

Jesse and Gene return to Westcom fold in AM role

Toronto's last remaining all-hits AM radio station, AM640, has picked up the morning duo of Jesse and Gene, who were recently cut loose from CFTR.

The popular pair co-hosted CFTR's morning show from 1989 until the station became an all-news operation on June 6.

Jesse (Dylan) and Gene (Valaitis) gained an immediate audience when they joined Toronto's Q107 in 1986 as co-hosts of the Morning Zoo. Their appointment to AM640 marks their return to the Westcom Radio Group, which owns and operates both AM640 and Q107.

Danny Kingsbury, vice-president of programming for AM640 and Q107, says, "It's not often that you can count on listeners migrating from one station to another when the personalities cross the street... but with these two, it's as close to a sure thing as you can get in this business. Jesse and Gene singularly bring to AM radio a rare speciality that cannot be replicated. They are funny,


Celine Dion firmed for upcoming CTV special

Celine Dion will star in The Power Of Love, an upcoming one-hour CTV network music special.

Carol Reynolds, former producer of the Juno Awards and now with Paragon Film and Television Productions, will produce the special, which will be taped in Quebec City later this year.

Dion is scheduled to perform several of her hits, including Beauty And The Beast, Where Does My Heart Beat Now, and Love Can Move Mountains, as well as new material expected to be recorded in the studio for her next album.

Dion is currently charting with Water From The Moon from her self-titled album that is nearing the 500,000 units sold mark in Canada.

Cinram expands with Nelson Vending merger

Toronto-based Cinram Ltd., a major manufacturer of compact discs and video tapes, plans to merge with Nelson Vending Technology Ltd.

Cinram is expected to issue up to \$1.8 million worth of stock to Nelson shareholders in exchange for the Toronto-based company's shares, as well as assume responsibility for its approximate \$1.5 million debt.

The new line of business for Cinram is Nelson's computerized network of vending machines that dispense movie videos, most of which are located in convenience stores.

The merger also offers Cinram a \$36 million tax loss that will be beneficial to its operation.

Nelson apparently lost \$3.3 million last year on sales of \$3.5-million. It was suggested that Nelson's problems included expanding too quickly and bringing on board a sophisticated main-frame computer system that turned out to be very expensive to operate.

Cinram made a profit of \$10.2 million last year on sales of \$86.1 million. Shares on the TSE closed at \$25.37 on June 17, an increase of 12 cents. There were 8,700 shares traded.

Nelson shares for the same date were down 2 cents to close at 3.5 cents.

Evelyn Cream appointed to Warner classical post


Evelyn Cream has been promoted to the position of marketing manager of classical repertoire for Warner Music Canada.

The stage, bathed in soft reds and blues, added that touch of mystique to Cohen's humbling performance. The high priest of pop poetry effortlessly, and with cunning blandness, introduced each song with a few of the lyrics before segueing with incredible ease into the fully orchestrated number. The conduit to his audience was the lyrical content and, with the cult following he draws, that's all that's necessary. The instrumental and vocal support is made up of technically perfect professionals who are as unique and individualistic in their profession as is Cohen -- a marriage seemingly made in heaven. for Toronto. And isn't that an interesting trio of names that has been mentioned as being part of one consortium: Bill Ballard, Jim Fifield and Michael Cohl? Is Toronto big time or is Toronto big time? (EC: You can't convince Ed Needham . . . !)

Ed Needham was right on!!! How trite and bloody stupid are some of the complaints that are levelled against broadcasters? And their watchdog, the Canadian Broadcast Standards Council (CBSC) is just as stupid to listen. He's the kind of guy you love to hate, and he makes good radio. (EC: He's mild compared to those two morning dodos who are flying all over the place!!!)

A multicultural Oh Canada . . . ? Now, won't that be neat! Ross Carlin, the guy who was responsible for producing two new versions of our national anthem, has another gig . . . same song. Do si do . . . ! Hey, when there's a fortune involved, it's time to share . . . but only in the beginning. Watch for a couple of unlikelies to join forces to make sure they get what they're after. A little bit of advice. Make sure it has a western base. (EC: Yippy I Yay . . .!)

