

BMG slaps Warner with antitrust suit

Warner Music Canada will soon be looking a double barrel in the face after the Competition Bureau filed an application to the Competition Tribunal that alleges anti-competitive practices on the part of the record company giant. The application followed a complaint made by BMG Music Service, the record club affiliate of the major label, after Warner Music consistently failed to supply the record club with product from its catalogue. The order, which is being sought under the refusal to deal provisions in section

Watch provides national bridge for youth culture

Item: Spice Girls, the newest of the new teeny bop sensations has just hit a phenomenal 18 million records worldwide, pretty convincing proof -- as if we needed it -- that the demographic with the largest expendable income continues to be the teens. In the wake of those numbers is Toronto-based Watch magazine which, starting last month, has expanded its distribution coast to coast to meet the growing demand for an age-specific publication. Increased distribution for the self-described youth culture magazine will mean that 125,000 copies are expected to reach some 800 high schools across Canada, a figure representing approximately 25% of schools across the country.

Watch's penetration in highschools will also be complimented by metal racks at Music World stores in Canada, which will feature items from within the musical coverage that is one of the magazine's main emphasis. The strategy is expected to also eventually incorporate volunteer student representatives for promotional efforts on behalf of Watch and its clients. The free publication is expected to meet the demand for a vehicle with exclusive interests in the Canadian youth market, a point which schoolboards have welcomed on the grounds that it encourages their students to read.

The market has already responded aggressively to the free magazine's editorial overhaul and already Watch is boasting a selection of new major advertising clients including Roots, Aldo Group, and Warner-Lambert, all of whom will be joining

previous supporters Sony Music, Columbia Sportswear, Music World and Doc Martens.

Ironically, editors of the four-year-old publication have upped their editorial to account for approximately 65% of the content of the magazine (historically, ads and editorial were divided evenly). Youth Culture Inc., the company that owns Watch, is also planning on building a database for future programs, including the plan to eventually launch a direct mail magazine for teenage girls.

75 of the Competition Act, will force Warner Music to provide BMG with product if and when it is approved by the Tribunal.

According to BMG, Warner's refusal to provide product stems from their "vested interest" -- 50% ownership along with Sony Music -- of Columbia House, which constitutes the record club's primary competitor in Canada. Columbia House operated as a monopoly for several years prior to BMG's entry into the country's \$200 million industry that caters to an estimated two million Canadians. Nevertheless, BMG is insisting that there was an understanding between the vying companies prior to BMG's arrival into Canada.

According to BMG, Warner had given them assurances that it would make its music available to the competing record club, just as it does in the United States where Columbia House and BMG

Majors to take a greater role for CMW '98

Plans were set in motion this week for a the six major music labels to take a bigger part in the Canadian Music Week Conference and Festival to be held March 5 - 8 at Toronto's Westin Harbour Castle. Representatives from Warner Music, PolyGram Canada, EMI, BMG, Sony and Universal agreed to come together in a newly created advisory panel, that will suggest changes and strategies on how best to maximise their presence at the annual event.


Among their suggestions for CMW '98, is a video presentation showcasing upcoming releases that will run a continuous loop on a specially-constructed "video wall" within the exhibition. While the Music Marathon will continue to present performances and showcases during regular exhibition hours, several key acts will be moved to

evening slots.

As well, the majors agreed that CMW multimedia place a greater emphasis on recorded product, while interaction between artists and their fans will be encouraged through an autograph booth. In addition, tickets to the Festival and exhibition will be available only at the major Canadian retail chain as a way of encouraging the public into the stores. A portion of ticket sales will be donated to the Music Therapy Trust fund.

"Last year's event was great and we had the highest attendance in our 14-year history," commented Dixon. "However, we want to listen to the Canadian music industry even more closely in order to ensure CMW '98 will be more relevant to its needs. And the support of the 6 multinational majors is integral to the event's success."



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

have rivalled for years. The club was launched two years ago, attracting 800,000 members which immediately caused a drop in pricing of club CDs as a direct result of the newly created competitive arena.

