The River heralds Canada's first AAA radio format

Warren Cosford, operations manager of the four CHUM Group stations in Windsor, literally blew CKLW-FM off the air at 9 pm on Nov. 18. The station was wiped out in front of a large gathering of media and record industry people and went out over the airwaves.

The station that held fond memories of the old days of the Big 8, was quickly replaced by CIDR-FM, 93.9 The River. The call letters are C for Canada and IDR for International Detroit River.

The station is part of Windsor's CHUM Ltd. radio operations, Radio Four, which includes 89-X, a modern rock format that is #2 in the Detroit market.

The switch to the new call letters and its AAA (Adult Album Alternative) format, is a first for Canada. Murray Brookshaw, program director for the new station, explains. "The format is not heavy metal. It's not rap. It's not mainstream country or electronic pop. It is geared specifically toward rock fans aged 30-45 whose tastes touch down somewhere between modern and classic rock.

On-air personalities for the new station are Jeff "Zippy" Crowe, long-time Detroit radio personality and rock music critic; Jim Duff, who joins the station from Toronto's CFNY-FM; long-time CKLW personality Mark Elliott; as well as Jim Quick and Jim

McKenzie.

In the Nov. 22/94 edition of The Windsor Star, entertainment writer Ted Shaw explains the reason for the switch. "Wayne Stafford, Radio Four general manager, said the station need to differentiate itself from stations near it on the FM dial, namely WCSX and WJOL, which are playing rock music similar to the former CKLW-FM format."

Stafford went on to point out that the new



station "will be like a '90s version of WABX."

Shaw explains that WABX, "the defunct former Detroit FM station, was one of the first and most influential album-rock stations in North America in the late '60s and '70s."

The Department of Communications had approved the switch of call letters. However, and because the music still meets program commitments to the CRTC, no special approval was needed for the change.

Annie Prevost moves up from part-time to full-time retail merchandising representative for Mercury/Polydor in Quebec.

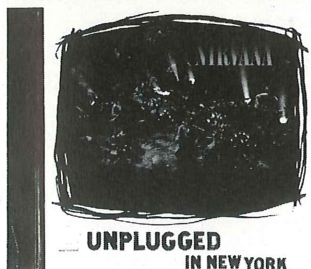
Prevost's territory for retail support activities will include the entire province of Quebec.

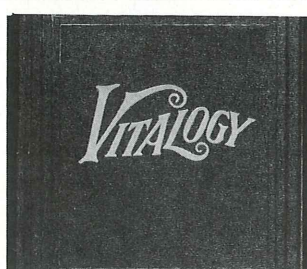

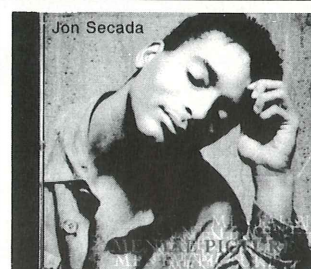

Warner Music Canada vice-president of A&R, Kim Cooke, has announced the signing of Hamilton-based band the Killjoys to a multi-album world wide contract.

The Killjoys' debut release *Starry* is currently enjoying extensive play on many campus stations, along with modern rock outlets CFNY in Toronto and Windsor's 89X. The band's video for *Today I Hate Everyone* is in regular rotation on MuchMusic.

The punk/pop band consists of guitarist/vocalist Mike Treblicock, bassist Shelley Woods and drummer Gene Champagne. Treblicock, when asked why the group chose Warner, replied, "Hey, all I wanted was Bug Bunny videos."

Warner will begin distributing *Starry* in early January.

Roch Voisine signs with BMG International

Pop star Roch Voisine has signed a global agreement with BMG International, which will include all of Europe and the US. In Canada, Voisine's albums will continue to be distributed by Select Distribution.

The contract between RV International and BMG International calls for four albums to be recorded for international release. Voisine and manager Paul Vincent have signed a contract giving them total artistic control over the content and production of his albums.

The contract also calls for continued collaboration between Voisine and Georges

This would have been Gagnon's first Toronto concert since 1987.

PolyGram acquires 50% of Def Jam Records

PolyGram CEO and president Alain Levy has announced the acquisition by PolyGram of 50% of RAL/Def Jam Recordings for \$33 million. The agreement is retroactive to June 1, 1994.

Def Jam is one of rap music's premiere

Finkelstein launched True North as a licensed label in April of 1970. "Now we're going to go to a full pressing and distribution agreement. By becoming a full P&D label, we are going to restructure the label in the sense that we will be hiring two new staff people right away, a new press and promotion person and someone to help us in the production end."