Eyes east...! Capitol, oops, EMI Music Canada, has opened the door to the not so mysterious east. Now, with the Rankin Family proving there's a treasure trove in the Atlantic provinces, here comes the next gem... Ron Hynes. Clever guys these EMI Music people. They took a bunch of us across Toronto Bay to

the Toronto Yacht Club and we became a captive audience for a performance by newly-signed Ron Hynes. After a nice feed of flown-in-special-from-Newfoundland lobster, arranged by EMI Music's in-house Newfielander Steve McAauley, Ron Hynes performed a brief and lyrically-rich set... a sampling from his Cryer's Paradise album. A nice touch. Even CISS-FM morning personality Cliff Dumas stayed past his 10 p.m. bedtime call. (EC: Don't say oops around that guy who fell out of bed...!)

Mini-discs are really humming!!! Celine Dion's self-titled album is closing on the 500,000 units sold mark. CDs and cassettes that is. But look at this. The Mini-disc of the same title has sold 13 copies, and not all in one store. (EC: That's more than the hardware has sold!!!)



Attic's Al Mair reflects on 20 years in business

In the spring of 1974, two young veterans of the Canadian music industry got together on a Friday night to talk shop. Two days later, Al Mair and Tom Williams decided to form Attic Records.

Within 48 hours, the pair had raised \$300,000 in borrowed funds. And on June 7, 1974, Attic was incorporated. Mair, who was managing Gordon Lightfoot at the time, set up an office with Williams and Heather Murray

Alannah Myles's Sonny Say You Will is the other Cancon entry as it bows at No. 86.

What's going on? It's an odd coincidence, but Barenaked Ladies' What A Good Boy moves up to No. 50, while 4 Non Blondes' What's Up is No. 51 and Spin Doctors' What Time Is It is No. 52.

In and out. The Best Of Van Morrison - Volume 2 drops off the Albums chart. At the same time, his latest album, Too Long In Exile, is the top add as it debuts at No. 13.

The hot sellers. Here are the 10 best selling albums at A&B Sound in Vancouver as reported by Julie Ryan. 1. Janet Jackson 2. Lenny Kravitz 3. Eric Clapton 4. Aerosmith 5. Rod Stewart 6. Van Morrison 7. Porno For Pyros 8. Spin Doctors 9. Midnight Oil 10. The Tragically Hip.

The soundtracks. The four movies with a soundtrack on the chart are Sliver (No. 11), The Bodyguard (No. 12), Aladdin (No. 50), and The Crying Game (No. 99). The Sliver Soundtrack is now the top soundtrack on the chart, ending a streak of 27 straight weeks when The Bodyguard had the top soundtrack.

in a Toronto house owned by his client. Within a few weeks the label had signed its first act and released its first single, Fludd's Brother & Me, which peaked at #29 on the RPM Top Singles chart that October.

"We decided that within five years we'd be fabulously rich owners of a major worldwide corporation," Mair reminisces today. After the first year, however, Attic had grossed \$36,000 but ran a loss of \$100,000. But by the end of the second year -- and releases from Ron Nigrini, Debbie Fleming, Ken Tobias and Shirley Eikhard -- the company had broken even and was starting to turn a profit. Mair was confident enough in Attic to end the managerial relationship with Lightfoot which he had been continuing in addition to his new responsibilities.

Attic, which was distributed by

Montreal's London Records, had its first big hit in 1975 with Hagood Hardy's The Homecoming. The album went platinum and the single went gold in Canada, and both also became hits in other territories. "Almost all of our success has been based on getting started here first and then selling it abroad," Mair says.

"The label was formed to sell Canadian artists. But early on, economically I realized that you can't break even in this country just making records by Canadian artists. You have to do something else. Many of the (Canadian independent) companies are combined management/record companies -- Anthem, True North, Alert. We made the decision early on not to be into management. Therefore we're not managers. We're totally reliant on record sales, publishing revenue and other forms of revenue. Our way of paying the bills was to licence foreign product."

Over the years, Attic has had success licensing foreign artists as diverse as Motorhead, Plastic Bertrand, Katrina and The Waves, George Thorogood, Jennifer Warnes and, most recently, House Of Pain. While Attic works with some labels, such as Tommy Boy, on a selective basis, the company also has licensing deals covering entire labels. Scotti Brothers, Profile, Mammoth, Roadrunner, Malaco, Luke, Bandleader and, the newest addition, First Night, are now all part of the Attic family.