"The only conclusion one can make on Warner's reneging on its initial agreement to supply BMG with product is that it wants to have exclusive control over the flow of music to record club members in Canada," stated George McMillan, president and CEO of BMG Direct Ltd. "Warner's behaviour is harmful to over 2 million Canadian record club members. They are being treated like second class citizens by being denied the benefits of competition enjoyed by US consumers."

For its part, Warner Music claims that the

remedy being sought by the Bureau will lead to automatic compulsory licensing, something which would violate intellectual property rights of the artists and cripple their economic well-being.

But McMillan is accusing the label of employing "scare tactics" and of creating a "smokescreen to hide the real issue."

"Bertelsmann is a leader in the music industry

and would not, out of concern for its artists, support compulsory licensing for music or any other intellectual property," he said. "To say that the sky is falling regarding intellectual property rights, as Warner claims, is a red herring. The Competition Bureau is simply seeking to maintain and promote competition in the record club market for the benefit of Canadians. Canadian competition law supports the relief being sought against Warner."

McMillan added that the company will do everything in its power to support the Bureau's attempt to require Warner to re-channel its product into the club. To that end, the company filed intervenor status in the Competition Bureau proceedings against Warner and, independent of the complaint, also commenced a private civil action

that named Warner Music Group Inc., Warner MusicCanada Ltd., and The Columbia House Company (both in Canada and the US), for the recovery of damages estimated at \$75 million.

Warner Music has until the end of the month to formerly respond to the Bureau's application to the Competition Tribunal. Whether things will get ugly or resolve themselves in the near future remains to be seen.

"The case is very simple," said McMillan. "Warner has refused to supply BMG's mail order record club with music in an attempt to re-establish Columbia House as a monopoly in the record club market in Canada. This will prevent Canadians from enjoying the benefits of competition -- choice, competitive prices and better service."

HMV's Superstore to fete Yo-Yo Ma's Bach series

Internationally-acclaimed cellist Yo-Yo Ma has brought the Suites for Cello Solo by J.S. Bach into prominence in a film series titled Inspired by Bach. The series pairs Ma with six artists, each of whom has chosen one of the Bach Suites to explore in collaboration with Ma; choreographer Mark Morris, filmmakers Atom Egoyan and François Girard, ice dancers Torvill & Dean, garden designer Julie Moir Messervy and Kabuki actor Tamasaburo Bando.

Ma will be on hand for an exclusive performance and meet and greet at HMV's Toronto Superstore (333 Yonge Street) on Oct. 24 from 12:30 to 2 pm to celebrate the release of the films' soundtrack, an all-new recording of the Suites by Ma.

Ma's first recording of the Bach Cello Suites, released on Sony Classical, won a 1984 Grammy

Award. His interest in exploring the Suites again, in this unique manner, came after he took part in a 1991 symposium on Bach scholar Albert Schweitzer. He was apparently so fascinated by Schweitzer's description of Bach's music as "painterly" and "pictorial", that he began planning his Inspired by Bach project. The series of six short films that came out of this vision will be aired over six weeks on TVO, with the first film's premiere scheduled for Sunday, Oct. 26.

Tower in-store for Jethro Tull's Toronto date

From Noon until 1 pm on Oct. 20, Ian Anderson, Martin Barre and Andrew Giddings of Jethro Tull will be on hand at Tower Records in downtown Toronto.

The trio will perform three acoustic songs on the main floor, followed by a question and answer session open to the public and media. Vince Parr, Director of Marketing for Tower Records, is requesting that those wishing to take part should fax their questions to the marketing department, at 416-593-7995, ten of which will be chosen for the floor. After the Q&A session, the trio will sign autographs.

The Tower in-store is part of Jethro Tull's 1997 North American Tour, promoting the EMI release of the Special 25th Anniversary Thick As A Brick. The band appears in concert at Massey Hall that same evening.

