### Battle lines forming on behalf of tunesmiths

What must be an embarrassment to the federal government is the reluctance to abolish the category in the Canadian Copyright Act dealing with Compulsory Licences. Section 19 of the Copyright Act, which took effect in 1921, established a compulsory licensing system for the mechanical reproduction of literary, dramatic and musical works. In essence, the section provides that once a mechanical reproduction of such work has been made, anyone else can make their own recording of that work if they meet the requirements of the Act.

The royalty rate of 2 cents (per song) in Canada is still the same as it was in 1924 and is subject to change through legislation only. Compared to other countries, Canada is at the bottom of the ladder, paying songwriters and music publishers 20 cents per album, compared to \$1.10 in Switzerland, \$1.03 in Japan, 70 cents in the U.S., 62 cents in the U.K., and 33 cents in Hungary.

The Canadian Music Publishers Association (CMPA) is currently marshalling an assault on government in hopes of having the outdated Section 19 abolished. Mel Shaw, veteran songwriter and producer in lending his expertise in this fight, suggests, "It is possible there is no other area of Canadian law, so confining to an art form and business that restricts to the degree as does the 'compulsory license,' a stipulation that states a song is to receive only 2 cents for each recorded use."

Continuing with, "The decades that this rule has been in effect are from the '20s through the '80s . . . consider the changes. There are very few items, created and sold, that carry such a high appreciation and estimation by the consumer . . . and yet have

In fact, there may only be one, a recorded song."

Shaw goes on to suggest that "This federal government can make a change - that they themselves have researched and found to be needed, without waiting until another absurdity is placed before the public and its media, resulting in embarrassment to us all. Canada should walk and not be dragged from our 'piano roll' royalty into the compact disc era."

Shaw concludes with "This Conservative government is now in the 'time-frame' to celebrate with international acclaim the removal of the compulsory license to benefit all composers and music publishers. Let's have fair value for creative dreams."

John Bird, of Gordon V. Thompson Limited, remembers very well, joining the music publishing firm in 1946, and even at that time, the president of the firm, Gordon Thompson was seeking changes in the "outdated" Copyright Act - a fight he carried on over the years with each successive government. When Mr. Thompson died in 1965, Bird took over as president and continued the "written and verbal" war, urging various governments to do something about the Act.

"In 1967, the Economic Council called for briefs re: copyright revision," Bird

## No Supertramp 'hits' LP but Police to carry A&M

Currently selling in Europe, and available on import domestically, is Supertramp's latest release titled The Autobiography Of Supertramp. Although the package would have undoubtedly sold very well during the holiday buying season for A&M Records, "Unfortunately," relates A&M's Vice President of Sales, Bill Ott, "we don't have the rights."

Apparently, the group's management believes releasing a "hits" package in North America "would be perceived as the end of the group," explains Ott. Rick Davies is writing material presently for a new album that is tentatively slated for a second quarter release next year.

A&M is riding into the heaviest buying season atop the laurels of The Police, Chris deBurgh and associated label product such as OMD and Human League.

This past year, Ott reveals, has seen the company achieve a great deal of success breaking (relatively) new acts. Among these are Janet Jackson and Iggy Pop's latest Blah Blah Blah. However, acts like David & David and Haywire are also providing satisfaction, given tightening radio playlists.

In spite of the fact these formats have presented problems for certain record companies, Ott maintains A&M's "diversity", which ranges from the Christian Word label to the jazz Concord label and from the pop/rock realm to children's records, has kept the label running at full steam as the new year approaches.

"The only label not represented is a classical one," concludes Ott, "and actually we are expecting to close a deal shortly, with an international label of some significance." recalls, "and we all thought ... 'at last!' We were given a deadline of 2 weeks to deliver our comments. We burned the midnight oil and met the deadline. Twenty years later, we're still waiting."

Bird continues with "I've told this story to a succession of Ministers, Deputy Ministers, Assistant Deputy Ministers etc. etc. They come and go, come and go, but I'm still here... waiting. This year, I celebrated my 40th year in the music publishing business with the same company, and the same Copyright Act . . . and the same 2 cents. Now, we are told that the government and bureacrats find themselves incapable of comprehending the complexities of the issues."