"We're working with labels that have proven that they can compete in their own country," Mair says. "We try to complement each label as opposed to having them in competition with each other."

One area where Mair has little competition is with the Bandleader label, which specializes in military music but has also released albums of cultural or historical importance to Canada. The albums are sold through a mail order service, which belongs to

Mair's children, called the Whitehall Music Guild. Although there's just a small niche market for the genre, more than 100 titles have been released and the Whitehall Music Guild now sells more military music than all

Canadian retailers combined. "We've always tried to put out records that deserve to be in the market, even if they don't sell," Mair says.

"We've also kept an eye out for catalogues. We've got Judas Priest's first four albums in our catalogue and have had them for 15 years. And over those 15 years we've sold a lot of Judas Priest records. We look for product that will sell over time, not just a flash in the pan."

Attic currently carries more than 500 active albums in its catalogue which, Mair says, assures the company of at least some guaranteed sales every month. "We try, particularly with Canadian artists, to keep the records in the catalogue as long as possible. Having those catalogues as opposed to being reliant on hits is very important for this company."

In 1979, Attic left London Records behind to sign a distribution deal with Arnold Gosewich at CBS. The distributor gave Attic a \$350,000 advance to be used for A&R, and Mair says "we used that opportunity to really grow quickly."

Attic and CBS ended their relationship in 1982 when Selkirk Communications, parent company of Quality Records, tried to buy the company. The buy-out offer was refused, but another deal was struck that would see Quality fund Attic as its A&R source for three years, after which time a possible merger might be discussed. Quality had never really developed any Canadian artists, but had acted primarily as a distributor. And since the company owned a large pressing plant, it needed to acquire product to press. That's where Attic would come in, the Selkirk hierarchy thought, and it gave Attic an A&R budget without even telling Quality's management. Not surprisingly, Mair says it didn't go over too well with them.

"Quality did everything they possibly could to sabotage the deal. The senior



management just hated us. The whole company was asleep at the wheel, it was just pathetic. The staff was poorly trained, poorly motivated and poorly led. We had the first negative month in our history, where our returns surpassed our sales. Within six months we would have gone bankrupt if we would have stayed there."

After five months of negotiations, Attic limped away from Quality. A year later, Selkirk wound down Quality Records. It took two years for Attic to recover from the almost fatal deal with Quality, and Williams elected to retire from the company on Sept. 30, 1983. That was the same year PolyGram in Montreal started distributing Attic.

Mair says Attic had mixed success in its

three years with PolyGram before it went over to A&M eight years ago. The label's been with A&M ever since, and Mair seems quite content to stay there. "You've got to control your own destiny and be involved with people who have the same vision as you do with your product."

Mair, who bought out Williams and the other remaining shareholders to become sole owner of Attic in 1986, would still like to open up in the United States. In fact, a couple of years ago before the brunt of the recession hit, he says he was close to a deal.

"We had some major American funding available and we had a heavyweight American to be the president of the U.S. record company. Unfortunately, he was the president of a major U.S. label and was under contract to that label and couldn't leave.

"EMI was quite interested in what we were doing, but Charlie Koppelman came down the road with the SBK concept and they went with SBK. So we had to shelve those ideas at that time. But we still are hoping, in the not too distant future, to be in the United States in charge of our own destiny."

But even with all his talk of American expansion, Mair proudly states that he is first and foremost a Canadian "flag waver." Such is Attic's catalogue of Canadian songs, he says, that a radio station could play the label's records 24 hours a day, seven days a week, for at least two weeks, without ever repeating a track.

Since starting with \$300,000 in borrowed money, Attic has gone on to register \$75 million in retail sales in Canada and \$35 million in the rest of the world. The company has also paid out \$18 million in production costs and artist royalties, and \$7 million in publishing royalties. An additional \$1.5 million has been spent producing videos.

"I think we've made a pretty substantial contribution to the Canadian music industry and to the country," Mair says. "In the history of our company, we've only made one album outside of Canada. (One Haywire album was made in Scandinavia.) We believe in making world quality records, and that world quality

records can be made in Canada."