True North will be working about 32 albums immediately. "We're moving all 22 Bruce Cockburn albums, Murray McLauchlan's *Greatest Hits*, Rough Trade's *Greatest Hits*, and all the Stephen Fearing albums." Gregory Hoskins and Ian Tamblyn are also on the label.

Barney Bentall will remain with Sony, but will be with True North outside of Canada. He is just starting pre-production on his fourth album. His three previous albums have all gone gold.

True North released 80 albums with Sony/CBS since 1970, with 35 of them being certified gold and platinum.

labels. Founded in 1983 by Russell Simmons and based in New York, the Def Jam roster includes some of the foremost names in the rap genre, including LL Cool J, Public Enemy, Warren G and Onyx.

The Def Jam catalogue includes recordings by LL Cool J (the first rap star to have four consecutive US platinum records), The Beastie Boys (the first rap act to reach sales of more than 5 million units in the US) and Public Enemy.

PolyGram has been the US distributor for Def Jam and the licensee outside the US since June 1. Since then, Island Records has, and will continue to, provide support in the marketing, promotion and publicity areas for the label. The first Def Jam release through PolyGram, Warren G's *Regulate...The G Funk Era*, has sold more than 2.7 million copies worldwide in its first five months of release.

EMI explores hip-hop world with new promotion

EMI Music Canada is endeavouring to crack a tough nut by making a headfirst promotional push into the hip-hop field. The promotion coincides with the recent releases of several high-profile new albums in the genre, from such names as Dream Warriors, Digable Planets, Lords Of The Underground and Spearhead.

The promotion, a result of the efforts of EMI's Angie Bazzana and Susan Demerais, centres around a radically designed GEO Tracker, co-sponsored by EMI and Toronto station AM 640. The vehicle has been making the rounds in southern Ontario over the past few weeks, everywhere from retail outlets to high schools, all in the name of promoting hip-hop music.

To say that hip-hop and rap are undiscovered countries as far as Canadian consumers are concerned is something of an understatement. Although urban artists enjoy

tremendous success south of the border, it's a style of music that has yet to catch on in large numbers with Canadian record buyers.

Over the last year or two, there have been a few minor steps in the right direction. The Dream Warriors' debut album reached gold in Canada, and earned the group a Juno for best rap recording. US3 had a major crossover hit with Cantaloop, reaching #24 on the RPM Hit Tracks chart (RPM - April 4/93).

In the rap vein, there have been strong chart runs in recent months by acts such as Snoop Doggy Dogg and Warren G, but the numbers for rap and hip-hop in Canada are still well below those in the US.

One look at the US singles charts reveals artists like Craig Mack, 69 Boyz, Da Brat, Ice Cube and Lucas. In fact, the soundtrack from *Murder Was The Case*, featuring Snoop Doggy Dogg, just recently became the #1 album in the US, surpassing Madonna, Boyz II Men and R.E.M.

The reasons why rap and hip-hop aren't as big in Canada are a little vague. But regardless of the reasons, EMI is attempting to bridge the gap with a slate of new releases and some creative promotion.

According to EMI's vice-president of marketing, Lisa Zbitnew, who is overseeing the promotion, the label is moving in the right direction in terms of lifting the genre's presence in the market.

"Certainly in the past year it's becoming more and more evident that hip-hop is very much a part of our roster. It's a very high profile part, both domestically and internationally."

The EMI push into hip-hop began last year with the signing of a distribution deal with US-based Pendulum Records, one of the top urban labels in the US. That has been followed in recent months by the signings of The Dream Warriors (the group was formerly with Island), Spearhead and others. As Zbitnew

notes, EMI is "probably one of the strongest labels in the hip-hop genre."

Zbitnew is quick to admit that hip-hop doesn't have a prominent place in the Canadian music scene, but she hopes that this new promotion will be a forerunner of things to come.

"The problem is that there isn't a lot of avenues yet in Canada to develop it, and so a big part of our mandate this year and next is to develop marketing tools to expose this music. Obviously we're talking about needing to be very proactive here, as opposed to reactive. It's going to be our job to create channels to reach a population that quite obviously is interested in this genre of music."

While the expense and effort involved in this current promotion will be considerable, Zbitnew feels that, in the end, it will be well worth it.

"Granted, it's a costly initiative, but you figure over the course of three months, not only is AM 640 being extremely cooperative in this promotion, but the vehicle becomes a two-fold opportunity. One, for six months it's going to be out there at events, everything from in-stores to school dances, basically bringing our music directly to the public. Two, it becomes a grand prize opportunity at the end of the promotion."