He concludes with "As Casey Stengel once said, 'Doesn't anybody know how to play this game?""

### LPs going the way of 8-track - ROW's Herzog

Citing diminishing sales in secondary markets, Records On Wheels' Paul Herzog

claims his figures indicate the album configuration is "dying off" and that in 2 to 5 years, will be "as popular as the 8-track."

Herzog, who services over 600 accounts nationally, also says the company is "thinking of changing the name

to Wheels," because they believe the reference to "Records" will soon be dated.

Overall, sales of cassettes outnumbers albums, yet cassette figures have levelled off, albums are declining and compact disc sales are increasing.

The CD figure would be much higher, "but we can't meet the demand," he continues. "We're ordering say 1,000 units and getting anywhere from a 5 to 10 percent fill. On certain new releases, we're ordering as many CDs as LPs. There would be even more of a gap, if we would have the fill and if that were the case, they'd probably double LP sales."

Herzog goes on to suggest that there are those who "still want to open up record stores," but that record sales are primarily limited to downtown locations. "We're opening new stores that only stock CD and cassette configurations," he continues. "In one particular secondary market store, on one 'typical' Saturday, the retailer reported selling 125 cassettes, 15 CDs and only 1 album, yet he had "just as many album titles in stock as cassette titles."

In areas where, 3 or 4 years ago, albums represented 80 percent of sales, "the LP has now almost died," Herzog indicates, "and the downtown phenomena is strange but true, their clientele haven't even switched to the CD format."

Not helping the album's future is the fact that "in the new year," concludes Herzog, "we can expect a dollar to 2 dollar increase in the price of album titles from the manufacturers."

## Record industry set for battle over DAT

At a conference held in Vancouver, this past December 11, officials from the Electronic Industry Association of Japan (EIAJ), the International Federation of Phonogram and Videogram Producers (IFPI) and the Recording Industry Association of America (RIAA) met to try and reconcile their differences concerning Digital Audio Tape (DAT) recorders.

The recording industry wants an anticopying device implemented into the DATs manufacturing process, using "Copy-Code" technology developed by the CBS Technology Centre. Copyrighted recordings could then be "encoded" by recording companies during the mastering stage, thereby inhibiting home taping and the piracy of such

# Sturdy cassette mailer designed by PRO PAK

PRO PAK Cassette Mailer of Thunder Bay, in their search to find a cost efficient way to handle TV mail order purchases, has resulted in what they describe as "a first in the design and manufacture of the PRO PAK cassette mailer." The lightweight package that meets postal regulations of 7/8ths thick and 100g weight comes under the first class mailing rate of 68 cents - and is constructed of 1/16" thick corrugated cardboard (address side white, other side brown) that is easy to handle, transport and store.

The mailer, specially designed for strength and cassette protection by tapered or wedged ends, can be used for cassette demos (publishers, artists, songwriters etc.) or TV mail order companies. If necessary to mail 2 cassettes, 2 packages can be taped together and mailed at a cost of \$1.12 first class (packages should be taped flat, side by side to maintain the 7/8ths thick postal regulations).

The cassette mailer has been tested through TV mail order purchases across Canada and the U.S. for the past year and there have reportedly been "no breakages of any kind to date."

## Hornsby & The Range hit No. 1 and gold in Canada

Bruce Hornsby and The Range have been certified as gold sellers for their album, The Way It Is (in both Canada and the U.S.) and the album has now entered the top berth of the RPM 100, nudging out Bon Jovi.

The album has been a labour of love for RCA/Ariola's National Promotion Manager Ken Bain, who has been plugging the band's debut since its release in March (see RPM, Aug. 30/86). The single entered the RPM A/C chart on Aug. 30, and went on to enjoy 13 weeks on that chart. The second single, the title track, with its move into the top spot, has now been charting for 12 weeks.

The band has just completed a 5-week tour of Europe and will be playing Vancouver's Coliseum Dec. 21. product.

DAT is a relatively new configuration that embodies "perfect" digital sound in a small cassette about half the size of a conventional analog cassette and is the tape equivalent of the compact disc. The Japanese regard this development simply as "recording equipment" and feel that mounting antitaping devices would destroy its main function - audio recording - and will reduce the value of DAT as a commodity to "practically nil," according to Toshio Takai, EIAJ president.