As Attic celebrates its 20th year in business, the company's 12 full-time and three part-time employees can look back upon some fond memories. In its existence, Attic has received 73 gold, platinum or multi-platinum certifications for albums sold in Canada, the U.S., Great Britain, Holland and Japan. Triumph, The Rovers, Patsy Gallant, Maestro Fresh-Wes, The Nylons, Lee Aaron, Goddo, The Bopcats and Teenage Head are just some of the Canadian acts that have had career boosts from the label.

One reason why Attic was chosen as the company's name was because it was a place to discover unknown treasures. But it was also derived from the name of a region of east central Greece, where the natives were

renowned for their good taste and integrity. And integrity is something which Mair says his company has always stood behind.

"Nobody can ever say that they didn't get a fair shake from Attic. And I don't think there's any artist who can say that Attic didn't give them a better than full shot."

Thai recording artist Manee has signed to Quality (Records) Special Products.

"Manee is special," says her manager, Steve Thomson of Backstage Productions International. "And hence Quality Special Products. I've been watching what Quality has been doing over the past six months and I'm impressed and I believe that they can do the job.

"Bernie Willock's enthusiasm at our MIDEM showcase and Linda Nash's drive and energy for the project have convinced me that Quality has the right approach to be part of the team to launch Manee to an American audience."

Manee's album, entitled Desire, was produced by Thomson and Rich Dodson and recorded at various studios in Toronto, including Dodson's Marigold Studios. All the material on the album was co-written by Dodson and Don Breithaupt. The album therefore qualifies as three parts Cancon (MPL).

As the result of Manee's MIDEM showcase, she not only landed the Canadian deal, but distribution pacts for Korea, Singapore, Indonesia and her home country.

Unique company hawking CBC radio dramas

Listen Hear Audio Tapes, a newly-formed private company, has signed an exclusive contract with CBC Radio to reproduce and distribute selected CBC radio dramas and productions.

The Delta, B.C.-based company also acts as distributor of spoken word audio tapes from other Canadian sources.

Bev Horan, the company's founder, says Canada is a world leader in the field of radio dramas, utilizing a talented pool of writers, performers and production people. "It has long been my dream to see these wonderful productions made available to those who may have missed them when they were aired on the radio.

"I had a feeling that the time for spoken word audio tapes had arrived, and my market research confirmed it."

Horan's research revealed that demographics indicated an aging population "whose eyesight is failing either due to age or illness. There are more commuters and many of those commuters have longer commute times than ever before."

The popularity of the Walkman also figured in Horan's research, and sales resulting from a trial entry into the marketplace confirmed there is a growing interest in spoken audio tapes. Circulation statistics from public libraries reveal an increase in audio tape

circulation.

"Educators indicate that children's listening skills are generally poor because they rely on television's visual stimulation," Horan says. "(But) there are so many excellent Canadian stories and dramas out there. Listen Hear wants to make them available for everyone's listening pleasure."

The company's catalogue contains selections of story telling, poetry, comedy, serious and humorous drama, armchair travel and intellectual pursuits as well as stories and dramas for children.

Sony's Caribana album is part of '93 festivities

Sony Music Canada will release Caribana, the official 1993 Caribana album, to help launch Toronto's 26th annual celebration of Caribbean culture.

The album, featuring 12 soca and calypso hits selected by the Caribbean Cultural Committee, will be released July 8. Fifty cents from each album will be donated to the committee as it attempts to eliminate Caribana's \$290,000 deficit. The album cover features this year's official Caribana design. Compact discs and cassettes will be available at Caribana events in Toronto and through major retailers across the country.

Although it has no official connection to Caribana, Quality is also trying to cash in on the July 19-August 2 festival with its Fun In The Sun: A Soca-Calypso Carnival album. The 16-track album was produced by Eddy Grant, MuchMusic VJ Michael Williams, and CFNY-FM and club DJ 'Deadly' Headly Jones.

Caribana is expected to attract 1.5 million participants who will bring in \$200 million to Toronto's economy.

On July 31, 45 masquerade bands, featuring from 75 to 1,000 masqueraders plus accompanying musicians, will compete for the band of the year title as they parade in a dazzling array of colours on Lakeshore Blvd. Trinidad and Tobago, Brazil, St. Lucia and the Antilles will be among the countries represented by Caribana masqueraders.

