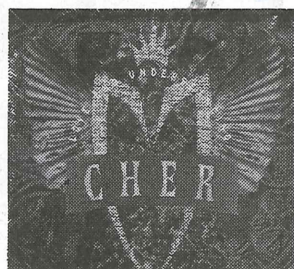

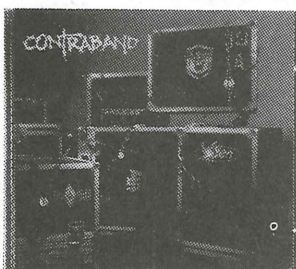

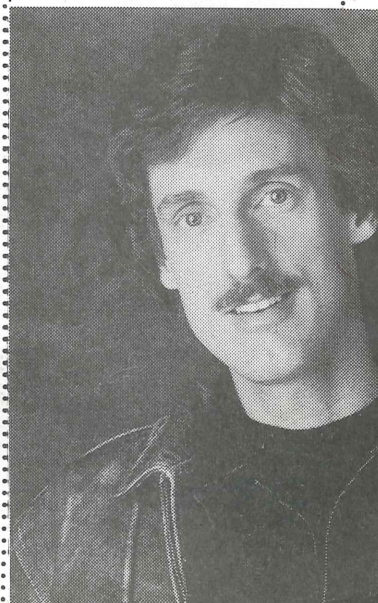

The show was entitled Heatwave '91 and it got under way with speeches by Carol Wright, BMG Director of Artist Marketing and Jim Campbell, BMG Manager, Artist Marketing. What followed was a video collage of their international roster. Featured were such artists as: Cowboy Junkies, Crash Test Dummies, Eurythmics, Aretha Franklin, Rick Astley, Jeff Healey, Dave Stewart, Black Box, The Silencers, KLF, Big Country winners

The final act of the night was Arista's Keedy. Hailing from Milwaukee, this young talent treated the audience to three numbers from her debut Chase The Clouds. Her first single, Save Some Love, is taking off at radio.

Eureka label names new staff members

Eureka Records recently announced the addition of two new members, Stephanie Roy and Jack Hunter. Both Stephanie and Jack will be learning all the bad habits of the business from current Eureka staff Joel Wertman, Tina Simpkin and Michele Stanger.

Roy will be working out of Eureka's Head Office located in Toronto, but will be handling the Quebec market at both radio and retail.

Hunter will be taking care of the U.S. responsibilities working out of Buffalo, New York. He will be working both U.S. college radio and retail.

Corndogs firm dates for major Canadian tour

The Corndogs, described as "one of Canada's best rock and roll bands to come out of Toronto's bar scene" are taking their unique brand of rock-edged R&B and country soul across Canada. The tour also ties in with the release of their second album, What The Hell Is Going On, released on Latent, a boutique label founded by Michael Timmins of Cowboy Junkies. Timmins and Peter Moore co-produced the album which was recorded at Hamilton's Grant Avenue Studio.

The tour kicked off at Toronto's El Mocambo (May 27), followed by the Pig & Whistle in Burlington (31), The Rhino Room in Toronto (June 1), The Hideaway in St. Catharines (6), Sudbury's Townhouse Tavern (7-8), Thunder Bay's Crocks & Rolls (10), the Spectrum in Winnipeg (11), The Power Plant at the University of Alberta in Edmonton (13-15), Banff's Silver City (17-19), Harpo's in Victoria (20), Vancouver's Town Pump (21), Westward Club in Calgary (27), Saskatoon's Amigo's (July 1-2), Thunder Bay's Crocks & Rolls (4-6), the Horseshoe in Toronto (18), and Hamilton's Jackson Square (20) for an afternoon date, opening for N.R.B.Q., and that evening at the Corktown Tavern.

No Boss/No Paycheck has been taken as the first promotion track from the album, and is also included on the BMG Pop promo CD # 16.

