CIRPA/PolyGram launch for Best of Cancon Rock

The Best of Canadian Rock, available in double-CD-cassette configurations was launched at an industry event in Toronto on Oct. 7. Featured on the release are 36 original recordings spanning three decades of Canadian rock. The package had been previously released as a TV package on Ed LaBuick's TeeVee Records.

The project is a collaborative effort between many of Canada's past recording artists, record labels, music publishers, producers, managers and CIRPA. Steve Thomson, who heads up Backstage Productions, spearheaded the project.

Al Mair, President of CIRPA and Attic Records, pointed out that all proceeds to CIRPA from the sale of the package, "will be reinvested backinto support of the Canadian music industry. We must thank all the artists, producers, labels

Through the cooperation of all the major chains and rack jobbers, the package is available at retail from coast to coast.

Roper to Anthem to helm management activities

BobRoper takes on the mantle of Vice President of Anthem Entertainment, the Toronto-based umbrella company that handles Anthem Records, SRO Management, plus a variety of management, music publishing and production companies. The firm also manages the careers of Rush and Gowan.

Roper joins Anthem after years of involvement in the music industry. This includes periods as tour manager for Supertramp, concert production work with CPI, seven years as A&R Director for Warner Music Canada, and most recently as manager of Sharon, Lois & Bram, one of the five highest-grossing Canadian acts in the United States.

In making the above announcement Ray Danniels, President of Anthem Entertainment, noted, "Bob Roper is simply one of the most experienced men in the music business in Canada. His background gives us a perfect opportunity to expand the management side of our business."

Roper added, "The first thing Ray and I did was put together a list of artists that we would like to work with. We already have the machinery in place in this organization, and we want to work with other artists, from Canada or from the United States, with the determination and talent to take their careers to the limit." Thomson is also working with Ian Kennedy on the production of a three hour radio spectacular of The History of Rock in Canada. Ronnie Hawkins will host the syndicated series, which will provide profiles of many of the artists featured on The Best of Canadian Rock. The project has received support, through Bob Mackowycz, from CAPS (Canadian Artists Programs on Satellite), a division of Maclean Hunter Ltd. and KEY Radio Ltd.

Maxwell King testing market with new release

Maxwell King (aka Gino Salvador) has discovered that, contrary to general belief, radio stations do accept 7" vinyl singles. His latest Jaggar instrumental single was shipped to 200 AC/Easy Listening stations. "The response has been fantastic," says Salvador, who followed up his mailing with phone calls to the various music directors. "Yes, they accepted the single, gladly," he reports.

The methodology behind Salvador's release is a testing of the market to determine what side the music directors preferred; Maple Leaf Samba or What A Lovely Dream. "Many said they had been waiting for another Maxwell King instrumental," says Salvador. "I was pleasantly surprised and very pleased to find they are playing one or both sides and they are split almost evenly as to what is the best side."

Salvador's initial release, The Mood I'm In, made good AC chart inroads in 1989. Subsequent releases, In Love Again, The Lady Caught My Eye and Here I Am, gained impressive airplay, not only in Canada, but in Italy, the UK, and the US. He followed the singles up with an album entitled Wine & Lovers, and again, the reaction in Europe, Canada and the US, "was fantastic", he enthuses.

Salvador wrote and produced both sides of the new single, which was recorded at Rick Wilkins' Toronto studio. Wilkins, who arranged both songs, and supplied keyboards on the session, was joined by Eugene Amoro on alto sax and flute, and Jim Tate on guitar.

Salvador now plans to release a CD that will include his Wine & Lovers release, plus his latest singles.

The Jaggar label is based in Toronto.

Attic chief sees marketing as key to increased sales

Attic Records president, Al Mair, says that if record labels want to improve their sales, slashing prices isn't the way to do it. "The price of a CD isn't remotely out of line in comparison to other entertainment mediums competing for the consumer dollar. What the industry has to do is market their product better so the consumer, feels good about buying a CD or cassette."

Mair feels Dire Straits set a good example on their latest release, On Every Street, by refusing to offer discounts and instead told the label to put the extra money into marketing.

Mair practices what he preaches, as he says Attic recently hired more marketing staff to ensure the public knows more about Attic releases.