Other Caribana highlights include: the rap-off competition at College Park on June 26; official festival launch in Nathan Phillips Square on July 19; warm-up party in Nathan Phillips Square on July 23; junior carnival at Lamport Stadium on July 25; sunset cruises aboard the Trillium from July 26-30; king and queen of the bands show at Lamport Stadium on July 29; carnival dance at the Toronto Airport Hilton on July 30; Caribana "Las Lap" party at the Delta Toronto Airport Hotel on July 31; Kaisofest at the Skyline Hotel on Aug. 1; and the Olympic Island Caribbean music festival on Aug. 1 and 2.

CityTV will run a five-part serial on the making of Caribana on its six o'clock

newscasts from July 26-30. The station will also air a one-hour prime time special on Aug. 5. It's expected that City will also release a souvenir video of this year's Caribana events after they're over.

College Park houses Caribana's marketing office as well as two stores selling Caribana merchandise, souvenirs and event tickets. Caribana merchandise will also be available at the Bathurst, Dufferin, Lansdowne, Keele and Jane subway stations starting on July 15.

A Song For Brent will help young quadriplegics

A Song For Brent, a single by Alberta singer/ songwriter Cindy Church which is scheduled for an early July release, will touch many in Canada's country music industry.

The song is dedicated to Brent Berezay, who became a quadriplegic at 15 after being thrown from his horse during a rodeo roping event. Berezay is capable of only the smallest movements and is unable to communicate verbally, but it was noticed that he responds emotionally to images in country music videos he watches on television.

During Country Music Week in Calgary last year a writer's workshop was organized to put a song together for Berezay. Church agreed to sing it and the Berezay family was invited to Calgary to watch and listen to the many writers, singers and musicians who took part in the recording session.

A Song For Brent is not only intended for Berezay, but to also help others like him. Most of the materials and services required to record, manufacture, promote and distribute the record, as well as to collect royalties, were donated. All the profits from the sale and broadcast of the recording and music will be donated to the A Song For Brent Society, which will administer the proceeds specifically for the benefit of brain-injured quadriplegics who sustained their injuries in childhood.







"Southern Albertans looking for a true rock radio station finally have a place to call home -- CKRX 1090 Rocks," reports station general manager Clyde Ross.

Formerly 1090 CHEC, which went to air in 1959, the new station hit the airwaves at noon on May 21.

"Extensive market research shows radio listeners in Lethbridge and the surrounding area wanted a true rock music station and CKRX delivers," Ross says.

The new format allows a mix of classic rock like the Rolling Stones, Led Zeppelin and the Eagles, with today's popular rock with releases by Bryan Adams and the Black Crowes.

Salvador Dream signs to Warner Music Canada

Warner Music Canada has signed Salvador Dream, a Vancouver-based power trio, to its domestic roster.

Salvador Dream came to the attention of the company before it had even played a live show by sending it two demo tapes last fall. Representatives from most of the major record companies went to Vancouver to see the band showcase in January.

"From the first listen to the demo," says Warner Music Canada's vice-president of A&R, Kim Cooke, "it was apparent that Salvador Dream were on to something special -- an uncommon melding of power, rhythm and groove, fused with melodic songeraft and influences from Black Sabbath to John Coltrane, and the whole new school of Primus and Helmet -- it's a combination I couldn't resist."

The band, consisting of Russ Klyne (vocals/guitar), Ray Garraway (vocals/drums) and Toby Peter (vocals/bass), is currently writing and road testing new material. The group recently opened six shows for the Quireboys in western Canada and will be playing some Ontario dates in late June.

They handed out promotional items and signed up listeners to qualify for a trip for two to see the Tragically Hip in Minneapolis.

Over the summer the station will give away an estimated \$30,000 in cash and prizes to drivers whose vehicles are sporting the new CKRX Win sticker.

CKRX is owned and operated by Monarch Broadcasting of Medicine Hat, which owns radio and television stations in a number of markets in Alberta and British Columbia.

Standard Radio wins big at RTNDA awards

Standard Radio stations picked up four central Canada region awards for excellence in news coverage at the recent Radio and Television News Directors Awards convention (RTNDA) in London, Ont.