Hip-hop and rap are like any other forms of music. There are strong points and weak points, and different artists doing different things. Zbitnew says the key for Canada is to find the things that have worked here in the past, and build on those successes.

"Hip-hop is a pretty broad explanation, it's kind of like rock and roll, certain things will work here and certain things won't. But I think if you look at the success of everything from Snoop Doggy Dogg to the Digable Planets, we've had a series of gold and platinum records in Canada. Even the Beastie Boys went triple platinum in Canada, and that's definitely a hip-hop record. So we have seen those successes, and I think we can build on

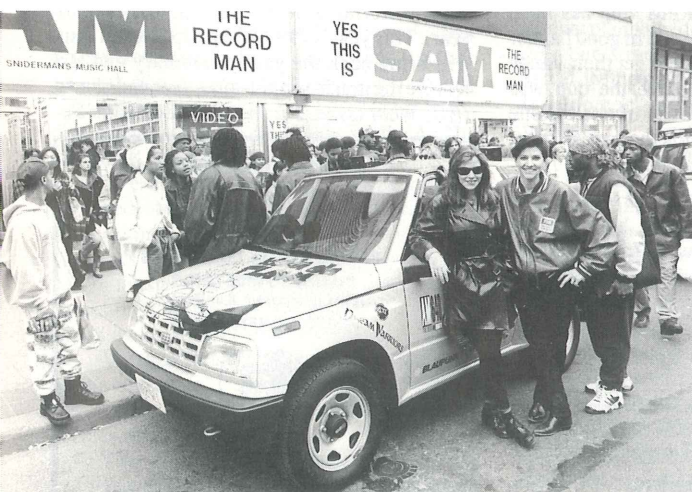

Ottawa singer/songwriter Tyley Ross has been picked to play the role of Tommy in the upcoming Mirvish/CPI Toronto production. The Pete Townshend musical is scheduled to open March 1 at Toronto's Winter Garden.

The Tommy production team, comprising Townshend, director Des McAnuff and choreographer Wayne Cilento, were in Toronto (Nov. 16) for the Mirvish/CPI media launch of the musical, after which they spent several hours of auditioning hopefuls for the Toronto production.

The 24-year old Ross moved to Toronto two years ago. He originated the Jinx role in the Toronto production of *Forever Plaid*. At the time he was picked for the Tommy role, he was the understudy to the lead part in *Miss Saigon*, which is in its second year at the Princess Of Wales Theatre.

Very rarely do dailies cover the same story, but both the Toronto Star and Sun laid on big time coverage of the Sony CD plant . . . and Pearl Jam. In fact CP and the Southam Star Network picked up on the piece and sent it across the country. The Pearl Jam release of Vitalogy got coverage practically every day of the week. Was it good for sales? Even before the papers hit the street, more than 400,000 CDs had been ordered for Canadian retail and 2.6 million CDs for the US. More good news. Céline Dion's album,

the Colour Of My Love, has gone diamond. Sony had hoped to break the million sales mark by Christmas, but were more than a month ahead of that prediction. Céline has a three-date, sold-out Forum engagement in Montreal where Sony president Rick Camilleri will present her with a truckload of metal; the diamond award, seven-times platinum for her self-titled album and six-times platinum for Unison. Her latest release, A L'Olympia, shipped more than platinum. Wait! There's more. The big day is Dec. 19. That's when Céline and manager René Angélil tie the knot. When she was on Jay Leno's show a couple of weeks ago, she invited him to the wedding. Any bets that he'll be there? *(EC: That's more than a little good news . . . !)*

Did you know . . . ? Sandy Davis will now liaise for record companies at CISS-FM and the New Country Network (NCN); Corrinne Vallis was just hired from CBC to be the creative director at NCN and that she will report to Doug Pringle; Janet Tretarten is now the music director for both CISS-FM and NCN; and Julie St. James, who comes from Ottawa where she worked for Rowlco, will be Tretarten's assistant? So far, a new channel hits the air nationally, and only one outside person is hired. *(EC: Cost-cutting so soon ?)*

Rob Christie to the Big Smoke! J.J. Johnston finally has a morning personality who could break the jinx. Rob Christie went to air at 5:30 am Monday Nov. 21 and he sounds pretty good. Get rid of too many references to "the Big Smoke," and he'll be better. He had a lot of interesting guests; Honest Ed Mirvish, Alan Frew, Lawrence Gowan, and me of course. BMG's Dale Peters, Larry Macrae and Warren Kopnick hauled in a cake, which went over really well. At least the Barker appreciated the new twist on his name. Maureen Holloway, doing the entertainment news, came up with a priceless line. She was reporting on the liver transplant for David Crosby and left the listeners with "his old liver is the new bass replacement for the Rolling Stones." *(EC: That makes the bass player chopped liver . . . !)*