CBC's The Entertainers delivers Routes West live

CBC Radio's The Entertainers have scheduled a series of live dates to tape seven of the West Coast's definitive roots, or back-to-basics, artists. The seven are featured on Routes West, a 14-song CD released a few months ago.

The seven acts, plus one additional guest were taped at Vancouver's Town Pump. Taping began May 26th with the Stoaters and Sandy Scofield. The following Sunday (June 2), Nervous Fellas and guest artist Eugene Ripper will be showcased, followed by Last Wild Sons and Herald Nix (9) and Roots Roundup and Tami Greer (16). Air dates for the shows will be announced by the CBC at a later date.

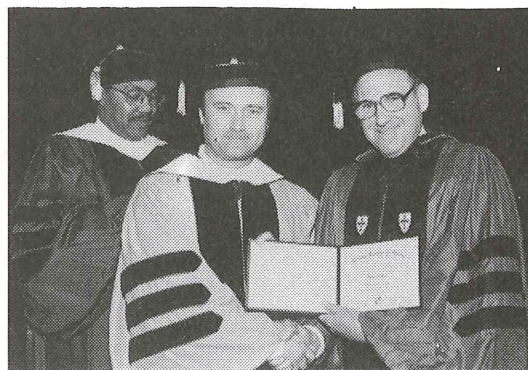
Ertegun, Collins, Jarreau doff Berklee degrees

Ahmet Ertegun, founder of Atlantic Records and Grammy-award winning recording artists Phil Collins and Al Jarreau, recently received Honorary Doctorates of Music Degrees from the famous Berklee College in Boston. The degrees were bestowed on the threesome by Berklee College of Music President Lee Eliot Berk.

Held May 4, in the Hynes Convention Centre, Ertegun, who was principal speaker, addressed the largest graduating class in Berklee's history.

In introducing Ertegun, Berk acknowledged the years of contributions by Atlantic "to the legacy of popular music", naming the Rolling Stones, Aretha Franklin, John Coltrane, Cream, Led Zeppelin and other notables from Atlantic's roster. He also noted that Ertegun, who is Chief Executive Officer of "one of the most powerful record labels" in the industry, "is the longest-standing record label founder still at the helm of his company." Berk characterized Ertegun as "a consummate music businessman, a nurturer of outstanding talent, and the ultimate music fan."

In his address, Ertegun cautioned the 600 graduates, "This is the most important juncture in your lives. Whatever job you go into, do it well and new opportunities will follow." He concluded with, "Remember that the greatest attribute of a winner is humility."

Marigold's artist roster presented on Worldbeat

Marigold Productions is currently promoting the release of its new CD compilation, *Worldbeat Vol. 1*.

Of particular note in the Pop/AC category is the Rich Dodson track of *Love City*, taken from his upcoming album *Common Ground*. Dodson is currently celebrating the 20th anniversary of his hit composition, *Sweet City Woman*, an international chart vehicle for The Stampedeers.

Also featured are new artists Dario Toso (*Conditions Of Love*) and Calgary's *The Livin' Daylights* (*Generation To Generation*). Veteran rocker Dennis (Garfield) French is also included on the CD with *No Turnin' Back*, which he wrote with Rich Dodson.

Shane Harvey, who has been teething his writing talents on film scores, has his *Love's In Remission* track included on the compilation. Harvey recently completed the musical score for *Clearcut*, a feature film starring Graeme Green (Oscar nominee for *Dances With Wolves*). The film will be premiered at the Cannes Film Festival this month. Interestingly enough, the *Clearcut* soundtrack includes *Come On Over* a track from Eddie M's album *Incognito*. This heavy rock band is included on the *Worldbeat* compilation with *Too Hot To Handle*, written by Eddy McDonald.