CFRB's Donna Tranquada won the Dan McArthur Award for best investigative reporting for her story, The Truth About Corey. CFRB's news team won the Charlie Edwards Award for best spot reporting with its story, The Yonge Street Riots, which also received the national Charlie Edwards Award for best spot reporting. Mark Rennie of CJAD Montreal won the Dave Rogers Award for in-depth reporting for his story, Pan Handlers in the Montreal Community.

An honourable mention went to the CKTB St. Catharines news team of Les Walton, Dave Zarecky and Mike Haines for its coverage of a Niagara helicopter crash that claimed the life of a Buffalo television news reporter.

More news and talks wins big for Winnipeg's CJOB

Ted Farr, program director of CJOB 68 in Winnipeg, is ecstatic over the results of the spring 1993 BBM book.

It had been more than a decade since Winnipeg had a radio station with more than four million hours of tuning per week. But in 1992 CJOB had 4.1 million hours and, in the book released June 11, the station had 4.4 million hours of tuning, making for an all-time record gain of 1.1 million hours from last spring.

Total circulation for CJOB grew from 287,000 in the spring 1992 BBM to 310,000 in the most recent book. Total circulation represents all listeners 12 years of age and over. "Only once in the history of CJOB has it had more circulation. That too was in 1982," Farr says.

"CJOB has the highest share of tuning of any radio station in Canada and the highest share of tuning of any news, talk station in North America."

CJOB general manager Ralph Warrington stresses "the risks we have taken with the development of more talk and news programming are proving to be what Winnipeg listeners want from CJOB, and we have the



THE BOOMERS Art Of Living WEA - CD 91854-P

This may be the album that makes this impressive group of veteran Canadian musicians as big in their own country as they are in Germany. Ian Thomas writes the they are in Germany. Ian I homas whites the songs, handles lead vocals and gives a hand on guitar, while the rest of the band is comprised of Bill Dillon on guitar, Peter Cardinali on bass and Rick Gratton on drums. Paul Devilliers co-produced the album with Thomas at his farm studio last winter. The title track leads off the album with a punchy lesson in the art of living. You've Got To Know, the jaunty first single and video, could cross over to multiple radio formats. The Way You Feel is a Leon Redbone-styled ballad, but without the gruffness of his Budweiser-prone voice. Dillon's mandolin stands out on Modern Man, and his occasional steel guitar flourishes add subtlety and distinction throughout the album. - SM



DILLON FENCE - Rock/Pop Outside In Mammoth/Attic - MR0049-2-Q

Dillon Fence comes from the emerging music scene of Chapel Hill, N.C. and Outside In follows up the critically acclaimed debut, Rosemary. The album offers a blend of slashing rock and mellower acoustic moments, with a pop sensibility throughout. Kent Alphin and Greg Humphreys are both more than capable guitarists, but producer
Lou Giordano (Sugar, Toad The Wet
Sprocket, King Missile) has left the mix a bit
muddy. Safety Net and One Bad Habit are
recommended, as is the primarily acoustic pop number, Hold Me Down. - SM



OPEN MIND - Folk/Pop Suspect Terrain Open Mind-002

Open Mind's first album, The Stones We Carry, was an excellent vehicle to introduce this talented duo, but it unfortunately didn't get the exposure it so rightly deserved. This time around, however, they've acquired a bit more bite. Cynthia Kerr's music and lyrics have no barriers, crossing easily into folk, rock and pop. The vocal purity fuses beautifully with Randall Hill's mandolin and Laurel Arbuckle's stand-up bass, not to mention the instrumental support from members of Junkhouse. The beauty of this recording, which was engineered by Daniel Thorpe, is its unpretentiousness. But there is a real meat and potatoes base that certainly doesn't go unnoticed, particularly on The Wall, Touch The Water and Heartbeat. This talent is too great to let fall through the cracks. Some of the songs on Kon Kan's third album veer off from the former electrodance route and focus more on guitars to offer some welcomed variety. Barry Harris (lead vocals, acoustic guitar) is still the main man, but he has now gathered a full band comprised of Seri Gee on keyboards, Michael Hampson on lead guitars and Anton Cook on drums. About half of Vida's 11 tracks use the "live band" approach, while the rest return to Kon Kan's original dance roots. Sinful Wishes had a pretty decent run as the first single and both the original and dance mixes are included here. The followup, S.O.L., features some Caribbean grooves and toasting from Crash Morgan. Move To Move (Revisited) is a reworking of the 1989 ballad. For the non-dance crowd, Should've Known Me (Better Than That), Should've Known Me (Better Inan Inaq), should have some appeal. Harris' voice actually takes on the qualities of David Bowie's on a successful cover of Moonage - SM