Mair says he's encouraged that US retailers will be raising the prices of CD's and hopefully

cassettes in the near future. "The Digital Compact Cassette could make a huge difference. People don't treat their cassettes with the same respect they do their CD's. The DCC will be on par with CD's, both in sound quality and packaging. We could see a big increase in sales when the DCC hits the market."

As Canada's largest independent label, Mair says Attic continues to fight the good fight, but it's not easy in the face of US competition. "People only have so much money to spend on entertainment and our airwaves and media are just inundated with so much American product. So when a person goes into a store they tend to just look for the new Guns N' Roses or Michael Jackson release.

"Hopefully if we do our job right, along with the retailers, we can make that person pick up a Canadian artist along with the big names."

Anne Murray tour - another box office triumph

Anne Murray has been touring since 1977, seven months each year, and her latest, in spite of the economically dismal state of the country, is one of her best. Leonard Rambeau, who heads up Balmur Ltd., Murray's management group, reports that even in the US, where the recession has hit hard, Murray's dates sold out. "ICM Los Angeles reports that Anne's date was the top draw for this past summer. We were told they had promoters looking for extra nights, where some dates for acts had to be cancelled."

In Windsor, not exactly the healthiest city, employment-wise, in Canada, Murray's two dates are sold out. For the opening night gala (the re-opening of the new Cleary Auditorium), tickets were pegged at \$110 each, all of which went in a short period of time.

Bell Canada is the major sponsor for Murray's London, Kitchener, Ottawa, Sudbury and Toronto dates. The sponsorship is part of Bell's Legacy Series with proceeds going to the Youth Environmental Alliance. Last year, Bell sponsored a portion of the Rita MacNeil tour, the year before, the Royal Air Farce, and before that Air Supply. Each year the Legacy Series raises awareness and funds for different causes.

When completed, Murray will have played 90 dates for the year. This current 26 date leg of the Capitol star's tour saw a return to the Trump Plaza, part of an ongoing contract for multiple

Rockers stage benefit for Brian MacLeod

The elite of Vancouver's rock music community staged an extravaganza (Oct. 6) that raised over \$50,000 for song writer/producer Brian MacLeod, who is currently battling cancer. Kimberley Blake of Bruce Allen Talent reports Vancouver's 86 Street Music Hall was "jampacked" for the benefit.

Taking part in the concert were Bryan Adams, Bill Henderson, Colin James, Chrissy Steele and Loverboy. The date was organized late last week and staged within two days in order to include Adams and his band, who set off on their world tour the day after the benefit. This was also a treat for the Vancouver music fans, in that Loverboy played together for the first time in more than two years.

MacLeod's longtime songwriting and performing partner from Chilliwack, Bill Henderson, was joined for his acoustic set by his singing daughters, Saffron and Camille, a member of the West End Girls.

Blake reports that "a memorable all-star jam" closed the show with the musicians sending taped recorded messages of good will to MacLeod, who is in Houston, Texas, receiving treatment for a rare form of cancer. MacLeod had video taped a message to everyone from his hospital bed. His treatment is expected to take six months and cost upwards of US\$300,000.

Rambeau also reports "a very healthy advance" for Murray's Toronto dates, which will be augmented by 12 strings. "We always get that 98 to 99 percent for Toronto, but you can't assume that every year is going to be the same. It gets tougher each year... with more and more events competing for the dollar."

The tour is timely however, with the release of Murray's new album, Yes I Do, and the chart success of Everyday, the first single. Murray's new album however, doesn't qualify as Cancon, which signals some Canadian broadcasters to back off and wait to see what it does in the US. "All this fuss about Bryan Adams not being

Canadian . . . we've had to live with that for years," says Rambeau. "They're just catching up to Bryan. Anne, by virtue of doing some of her stuff in the US, and just doing vocals here and not being a writer . . . we've had to deal with that non-Canadian stigma for years."

Rambeau is disturbed that some Canadian programmers refuse to recognize Murray as an international star, and they are adamant, says Rambeau. "They say 'when it's a hit, call us i.e. it's not Cancon, so we're not going to play it.' Anne has to have a hit in the US and then Canadian programmers will follow."