The RPM Cup is cup-napped . . . ! It has happened again, the RPM Cup has been stolen. Apparently it's safe and in good hands, but the Warriors would like to get their hands on those hands. The last time the cup was stolen, it showed up on the top of a telephone post in Ottawa. *(EC: Obviously they've got a bunch of sore losers in the league . . . !)*

Michelle in Cologne . . . ! What a nice gesture. Michelle Wright and her manager Brian Ferriman called last week from Cologne, Germany where Michelle is in the midst of a concert and promotion tour. Just on the strength of the coverage she is getting on radio, and there aren't country radio stations over there as we know them here, her latest album, The Reason Why, is beginning to attract attention at retail. *(EC: It's surprising how many acts overlook that important European market !)*

Is anyone home taping . . . ? Is a major MAJOR retailer about to blow the lid on home taping, and how infinitesimal it really is? *(EC: No . . . !)*

Say it isn't so . . . ! Just when we thought it was safe to stock a lot of CDs, there is a move on to go back to vinyl. Record companies could come out with so much of this stuff that the collectors, the very people who are pushing for this, will be the most effected. *(EC: I love collectors and chart addicts. They live in a world of their own . . . !)* They also subscribe to RPM and buy it in stores. Record dealers love chart collectors. *(EC: Let's have a love-in . . . !)*

Building a star system . . . ! Up until now, it has been a real struggle, but I think it would be real useful for CBC and CTV and anyone else with power *(EC: Love that word . . . !)* to do cameo walk-ons whenever possible to give Canadian stars an extra boost. Why shouldn't Kurt Browning do a walk-on to the set of Rita And Friends? Why doesn't Anne Murray just drop in and say a quick hello? Why don't the producers of The Air Farce and Kids In The Hall use a cameo of Michelle Wright or Gordon Lightfoot? *(EC: If he can come out of hiding . . . !)* Canadians love Canadians and want a chance to go that extra mile to build a star. *(EC: There is no end to what this could do and what it would mean . . . !)* What a nice production plus. *(EC: A little bit of imagination. Go for it . . . !)*

The Jon Stewart Show. Yeah . . . ! This syndicated, low-budget show is acquiring a cult following and is a boon to our industry because he features new recording acts. Stewart comes from MTV and is seen very late at night in the Toronto market and probably as late in most markets. The producers do a great deal with their small budget, and the intellect of the show far surpasses the very expensive Letterman and Leno talk shows. The guests are younger and Stewart seems to attract a younger audience. This is the type of show that is needed by the record business. The more Stewart succeeds, the more the big shows will have to find and use recording artists to match the pace. Funny what you can do with a small budget and a lot of imagination. *(EC: Building new recording stars . . . !)* He may be too good to last!

It's a wrap . . . ! Years ago RPM used to do an editorial review of the big stories of the year. This year's 1994 Wrap-Up Special Issue will bring back the yearly summary and also feature the much-sought-after year-end charts. *(EC: What issue is it in. . . ?)* See page 5.

CD-i pros and cons! After the indepth report on the CD-i player and all its positive qualities and its unlimited compatibilities in RPM (October 31/94), one minor aspect of the high-tech innovative hardware was omitted. Repairs! The CD-i machine that was loaned to Interactive Ware for a few weeks was involved in a little mishap. On contacting the owner, we were advised to return the machine to Philips and they would be capable of fixing the unit. Philips' up-front estimate charge was \$20, but they were certain the machine would be fixed and returned within a couple of days. Six days later Philips called and quoted an unbelievable

\$183.14 for the insignificant repairs. Upon receiving the player from the manufacturer, and after refusing the pricey estimate, the Magnavox CD-i 220 was taken to a local fix-it shop and returned like brand new within two days for \$82.00. Along with the damaged player the remote was also broken. The helpful Philips staff-member offered a 1-800 number in Montreal to contact, which handled all parts orders. Following the new hand-unit order, a credit card number was requested and a remarkable \$92.00 plus taxes and shipping and handling was demanded at total of \$113. A cracked remote (which still works) and a CD-i player with the R/F connector slipped out of the back (which still worked) was going to cost according to Philips over \$300. Sounds kind of odd considering nothing internally was damaged and a new unit only costs \$399. Big business is certainly BIG bucks. Hurray for the small businesses that are trying to earn an HONEST living.

