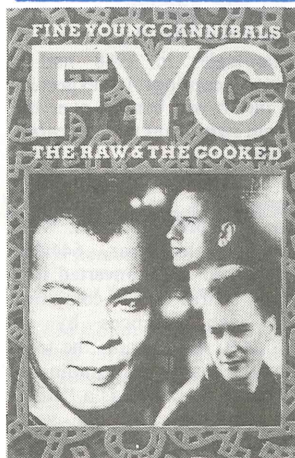

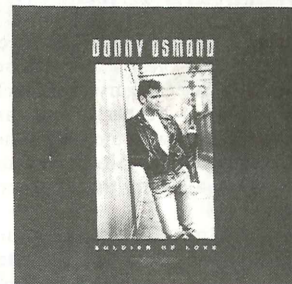

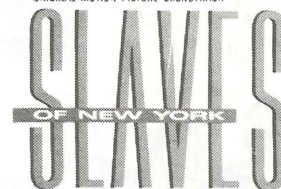

## Juno win raises stature of Oak Street Music

Winnipeg-based Oak Street Records came away from this year's Juno Awards a double winner, in one category. The label's first two releases, Fred Penner's *Place* and *Lullaby Berceuse*, both won the 1989 Juno Award in the Best Children's Album category, the first time in Juno history this category has ended up in a tie.

Oak Street was established in November of 1987 by children's entertainer Fred Penner, and promoter/producer Gilles Paquin. The label's main focus is on family entertainment, and with an international distribution deal with A&M Records, the pair plan to take the label "to the forefront of family music in North America."

For Penner, it was a natural progression to form his own label. He found the timing

right to capitalize on the momentum generated by his first four albums, his five children's books and the popularity of his national CBC-TV production, *Fred Penner's Place*. As Penner's personal manager, Paquin brought to the partnership the right amount of industry experience, as a partner and associate in one of the largest concert promotion networks in Canada.

The initial release for the label was Penner's fifth album, *Fred Penner's Place*, his most elaborate in terms of instrumentation, arrangements and production. Released in March of 1988 in Canada and in the U.S. in May of the same year, the album has sold 30,000 copies, and is expected to continue with steady sales, being that the shelf life of children's music is

virtually endless.

Oak Street's second release, *Lullaby Berceuse*, is a bilingual lullaby album featuring Connie Kaldor and Carmen Campagne. The album is described as a new concept "with a traditional theme." Most of the songs are original, with the other compositions being new arrangements on traditional lullabies.

Further releases for the label include *The People On My Street*, written by Bob King, who wrote the well-known *Sandwiches*, and a new Penner album.

In making the above announcement, Parrish noted, "I look forward to the dynamic and profitable expansion of the company's promotional sales activity under the direction of Mr. Stevens. And, with Keith Hunt, the company has effectively ensured the continued high quality sales management of our Western Canadian stores."

## Wong to Vice President BMG Canada Finance

Don Kollar, President and General Manager, BMG Music Canada, has announced the appointment of Liew Wong to the position of Vice President of Finance. Ms. Wong, a Chartered Accountant, was most recently Controller for the Cineplex Odeon Corporation.

In making the above announcement, Kollar stated, "Liew joins us at a very exciting time. She is a valued addition to BMG's management team."

## Whittaker tour still on despite murder of father

Roger Whittaker, whose father was murdered this past March 31st., has indicated through his Canadian publicist, Gino Empry, that he will still tour Canada as planned. "He has no intention of cancelling the tour," said Empry. Whittaker is currently in his native Kenya, where his parents have lived for sixty years. "He just wants to make sure his mother is well taken care of before he leaves the country," Empry continues.

The elder Whittaker, 84-year old Edward, was killed at his Nairobi home by burglars. His mother, Violet, aged 83, was tied up, but apparently not hurt.

Whittaker's Canadian tour begins at The Grand Theatre in Sudbury, where he will play two shows (April 27-28). The western leg of the tour is capped at Vancouver's Queen Elizabeth Theatre (May 19-20), after which he will commence his Atlantic provinces tour at St. John's Memorial Stadium (23), followed by Centre 200 in Sydney (25), Halifax's Metro Centre (26), the Moncton Coliseum (27) and Fredericton's Aitken Centre, the final date.