In spite of the reluctance of some Canadian programmers to air Murray's recordings, she continues to rack up sales of more than a million albums each year, the true reading of her immense popularity.

Casey House to benefit from CBC production

Last month a group of Toronto entertainment figures headed up by B.J. Cook, organized a benefit concert with all proceeds going to Casey House Hospice. The hospice is a twelve-bed hospital affiliated palliative care facility for AIDS patients. The concert, held at the Rose Cafe, raised over \$15,000. Besides Cook, who is well known in Canada's songwriting community (Night Heat etc.), Diane Hetherington, Tobby Johnson (Molly Johnson's sister), Cynthia Dale (Street Legal), Carole Pope, Maggie Moore, and more, took part in the fund raiser.

The benefit was so successful that Maria Armstrong of CBC's TV Network Programming will produce a major fund raiser (Nov. 3), a country dance billed as Two Steps Closer. The concert/dance will be held at Bar 1 on Isabella Street in downtown Toronto. The proceeds will be donated to Casey House Hospice. Unfortunately, the services available in Toronto at present, look after only the needs of adult male patients. It's hoped that with benefits such as Two Steps Closer, and with the added impact of Women For Women, the program can be expanded to accommodate women and children with AIDS.

"We have to raise the awareness of everyone possible," says Cook. "I don't think the full impact of this dreadful disease has struck home to most of the population. I've lost close friends, and it's agonizing to see how many more are suffering and I know only too well how they suffer."

Cook is also critical of the entertainment business for its lack of participation. "It seems everybody wants to sidestep the issue. Well, the issue is here and when it does hit, it's terrifying. The best way to bring attention to the needs of the people with AIDS is through the help of entertainers, recording artists, television stars, anyone who has a platform. AIDS isn't going to go away . . . it's here for a long, long time."

Firmed for the benefit are Michelle Wright, Jack DeKeyzer, Scott King, Lori Yates and Rick Jones and his band. Armstrong hopes to firm other top Canadian country performers over the next couple of weeks.

As part of the fund-raising efforts of the day, organizers hope to raffle memorabilia,

personalized articles or similar items from major country stars

Armstrong points out that there are no costs associated with the production of the benefit. The facility, sound and lights and performances have all either been donated or sponsored. "This is an important benefit for many reasons. Not only is the cause extremely important, but in addition, this benefit will reach many people with the true message of country music and what country music stands for in our respective communities."

Cook has designed a pin, black for friends lost, and yellow designating hope for HIV carriers. The pin will be sold at the benefit.

Petty show to spotlight seventies Cancon acts

Commencing with its Oct. 14th edition, the Dini Petty Show, a CFTO-TV production, will feature top Canadian musicians from the seventies.

The special series, titled The Music We Grew Up With will begin by profiling key members of Lighthouse (Oct. 14), the Stampeders (16), Edward Bear (17) and artists Terry Jacks (15) and Ian Thomas (18).

Recent footage, taken at the homes of the individual musicians, will be used to complement the comprehensive, in-studio interviews with Petty.

The series is the brainchild of Randy Gulliver, the director of the Petty show and former keyboard player with Edward Bear. He has been working on the project since June. His intent with the series is to show viewers what some of Canada's most popular musicians from the seventies are doing now and how these performers have adapted to life away from the spotlight. "The project helped me see why there is a resurgence of interest in music produced by 'classic' Canadian bands and artists. These bands all give you a sense of Canadian unity and identity. They remind us of a time when you did have a sense of a unified country."

Spitfire Band flying with 10th anniversary album

For those who may have thought big bands had gone the way of the do-do bird, Jackie Rae, founder of The Spitfire Band has news to the contrary. "We are alive and well, and packing them in," says the former WWII Spitfire pilot. The band celebrates its tenth anniversary with the release of a special anniversary album released on the Tembo Music label.

Rae recalls that it was in 1981 while meeting with Don Hartford, who was President of CFRB at that time, and CKFM's Bill Ballentine. "We were talking about the resurgence of big band music, and we were looking for a name for my band. Ballentine came up with the name because of my war years with the aircraft."