Evidently the tremendous sales potential of the DAT recording system, and its impact on the recording industry, was reflected in the seniority of those in attendence at the conference. The EIAJ delegation included: Akio Morita, chairman, Sony; Akio Tanai, president, Matsushita; Seiji Sudo, president, Hitachi; Ishiro Shinji, chairman, JVC; as well as Takai.

IFPI representatives included: Bhaskar Menon, chairman, EMI; Mo Ostin, chairman, Warner Brothers; Robert Summer, president, CBS International; Jan Timmer, president, PolyGram; Chris Wright, chairman, Chrysalis; Walter Yetnikoff, president, CBS Records; Ian Thomas, director general of IFPI; and Nesuhi Ertegun, IFPI president, and chairman, WEA International.

Other seemingly detrimental aspects of the DAT equipment is its impact on the CD market, that DAT might actually replace the CD. However, Takai assures they compliment each other and eventually "both will find their respective niches." He adds, "Furthermore, whether to choose the CD or the DAT must be left to the discretion of the consumers."

The EIAJ delegates also delineate between the consumer's "right" of home taping practices and of piracy. The recording industry does not. Takai believes anti-taping devices would not curb piracy anyway, "which should be the real target of denunciation," he says. "Only prosecution will eradicate piracy."

In this regard, the EIAJ does not view the question of delaying or disabling the DAT as having anything to do with any issue of international trade. That, rather, it is a question of every country's domestic copyright law.

EIAJ chairman Saba confirms, "We can have a full and vigorous meeting today while being careful not to violate anti-trust laws." Because home taping, legal in Japan, is an issue settled by each country, Takai points out, "Home taping is nothing more than a variation of the mode of usage, the price of which the consumer has already paid." They also question why present-day analog audio tape recorders do not require anti-taping devices.

However, the EIAJ's non-acceptance of the sound recording copyright protection was deplored by IFPI president Ertegun. "We had hoped for a positive, constructive response that would be sensitive to the rights and career needs of our artists, our songwriters, and our companies," he laments. "Instead we found these concerns unheeded, and the makers of DAT will ignore copyrights. In the long run consumers and music lovers will suffer."

The video is also receiving airplay on MuchMusic and twice this past week on CBC's Video Hits.

She's Got, the debut single by Jato on Parallel One Records, is due for a February release and work has begun on the video that is being shot by James O'Mara and Kate Ryan (Bryan Adams, Loverboy etc.) of Vancouver. Watch for both Body Electric and Jato on tour seperately in early 1987.

A&M recording artist Domenic Troiano's latest release, the theme song from the CBS/CTV hit cop show Night Heat, is being very well received. Watch for another television theme release - of CBC's Airwaves, coming in 1987.

Anne's Theme, the first single from Hagood Hardy's 11 album, and Geminiwinning music score from the acclaimed CBC drama - Anne Of Green Gables, debuts on RPM's Adult Contemporary chart at No. 21. ### 1986 - a year of "hot albums" - in retrospect

As always, this past year, our music industry certainly had its share of dissent, disappointment, disillusionment, and eventual disagreement within the very circles that idealistically should be working together. The bottom line however, is that the various labels were able to adapt to the softening formats and tightening playlists; while in the wake of recent surveys, radio stations have discovered that going "gold" was not the answer that in the short run would appear to be a profitable venture.

Canadian record releases were many, including a good variety of independent material. However, with few exceptions, these releases did not fare well in the international arena. As the new year approaches, those few exceptions continue their momentum, both at home and abroad. Overall, the labels, fortunate enough to obtain U.S. distribution, achieved only marginal success for their acts - not from any lack of effort, merely a lack of commitment from their foreign counterparts.

Young and new bands, trying to surface, were handed quite a task. A few were able to surmount the obstacles placed in their paths

to fame and glory. Of the bands that crashed through the barrier, Glass Tiger was perhaps our greatest success story. They were subsequently rewarded at this year's Junos, and presumably, at the bank as well.