Debbie Johnson and Carol Medina, two of Marigold's mainstay AC artists are also featured on the *Worldbeat* CD. Johnson's entry, *Love Will Find A Way*, a Johnson original, was taken from her Marigold album, *Touch The Sky*. Also included is *Just Like Magic*, a recurrent/gold track still garnering good airplay and listener response. Medina follows up her last chart track, *So Good For You*, with *Wait 'Til*

Rockcards are first Rock 'n' Roll cards

Collectible cards have long been the favourite of teens and make up a billion dollar business annually. Now Brockum, along with Major League Entertainment, has introduced the world's first Rock 'n' Roll trading cards - *Rockcards*.

Created by Major League Entertainment of Albuquerque, New Mexico, under exclusive license by Brockum, these cards are manufactured and distributed in Canada by Montreal-based *RecTrack* (Canada).

The first series of cards feature over 25 of the most popular rock groups including Bon Jovi, Motley Crue, Poison, Yes, AC/DC and more. There are a total of 288 cards available. They were introduced to the market May 1st and target males and females from age 8-18.

Each pack of cards contain a total of 15 cards, 13 of which come with an anti-counterfeit hologram emblem on the back. Vital information about the band, or individual members, is also printed on the back. Each pack contains one of 18 available Rock 'n' Roll Art Cards with a peel-and-stick back. Also included is one of 9 hologram peel-and-stick group logos, limited edition Legacy cards featuring the Grateful Dead and one Backstage Pass Concert Kit, which allows buyers to win merchandise and concert tickets.

My Heart Finds Out. Medina's vocal styling won critical acclaim during her recent concert in Yugoslavia where she represented Canada at The Golden Palm Festival (RPM - May 4/91). Her new song was co-written by James Collins and Don Breithaupt.

Mid-tempo ballads, targeted to AC/MOR radio include Chris Bianchi's *Praying For A Miracle*, Paul London's *Girl, I'll Always Love You*, *Someone Cares* by Sierra Blue and Doug Cameron's *Stay With Me*, the title track from his album, and the follow-up to *Don't Tell Me*. Recurrents include Shane Harvey's *This Kind Of Love*, The Foxrun Band's *Lost In Love* and *Claim To Fame* by Robert Armes.

In the AC/country crossover slot, Brian Tyrell is the sole occupant with *Save The Children*, a Rich Dodson original. Debbie Johnson's popular video/single, *Mega Love*, is included for the pop/dance market.

Winnipeg's Hart Rouge releases new album

Hart Rouge, a Winnipeg band that made national news a few years ago with their French/English, English/French debut, are on release with a new English-language album entitled *Inconditionnel*. The album is released on the Traffic label, distributed in Canada by MCA.

Produced by Andre Lambert and Daniel Lavoie, the ten tracks are original compositions by bandmembers Annette, Michelle, Paul and Suzanne Campagne. The title track was taken as the first single and is now enjoying impressive chart action on *Radio-Active*.

The popular quartet will be performing live at Toronto's Harbourfront on June 23 as part of the Saint Jean Baptiste festivities. They will also be performing in Sudbury (22) and in Windsor (24). All three dates are being produced by Radio Canada.

Bryan Adams song on Robin Hood soundtrack

Bryan Adams will release his first recorded work in five years, with (*Everything I Do*) *I Do It For You*. The track, to be released as a single by A&M, will also be included on the film soundtrack for *Robin Hood: Prince Of Thieves*. The song, written by Adams and producer Mutt Lange, was recorded at Mayfair Studios with engineer Bob Clearmountain at the board. The track will be released as a single on A&M June 12.

The song is based on a recurrent musical theme from the film's score, which was composed by Michael Kamen, who also composed the bulk of the soundtrack. The soundtrack will be released on the Morgan Creek label as well as on Adams' upcoming A&M album.

Adams has been in the studio recording his sixth album for A&M which is set to be released sometime this fall.

Two Eureka acts signed to Famous Artists Agency

Eureka Records announces that Acosta/Russell and *Marvelous Sauce* have been signed to the Famous Artists Agency Inc. in New York.