The Canadian Talent Library (CTL), a funding organization founded by Standard Broadcasting, supplied the backing for the band's first album. Ironically, Heather Sym, who is Executive Director of FACTOR, which absorbed CTL in 1982, handled all the administration duties for CTL at that time. Rae gratefully acknowledges Sym's "baby-sitting" of him and the other CTL projects.

Also a major player in the launch of the band's career was Ed Preston, now President of Tembo Music, but who, at that time was President of RCA Records Canada. "When Ed heard the first couple of tracks," he said, 'Terrific ... I'll take it,' and we signed with RCA," says Rae.

The album, which Rae produced, was very successful, becoming a priority item at MOR (easy listening) stations across the country and gaining front-rack space at retail outlets. The Marie track was taken as the first single. "It was a roaring success. We got calls to do personal appearances which presented a problem. We hadn't looked any further than making an album, so the calls to book dates was a venture we hadn't looked into."

Micky Erbe, musical director and arranger,

put together the arrangements for a sixteenpiece band, "and we hit the road. The timing was good, the initial impact by CFRB was terrific and the arrangements by Erbe were just what the people were looking for. He wrote some terrific charts. They weren't copies of the '40s music. He used his imagination to update the material. Some of the original licks were used for nostalgia purposes, but he made everything sparkle."

The band's repertoire also spread into the '60s and '70s and the demand for personal appearances, hosted by Rae, who was also the vocalist, continued to grow. Joining the production/arrangement team was Laurie Bower, a highly respected vocal arranger and master of the trombone, who had become well known through the release of CTL recordings by the Laurie Bower Singers.

After the first album went gold, the band's repertoire was expanded and the Rae, Erbe, Bower team worked on more releases; The Spitfire Band Swings The Movies, Swings Down Broadway, and more, a total of nine albums. The band received four Juno nominations between 1983 and 1985. Dates included the Lincoln Centre and the Metropolitan Club in New York with a live broadcast on WNEW, concerts in Detroit, the London, Ontario Jazz Festival with Rosemary Clooney, an appearance with Helen O'Connell, capped by a year's engagement at the Imperial Room of Toronto's Royal York Hotel. Rae cut short the Imperial Room date after a year, "because I didn't want it to become a hotel band. It's a pretty flashy band."

Rae maintains there is a need for the Spitfire Band type of music, and it's not just for the older demographics. "I find it quite refreshing to see the number of young people who turn out for our concerts. They know the repertoire and they even ask for the older material, which I find amazing that they are familiar with music from the forties, fifties and sixties. They get up and

boogie and jive with the best of them."

Now, with its Tenth Anniversary album, the Spitfire Band, are ready for another decade of swinging and swaying the big band way. Included are the most requested songs from the band's ten year history, including Just In Time, Marie and S'Wonderful with Jackie Rae on vocals, I've Heard That Song Before, New York, New York, Hey There, Days Of Wine And Roses, and more, including a timely medley of Here Comes Santa Claus, with the band on vocals, and Sleigh Ride.

Sitting in on the session for the Tenth Anniversary album were: trumpets: Arnie Chycoski, Dave Woods, Mike Malone, John MacLeod, Guido Basso, Bob Herriott; trombones: Gerry Johnson, Laurie Bower, Bob Livingstone, Russ Little; Saxes: Jack Zaza, Dave Caldwell, Steve Lederer, Bill Ruttle, Bob De Angelis, Moe Koffman, Bernie Piltch, Harvey Kogen, BobLeonard; guitar: Hank Monis; piano: Gary Gross; bass: Rick Homme, Tom Szezesniak; drums:, Brian Leonard, John Sumner.

"We haven't been invited to the west or the east coasts of Canada yet, but I think it will eventually happen." There are 21 people to travel in the band, a major undertaking. However, with the release of the band's Tenth Anniversary album, five dates for the month of October added a note of triumph for the album launch, and further dates are now being pencilled in.

Sony Music signs deal with Einstein Brothers

The Toronto-based Einstein Brothers Record label has a foot in the international door with the signing of an international licensing agreement with Sony Music Canada. Comprised of Tin. Thorney, Erica Ehm, Alan Kates and Jody Colero, the company was first started by Thorney and Colero as a music production company providing scores for films and music for radio and television commercials. Kates is well known in the business and is one of the country's leading managers. He is currently guiding the careers of Prairie Oyster and Sylvia Tyson. Ehm, a songwriter, is a MuchMusic veejay.