Chartwise, WEA Music of Canada turned in a great year of releases. Their product topped the charts for many consecutive months and they enjoyed considerable fortune in breaking new acts as well, including Simply Red, Anita Baker and most recently The Georgia Satellites. In January, in what turned out to be quite a surprise for the label, Mike & The Mechanics' self-titled album made its debut and moved quickly, to help the Genesis "family" domination of rack space during the summer months - later joined by Peter Gabriel's So and Genesis' Invisible Touch, as well as Phil Collins' long-running No Jacket Required album.

The entry of the self-titled album by the Fine Young Cannibals marked the start of a very respectable year for IRS Records, which eventually had chart-topping product from Belinda Carlisle and Dr. And The Medics. For IRS' Canadian distributor, MCA Records, scored their "best year ever" with their associated labels also releasing charttopping material.

The February release of Bruce Cockburn's World Of Wonders unfortunately did not accrue enough sales to maintain the entire True North roster. The label was trimmed by founder Bernie Finkelstein, leaving several artists "label-less", notably Murray McLauchlan and Doug Cameron.

Also felled was Quality Records and its roster of artists including FM and Images in Vogue. The latter remains unsigned, while MCA picked up FM's latest release, Contest, however, the band's fate is in doubt.

Following Cockburn's release, another perennial favourite, Anne Murray, found herself charting with Something To Talk About, which began the Cancon chart domination by Capitol throughout the year. Highly successful with their domestic product, this contrasted the rather mediocre year for their international talent. Both Bob Seger and Tina Turner made impressive chart runs, but Paul McCartney didn't, and Duran Duran still might.

Mid-March saw Robert Palmer's Riptide album finally achieve chart recognition, which was fueled by his hit single, Addicted To Love, propelling Island Records through one of their best years. Yet Island eagerly anticipates the arrival of a new U2 record, and in conjunction with the planned 25th Anniversary celebrations, next year looks to be their most rewarding.

The upcoming weeks, CBS and WEA square off with the release of The Rolling

Stones' Dirty Work and Van Halen's 5150. Although the Stones got the better jump, entering at No. 49 with a bullet (the second highest debut - Bruce Springsteen's Live set came in at No. 20), 5150 continues to chart today, proving that commecialism sells. Van Halen also tallied higher scores than their former frontman and nemesis, David Lee Roth, who released his second solo effort, Eat 'Em And Smile - it contained no ballads however.

As the summer months approached, WEA had all the ballads they needed however, hitting radio and retail week after week with albums by Peter Gabriel, Genesis, Madonna, Gordon Lightfoot, Steve Winwood, and Peter Cetera. The week of their respective releases, each album made its debut as the highest new entry. So did The Smiths and Roth's album.

Unfortunately, WEA lost a substantial amount of its domestic roster when Duke Street Records signed a new distribution agreement with MCA. Soon after, that particular label was on release with new product from Lionel Richie, Huey Lewis, Boston and Billy Idol - all of which accounted for their "best year" in sales. With the Chrysalis contract up for renewal this month, the label's success in the new year could conceivably be

### Challenge at radio in breaking acts - label execs

Format adjustments and the cautious nature of some radio stations during the course of 1986 have made it more difficult for record companies to establish new recording acts, according to representatives from both CBS Records Canada and WEA Music of Canada.

"There are some stations that are exciting their audience and trying to keep them entertained," says Kim Zayac, Director of National Promotion & Media Relations for CBS Records Canada, "but the majority of them are bogged down - and some seem to feel they're boring. If it's not gold music, then it's a problem of stations pulling back.

"CHUM AM is more current for me than CFTR," he continues, "and CHUM is

basically a gold station. It also bothers me that there are some stations using consultants from outside the country. I think this is unhealthy."

"I think radio in 1986 was a bit stalemated said Larry Green, National Promotion Manager for WEA Music of Canada. "They're between a rock and a hard place, and where it should go next. They're really not sure where they should turn."

Green stressed that WEA had an excellent year, but he believes that format changes and adjustments make it difficult to "maximize the sales potential of an act."

"Radio still has the attitude that it's not their job to sell records," says Zayac. "But they still have to be concerned about the flow of records. We have to be in touch with their needs. In some cases, stations are just trying to protect their lead by not playing a record that is unproven."

Zayac is concerned that some programmers are too worried about turning people off, and not interested enough in turning them on.