Effective since May 27th, the two Eureka recording acts will be booked in North America through Famous Artists, an agency that also handles Vanilla Ice, M.C. Hammer and New Kids On The Block, to name a few.

Acosta/Russell have been busy as of late with their single *Never Change My Mind* doing quite well at radio. They recently played at the Tulip Festival in Ottawa and at the Mayor's Anti-Drug Concert at Toronto's Ontario Place.

Eureka also announces that Acosta/Russell's new single, *Call Me*, a dance number, will hit the airwaves on June 3rd, followed by an in-store appearance at HMV in the Scarborough Town Centre, on June 8th.

Looking back . . . ! Leafing through RPM's archives, all the way back to 1964 to write the script for intro'ing this year's Big Country Awards, I came across some very interesting information. For instance . . . now get this, Bob McAdorey was voted Country Radio Personality in 1968. At the time, he was with CFGM in Richmond Hill. Steve Glenn of CHOK Sarnia, now at CKTY was right behind him in second place, followed by CKBY's Ted Daigle. Who should be at the Big Country Awards this year, but Steve Glenn. A further check of the archives reveals that Steve was one of the first to send a "booster" letter to RPM, and, in the December 21st issue he reported good action on two Cancon singles, Bitty Baby by the Howard Sisters and This Old Heart by Dusty King. He was also plugging Dutch's Log Cabin in Port Huron, Michigan as the place to catch top Canadian and American acts. (EC: Bob McAdorey, Country Radio Personality . . . ?)

The JUNO AWARDS were originated by Walt Grealis and Stan Klees on February 23, 1970.

It wasn't a case of being nominated and winning, both events were attended, not only by the nominees, but well-known names in the country field as well as programmers. They were there to show support for their industry. (EC: Is there a better way . . . ?)

Firstclass . . . ? Taking government and other funding to lavishly waste on a precipitous lifestyle, not only does a lot of harm to those earmarked for the money, but it gives a black eye to the industry. (EC: An unpoliceable situation!!!)

After twenty-six years . . . ? When I was going through RPM's archives, one name that was a constant on the charts from 1964 was Dick Damron, who was signed to RCA. Outside of Wilf Carter, Dick is one of the longest-running signings with RCA. Well, the romance is over. I hear that Dick has signed with ATI for the release of his new instrumental album titled Mirage. The special CD will also include Night Music, Dick's previous instrumental album. As far as his vocal work goes, we'll know more about that next month. (EC: That's a lot of years . . . !)

Are the bidding wars over . . . ? It used to be, that when one company tried to steal a valued member from another company, the ante would go up, and sometimes up again. Well, we're in a recession . . . maybe even a depression, so, thinking is changing. I'd give any change, regardless of money, a lot of thought. A cozy nest in a strong oak is far better than one in a weeping willow that has root trouble. (EC: Can you be more ambiguous)

Keep your eye on Ivan . . . ! Many said it couldn't be done, but CBC-TV is surging ahead, proudly waving its Cancon banner. Cancon in prime time is up to 91 percent from 84 percent last year. Entertainment Program Chief Ivan Fecan has a bunch of pretty impressive productions coming down the pipe. (EC: The mouse that roared . . . ?)

I felt very honoured . . . ! Each year Carmen Di Paola hosts a Celebrity Banquet in York Region (Toronto) to raise funds for Variety Club and the Heart and Stroke Foundation of

Included were Tom Fergus (Toronto Maple Leafs centre), Frank Mahovlich (past NHL star), Don Moen (linebacker Toronto Argos), Jeanne Cooper (Mrs. Catherine Chancellor, The Young & The Restless), Jane Withers (Hollywood great and Josephine The Plumber), Alan Young (Mr. Ed), Frank Stronach (Chairman, Magna International), Bob McAdorey (Global TV Entertainment), and lots more. What a great evening and what a nice feeling to be doing something for Variety's Kids and the Heart and Stroke Foundation. (EC: Right on!)