FISHBONE Give A Monkey A Brain . . . Columbia - CK 52764-H - Rock/Funk

While not completely abandoning its ska and jazz roots, Fishbone has taken a decidedly heavier approach with this album. Producer Terry Date (Pantera, Soundgarden) and mixer Andy Wallace (Nirvana, Rollins, Sonic Youth) obviously have something to do with it, but the music also reflects the heavier messages found in the group's lyrics. Ultimately, though, this metal mixed with funk material lacks the spontaneous fun of the band's earlier work. Exceptions to this rule are Unyielding Conditioning, a very danceable ska tune with more of an emphasis on the group's horn section than found elsewhere, and The Warmth Of Your Breath, which mixes playful musical ideas with some all-out thrashing. But be warned, it's definitely not a love song. Drunk Skitzo combines both breezy and avant jazz (courtesy of Branford Marsalis on sax) with schizophrenic lyrics and high energy punk. This seven-piece Los Angeles-based band has gained a reputation as one of the most energetic live

acts around, so watch for its appearance as part of this summer's Lollapalooza bill to generate some interest at retail.

The band that influenced so many as one of the leaders of the early '80s Los Angeles punk movement has returned to take on the newcomers in the marketplace. The group hasn't lost its intensity and singer Exene Cervenka and vocalist/bassist John Doe have widened the thematic bases of their earlier work. For example, the first single, Country At War, looks at racism in the U.S. The big beat, rockist guitar, hint of organ, and familiar strained harmonies of Cervenka and Doe arouse comparisons to X's late '80s material. Someone's Watching mixes mental anxiety with musical power. Clean Like Tomorrow, New Life and Lettuce And Vodka are also representative of the aggressive angle producer Tony Berg (Michael Penn, Squeeze, PIL) has taken with the album. - SM



POWDER BLUES - Blues/Rock Let's Get Loose


WEA - CD 92488-P Powder Blues are celebrating their 15th anniversary and they've thrown a party on Let's Get Loose. If music can make you feel

So this album, produced three years ago by Hoodoo Guru Dave Faulkner, is a welcomed fix for the band's dedicated cult following. The sound hasn't changed that much in all this time, but if you're looking for sweaty, good time, no need to think '60s garage rock and pop, you can't get much better than this these days. This style made a bit of a comeback in the mid to late '80s, but it has fallen out of favour in recent years as the grunge juggernaut rampaged. But now is as good as time as any to bring it back again. Pick a track, any track. The next album is scheduled to be produced by R.E.M. guitarist Peter Buck, who used to be in a side project band with Streng called Full Time Men. The Fleshtones' frantic live shows have become known as the kind of thing that urban legends are made of. - SM



ROBERT FORSTER - Pop Calling From A Country Phone Beggars Banquet - BBQ CD 133-Q

This 35-year-old former Go-Between has always been a clever, literate songwriter and, while writing and recording this second solo album, he seems to have been in a good mood, to boot. Forster produced the album himself and he's dropped country music influences all over the place. The Circle and Falling Star are pure country pop. The piano on Forever & Time gives the song a honky tonk feel, and an Elvis inflection crops up in Forster's voice, which is pretty unemotional through most of the album. There's a noticeable Feelies influence on the danceable 121. Beyond Their Law, a mid-tempo ballad called Drop, and Cats Life, where the guitars are allowed to cut loose from their reins, are all top drawer tunes. Calling From A Country Phone will appeal to campus stations who loved the Go-Betweens, but it should also be given a shot by CAR, AC and new country stations.

Toby Keith hits No. 1, literally coming out of nowhere after only six weeks of charting with his Mercury release, Should've Been A Cowboy. The Keith original, taken from his self-titled album, is the biggest mover this week, up from No. 18.