Toronto still goes wild for Oscar and Earnest

"The play's the thing" which is a good thing for the production of Oscar Wilde's The Importance of Being Earnest in current run at Toronto's Princess of Wales Theatre. The play has been quite properly described as a trivial comedy for serious people.

This production however, and for reasons unknown, has elected to go broad, a theatrical term referring to lack of restraint. Perhaps it's because of the physical dimensions of the capacious P.O.W. Whatever the reason or reasons, the familiar comedy of manners which was written as a telling commentary on the social mores of the time has become a spoof and indeed, edges perilously close

to burlesque.

For the record, the sets, lighting and sound for this intimate play are a comfortable fit for the theatre. Still, we'd be more than remiss not to point out that the director's blocking is such that one occasionally can't hear the actors. That's not the fault of the theatre; it's the fault of the director.

Not that it matters. The familiar lines are timeless and virtually indestructible even when roared rather than acclaimed. And, truth to tell, one quite enjoyed the presentation. Granted, it's not Oscar Wilde as one has come to expect it, but Wilde or wild, it's still devilishly funny. -BW

Cash injection extends life of Quality Dino

Louis Kircos, CEO of Quality Dino Entertainment Ltd. (Quality), reveals the company has agreed to terms "for a cash injection of approximately US\$2 million and a financing arrangement that provides the company a Cdn\$2 million financing facility from Morrison Financial Services Limited." Morrison has purchased the indebtedness of Cinram, a secured creditor, and entered into an agreement with Quality with regard to repayment of that debt.

It was revealed that "subject to certain conditions, the indebtedness evidenced by the promissory notes can be utilized to purchase convertible debentures, which have a term of five years and a day. The notes and the debentures will bear interest at a floating rate of 1.5 per cent over the US prime rate payable quarterly. Each debenture will be convertible at any time into common shares of the company at a conversion ratio of one common share per US \$0.10 principal amount of debenture. On maturity, at the company's option and subject to a holders right to convert, the debentures may be retired in cash or in common shares. In addition, the terms of the previously announced debt issue of US\$2.5 million in June 1997 have been amended

to provide for the same conversion terms as the new financing. The issuance of the debentures is subject to various conditions including implementation of a plan of restructuring under the CCAA in form and substance satisfactory to the investors and compliance with applicable laws."

As a result of the commitments, Quality received approval from the Ontario Court of Justice (General Division) to extend the Stay Order pursuant to the companies' Creditors Arrangement Act (CCAA) until January 29 of next year.

The funding has enabled Quality to secure product lines for fall distribution. As Kircos points out, since obtaining the original Stay Order "numerous suppliers have continued to supply the company with product which, together with current inventory, have provided sufficient levels for the continuation of the business."

Ed LaBuick, president of Quality's music and video division, is obviously happy with the new arrangement indicating that the company's fall line-up "is as strong as it has ever been." He goes on to point out that with album releases including "the multi-platinum Dance Mix series and the platinum

A number of industry people will be available to answer questions at Holy Joe's, including Bonnie

Fedrau, Michael Perlmutter, Barbara Sedun, Sam Touma, Josh Levy, Karen Pace, Byron Wong, Kingi Carpenter and Doug MacRae.

The awards presentation gets underway at 9 pm and includes performances by a number of unsigned acts, including Roach Motel, Noah's Arkweld, Lenni Jabour, Jemeni, My Brilliant Beast, High Street, and Admiral.

There will be 12 "signature" awards presented. Each of the bands will receive an award, along with one "significant independent" from the fashion, film, music and art scene. The public will have the opportunity to cast a vote for one of the performing bands which will receive The Public Warning Award.

The evening's concert will be broadcast live to a worldwide audience on Virtually Canadian (www.virtuallycanadian.com), Canada's 24-hour on-line radio station.

performing Chris Sheppard's Destination Dancefloor, and the 9th volume of the successful Don Cherry's Rock'Em Sock'Em hockey action video series, Quality is well positioned for this winter." He concludes with "Quality is one of Canada's leading TV marketing companies and this fall will continue to support its line-up of albums, videos and consumer products with significant advertising campaigns."