"It's easier for radio to turn a corner, but not so easy for us," said Green. "When they change formats they sometimes leave a gap. If everyone's going for the same demographic, it's difficult to get some music played. We have to find more creative ways to sell our product and the creative companies will survive."

Green made it clear he had no major complaints with radio this year, noting that many records have broken in Canada. But he pointed out that some stations have become overcautious.

"Someone, sometimes has to step out and make a choice," said Green. "Somebody's got to take more chances. FM is still stepping out a little sooner than AM."

Zayac believes one of the main reasons stations are either making format changes or format adjustments is in order to aim for the age group the advertisers want - national advertisers in particular.

"It's based purely on economics," continues Zayac. "National advertisers want that 22 to 49 age bracket. The sales departments are dictating the music being played. I don't want to keep them (radio) from making money - but stations should remember where the music is coming from - and that's the record companies."

Zayac explained that with the major bulk of the audience getting older, the listeners still want to hear older material, songs they're familiar with. He acknowledged that gold does get good results and listeners are comfortable with it. He said stations are uncomfortable with unexposed material.

One of the major problems would appear to be non-consistency when it comes to Southern Ontario stations charting Top 10 records or No. 1 hits and Western stations ignoring these chart items, or vice versa. Zayac is of the opionion that some programmers

halved. Chrysalis is distributed by CBS stateside.

The week of Oct. 18 saw 2 key albums charted, albums that were released months prior. They were Bruce Hornsby & The Range, and David & David's Boomtown. Obviously, new acts were being broken, radio proving it is the strongest medium to do so.

While the majority of the industry was gearing up for the Junos (and as the Stones'

album dropped off the charts with Van Halen sitting at No. 24), CBS was readying the Bruce Springsteen Live set, advertising, "Yes, retailers, there is a Santa Claus."

In the meantime, examples of albums exemplifying a "back to the basics" approach were released, one with fanfare, the other without, but both harbingers of a sound to come. Their labels not wanting to hear about commercializing or adding a synthesizer track. However, no sooner had the needle been dropped on those than U.K.'s Duran Duran and Paul Young were explaining the virtues of, and how important the guitar was, to their projects. Much of this however, can be directly attributed to the phenonemal success and influence of Bryan Adams' gutsy Reckless, which was certified diamond last year.

Another Cancon diamond success was Corey Hart for his Boy In The Box album. His follow-up, Fields Of Fire, has exploded on the charts and his latest single, Can't Help Falling In Love, could be his most successful outing.

And then Christmas came early, with the Bruce Springsteen package causing store lineups and jumping into the RPM 100's No. 1 spot after just 3 weeks, where it remains today.

#### Cole Younger Band off with bang

The Cole Younger Band's latest Academy single, Border Bandits, is off to a good start. The single, a tribute to the late Cole Younger, who rode the U.S. midwest in the 1800's with Jesse James, has been given immediate adds at stations from the West Coast through to Nova Scotia. The single was written by the band's Mike Peters. The other members of the group are Steve Kramp, Gilles Lauzon, and Tom Aquino.

#### Stoker Brothers ready with LP

Mike MacDonald, manager/booker of the Stoker Brothers, dropped off a copy of the band's new self-titled cassette, which is on hold until present distribution talks are completed. A key track on the cassette is a poporiented song, Listen To My Heart, which is expected to be released over the Valentine's Day period. Also key on the cassette is Fiddle My Time Away, a solid country outing that will be released in the spring of next year. The material on the cassette was co-written by Mickey and D.J. Stoker. The session was produced by Rick Whitelaw at Toronto's Inception Sound. Mike suggests that anyone looking for good song material should give him a call at 519-756-5147.

#### Lorelie Brooks releases on Royalty

New from the Edmonton-based Royalty label is a single by Lorelie Brooks. The session was produced by R.Harlan Smith with Wayne Saunders doing the musical arrangements. Lorelie is from Middle Lake, Saskatchewan, where she has become a local favourite.