George Fox is proving that his Mustang Heart album has the most potential of any of his releases. Fresh from his Big Country win as top male vocalist, Fox bounces back onto the charts with Breakfast Alone (No. 80), which has the most adds this week. Fox cowrote the song with Bob Gaudio, who also produced Mustang Heart.

Vancouver's Lyndia Scott makes a move for national recognition with The Moon She Knows (No. 89). The single is taken from her album Isn't It Always Love, produced by Bill Buckingham and Randall Prescott. Scott was a winner in the third annual CKWX songwriting competition with her first single, which is included on the CKWX CD compilation. Born in Montreal, Scott moved to Vancouver to complete her formal education and get a sociology degree. Her first taste of success in the country field was winning the local Bud Country Talent Search in 1989. She took home third-place honours at the national finals which were held in Ottawa that year. Scott is currently touring Canada promoting her album, which is being distributed through Spinner Records in Vancouver. Scott is managed by Mark Ireland of DMI Talent in Toronto.

RJL recording artist Rocky Swanson enters the chart with Old King Edward Box, a track from his album, The Right One. Blair and Marlene Anderson, who head up RJL, have been successfully working the single, which is now playlisted at more than 50 stations from CKNL in Fort St. John through to CKIX-FM in St. John's. Swanson has been nominated for six BCCMA Awards: Entertainer, Male Vocalist, Single, Song, Duo (with Robert Campbell), and Album of the Year. Swanson's album was produced by Ralph Murphy, mixed by Bill Buckingham and was recorded in Vancouver at various studios. RJL is based in North Vancouver, B.C.

Ronnie Prophet is starring in a country revue at The Country Legends Music Theatre on the main drag of the Wisconsin Dells. The theatre is the brainchild of Nashville native Donna Turek, who moved to the Dells in 1989 to open a dance club for teenagers. However, after a trip to Branson she decided to move to a country format. She also expand her club, adding 270 square metres and a 12-metre stage. She also installed a Peavey threedimensional stereo system and stage lights. Prophet, a veteran Canadian recording artist, was a natural for her launch. Turek describes Prophet's show as "a cross between Branson and Las Vegas." His show is complete with costume changes, comedy impersonations and an Elvis Presley medley. Prophet is backed by wife Glory-Anne and a six-piece band. Confirmed for guest appearances over the summer are Radney

Foster (July 10), Janie Fricke (Aug. 28) and John Conlee (Sept. 12).

The Saloon's Sunday All Star Jam sessions hosted by Albert Hall (a.k.a. CCMA president Chris Hughes) have moved to a new time slot and will now run from 7 to 10 p.m. Some of those who have already jammed with aspiring new artists include Marie Bottrell, Larry Good and Mark C. Maxted. Blues harpist Reg Titian was scheduled for a June 20 jam. Hughes is looking after arrangements at the Toronto club and can be contacted at 416-462-0860.

New Country CHAT in Medicine Hat, Alberta now boasts the Media Touch System (MTS), the latest in computer programming that operates with touch screen. To play a song, you touch a start command by the title on the screen, and it's immediately activated. To make a request, the operator punches up the MTS library which is integrated with the station's music scheduling system. The station also has one of the first 300 CD jukeboxes in Canada. Through its two separate play heads, the system not only pulls all the music requested, it even cues up the right tracks. Onair personalities no longer have to pull music for their shows, and eventually they won't even have to pull or sign off their commercials. The information on MTS and the 300 CD jukebox was discovered in Monarch Notes, a very newsy and informative in-house publication from The Monarch Group.

It's now Dr. Ian Tyson. The Alberta recording artist received an honourary Doctorate Degree at Athabasca University's 16th annual convocation on June 12. Tyson lives on a ranch near Longview in the Alberta foothills of the Rockies. Jeremy Mouat, a history professor at the university who nominated Tyson, says, "Country music is a uniquely egalitarian musical form and its resurgence reflects many people's desire to get in touch with the authentic roots of Alberta's past. Like country music, Athabasca University aspires to be egalitarian. Its unique mission calls for it to be open, accessible, and even unconventional. Mr. Tyson reflects these ideals."
