favourable and ultra critical. Those who want a glitzy show that may be bought by NBC, CBS or ABC to be broadcast nationally in the U.S. or even internationally, feel that the show finally had the ingredients to attract an audience in the U.S. Those purists (of which I am one), felt the intrusion of foreign acts has taken away from the original intent of the Junos . . . but the Junos have always been a battlefield. The dailies never liked the awards show. It went wrong with the chatter during the Glenn Gould presentation, the tasteless criticism by CARAS of Anne Murray for not attending the Junos, the

cameras leaving the Guess Who stranded, CRIA's attempt to start the Maple Music Awards in early 1974, Stompin' Tom returning his awards to CARAS to protest the "foreignization" of the Junos. He was before his time. (EC: Is that all there is?)

If we create a battlefield, so be it! The Junos are wrong. The two foreign performances turned into three . . . a few presenters turned into more. I must commend the CBC, because the Rod Stewart segment was the best, conceptially, the best of lighting and camera work and finally Rod Stewart was the only well-dressed performer, or presenter there that night. He actually stole the show from any other performer, presenter or recipient, Canadian or foreign. I know he's quite a clothes horse and left more than a few thousand bucks at a couple of Toronto boutiques. One owner even let him shop on Sunday. (EC: Would he do the same for Kim Mitchell . . . ?) I must add that I saw the program on television when it was rebroadcast on YTV so I was not part of the hysteria that takes place at the theatre. For the first time, I was a viewer, sitting at home watching an award show on television. (EC: I bet you missed the fancy finger food!)

Creative black eye!! The viewers got a good look at what was worn Juno night and I'm afraid they didn't do much better in that department with the bowtie that looked like it lit up . . . the flashy tuxedos and the no-attempt-to-be-black-tie. This was no fashion show. (EC: Yes, but how appealing to all the tayern owners . . .!)

Now that it's over . . . Will CARAS really get some good creative imput from the industry on how to make sure that next year's Junos have some style, panache, glitz and glamour? Will there be feedback to inspire the CBC to make this show a tribute to Canadian accomplishment and excellence. Someone once said, "The Junos are all we've got." I don't want them to say, someday, that it was all we had. Forget the ratings. The mandate of CARAS and the Junos should be to create a star system in Canada. I think that was the original intent and if someone offers the Junos a Beatles reunion next year . . . the answer shouldn't be 'NO! it should be DEFINITELY NOT! (EC: Right on . . . !)

Fear of the Junos . . . ! I fielded a lot of phone calls regarding my stand on the three foreign acts that performed at this year's Junos. Most of the callers who agreed asked not to be quoted. The Junos are a very powerful force in our industry. The large committees that work to create the Junos touch every facet of the industry and a number of those who called worried that I was putting myself and this publication in jeopardy. One caller brought this historic item to my attention. The Toronto's Star's Sid Adilman, writing in his Eye on Entertainment column (dated Thurs. Jan 24, 1974) "It's reassuring to be told that the Canadian Record Industry Association's formation of its Maple Music Awards isn't meant to interfere 'in any way' with the operation of RPM Magazine or with the publication's highly regarded Juno Awards. But is it mere coincidence that RPM, for the first time in the weekly's 10 years, couldn't solicit a single record industry advertisement. That left its Jan. 19 issue without ads. Or is it just as coincidental that the Jan. 25 issue carried fewer ads than is usual for this time of year.?" (EC: I remember it well . . . !)

Now, that's funny. I received a report that the industry's favourite PR person, GE, was seated at the Junos at showtime, 7 pm, and at 7:01 he was asleep. He was awakened at 7:30 and told he was in the wrong seat. He moved to the proper seat, with his companion at 7:35 and was asleep at 7:37. He woke up as the show closed . . and said to his companion, "I wasn't too impressed with the Junos this year." (EC: Now, that IS funny . . !)

A dailies scribe with guts! I thought I was the only one who was critical of foreign acts being used "to make Canadian performers look better" at this year's Junos. Not so. Craig MacInnis, writing in Starweek, asks the question, "Why has the Canadian Academy of Recording Arts & Sciences (CARAS) turned over two coveted performance spots to foreign artists?" He then refers to Milli Vanilli as "West German rasta-goofs," with their "dreadlocked hair extensions." And he wasn't too flattering about Rod Stewart either, tagging his music as "tired old English-playboy-gone-to-seed Schtick?" Anyway, back to the Junos and the Star's MacInnis, who did the unthinkable . . . he levelled a broadside at Canada's "sacred" operatic singer, Maureen Forrester. MacInnis asks, "What in the name of Mahler's mother is contralto Maureen Forrester doing with this year's Hall Of Fame award?" Bad enough that she got the award, worse that her five children made the presentation, a too long, annoying and useless action that probably appealed to less than 1 percent of the audience. (EC: It's not over till the fat lady sings . . . !)