## Cinram sales are up but earnings reduced

For the year ended December 31, 1988, Cinram has announced an increase of 38 percent over 1987 (\$40.0 million vs \$29.1 million). Net earnings before extraordinary items for the year were \$3.4 million or \$0.45 per share vs \$3.4 or \$0.44 per share in 1987. Final net earnings after extraordinary items were \$3.2 million or \$0.42 per share vs \$3.7 million, or \$0.49 share in 1987.

Shipments in the fourth quarter were up for all configurations. This included a large increase in vinyl record shipments, the result of new customers acquired in the third quarter. Although shipments were up, the company experienced reduced earnings, citing transitional costs associated with absorbing the additional business.

Much of the increased sales for 1988 came from shipments of compact discs. However, the earnings of CDs in the second half of the year did not reach a level required to generate the same margins as other configurations. In view of the compact disc equipment being put into operation,

total depreciation and amortization charges for the year increased to \$3,059,000 from \$1,706,000 over the previous year.

It was also revealed that the acquisition of Praxis Technologies in 1988 had a "negative" impact on earnings. It's expected, however, that Cinram will benefit over the next few years from significant tax loss carry-forwards available.

So far this year, the company reports orders are ahead of last year, particularly with a sharp growth in orders of CDs.

In February of this year, 644,284 warrants were exercised and converted into 1,932,852 common shares of the company. This increased cash balances by an additional \$7,570,000. As a result, the total number of common shares outstanding is 9,576,000. On what is described as a "fully-diluted basis," earnings for the year, before extraordinary items, were \$0.40 per share vs. \$0.39 in 1987. After extraordinary items, fully-diluted earnings per share were \$0.38 vs \$0.42 in 1987.



## A&M celebrates platinum on Sam Brown's debut

After months of pushing, and having recently surpassed the platinum sales plateau, A&M Records are now celebrating the success of Stop, Sam Brown's debut album. According to A&M's Jim Monaco, from his hospital bed in Toronto, Canada is the only country to have earned this distinction so far, which has caused the label, stateside, to take another look at the record and its first single, the title track, although the second single, This Feeling, was released to Canadian radio this week.

While citing strong support from all areas of the industry, Monaco adds that initially, radio stations were responsible for getting the project off the ground. Their response, in the early stages, was "critical" and coupled with "a bit of luck and a lot of hammering" the first single began its long, hard climb up the charts. In fact, because of the record's immediate success in Quebec, the story strongly resembles "the good old days," recalls Monaco, when bands like Supertramp were launched in la belle province.

In the past few years, Quebec has really distanced itself from the rest of the country, actually creating its own music industry in the process, and this has paved yet another avenue for the major labels to explore for their own new artists. Spreading success across provincial borders though is proving to be more difficult than in previous

years. However, primarily due to A&M's commitment, Sam Brown provides a notable exception.

"It just goes to show you that there's room for a great song and a credible artist," Monaco continues, "and that you can still break someone out of that market, which is very healthy. I don't think it happens as much as it used to, but then again, I don't really think any other record company works the way ours does, because of our position in the market. We don't have very many guaranteed hits, so it's necessary for us to really commit. From day one, it began with

the promotion department. We're a little company and we can't do it any other way. We'll work something well beyond the point that other people normally would.

"We have a lot of artists who aren't mainstream and it's only one thing to be committed, it's another to see your commitment flower. It's not like we can make a hit out of whatever we want. If we could do that . . . well, I'd be retired and in the south of France right now. It's a question of giving the consumer the opportunity to make a choice," he concludes, "and the public, here, has decided. Now, there is the opportunity for Sam Brown to become a big star."

## Skid Row's Bach goes "wild" in Virginia

A "foul mouth" doesn't sit too well with officials in Hampton, Virginia, as Skid Row's lead vocalist Sebastian Bach recently discovered.

The band was playing Hampton's 14,000 seater arena and apparently, Bach got hold of a complaint letter that suggested the band was "a foul-mouthed, untalented group, who were found in the gutter," and recommended that they "be put back in the gutter where they belong." Bach read the letter in its entirety and then forewarned those in his audience "with weak ears" to "step out into the foyer and get some popcorn or something for the next few minutes," while he "foul-mouthed" up a storm.