CDs saving the day . . . ? The latest figures from CRIA show a 46 percent increase in CD shipments over last month and a 25 percent increase over last year. Forget the other configurations. (EC: Keep your head in the sand . . . !)

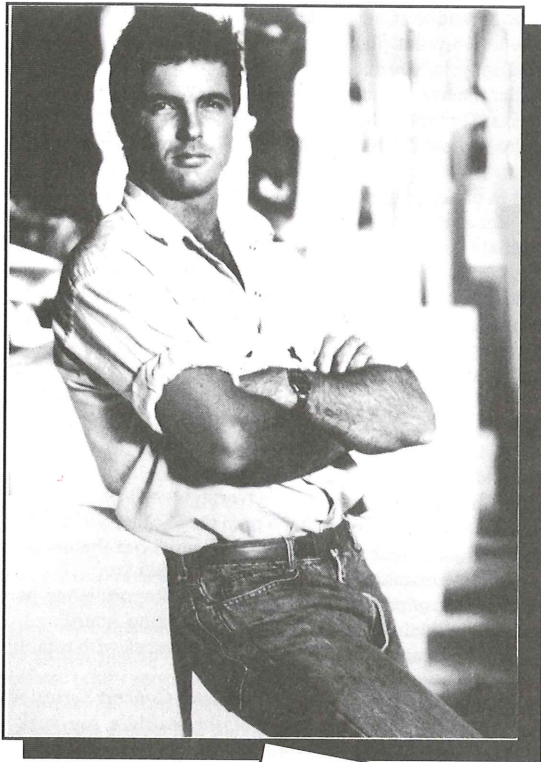

CJBK/BX-93 presents Environmental Awards

The 2nd Annual London Environmental Awards presented by 1290 CJBK and BX-93 were held on Earthday '91 (Apr. 22).

In the Individual/Community category, Craig Everest was recognized for "his outstanding contribution toward rejuvenating the

Sifton Bog." His initiative, that determined that a wetland area can rebound after being temporarily drained, began as a biology project. Everest worked in conjunction with the Oakridge Hazelden Ratepayers in developing a plan of action to restore the bog to its original state.

In the Corporate category, the collective effort of Zehrs Food Mart in St. Thomas is being acknowledged. The staff and management of the food store have an 18-point plan aimed to reduce, re-use and recycle. A sampling of their program includes the availability of paper and cloth grocery bags, a recycling bin for used grocery bags, a policy of not sending any cardboard to landfill sites, reducing the volume of plastic wrap used in packaging, not using styrofoam in any department, and updating advertising materials rather than replacing it.

It was pointed out that "Both of these award winners demonstrate that environmental action can be taken at the grassroots level and can deliver positive benefits for the community at large."

Judging was conducted by The Thames Region Ecological Association, The McIlwraith Field Naturalists and CJBK/BX-93 Environmental spokesperson, Heather Hiscox.

Hiscox pointed out that "The increase in the number of entries received this year is indicative of higher levels of awareness of participation in all kinds of environmental projects by all kinds of individuals and groups." She concludes with, "The quality of the contributions by the winners shows that we all can play a role in taking better care of our environment."

CJBK and BX-93 were the first radio stations in Canada to produce and broadcast a daily report on the environment. The Environment and You is hosted by Hiscox and is heard throughout the day.

Pelmorex launches satellite network

Pelmorex Broadcasting Inc. is set to launch its own radio satellite network. Originating from the company's Regional office in Sudbury, Ontario, the network will provide enhanced radio programming via satellite to 17 Pelmorex radio stations in eleven communities across Northeastern Ontario. "Pelmorex has developed news and feature programming designed especially to meet the needs and interests of the people in the north," explains Michael Bartoli, Promotions Director for Pelmorex.

Bartoli goes on to point out that Pelmorex was founded by its president and majority owner Pierre Morrissette "for the purpose of acquiring and strengthening small and medium market radio stations across Canada." Morrissette's satellite background began in 1983 when he was president and Chief Executive Officer of Canadian Satellite Communications Inc. (CanCom). During his five year tenure the system had grown substantially. He resigned in 1989 to form Pelmorex Communications.