Gordon O'Keefe, Quality's CFO reports that in addition to its focus on new financing, the company has concentrated its efforts on downsizing, reducing expenses, and numerous operational and strategic matters to enable it "to develop a proposal plan to creditors." The company has until Dec. 16, 1997 to submit its plan to the court. The period from Dec. 16, 1997 through Jan. 29, 1998, is intended to be used for creditor review and approval of the plan.

FACTOR salutes CHUM on \$2,000.000 contribution

Attitudes are changing!!! It's taken a long time, but there appears to be a whole new respect for country music from the multi-nationals in particular, and with some retailers. And you can see why. Gold and multi-platinum certifications for country albums have been on the increase, ever since Garth Brooks and Shania Twain led the way. Every multi-national. without exception, have a full roster of country acts. Attitudes have been difficult to change however. It's one thing to have a large country roster, but if there's resistance down the line at the label, the country act isn't going anywhere, and there's been a lot of proof of this over the past dozen months. Competition in country is keener than ever. No sooner does a pretty face hit #1 and another one is bidding for that slot. Now, if we can only convince retailers to boot out some of the pop and rock crap and front-rack country, we'd see a major chain in customer buying habits. I wonder if anyone at retail ever monitors how many calls they get for country records? (EC: Are you kidding???)

There's more to Q than Stern!!! They say "as the morning goes, so goes the rest of the day," which is the case most of the time. When you have a shockjock like Howard Stern opening the day, how do you program the rest of the day? Very carefully, I would imagine. So, it's been very interesting listening to what Pat Cardinal is doing with Q107. There's that feel of the old rock powerhouse, but with a difference. Cardinal is layering his music with a bit of his own shock and he's building a very entertaining format. It will be interesting to see just how the rest of the day is going. (EC: It's that western influence!!!)

Rewriting history!!! There are too many books coming out on the early evolution of Cancon that rewrite the facts and unfortunately there are many who will read this stuff and believe that it really happened. The truth is that many of the writers weren't there physically or mentally. The research is done by interviewing artists who they revere and



There's a place in Calcutta called the black hole, an infinitely depressing place, especially since it functions as a jail within the confines of one of the grimmest places this world has allowed to exist.

grimmest places this world has allowed to exi It's a striking and hopeless place, and stupefyingly odd to find it on the lips of someone like Sass Jordan. Doubly stupefying because Jordan, as of the present, is all smiles. That circumstance is due to several things; her pregnancy, her new-found significant other (found standing a little ways to the left of the stage, playing guitar -- go figure) and a startlingly riveting new album titled -- what else? -- Present.

But before all that was the Black Hole of Calcutta, where, metaphorically of course, Jordan spent the last four years; that time directly preceding, involving and following the release of her 1994 sophomore effort titled Rats.

"It's so hard to look back on it and to really think clearly because it was such a confusing time for me," she says during a media junket in anticipation of the release this week, of Present. "It tends to be cloudy. But you know, I think that absolutely everything that happens to anybody is necessary, for our evolution as a human being."

Maybe so, but the time spent living in LA was, at the time, far from a pleasant experience. Jordan was simmering in the cold fallout of a few "really destructive relationships," which seemed to mirror off in a host of appalling

individuals which followed her, like bad omens drawn by bad karma, into her life. There were also problems with her manager, with whom she finally severed ties and lived to write about it (a song called Do What I Can devotes some words to that



particular story). But in the end it was Sass Jordan -- the girl who gave us a stunning debut with Racine, who duetted with Joe Cocker for The Bodyguard's unforgettable Trust In Me, who was named Album Rock's Top Female Artist Of The Year by Billboard mag -- who had to come out of it.

"Something good did come out of all that," she says. "It was very dark and difficult but I'm really glad because I learned so much. I wouldn't have been able to write at this point in my life had I not gone through all that and I wouldn't have the compassion that I have if I hadn't experienced it; it was wonderful but it was difficult at the same time. It's like life, life's that way."