He was arrested and handcuffed just prior to the band's encore, Youth Gone Wild, and charged with "using abusive and violent language." He spent the night in the local jail and the next day, was fined \$35 and told "never to return" to Hampton.

## Toronto Blues Society honours Daddy Cool

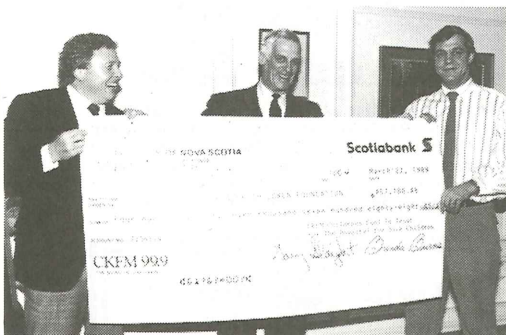

(EC: *He'll make money on it!!*)

**Save the longboxes . . . ?** Yes, save the longboxes and build plazas on the raped countryside. Have you killed a tree today? There's one defender of the longbox who claims he knows at least 400 customers who save the longbox. (EC: *They save the longbox and throw away the CD!!*)

When you have good company, the event can really be an EVENT. Joanne Smale arranged this one, and she seems to be doing most of them these days. The food was good, but I hate being limited to just beer and wine. (EC: *That's your limit anyway isn't it . . . one beer?*)

**Marketing expertise . . . !** Watch for a large organization to get marketing conscious over the next little while. They've just taken on a couple of new, old hands, and it will be interesting to see if they can create attitudinal change within that hierarchy. It's certainly needed. (EC: *Not just in that company . . . !*)

**Just a matter of speaking . . . !** I was sitting with a group made up of record company executives, broadcasters and promotion and sales people the other day, and what an experience. I actually saw a record company president squirm over the language being used. No . . . it wasn't foul-mouthed language . . . it was like, hey man, and a very expressive usage of today's method of communicating. It wasn't the young sales or promotion people who were mousing off, it was a record company executive, who was trying too hard to be "in". It just didn't fit. Like the guy with a 50-year old face, and a 20-year old rug. (EC: *It's not bad if it's on straight . . . !*)

**COVER STORY - by Graeme Boyce****Brighton Rock melting metal to fit pop mold**

New and struggling bands can kickstart their careers into high gear any number of ways, but among the most popular are: writing a hit song, or simply touring until the cows come home and forcing the media to pay attention. Even though they have written a hit song, and they are constantly on the road, for Brighton Rock, the task is a little tougher in Canada. Because they are Canadian, getting the media to pay attention is proving to be most difficult, not in any other country, but in their own backyard.

Trying to get the Canadian press to take Canadian bands seriously seems to be an age old problem, certainly one that has plagued the music industry for decades. Editorial space for musicians is never taken for granted and is always fought for, especially for Toronto-based bands, in the daily newspapers in Toronto, says Gerry McGhee. However, sooner or later, the press at home will have to listen to and print, he hopes, their story, because the band will be too successful to ignore.

While promoting Brighton Rock's second album, *Take A Deep Breath*, the lead vocalist points out that his band should be taken seriously today, in view of the fact that *One More Try*, the first single, has entered the top twenty in Canada and their recent tour sold out in all but one city. This, apparently, is all without the support of any metal fanzine, only because there are none in this country, such as *Circus* or *Hit Parader*.

**Berofo to Oak Street as Director of Marketing**

Fred Penner and Gilles Paquin, of the Winnipeg-based Oak Street Music, have announced the appointment of Stephen Berofo as Director of Marketing. He comes to Oak Street following twenty years of industry experience, including appointments at Elephant Records and Virgin Records Canada.

As Berofo points out, "With Oak Street's success at the 1989 Juno Awards for Fred Penner's Place and Lullaby Berceuse, I feel this label will become a major vehicle for the development of quality Canadian family entertainment."

Although, he stresses, the band will be featured on the cover of *Kerrang*, regarded as metal music's bible. Still, the show must go on.