Astral's multimedia division headed by Bud Gillan

Astral Communications Inc., the Canadian-based global communications company, is moving into the interactive world with the establishment of Astral Multimedia. This new division is dedicated to providing high-quality education, edutainment and entertainment multimedia products for worldwide markets.

Astral Multimedia, headed by 11-year IBM vet William (Bud) Gillan, "will bring together the synergies generated by existing Astral operations and our global partnerships to enable us to become leaders in the development, creation, financing,

Greenberg stated, "Bud Gillan has been actively involved for many years as a developer/producer of numerous award-winning interactive products before joining Astral. His dynamic leadership and his vast experience in product planning, design and publishing teamed with our strategic partners, will help make Astral Multimedia a world leader in the development and creation of interactive products."

Gillan will report directly to Greenberg and will be responsible for defining and implementing Astral's strategies and shaping the team that will create content, product, and service the new division.

Gillan, obviously enthused about his new position, notes "Astral is a very diverse, yet integrated company, well-suited for the interactive business, with a world class reputation in the creative and distribution aspects of the video and broadcast industries. Astral will be very appealing to developers, multimedia authors and software publishers who want to produce multimedia products for the North American and international markets. It is eye-opening to see all the things going on in this company."

MCA Records and Warren Miller Enterprises have teamed up for Miller's latest ski opus, entitled Vertical Reality.

The film features 18 songs from 14 different artists, including Patti LaBelle, Sass Jordan, Live, Angelfish and others. Vertical Reality is Miller's 45th annual feature film, and will be shown in more than 200 cities across the US.

Along with those named previously, other artists featured on the soundtrack include Lynyrd Skynyrd, Joe Walsh, Steppenwolf, Earl Slick, Flotsam & Jetsam, Young Black Teenagers, Lulubox, Dig, Best Kissers In The World, Kinky Machine and others.

In each market where the film is being screened, MCA will be coordinating radio promotional giveaways of music from the film. As well, special cassette samplers of MCA music, featuring Jordan, Steel Pulse, Smashing Orange and Justice System, will be given away to screening audiences.

Unplugging along. For the third straight week, Nirvana has the top spot on the Albums chart. If the album is to hold the #1 spot for a fourth week, it will not only have to hold off challenges from The Eagles, Page/Plant, Bon Jovi and Aerosmith, but also the new Pearl Jam album.

A good year! John Mellencamp continues to enjoy a prosperous 1994. Dance Naked rises to #8 and could follow Wild Night as his second #1 song of the year. Only two artists have had two #1 songs this year. Name the artists and the songs.

Another big hit. Jann Arden has the biggest hit of her career on her hands. Insensitive was the top entry three weeks ago. It then became the fastest-rising song two weeks in a row. Now, in just its fourth week, Insensitive is #6 with a bullet.

An obvious trend. Glance at the top six albums. Do you notice anything peculiar? Yes, the top half-dozen sellers in the country are basically greatest hits packages or new versions of old songs.

The Christmas rush. Releasing a new song, and Christmas shopping are two sure-fire ways to spark album sales. As soon as Barenaked Ladies and Celine Dion release new tracks, albums sales showed a noticeable increase. Other albums that have already been on the chart for a while are surging once again thanks to stocking stuffers. Those include The Lion King Soundtrack, Ace Of Base and The Rolling Stones.

Another continuing trend. Of the six albums entering the chart, four of them are various-artist collections. The Energy Rush II compilation leads the way as it debuts at #35. Frank Sinatra's Duets II, Party Mix 1994 and Woodstock 94 are the others.

The top three. The three highest adds on the Hit Tracks chart are from Canadians. Alan Frew's So Blind is the top add as it debuts at #71. Joni Mitchell's How Do You Stop is #77 and the latest release from Roch Voisine, She Picked On Me, is #79.

CRIA stats for Oct. show continued singles slide

The Canadian Recording Industry Association (CRIA) statistics for October reveal a continued struggle for singles. Although CD singles are up 123% for the year-to-date, compared to this time last year, cassette singles are down 73%, creating a 30% decrease in total singles' sales.

The stats also revealed a continued decline in cassette sales, as more and more consumers make the switch to compact disc. Cassettes shipped for the year to date total 16,129,000 units, down 7% from a similar date last year.

CD sales for 1994 thus far show an increase of 26%, with sales for October alone up 35% from the same period in 1993. Total album sales are up 17% so far in 1994, as compared to the same 10-month total from '93.