Present returns Jordan to the singular mindedness and the optimism of Racine, the album that scored her three top 10 hits in the US as well as tours with Arc Angels, Aerosmith, Steve Miller and Bryan Adams. Hardly surprising to note that it marks a change of mood from the dark opus that was Rats or that it is clearly her most mature work to date. Jordan even managed a few names on the album; Bun E. Carlos and Tom Peterson of Cheap Trick and John Shanks from Melissa Etheridge's band, all of whom contribute on More To Life, a song which succinctly sums up Present's central emotive force.

"I love music and that's the reason I'm here," says the singer songwriter, "so I can touch as many people as possible. I don't feel particularly important, everybody is important, every single person; my thing is just that I have to do this for now, talk about stuff that I go through. It's amazing how many other people go through it too and it makes people realise that they're not as isolated, or alienated or alone, which is important. The human animal is a social animal who is never alone. We live lives with other people and that's the high point of our existence."



Farmer's Daughter To Lift PeaceKeepers Spirits



KACY CROWLEY Anchorless Atlantic 83038-P

This former deadhead plays the guitar and sings but hang on a sec, we mean sing. Here's a sample: "Will I surrender and learn to fight/ Like camouflage through the dark and the light/ From the bottom of my dreams comes the sound/I wear my music like a broken crown." Kacy Crowley was signed to Atlantic because her music is all about veracity and plaintive emotions, those very things which seem to elude the people who try most to achieve them. A native of Northampton Massachussetts, the singer/songwriter was baptised into popular music by the likes of John Denver and John Cougar Mellencamp. And despite the Grateful Dead period that followed her into late adolescence, she manages to maintain a firm hold on the rocky, groovy roots that marked her earlier influences. In Singers Are Ugly, Crowley makes cracks about people like Mick Jagger and... herself: "My dreams become bone thin/Bone dust indie my skin/In the city." Atlantic and Warner Bros. are planning a big push for the missus and are expecting a big reception in North America. For that reason you will hear Hand To Mouth bopping around radio where it will be a strong contender for the big CHR hit. Comparisons to Sheryl Crow might be informative but are ultimately pointless; this girl is dominating her very own corner in the pop world, a corner that stands to get a hell of a lot bigger in the months to come. -RG

THE VERVE Urban Hymns Virgin 44913-F

In the seven years since their crash into the British music scene, The Verve have elicited all sorts of conflicting responses, turning them into a type of pop paradox par exelance. Much has been said, for example, of their grandiose comments -- a la Oasis -- to a less than impressed media, of their hotel room antics and of their drug fuelled spats. And then there's the music. But before we go on to explain why



Urban Hymns is a fantastically achieved pop album, we are obliged to refer to the past, when three singles, notably All In The Mind, She's A Superstar and Gravity Grave made this band a reference point for much of the stuff this decade has cranked out. Now back to Urban Hymns. The album has had an early introduction on CHR with Bitter Sweet Symphony, a tune that exudes the eloquence that The Verve are accused of being arrogant for continually pointing out. In truth, Urban Hymns progresses to a semblance of their elder brothers in Oasis by concentrating guitar pop and breathy ballads into a '90s psychedelia that -- inexplicably -- makes this pop music a lush, succulent, brittle and edgy piece of work. Talk about paradoxes. Songs like Sonnet, which showcase strong words in a framework of perfect melody structure and playful delivery will ensure that this album will be canonised among the best the period -- and the country -- has produced. Single to follow will be The Drugs Don't Work.