So, as they did last year, Brighton Rock must attempt to secure as many opening slots on arena tours as they can, a feat which requires a hit song, or more blatantly, money. Most tours are packaged in the U.S., yet this remains virtually the only way to appease the teenaged audiences, who are buying the records. Unfortunately, there are no tours worth joining, but they are not letting their hit song go to waste, not at all. "We'll go out and do the clubs," McGhee explains, "because we don't want to sit at home twiddlin' our thumbs, waiting for a tour. The only reason we do records and videos is so we can go out and tour live."

"Our record company said this is going to be the most silent gold record in the last ten years. The record's going gold and nobody knows about it," he continues, "because these people just don't want to acknowledge us. The British are taking us seriously, the Americans have taken us seriously, but we can't get our own people to take us seriously and that's really frustrating. More than anything, we want to do really well here."

The band's debut, *Young Wild And Free*, was produced by Michael Wagener, and garnered the band, not only international press, but also several Toronto Music Awards last year. *Take A Deep Breath* was produced by Canadian veteran Jack Richardson. But McGhee informs, given their druthers, they would not likely record at all, although there have been no problems in the studio to date. However, they realize they have to, it's the nature of the business. "Rock 'n' roll is supposed to be played in front of people, first and foremost," McGhee continues. "If we could just go out and play all these places, then I don't think we'd make records, they're so expensive."

Having matured and grown a little wiser over the past year, and having toured with Triumph and Joan Jett, among others, the band chose to record a much sparser album this time, leaving many tracks actually empty. The new album was a venture into regenerating their live show, careful not to

sound too overproduced or clinical, from a technical standpoint. In fact, McGhee notes, consumers can't really be aware of the differences between, for instance, live drumming and a beat box, and that most bands are moving away from the technology that has brought so many faceless bands into prominence in the past few years.

"The way we look at it," continues McGhee, "is that this is the same thing they did to Rush. When they started out, they were the band everyone loved to hate. If the press comes around . . . great. We appreciate their support and we wish everyone was on our side, but it's never going to be that way." He concludes with, "We just don't let it bother us . . . we do our gig and keep on writing."

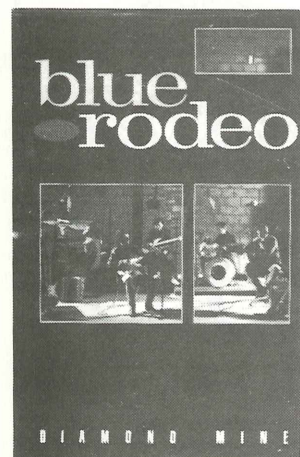

Whether they achieve international acclaim or not, Blue Rodeo carry the banner high for Canada. In a musical world soured in recent years with so many new acts manufactured merely for an assortment of economic reasons, the music industry should delight in such a record as this. The songs vary, their lengths vary, and because the band has been left to their own devices, the virtually unadorned potpourri of material encapsulates their wisdom and vision, for all new bands to rival. Keyboardist Wiseman adds depth, almost Doorsian at times, to the Keelor and Cuddy compositions, where otherwise they might simply be considered ordinary and certainly not as colourful as they now are. Watch God And Country and Now And Forever follow in the footsteps of the title track. Both are sure-fire hits. - GB

**EXTREME** - Rock  
Extreme - A&M - SP-5238-W

Spawned from the same Boston scene that produced Aerosmith, Extreme share that band's penchant for catchy guitar riffs and funk-rock hooks. The band seems to have learned a great deal from the arena rock masters and are now translating all that playing experience onto vinyl with songs that demonstrate their proficiency and development. Wind Me Up is especially hook laden and should be automatic selection for AOR. - BW

**SEBASTIAN** - Pop  
White Liberals On Reggae  
Cabbage Town - CT-010

Sebastian first came into being with The Lords Of London, a '60s pop band, at best, "sucky pop", which may have been the reason the regenerated Sebastian is now known as a "no bullshit, sometimes off-side, politically incorrect," tunesmith of today. One thing is for sure, he's ripe for a cult following and this production by Andy Camp (Studio B) has enough balls to open a few doors. The core trio of Sebastian (guitar and vocals) comprise bassist Donny Johnston and drummer Jim Dumanski, and they are given a little enhancement by Curtis Driedger (former leader of The CeeDees) on fiddle, and mouth harpist Lance Bennett. The title track is key along with No Compromise, Spanish Gold and Toss Of The Ice. - WG