The Pelmorex Satellite Network will focus on the production and supply of regional news, information and feature programming. These programs will be fed live simultaneously to all Pelmorex stations through a technical arrangement with Novanet of Oshawa.

Bartoli also points out that "The people of Northern Ontario will have the opportunity to interact and express themselves on a live 1-800 telephone line."

Rock Radio Network goes to air May 24

The Rock Radio Network signed on at Midnight, May 24th, with the Overnight Show a six-hour syndicated program.

The proposed launch of Canada's first exclusively album rock format syndication service was announced by the Westcom Radio Group, its flagship rock affiliate, Toronto's Q107, and Seltech Broadcast Systems.

"The Rock Radio Network is the next logical step in the evolution of radio in Canada," says RRN's Executive Producer Steve Warden. "In these tough economic times, it's difficult for individual stations to devote the resources necessary to the running of top-quality programming 24 hours a day."

He continues with, "RRN is a creative alternative. It is also a pretty exciting way to help tie together this fractured nation, at a time when people, especially the raised-on-rock-n-roll generation, is wondering if this country's going to stay together." He concludes with, "A sense of nation has certainly been part of the CBC's mandate for 50-odd years; without being too self-important, The Rock Radio Network considers the Canadian identity part of its mandate."

Overnight will be the mainstay of RRN, but a number of other weekly "specialty" programs will round out the network's inaugural schedule. Included are:

The Rock Report: a one-hour rock 'n roll magazine, featuring interviews, news and in-studio performances with established and new artists;

Superstar Concert Series: which captures some of the world's top rock acts live, in concert;

Canada's New Rock: a national showcase for new talent, featuring demos and independent releases; and

In The Studio: recalling the making of classic rock albums with the producers and artists who recorded them.

RRN will also provide occasional specials and Album Premiere broadcasts, and is developing several other new radio concepts.

The Rock Radio Network will be delivered via Seltech's C-Band and KU-Band systems on the Anik D1 and Anik C1 satellites, respectively.

Country 59 honoured with 3 Crystal Awards

Toronto's Country 59, which changed its format to country in April (RPM - March 30/91), won big in the creative field at the recent Crystal Awards. The awards are presented annually by The Radio Bureau of Canada.

The station's Creative Director, Greg Stevens, and producer Bruce Matheson won three Outstanding Performance Awards. Both accepted the Gold Award in the category of Station Promotion for their production of Tool Tunes: The Album; Matheson won a Craft Award for Excellence in Production; and Stevens was awarded the Larry Heywood Award, representing the Crystal's highest honours for creative efforts.

George Fox's secret recipe - Spice Of Life

Whoever coined the phrase 'nice guys finish last' certainly never had country singer/songwriter George Fox in mind. Not only has this rising star won more awards than you can shake a stick at (including two Junos and a whole slew of Big Country Awards), he's also a very down-to-earth, nice guy, too.

On Sunday, May 26th, Fox took home two more awards, from the RPM Big Country Awards, for Top Male Vocalist and for the Best Country Album, entitled *With All My Might*. They were awards well deserved.

All this has happened for Fox in a relatively short period of time. It was only three years ago when he signed an exclusive management deal with Leonard T. Rambeau, of Balmur Limited who also boast Anne Murray and Frank Mills, among others, on their roster. That same year, he released his first single and album on WEA (now Warner Music Canada). The album was entitled *George Fox* and the single was *Angelina*. The followup single was *Long Distance*.