## Cancon country chalks up one of its better years

The Canadian country music industry has just come down off one of its best years, fueled by state-of-the-art productions and exceptional song material. As well, the acceptance of Cancon at radio has also shown a vast improvement. Last year, RPM's Top 100 Country Singles could only muster 4 singles that qualified as Cancon: It Always Hurts The First Time by Carroll Baker (No. 41), Anne Murray's I Don't Think I'm Ready For You (No. 58), the duet of Gilles Godard and Kelita Haverland on We Won't Ever Say Goodbye (No. 80), and Jamie Warren's Take Me Home Mississippi (No. 100). Murray was also represented on the chart at No. 2 with Time Don't Run Out On Me, but this single did not qualify as Cancon.

In the past, Cancon country releases were usually relegated to obscure playlists, and some programmers, even to this day, discriminate against Cancon by using 2 different charts and playlists: one for international, the other for Canadian country. However, the majority of country programmers are now integrating their charts and playlists with Cancon. This prompted one country programmer to note, "Watching what was going on in both major and secondary country markets, I was quite amazed at the chart numbers that were given to Cancon singles. This action influenced me into taking another listen at some of these releases, and I even tried them on my listeners, resulting in a whole new thinking at our station. Now we playlist and chart Cancon singles on playability first, and listener reaction secondly, and both seem to be working fine." For obvious reasons, this country programmer will remain nameless.

This change in programmer attitude, plus the stepped-up production, promotion, and marketing thrust by record companies and individual artists has, this year, resulted in a healthy increase in "legitimate" Cancon country hits. RPM's Top 100 Country Singles of 1986 boasts the unheard of figure of 10 percent, plus (11 listings), Cancon.

Leading the list is Anne Murray's Now And Forever (You And Me) ( No. 6), followed by Audie Henry's He's My Gentle Man (No. 37), Take A Little Chance On Love by The Mercey Brothers (No. 67), In My Arms Tonight by Bootleg (No. 68), Hot On The Heels Of Love by The Haggertys (No. 77), Terry Carisse's Love Sweet Love (No. 80), Bootleg's Ordinary People (No. 87), Reach Out And Touch Her by Harvey Henry (No. 94), Anne Lord's I'll Never Get Over You (No. 98), Carol Martyn's It's Times Like This (No. 99), and Pretty Diamond Ring by The Mercey Brothers (No. 100). Also rare were the scoring of 2 singles each by Cancon artists: Vancouver's Bootleg, who release on the Rana label, and The Mercey Brothers, from Elmira, Ontario, who release on their own MBS label.

The year 1986 has been one of the better for Cancon country and paves the way for what should be an even greater year for 1987.

Dates for the Big Country Awards will be announced shortly.

play records "based on their own tastes and unfortunately, there are some stations not willing to play records that are not Top 40 in the U.S. Some feel their market is special, while others don't want to admit they've made a mistake. Perhaps they believe their market is unique and individual."

Zayac goes on to suggest that these stations are sometimes throwing away hits, and he finds this type of behaviour odd because the song's potential has been proven in another major market.

Green, on the other hand, is of the opinion that stations were making the first move when it comes to format changes, rather than merely pleasing their advertisers.

"I think stations are moving in whatever direction necessary in order to get an audience," says Green. "The more listeners they have, the more successful they are financially. I think if a station changes format, certain advertisers will certainly step forward, but I also think it's the stations that are making the move first."

Green pointed out that when stations change formats, or make adjustments, record companies have to think creatively and determine other ways to sell records.

Zayac says radio could give new acts "a much better shake," but he finds the popular argument is that it's not radio's concern.

# The gold format will burn itself out in time

Zayac points out. "We have so much consideration for what they do - and they should have the same consideration for us. I want to achieve their goals, and at the same time achieve mine," he continues. "My attitude is, how can I best serve a station in order for them to get more listeners.

"It sounds like I'm painting a gloomy picture," says Zayac. "But these stations go in cycles. I think the gold format, for instance, will burn itself out. Certain stations are cautious. It's those consulted by companies from other countries. Toronto is particularly tight and Ontario is a problem. Montreal is still fairly open, and Vancouver is turning into a healthy market."

Zayac feels the healthiest stations are those on the FM band and AM stations not using outside consultants. He also added that Edmonton has a very healthy market. With some others, he says it's the old chicken and the egg story that stations aren't going to play it until there are sales. PM