**JAY W. MCGEE** - Pop/Soul  
Survivor - Quantum - QR-88001

Boasting a musical career as a background vocalist for the Modern Drifters and then fronting the likes of the Otis Brothers, Giant Steps, Crack of Dawn and Salongo, it's only natural that Halifax-born McGee should have a smooth-as-silk vocal soul quality. The timing, projection and vocal purity this talent commands should be let loose for the enjoyment of the masses. Produced at Toronto's Kensington Sound by Zezi Tayyeb, who also provides effective synthesizer and guitar inserts. Key are 21st Century Dreamer and I'm A Survivor, the latter released as a single. - WG

**MAD ABOUT PLAID** - Pop  
Plaiditudes - Quantum - QR-88002-E

This obviously well-taught group present a polished debut, perhaps more than necessary though, perhaps taking away from the energy. Having mixed a variety of musical styles quite well, and maintaining a steady pace throughout, they display potential and at retail (if convinced) should pull off some respectable numbers. A classy, yet enjoyable set. - GB

**SHENANDOAH** - Country  
The Road Not Taken  
Columbia - FC-44468-H

For a left-fielder country band that a few critics said wouldn't make it, Shenandoah just might have the last laugh. There's more than a slight country soul feel here, vocally manipulated by lead singer Marty Raybon. The instrumental backing and vocal harmonies are as free-flowing as the song material. Lots of good programming. Contains She Doesn't Cry Anymore and Mama Knows, both of which, along with the title track, paved the chart way for this band. Produced at Muscle Shoals by Rick Hall and Robert Byrne. - WG

**CHARLEY PRIDE** - Country  
Moody Woman  
16th Avenue - D1-70554-N

White Houses, Pride's current single release, has already made moves up the charts and there's a few more tracks here that should follow. Included are Roger Miller's penning of Heaven Help Us All, a duet with Dion Pride, Sail Away, written by Mickey Newbury and Amy's Eyes from the team of T. Brown and J. Prater-Hunt. That's David Briggs on keyboards and Harold Bradley on bass with a little mouth harping from Charlie McCoy. - WG

## THE SANDMEN WESTERN BLOOD

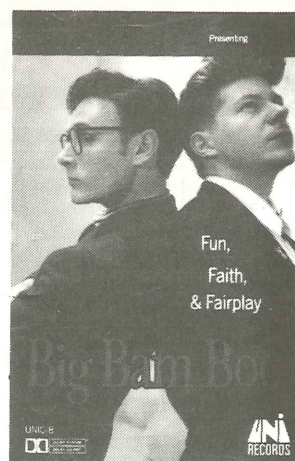


**SANDMEN** - Rock

A&M is excited about this particular release and they have a perfect right to be. The Sandmen are an up-front, no nonsense quintet from Denmark dispensing the kind of rock that was popular fifteen years ago and is still sensational today. Lead vocalist Allen Vegenfeldt doles out the swaggering asides of an experienced frontman, and he's accompanied by a twin guitar attack which rivals those in some of the veteran blues based rock bands. AOR has several key tracks to choose from, including The Bell Man, Hate Your Ways and I Met A Girl. - BW

**ELSWORTH JAMES** - Soca  
Tribute To Ben Johnson

The record contains some lively soca, including the title track which points the finger of blame at everyone but Ben Johnson. Distributed by Soca Village Distribution. Cancon. - CM



**BIG BAM BOO** - Pop/Rock  
Fun, Faith & Fairplay  
Uni - UNIC-8-J

A British/Canadian coupling that has the makings of a North American hit. The tack is obviously simplicity, almost a folksy approach, which immediately attracts the ear and once cocked, the lyrics assault the senses with message power, particularly the Justice track. Both Shark, the Canadian (guitars), and Simon, the Britisher (guitars and keyboards), sing lead, and the vocals almost belie the lyrical content with their raw, youthful, sometimes straining, but carefully cushioned vibrancy. Also key is Shooting From My Heart, an impressive door-opener as the first single, but don't overlook Dream Song. Shark and Simon wrote all the material. Produced in England by Richard Manwaring. - WG