The main reason Pearl Jam has become the most potent purveyors of rock music in the '90s is because the band has been able to tap into the spirit that drives the genre. Rock music, regardless of whether it's Buddy Holly, The Beatles or Black Sabbath, has always been a style of music driven by emotion, emotion that makes you want to get up and dance, drive your car at a hundred miles an hour or get down and dirty with the one you love. Pearl Jam has tapped into that emotion with a vengeance, striking an emotional chord that leaves many of its grunge brethren gasping for breath in an effort to keep up. This newest effort offers a perfect example of why this band remains a step apart from its contemporaries. While so many alternative acts continue to turn up their guitars and amps, Pearl Jam has turned its down, presenting a sombre, reflective set of music that echoes the Ten album. The title, and essence of the album, is based on a 1,000 page book published at the turn of the century regarding the human body and mind and how they work. Vedder and company have taken this anachronistic philosophy and applied it to a 1990's society. The track Whipping, for example, is an earnest slam at Pro-Life activists who attempt to take the law into their own hands. Other songs delve into the fragile purpose of life, the callous disregard of unrequited love, and the modern-day mishandling of our youth. If this was their final album, it would make a potent requiem. -RR

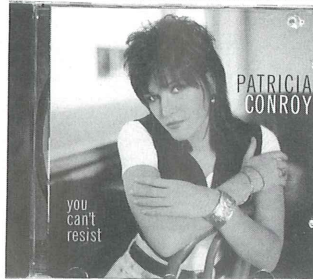
The phenomenon that is Celine Dion seems to grow day by day. With her latest album, The Colour Of My Love, recently hitting diamond status in Canada (sales of one million units), Dion is quite likely at the peak of her popularity. Sony/Columbia has seized the opportunity to rush-release this 14-song live collection from her three-night stand at the Paris Olympia this past September. This release is obviously targeted at Dion's massive francophone audience, as 10 of the 14 tracks are French. The four English-language songs included are Where Does My Heart Beat Now, Calling You (the theme song from the film Bagdad Café), Love Can Move Mountains and The Power Of Love. But English-speaking fans who may feel disappointed shouldn't give up on this one simply because of the large French-language content. Dion is a once-in-a-lifetime voice, and it's a testament to

her stunning singing ability that the music is appealing no matter what the language. Includes many songs from her Dion Chante Plamondon album, which has sold more than 400,000 units in France; a medley from the rock opera Starmania; Elle, which had never been performed live before the Olympia shows; and Jacques Brel's Quand On A Que L'Amour, which has never before appeared on a Dion album. Key here is Tony Arata and Scott Miller's penning of What Else Can I Do, Matraca Berg and Lisa Silver's Home In Your Arms, and George Teren and Susan Longacre's Too True Blue. Conroy isn't too shabby as a songwriter either. Check out Crazy Fool, but she has a bit of an edge when she teams up with Jennifer Kimball for the writing of Keep Me Rockin', which could be a left-fighter. All tracks are Cancon. -WG

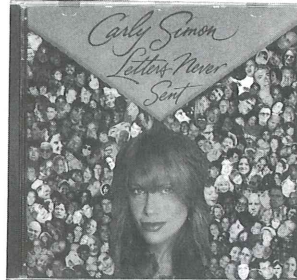

Catch The Wind, an exceptionally beautiful cover of Donovan's 1965 hit, has been taken as the first single, with an accompanying video. The band has gone outside its own circle of folksters with an incredibly touching duet of Con O'Brien and EMI's Celtic artist in residence, John McDermott on Let Me Fish Off Cape St. Mary's, written by Otto Kelland. The band also pays tribute to the late Stan Rogers with the a cappella Barrett's Privateers. Also key is Walk In The Irish Rain, a Steve Spurgin penning that will certainly touch the hearts of Irish people everywhere. Don't overlook Rattlin' Bog, which has become popular on the band's concert circuit. This traditional piece has been re-recorded and included here due to demand at retail. The album was produced by Derek Harrington and recorded at Toronto's Studio 92. Front-rack this one. It will be a big seller over the holiday season. -WG

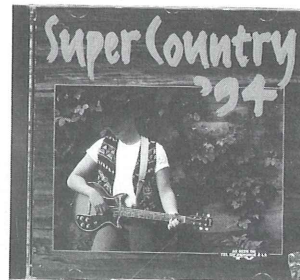

This latest album finds Simon at her artistic peak, culling a collection of vignettes that are sewn together like fine cloth. This is an album where the whole is better than the sum of the parts. 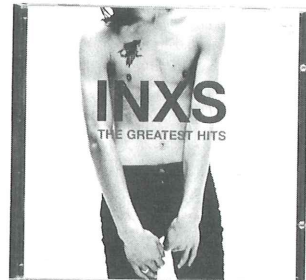