Fox hails from Cochrane, Alberta, where he grew up and worked on his parents ranch. He cites his first musical influences as the '50s style rock of American Grafitti and TV's *Happy Days*. It wasn't until he went on an agriculture exchange trip to Sweden, in '81, when he really discovered his love for country. He had taken some country albums with him, some Haggard, Waylon and Willie, at the request of his hosts, but ended up listening to them himself and really getting in to it. His taste for country grew even more when, on his time off, he would hit the streets and play his tunes for people passing by. "Busking is the ultimate marketplace," says Fox, "because you're out there and if people don't like you, you're left standing there with an empty guitar case. You find out what goes over with the people and a lot of country goes over pretty big." That was it!

He was now hooked on country music.

He returned home from Sweden and started playing around the community with local musician Jerry Martin. They quickly became local favourites. Eventually, Fox started writing originals and when he had recorded some of this original material, it found its way into the office of WEA Records and caught the attention of Bob Roper, then head of A&R, who signed him to the label.

Shortly after, Fox signed with Balmur Limited. That was 1988 and that same year he opened for Randy Travis on his tour through Western Canada. This was the turning point for Fox. He had to choose between life on the ranch or a career in music. "There was never any question that this is what I wanted to do," he says, continuing with, "I put my head down and went for it. Two and a half years later, I put my head up and I'm down in music row working with one of the top ten producers in Nashville and there's not a cow in sight."

The cows loss is our gain. Fox's new album, the follow up to his 1989 gold-plus success, *With All My Might*, is entitled *Spice Of Life*. It is his finest yet and it should gain him many more fans throughout North America. The album was produced by Nashville veteran Garth Fundis, who has worked with Don Williams, New Grass Revival and Keith Whitley, and recorded in both Toronto and Nashville. Fox wrote the title track and co-wrote three of the tunes. The album also features songs by top Nashville writers Roger Ferris, Rory Bourke, Charlie Black, Bob Di Piero and John Scott Sherrill. Fox says it was quite an experience to work with such gifted songwriters, but says there's almost too many good songwriters in Nashville. "They should put a sign up on the city limits saying 'no more songwriters, we've got enough'," he jokes.

Also included is the Buck Owens tune

There Goes My Love as the opening number. The album hit the stores May 21st and was released simultaneously in the U.S. (via Warner Nashville).

Extremely successful! A new No. 1 song this week. After two weeks at the top, Rod Stewart's *Rhythm Of My Heart* is replaced by Extreme's *More Than Words*. The album has also been boosted by the exposure from *More Than Words*. Pornograffitti climbs to No. 11 on the Albums chart.

What's for dessert . . . The Jeff Healey Band's *How Much* has this week's highest debut on the Hit Tracks chart. It enters at No. 53. That's 23 places higher than Crowded House's *Chocolate Cake*. It will be against the odds in it's bid to reach the top. Only one song with a dessert title has ever hit No. 1. Some people may think of *Red Red Wine* or *Brandy*, but only food dessert counts. Name the only song with a dessert title to Hit No. 1.


A Challenge at the top. R.E.M. has held the top album for five weeks now and it's tough to predict how long it will stay there. Rod Stewart's *Vagabond Heart* has been close for a few weeks, and now Michael Bolton's *Time, Love & Tenderness* is gaining quickly. Time . . . climbs to No. 4.

Two in a row! For the second week in a row, there is a debut on the Albums chart in the Top 30. Paul McCartney's *Unplugged (The Official Bootleg)* enters at No. 29. It has already gone higher than his previous album. *Tripping the Live Fantastic* peaked at No. 33 last year. His last studio album, *Flowers In The Dirt*, entered at No. 55 and peaked at No. 16 in July of 1989.

Standing the test of time. Wilson Phillips self-titled debut album slips to No. 20 this week. It marks the 46th week in the Top 20. That's one week more than MC Hammer's *Please Hammer Don't Hurt 'Em* spent. By comparison, the No. 1 album of 1990, Sinéad O'Connor's *I Do Not Want What I Haven't Got*, only spent 32 weeks in the Top 20. 1989's Top album, Fine Young Cannibals' *The Raw And The Cooked*, was there for 38 weeks. Wilson Phillips have a long way to go if they are to catch the top album of 1988. INXS' *Kick* spent an amazing 61 weeks in the Top 20.