**IRISH ROVERS** - Pop  
Hardstuff - Attic - LAT-1253-W

Shades of The Unicorn, but that was 22 years ago, and times have certainly changed, however, this happy group of tepechaunic music makers still have that "gift" of partymaking on disc. With this Bill Henderson produced session, our happy quintet gets down to their Irish folk roots, given a touch more believability through their guests, The Chieftains. They try their hand, and very well, with Mamma's Got A Squeezbox, the Who classic, as well as with material from Tom Northcott (Don't Fly Away), Randy Bachman (The Other Side Of The Evening) and Bryan Adams and Jim Vallance (All Sing). The latter is the first single from this album, which is one of the best of all-format releases this year. - WG

## Zarr in studio with BMG's Jeacocke

Producer Fred Zarr has been in Phase One Studios in Toronto putting the finishing touches on Sheree Jeacocke's new album. He

describes Jeacocke's songs as "strong, with an unusual blend of pop, R&B and rock." Zarr is known for his work with Whitney Houston, Madonna, Pretty Poison, Samantha Fox and, most recently, with Debbie Gibson and her Electric Youth LP.

BMG has scheduled the album for release later this year.

## Round Sound session for Micallef single

Blue Crystal recording artist Chuck Micallef has just completed work at Toronto's Round Sound on his next single, entitled A Pretty Sight. He is including his past charter, Loving You, on the flip. This single peaked at No. 23 on the RPM country chart after a run of fourteen weeks.

Micallef, once again, utilized the services of Toronto's top studio people for his recording date, which he co-produced with Bob Federer, who was also engineer on the session. 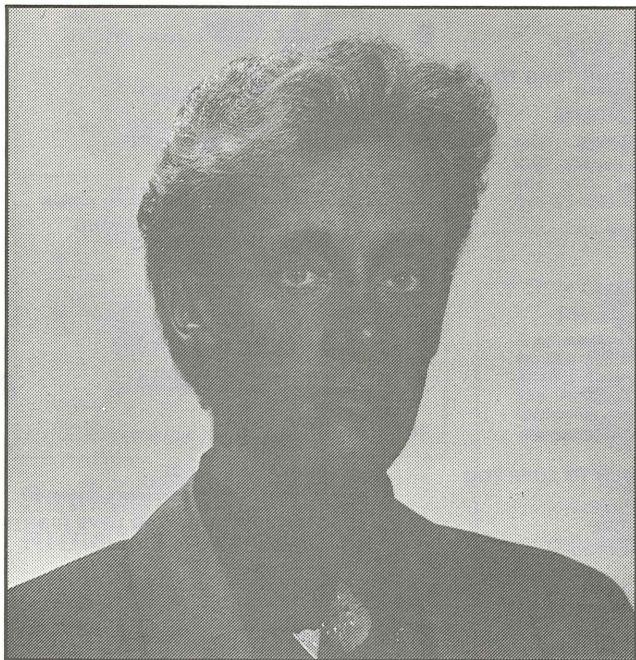

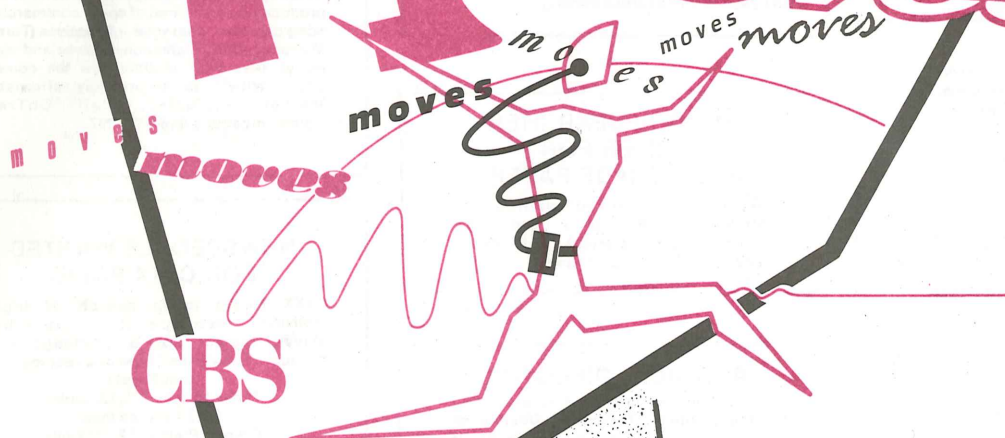