POPCAN Various Artists Alert 81033-Q

This cleverly titled release purports to contain some of the most refreshing indie pop currently fizzling in Toronto. Alert Music, who threw a nice little soiree for this thing last week sometime, is the one putting the compilation together under what must have been the



guiding philosophy of any independent pop that works. The triumph of the release, and what it claims over other releases that try to bring together unknown bands, is that it the music has the stamp of commercial radio despite (or because of) its independent freshness. There is a lot to quench the palate on this disk (all of sixteen tracks for a hot summer day). In our humble opinion, the standouts include Cool Blue Halo (Too Much Kathleen), Universal Honey (Wouldn't Want To Be In Your Shoes), Cinnamon (Another Edit) and the gem of the piece which belongs to that rockin' group of post highschoolers, Sour Landslide (Hired Goons). You will hear new and interesting on New Despots (an existential new wave pop experiment) and Minstrels (quaint pop with echoes of baja surf). A release which is both well executed and important to showcasing the kinds of talent that is currently brewing in our own front doorstep. The release notes for the album called it cool, sweet, simple and pure. That about sums it. Oh, and did we mention it was 100% pure Canadian? -RG

SANDBOX A Murder In The Glee Club EMI 857585-F

Cool. Here's an album that could be described as that game called Clue... or maybe it would fare better bringing into mind the disassociated associations of James Joyce's Ulysses... or maybe it's choose your own adventure. Whatever the *true* concept of this concept album, the point is that Sandbox have learned a lot about zest, subtlety and strong pop melodies since their last album (1995's Bionic). That album culled the Nova Scotia quintet some promising attention, top ten action on Much, and a slew of nominations from the Junos, CASBY and ECMAs. Despite all that, it's good to hear the band still maintains its independent fervour, something which is evident from a concept album allegorically based on a murder mystery. While the lyrics



give us much room to ponder whether Mr. White did it in the red room with a rope, the music stays close to the pop sensibilities that made Curious the wunderhit of yesteryear. Which means that while Murder In The Glee Club might not crown any sleuths over the next month, it will have the tendency to mysteriously appear on radio. The single is called Carry and, we're sure, will give the folks over at EMI tremendous possibilities for promo ops. Of course it has a great chance at success. That's just elementary, my dear Watson.

KEVIN CLOSS Homecoming Tower Bay-1

Careful! Kevin Closs could be catching. After reading the accompanying promotion piece, out of sheer curiosity, his squeaky clean instrumental (acoustic guitar) version of O Canada was the first track sampled. The inspiration energy on this track goes without saying. Closs is an artist with balls and a unique vocal property to play touch-and-go with not only his own but also the imagination of his listener. His folk roots are pretty obvious. He tailor-fits his word imaging to a warm, almost cuddly projection that creates a message tie that fits several moods, all positive. Key here are Homecoming, Pell Mell, Nowhereland, and The Camp Song. But don't



overlook Red Dan's Lament. Also Key is Old Voice, written by Ian Tamblyn, who also produced the album and doubles on several instruments, and the Paul Dunn penning of Careful What You Wish For. Recorded at Ottawa's Sound of One Hand and mastered by Bill Kipper at SNB in Montreal.

11:11 - Newfoundland Classics Newfoundland Women Sing Songs by Ron and Connie Hynes TMP-1111

There's nothing more that captures the very essence of The Rock and its lush heritage than the works of Newfoundland's Ron and Connie Hynes. Add to that the individual vocal charm and a no-kidding delivery by 11 of the island's



best known female vocalists, and you have an entertainment package that underscores not only the importance of being a Newfoundander, but a female to boot. Needless to say, this has been a two-year labour of love by Ron and Connie and producer Declan O'Doherty, not to mention the support of TMP The Music Producer. All tracks are key, and whether by accident or design, the music and lyrics fit perfectly, the personna of each of the vocalists: Anita Best (I Never Met A Liar), Damhnait Doyle (She's Not Wild Anymore), Liz Picard (Picture To Hollywood), Kim Stockwood (Leave Or Be The One), Colleen Power (Mary Got A Baby), Vicki Hynes (If You Let Me Go I'll Fall), Mary Barry (April Fools), Shirley Montague (Only Lonely Sometimes), Shirley Dalton (Love's Thin Line), Pamela Morgan (Maybe She Went Crazy), and Kathy Phippard (Heart Of A Man). OLIVE Extra Virgin RCA 67507-N