For a brief time in the mid-eighties, particularly with the release of the mammoth Kick album, it could've been argued that INXS was the most popular band in the world. Perhaps the band's greatest crime is that it was never able to take that extra step. The

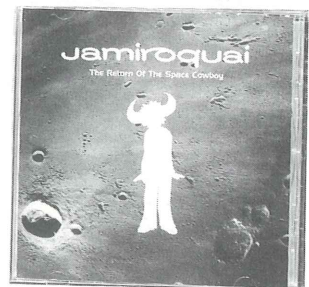


Kick album, which spawned four charted singles (Need You Tonight, Devil Inside, New Sensation, Never Tear Us Apart), was obviously the group's commercial and creative nadir, and the group quietly descended thereafter. What INXS did do, in some ways, was open the doors to the Australian music scene, presenting an entirely new industrial, gasoline-alley type of sound that found its finest ally in Midnight Oil. This package is built around, obviously, the Kick album, with all four of that record's hits represented here. Also added are such ground-breakers as Original Sin and What You Need, along with two new tracks, The Strangest Party and Deliver Me. -RR

We've heard so often about how some of the great blues artists from the past were trampled over by rock and roll, we forget that some of these blues greats are still playing today. Buddy Guy was making blues records decades ago, but for years, he was simply a footnote in the history of popular music. But in the last couple of years, Guy has had a rebirth, at least in the eyes of the music biz. His 1990 comeback album Damn Right I've Got The Blues went gold in Canada, while 1992's Feel Like Rain garnered him a Grammy Award. Both albums combined have now surpassed sales of 1.5 million worldwide. This newest effort is comprised of both Guy originals and material culled from past blues greats such as Bobby Bland and Charlie Brown. Guy is backed by Chris Layton, Tommy Shanon and Reese Wynans, who collectively had formed Stevie Ray Vaughan's back-up band. Some of the highlights include the lead track, I Smell Trouble, Slippin' Out, Slippin In, Trouble Blues and Cities Need Help. Produced by Eddie Kramer, known for his work with Jimi Hendrix and Led Zeppelin. -RR

This UK outfit first came to prominence back in 1993 with its debut album, Emergency On Planet Earth. The album topped sales of two million units worldwide, and made them the UK's top selling band of last year. The success obviously inspired some keen interest from the Columbia people, who signed the band to a multi-album deal. The music is funk, but it's a nicer, simpler version of funk, without the brash abrasiveness of most normal funk formations. This second album is quite a bit more polished and refined than the last, with a more upbeat sound, obviously reflective of the band's recent success. With a decent promotional push, this fine funk/pop package could make some headway in this country. Produced and arranged by band leader J.K. Highlights include the lead single, Space Cowboy, Just Another Story, Half The Man and The Kids. -RR

CD single and video opens US to Dyanne Halliday

Mel Shaw's MWC America of Nashville label has been picking up excellent reaction to its first video release, *Small Town Texas* by Dyanne Halliday.

The companion CD was mailed last week (Nov. 23) to 2400 country radio stations in both the US and Canada.

The video, which was filmed in the San Antonio area of Texas, was produced and directed by Shaw. The video has been picked up more than 50 US markets in only three weeks, including Denver, Kansas City, Austin and Birmingham.

Halliday, who moved with her family to Nashville last year, is also supporting the release with radio and video show interviews where possible. There has been a series of magazine interviews for upcoming issues. She guested on Birmingham, Alabama's daily one-hour top country program on WBRC-TV. Her three performances are scheduled to be aired Nov. 24, 25 and 28.

Halliday is also firmed for the Music Factory Show in Branson, Missouri on Dec. 1 and 2. Other television appearances for December include The Johnnie Pierce Show in Kentucky and the Gene Williams Show in Arkansas, a program that is syndicated to 20 markets in the US. For January, there are television appearances and tracking dates scheduled in Texas where there is heavy video play of her release.

One of the major priorities for MWC America since moving to Nashville was the marketing of Moments Of Meaning. The six-cassette package contains music and thoughtful narratives about family relationships, understanding of others and having a positive personal life outlook.

The narratives were written and produced by Shaw. Halliday handles the narrations and sings the four songs included in the package. Shaw reports that reaction "has been very positive" with requests for translated productions in other languages.