Live show all-important for National Velvet

Currently warming up for a nationwide tour in support of their sophomore effort, Courage, with Southern Ontario dates, National Velvet is glad to be back on stage, where vocalist Maria Del Mar and guitarist Mark Crossley contend the band belongs. The pair feels the live setting is the natural forum for the magical moments of rock and roll to occur, and that the extensive touring in which they engaged after their previous release was instrumental in the development of its superior follow-up.

The constant togetherness of roadlife, which has broken many a band, strengthened the creative outlook of the group as a whole by including all members in the songwriting process reports Del Mar. "We would just write on the bus and during soundchecks we'd try them out and, if we felt we could do it that night, we'd do it in front of an audience and see how it went over."

Not only did audience response assist the band in gauging the appeal of new material, it supplied the title for lead single Sex Gorilla. "It was originally called Sasparilla," she recalls. "People would come up after the show and say, 'Oh, I really like Sex Gorilla'." The amendment followed swiftly.

Audience involvement is only one reason for which Crossley maintains Courage has greater commercial potential than its predecessor, which received spotty radio support. "We've been recording for a while now," he begins. "We basically know how to work with each other. We had a good producer who brought out the best in everybody in the band, so naturally, with the evolution of the band, we got a better product."

Despite Crossley's optimism, Del Mar harbours concerns about radio's future acceptance of the album. "Even with a song like Shine On, and I think Shine On is probably the most accessible number, it still has an edge to it and even for a pop song it's pretty hard," she declares, adding that, to programmers, "Sometimes guitars are pretty scary!"

With inconsistent radio play in the past, National Velvet has greatly benefitted from popular music's new great mouthpiece, video; their clip for 68 Hours having won a CASBY. "Video is a must now," insists Del Mar. "It seems that bands that don't shoot videos - you just never hear from them again unless they have a very, very strong underground recognition."

"It's also a good way to judge a band," points out Crossley, "because if they have control over their videos, it's another outlet of expression. The only problem is if they have a very small budget or they have someone else controlling their videos."

While agreeing that video is virtually essential to the success of a young band, they are quick to point out that all the implications of the medium are not rosy. "I think the importance of video can be overblown and supercede the importance of the music," warns Crossley. "I think it's very important to keep it in perspective. The music is the most important."

Del Mar is quick to echo Crossley's sentiments, suggesting that while video effectively creates a perception of a band, it can also negatively alter the perception of the audience, as well as of musicians, as to the role music should play overall. "You can almost get lazy as a band," she declares. "I think sometimes video can be used as a cop-out from actually going out and touring. There's a lot of artists that have made it and

they've never played a live show in their life...and that to me is kind of sad. What it does to the younger audiences is devastating," she continues. "When we opened up for The Mission, the kids just didn't seem to know how to respond to a live show and we had to kind of walk them into it. After a while they started to get the hang of it and started dancing around."

Crossley lends his strong agreement: "I do actually think it detracts from the live situation because a lot of people listen to music just in dance clubs now and it seems to put a lot of pressure on live acts. I remember when synthesizers first came out and musicians were saying, 'Synthesizers are ruining rock and roll bands because they're taking the place of the actual musicians', like automated factories putting people out of work.

"And now video can do the same thing. Bands can go on with their synthesizers and not even have to tour. They put out a great single and just have one guy with his tapes sing along to it on a video and sell the same amount of records without doing any work. Rock and roll without actual playing and an actual band is really nowhere. I admire someone who can put together a whole song, but I think it reduces the impact tremendously if an act doesn't go out and communicate live with an audience.


"They don't know how to respond anymore and they start to get numbed by it," he laments. "It's like watching the A-Team on TV and seeing violence; you get numbed to it, the reality of it, and I think it's really important for music to be kept on a live level because that's what it's all about. You can't comprehend the impact of it unless you're there live and have a spontaneous reaction to it

"To me, the word 'art' means communicating," concludes Crossley. "It means being able to hone your skill enough to be able to get the exact message you want to come across to that person. Now that is art-communicating. And if it wasn't for that live feedback from those people, I don't think you can continue doing your work."

Another No Contest for CKUR