Initial release from the new label is Cassandra Vasik's debut album Wildflowers, set for an Oct. 23 release. Next up will be the debut of Hard Rock Miners, a Vancouver-based band.






Al Murdoch, LG73 afternoon drive personality celebrates the last day of summer.



Well that changed this week with Bryan Adams' Can't Stop This Thing We Started hitting No. 2, Mariah Carey's Emotions reaching No. 3 as well as songs from Dire Straits, Tom Cochrane and Martika all bulleting in the Top 10.

Is that all? Black Crowes' Shake Your Moneymaker enters its 68th week on the Albums chart by dropping out of the Top 20. Although it has been on the chart that long, it never cracked the Top 20 until its 35th week giving it a stay of 33 weeks in the Top 20. Compare that with other Top 20 stays from recent albums: Mariah Carey's self-titled album (49 weeks), Wilson Phillips's album of the same name (46 weeks) and MC Hammer's Please Hammer Don't Hurt Em (45 weeks). All of which pale by comparison of a few years ago when INXS' Kick album spent an incredible 61 weeks in the Top 20.

Bruce gets top add... A Dream Like Mine from Bruce Cockburn has this week's highest new entry on the Hit Tracks chart. It debuts at No. 61. In Cockburn's long chart history, he has but one Top 20 song (If A Tree Falls peaked at No. 8 in 1989).

Did you pick the right one? There basically were only three choices as to which song debuted at No. 1 in 1985. Both Northern Lights' Tears Are Not Enough and USA For Africa's We Are The World debuted well down the chart. Tears Are Not Enough hit No. 1 in its fifth week and We Are The World took one week longer. Band Aid's Do They Know It's Christmas entered at No. 1 Jan. 5, 1985.

HARRY CONNICK JR. - Jazz Blue Light, Red Light Columbia - CK 48685-H

Harry Connick Jr. continues his push to make big band jazz and swing music popular again. Connick's gorgeous vocals could melt the heart of any ice queen alive and on ballads like Jill and She Belongs To Me the romantic feeling fairly drips from the speakers. The title track and Just Kiss Me swing and jump nicely. Connick wrote or cowrote all twelve tracks, and while one could listen to him sing those beautiful old standards all day, it is admirable that he is pushing to create something of his own. THE HOLLY COLE TRIO - Jazz Blame It On My Youth Alert - Z21-81018-F

Blame It On My Youth is a good follow up to Cole's debut release Girl Talk. Cole's lovely voice is the main instrument, with Aaron Davis on piano and David Piltch on upright bass, supplying subtle support. Full of dramatic, humourous pauses, Cole has a unique style delivery. I'm Gonna Laugh You Right Out Of My Life is excellent, as is Tom Waits' Purple Avenue. Honeysuckle Rose is a pleasant surprise and I'll Be Seeing You is a perfect closing track. Hopefully we'll be seeing and hearing more of Ms. Cole. (CD reviewed)

JOHN MELLENCAMP - Rock Whenever We Wanted Mercury - CD-510 151-2-Q

Get A Leg Up, taken as a single from this set, has already scored major chart gains, entering the RPM 100 HotTracks at No. 31 (Oct. 12/91. This is vintage Mellencamp with his searing guitar once again taking a lead role. Not into too much concert dates of late, but there's no doubt his return via this package displaying his original roots, will bring him onto that circuit once more. The last time he hit Canada was in 1987, and PolyGram proudly boasts that his last album, The Lonesome Jubilee, is now



over six-times platinum in Canada. Mellencamp isn't fighting the troubled waters of America with this release, but he has that old "Cougar" bite, and that's what will propel him into the winning circle once again. Also key are Crazy Ones, which he co-wrote with Randy Handley, Last Chance and I Ain't Ever Satisfied. Lots of good blues and honky-tonk. Front-rack this one, it could be a big winner for the Christmas rush. Produced by Mellencamp. (CD reviewed) - WG