Hot soundtrack . . . Just six months ago there were seven soundtracks on the Albums chart. This week, *New Jack City* debuts at No. 56 to become just the third soundtrack on the chart. One of the reasons for the success of the album is the track *I Wanna Sex You Up* by Color Me Badd. It is the hottest mover on the Hit Tracks chart, jumping 33 spots to No. 50.

A trip down Baker Street. There haven't been many songs with a dessert title to even get near the top let alone reach it. Songs like: *Brown Sugar*, *Honey and Sugar Sugar* are ingredients but only Don McLean's *American Pie* qualifies. Although if you guessed it, I'll give you The Osmonds' *One Bad Apple!*

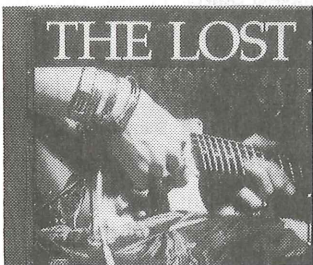
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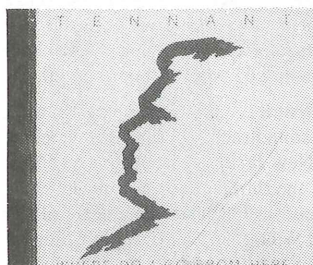


THE LOST - Rock

warfare in LA. Bon Jovi sings backup harmonies on all the tracks and guest appearances include Randy Jackson and Kenny Aronoff (John Cougar Mellencamp), making up a solid rhythm section. Medicine Man and Bang Bang are straight-ahead rockers that propel this album. Not one to forget you romantics out there, Nova has added two ballads, Someday and Hey Ronnie (Veronica's Song). 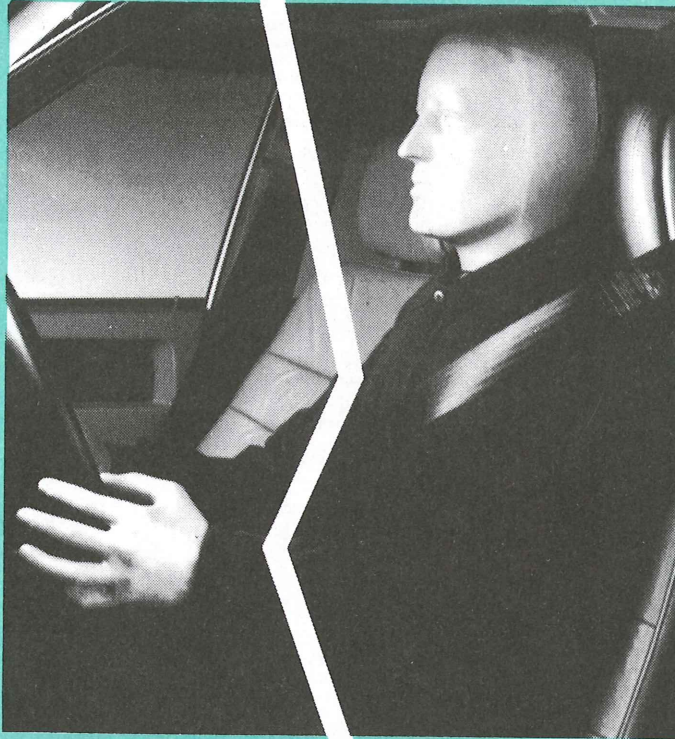
LEE GREENWOOD - Country

This year's Big Country Awards, held at Toronto's Harbour Castle Westin Hotel (May 26), once again honoured Canada's domestic country recording artists and broadcasters. This was also the first year that a sponsor took some of the financial load off the awards. Maclean Hunter Country Radio sponsored the awards dinner (RPM - June 1/91), and management staff and on-air personalities from several member stations were on hand for the event.