Sure, BMG staffers Dale 'I Wish I Was Dick Assman' Peters and Cameron Carpenter baited the weary RPM staff with booze, turkey subs and olives when they dropped off

this release, but that's not why you are currently reading this review. Olive pricked our ears because we heard in it what 500,000 Britons heard when they rushed out to buy the first single from the exploding UK phenom. The song was You're Not Alone and is, of course, included here in the trio's first North American release called Extra Virgin. The sound harkens to something we've heard before, notably Everything But The Girl, though Olive aims to throw a tasty splash of R&B into the techno-tinged trip hop mix that give their particular potion the taste of heaven. Something about the way Extra Virgin plays

Like their natural counterpart, Olive may be a matter of taste, but whatever you do, don't fail to give it a listen. You might be missing out on one of the main events of the year.

The sounds are true to what would seem to be the message of the movie and can stand on their own, but it's the assemblage of recognizable top talent that makes this a collector's item -BW

KARRIN ALLYSON - Jazz Daydream Concord Jazz-4773 (St.Clair Ent)

Reaction to Miss Allyson's performance must be ambivalent. On the one hand she's more than a competent pianist and a melodically true singer of great technical expertise, espeday, also from Canada, who has been recognized by the Videographers Awards for her excellent work on the project. As a parent of a teenager with A.D.D., Halliday's national TV appearance and radio shows have brought comfort to thousands of families. In the body of the video, there is a public service announcement for CH.A.D.D., America's leading family support group for A.D.D.It's also interesting to note that the video won the Cindy Award in Education. MATT KING Five O'Clock Hero Atlantic 82981-P

This accomplished guitarist, who has recently landed a tour that's not too bad for someone who is just starting out with his first Atlantic release. He's managed to land some fall dates opening shows for Patty Lovless and Bryan White. If his stage presence is as strong as the content of his new album Five O'Clock Hero, there won't be many fan's disappointed or buyer's complaining. When the voice of Matt



King leaves his body and journeys to the listeners ears, by the time it reaches your ears it's hard to figure out where that deep, powerful voice is coming from. He's definitely not one of those artists that "sounds like he looks." King has a certain oral that surrounds his talent. He can take a song like A Woman's Tears and belt out emotion like those on the top of the charts, and in turn rock-a-billy out a tune like I Wrote the Book. He is equally as powerful with a ballad, as he is with an edgy-up-beat roots song. As well as being a supreme acoustic guitar player, he also indulges in songwriting, the entire 11 songs on the album were written by King, with the help of some established cowriters and it shows in the lyrical similarity of the album. All the songs on the album are comparable in the depth of the lyrics, but are completely different in their unique rhythms. Five minutes of Five O'Clock Hero is enough to realize that he'll be punching in on the charts real soon with his first single of the album, A Woman Like You.-JI

CAITLIN HANFORD -Country Bluer Skies Denon 9027

If independent recognition is what Caitlin Hanford is seeking, all she needs to do, is keep on doing what she has done so well. Singing. Her new release on Denon Records, Bluer Skies is an album packed full of all spectrums of country music. She's comfortable belting out a gutsy country roots song and then just as easily approach a tune from jazz angle. In 1993 Caitlin, as a side project, joined together with Cindy Church, Sylvia Tyson and Colleen Peterson to form Quartette. After the group had released their three albums, Hanford moved on to pursue her own career as an artist. Having only co-written 4 songs of 12 on the album she makes up for her lack of pen-topaper efforts with her power packed voice that seems to be refined, possibly from numerous performances with the Quartette. Chris Whiteley who has written numerous songs for/ with Caitlin and for/with Quartette was involved in the writing of six songs on this album with two independent efforts, For the Chance of Lovin' You and Radiates. The album recorded at Metalworks studio in Mississauga is one that should not be overlooked by anyone who likes to listen to an artist that puts an authentic feeling into the songs their singing.