WARREN HILL Kiss Under The Moon RCA/Novus - 3117-2-N



JÖHNNY WINTER - Blues/rock Let Me In Pointblank/Virgin - CDV 3130-Q



MICHAEL PETERS - Country I Won't Love Again WEA - CD75517-P


Great things should happen to this smooth, matter-of-fact country artist. Peters has a natural ability to attract the ear. The vocals, sometimes clipped, other times flowing, create a visionary mystique around the lyrics. He has already established himself as a talent to watch. His years with the Cole Younger Band were obviously well spent. Now, with the distribution backing of a major label, he should be able to make even further inroads into the industry. PAGE TWO - Rock In The Heat Of Nevada Ralnbow Records - RDRCD-196

Page Two, a Toronto band, comprising lead vocalist Gord Douglas, drummer Peter Joseph Greco, bassist Rob Robinson, and guitarist Chuck Page, produced this album with George Rondina. Recording took place at Toronto's Number Nine Studios. Two singles, Lookin' Kind Of Crazy (RDR Promopak 9), and Play With Fire, a remake of the Stones hit (RDR promopak 11), have already met with good programmer acceptance.



Programmer reaction prompted the band to put out this nine-track CD. Douglas possesses a unique vocal projection that adds to the mystique of his lyricinterpretation. With the exception of Phelpe's Fire, and Lone Streets, written by Douglas and Bob Jackson, all the material was penned by Douglas and Page. Page's searing guitar work is exceptional and strangely enough allows a modicum of respect for the vocals, difficult to do when both are featured players. But don't overlook one of the gems here, Who Asked, written and arranged by Rick Wilkins. Lots of great entertainment here and if given front-rack positioning, the cover will attract alone. He points out however, that although not released as a country single, "it has that classic Taylor feel and appeal that bridges musical boundaries." Garth Brooks moves to No. 1 this week on the RPM 100 after the best weeks in his short history. His CMA win literally catapulted him into chart prominence throughout North America. His Toronto concert (Oct. 4) was a publicist's dream. Brooks lent himself to practically every offer made, satisfying the curious and the fans from both retail and radio. Brooks' latest album, Ropin' The Wind is now closing in on double platinum and retailers who have front-racked this item are being rewarded with instant customer recognition, and sales.

The station's Miriam Sakoor, reports that a 24-hour listener suggestion line has been set up to give listeners "the opportunity to help shape the sound of the 'new' station.

"An overwhelming number of listeners asked us to bring back the show, while others felt the station sounded better without it. In an effort to give our listeners what they want to hear, we decided to bring back The Quiet Storm."

Sakoor also revealed that the station is now asking if The Quiet Storm should be expanded to Sunday nights as well.

Cinram announces 1991 second quarter results

Cinram Ltd's consolidated sales for the second quarter ending June 30, 1991 were \$14,124,000 vs. sales of \$9,997,000 in the corresponding 1990 period. The increase in sales resulted from increased shipments of compact discs and from US cassette manufacturing operations acquired in the fall of 1990.

CJAY takes advantage of new FM regulations

Canadian radio certainly has changed in the past few weeks. Case in point is Calgary's CJAY FM. It is now known as Classic Rock CJAY. Station Program Director, Stewart Meyers, explains the reasons for the switch from what had been a cross between a lite rock and hard rock station. "Through the regulatory process, we felt we kind of got muscled out of our position. The station wasn't positioned musically nearly as strong as we wanted it to be. There was a hard rock station in town (CKIK), there was a lite rock station (CHFM) and we sort of claimed to be all things to all people."

Although CJAY has done quite well over the past few years, Meyers felt the station tended to be vulnerable at ratings time so the regulations that once hindered the sound of the station will now help. Meyers states CJAY can get back to their roots. "We wanted to reposition the station back to where it really was."

Classic Rock CJAY is now targeting the 20-30 year-old male by playing such artists as Boston and Aerosmith, but still keeping up with current releases from acts like Van Halen and Lynyrd Skynyrd. The station also decided to keep its original call letters. Meyers said it was all part of getting back to where the station came from. "That was part of our heritage campaign. There was a considerable amount of equity in the call letters." Meyers said the response from listeners so far has been very positive.