The promotion and publicity so far has included a nationwide talk radio call-in program, The Bill Moran Show from Los Angeles. Halliday shared calls from across the US with the national president Jo Anne Evans

of Children And Adults With Attention Deficit Disorder (CH.A.D.D.). The association has more than six hundred chapters in the US, serving the needs of the estimated 3,500,000 families who have someone in the family with A.D.D.

Halliday has also been invited to appear on *Wishing You Well* a popular show on American Business Radio Network. She will share the mike with Suzanne Mintz, president of the National Family Caregivers Association. It is estimated there are more than 18,000,000 Caregivers in the US. Halliday will also be recording a narrative entitled *Caregiver* that the association plans to make available to all members of the association next year.

Halliday is heading into a heavy radio interview guest schedule over the next few months. She will be a solo guest or be joined by either Evans or Mintz. It is estimated there are more than 1,000 talk radio stations in the US. The interest in Halliday has been generated through a wide mailing of the Moments sampler.

When making appearances and promotional visits for her country music career, Halliday also includes meetings with representatives of various organizations and associations that have found the thoughtful narratives of Moments Of Meaning important to their members.

The main reaction to the project has been generated from print advertisements in *Attention* magazine and the mailing of thousands of 14-minute cassette samplers to members of these organizations. "We have received enthusiastic interest for Dyanne to appear at seminars and conventions," Shaw reports. She will be a regular participant in a planned America On-Line session on parenting a child with A.D.D. Discussions are also underway for a 1995 30-minute special featuring Halliday and guests on the American Info Channel, a satellite network aimed

The first show, which aired Nov. 21, has met with good reaction from listeners. "I'm pleased with the sound of the program," says Thomas.

Shaw is targeting Halliday to appear on national television in regard to Moments Of Meaning in 1995. A second audio cassette series will have an accompanying video and pre-production is already underway with plans to utilize the Jim Owens television studio in Nashville.

Shaw's label is also busy with other projects, including developing works by a number of songwriters in the publishing division. A songwriting project for the state education boards has been created with the initial state involvement being Texas. A sports music project has been produced that includes a sponsor-based music/cassette. The project has been accepted by a sports league in the US and Shaw expects there will be expansion plans for other leagues in 1995.

Reserved decision on CMT by federal court

A three-judge Federal Court panel has reserved its decision on whether to order the CRTC to give the Nashville-based Country Music Television (CMT) a chance to be heard.

The CRTC had ordered CMT off Canadian cable by the end of the year. However, CMT, through its lawyer, Ron Lunan, is appealing that decision, which would replace the Nashville network with the Canadian-owned service, The Country Network (TCN).

The CRTC's decision to kick CMT out of Canada was made without giving the 24-hour country music video channel an opportunity to present its case.

them. It's an education process for us."

Despite the perception that rap and hip-hop music is being purchased mainly by a young black audience, Zbitnew says that, as is often the case, perception and reality don't often meet at the same juncture.

"Within our Kickin' The Flava compilation we included a questionnaire. The questionnaire basically asks people their favourite bands, how they found out about them, etc. And it's really interesting to see that a lot of people that are listening to Pearl Jam are also listening to Digable Planets. It's becoming an alternative music that's being accepted by alternative audiences.

"There's only so much going on in the music scene that's new and different and distinct and ground-breaking - and hip-hop is that. Although it's been around for more than 10 years, as far as entering into the mainstream,

for those kids that are looking for something new, this is new."

From an EMI standpoint, the biggest hurdle to overcome in terms of spreading the word about hip-hop is its regionality. At the moment, hip-hop popularity is still largely confined to the southern Ontario area, with a few pockets of popularity scattered throughout the country.

"Probably 50% of our overall hip-hop sales come out of the southern Ontario market. But you can't neglect pockets where it's happening elsewhere. Halifax is a big hip-hop market, Calgary has a fair bit of activity, and Winnipeg has a scene happening as well. I don't think it's as developed in a lot of the country because there isn't as much in the way of touring activity or promotional activity."

While radio air-play for rap and hip-hop in southern Ontario is largely confined to AM 640 and Energy 108 (Burlington), perhaps the biggest supporters of the urban genre is MuchMusic, where rap and hip-hop have a considerable priority.

"MuchMusic has been good in exposing these acts. I'm not sure of the actual statistics of the shows, but I believe Rap City and XTendmix are certainly some of their highest-rated specialty programs."

Ultimately, EMI believes that the audience for rap and hip-hop is alive and well in Canada, and that it's up to the record companies to find it.

"If you can't hear it on more than one or two radio stations across the country, it's up to us to figure out why you can't hear it.
